I am replying to your war 82625 in the absence of General HODGES who is  
in the Italy.

Colonel MAHARAGE is the chief Finance Officer in the A.G. The losses in  
technically qualified finance personnel have been so great that to release  
Col. MAHARAGE without a qualified replacement would be extremely unwise.  
SACMUS has already indicated the seriousness of the situation with regard to  
finance personnel in several signals to SACAO. The stress being placed on  
mobilization has not yet produced qualified civilians to relieve any  
large percentage of officers. If a qualified civilian is furnished to replace  
Col MAHARAGE I shall be glad to release him as soon as the new man can be  
oriented.

1. War Office have now stated that it is not proposed to dispatch a representative to this theatre in order to discuss the terms and conditions under which officers might be employed with this formation in a civilian capacity.

2. It would appear that there has been a substantial change of policy since this matter was first raised but it is regretted that no details thereof are known by this HQ. It is clear however that the chances of obtaining employment with AO as a civilian are slight and all applicants therefore should regard their application as rejected. No further applications of this nature are required.

3. It is possible that a very few appointments in a civilian capacity may be available at a later date for those officers possessing outstanding technical qualifications and who will be communicated via Airplot in due course as to their willingness to accept the employment offered.

2. Reference para. 3 of your letter.

(a) This HQ has received no instructions to award the 1/2 allowance on the posting of civilians and therefore the allowance in rank of officers is not affected.

(b) The HQ determines the equivalent military rank of a civilian whose services are required are to be appointed to the civilian candidate are proportionately the same as the pay and allowances of a military officer of similar rank.

(c) This HQ has no knowledge of any British citizen joining this Commission accompanied by his wife and family.

1. With reference to the question of the release or retention of British Officers serving the Allied Commission, enquiries have been received, as you will be aware, as to the conditions under which British Officers might expect to continue their service with the Allied Commission or Allied Military Government. These enquiries include the matter as to whether it might be possible to continue serving with the Allied Commission in a civilian capacity.

2. Further, some Officers may have volunteered to stay on in order to help the Allied Commission on the basis that it is going to be very short of officers and that no replacements will be available. This has actually happened in one particular case.

3. In connection with the foregoing, considerable concern has been caused by a statement made in a recent report received from the Transportation Sub-Commission to the effect that that Sub-Commission had lost three officers but that three British civilians had arrived. Officers who have volunteered to stay on have, in some cases, been looking forward to some advancement. Civilians frequently arrive carrying not only high military status but often with advantageous rates of pay and allowances and with their wives and families.

4. I therefore consider that information should be sent out immediately as to what is the policy in regard to the introduction of civilians into the Allied Commission and as to whether any arrangements are being made under which such Officers as are qualified would be given the opportunity of continuing their service with the Allied Commission in a civilian capacity.

TO: Full Distribution

1. Information has been received from the War Office that after the end of the current month the release of a certain number of suitable enlisted officers for employment as civilians in government service to those they are at present holding, can be authorized under para 327 of "Regulations for Release from the Army, 1945" omitting therefrom full class "A" Benefits.

2. The following are some of the salient points as to terms of employment etc.

(a) Salary rates for different military rank.

Rank	Per Annum
Colonel .....	\$1,000 - \$1,200
Lieut Colonel .....	800 - 900
Major .....	500 - 600
Captain .....	300 - 500

All may have a \$60 per annum War bonus.

(b) Board and service allowances will be paid (One Month Advance Pay) at the following rates.

Rank	Single	Married
Colonel/Lt Colonel .....	\$190	\$150
Major/Captain .....	\$175	\$125

(c) The above rates include accommodation.

5. Fuller particulars of the conditions of service are not available at present, but the War Office have been asked to send out a representative to discuss such questions as -
