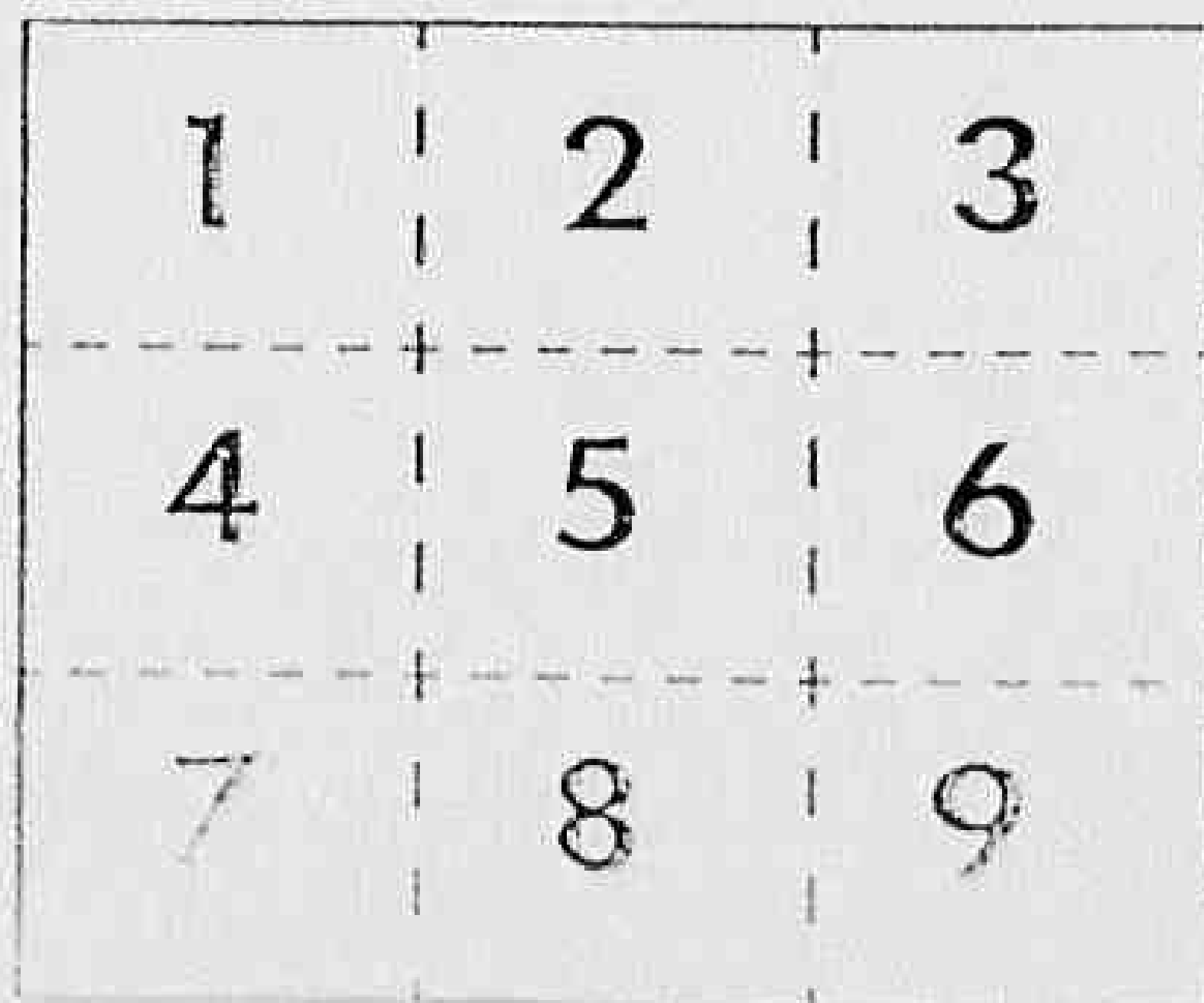
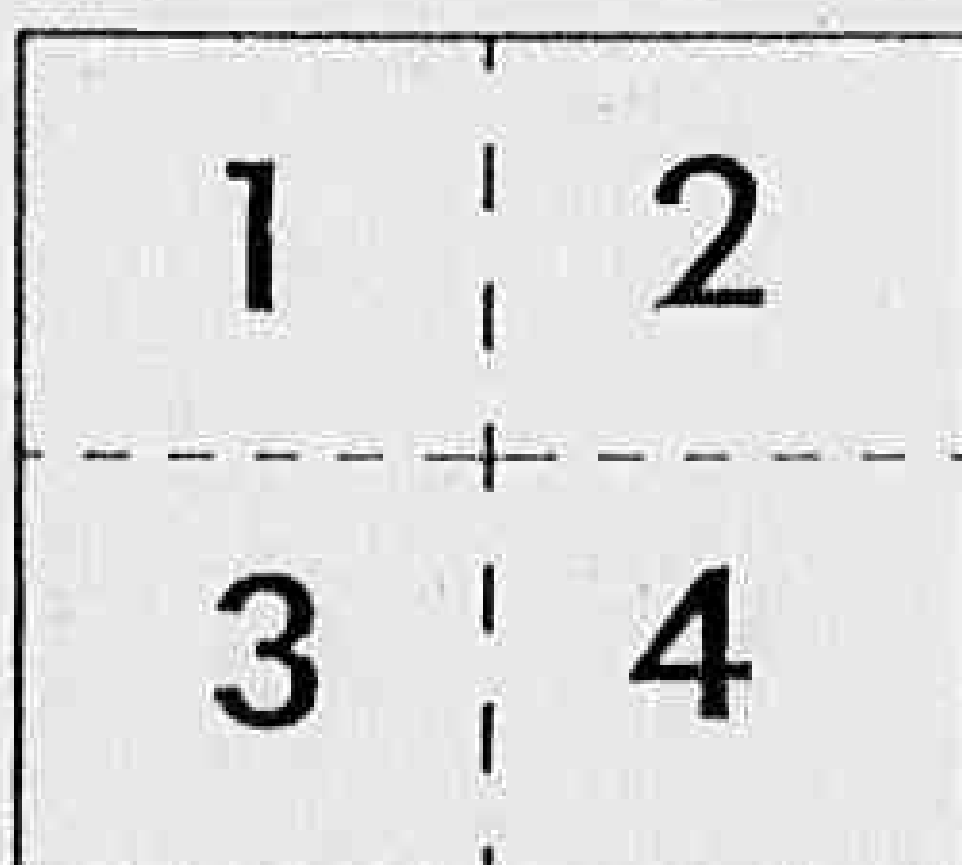
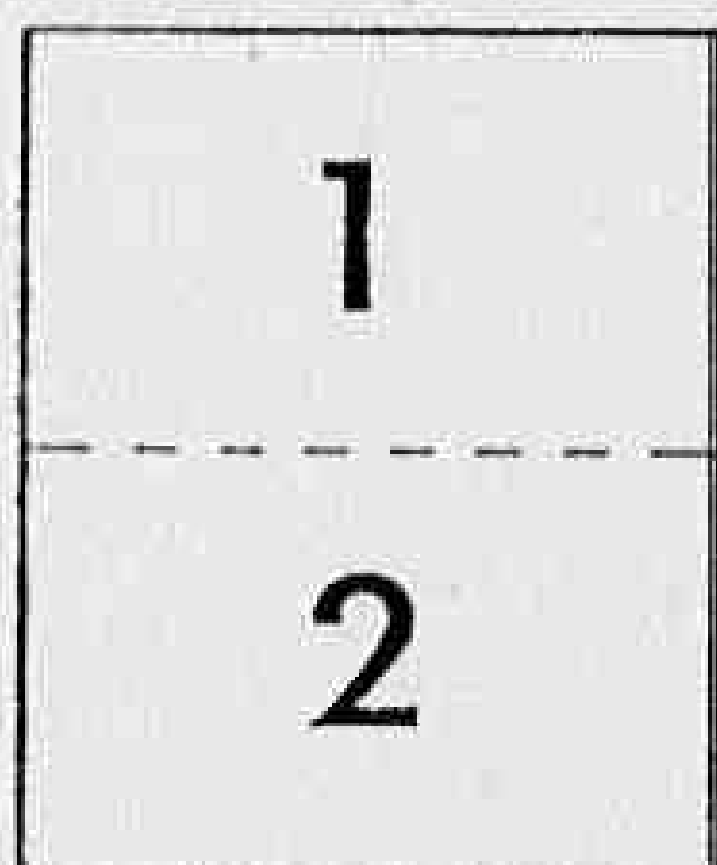

1. I discussed your letter of the 2nd of October with Major Fielden this morning. He is of the opinion that he needs one more PRO at HQ making a total of four instead of three which you suggest.

2. I think that in view of the work which he has to do four officers, in addition to the Director, is the minimum required. Major Fielden is prepared to state his case before the Committee if necessary. I strongly recommend that he be allowed to have four officers.

3. With regard to the information officer I recommend that Major Fielden should have Major Gillett. Major Hinkley is not required by Major Fielden and could be made available for a Region. Major Gillett is at present under order due to go to a forward Region tomorrow but there is no vacancy as a Provincial Commissioner. He would prefer to remain with Major Fielden as Information Officer and I recommend that this be done.

4. Major Fielden is ready to release Captain Owen to a forward Region. This will leave him with ~~three~~ American officers as PROs at HQ. - Major Bergin, Major Leacocks, Lt. Atkinson, and Lt. Braydon (British).

The apparent surplus of 5 officers is in fact a deficiency of 2 as the total of 62 officers shown in item 2 includes 7 medical officers, which is always been understood by this HQ would not count against the ceiling strength of officers. This was agreed verbally by Brigadier Dajohn. Extract of our HQ/1233/44 of 27 August 1944 and copy of HQ/116/44 of 16 September 1944 are attached for your information.

5. The details of the additional 32 NCOs are as follows:

This was agreed verbally by Brigadier M.H. in March of our M/DB/1233/44 of 27 August 1944 and copy of M/DB/1233/44 of 16 September 1944 are attached for your information.

5. The details of the additional 32 M/DBs are as follows:

- (a) 6 DBs are M/DB personnel and are not to be counted against ceiling, as in case of Medical and Hygiene Officers.
- (b) 4 DBs are attached to AD and are liable to be withdrawn at any time.
- (c) 7 DBs (various) are attached to AD and similarly are liable to be withdrawn at any time.
- (d) Balance of 15 DBs held pending reply our M/DB/1233/44 of 16 September 1944 para 2 (111).

6. I have, at any time agreed that the allotment of staff decided by the Joint and Compensation Committee would be sufficient to run the sub-Commission efficiently.

After operating for 2 months I am still convinced that the existing figures are inadequate. I reiterate that until such time as I can withdraw my staff from the South Italy Accommodation Centres I estimate I will need at least a minimum additional 15 officers and 30 GIs if we are to operate efficiently in Northern Italy as and when liberated.

It is also brought to your notice that I have approximately 30 British GIs who are eligible for return to US on leave service grounds and who may be withdrawn at any time. These GIs are holding key positions and must be replaced on their return to US.

7. (a) The functions of the sub-Commission are varied and essential and in view of the high proportion of civilian staff employed in the Accommodation Centres, Allied personnel are absolutely essential to supervise rationing, transport and hygiene.

(b) My transport problem is a serious one and unless I retain qualified supervising Allied military personnel the maintenance of my present allotment of vehicles will suffer.

8. The repatriation problem is developing daily and recently we have been asked to provide coordinating teams of Allied military personnel and Italian military. On the present strength of personnel I cannot continue to do this unless additional personnel are made available.

9. During the past year leave for officers and GIs has not been possible without seriously affecting the organization and in cases of illness in key positions a heavy burden is thrown on the limited staff available.

10. I understand that there is a proposal that I should take over the administration and care of the remnants of the Partisan Division in four camps in the SW Italy area with a capacity of some 20,000. These were previously dealt with by the Military Mission, whose military functions in handling of partisan soldiers has come to an end and their present problem is mainly a refugee one. I cannot hope to do this with my present strength of personnel.

In addition I understand that AFM have requested me to accept responsibility and the staffing of the Taranto Reception Camp. I am prepared to take over this camp provided I am given 2 additional officers.

11. My immediate requirements are:

(a) agreement to hold additional to my establishment, officers who are posted to AFM and 5th Army in excess of the 8 which I agreed should be provided by me to 5th and 6th Army out of my existing strength.

(b) agreement that my total (as establishment) shall be 142. X

supervising Allied military personnel the maintenance of my present allotment of vehicles will suffer.

8. The reputation problem is developing daily and recently we have been asked to provide combatting teams of Allied military personnel and Italian military. At the present strength of personnel I cannot continue to do this unless additional personnel are made available.

9. During the past year leave for officers and the has not been possible without seriously affecting the organization and in cases of illness in key positions a heavy burden is thrown on the limited staff available.

10. I understand that there is a proposal that I should take over the administration and care of the remnants of the Partisan Hospital in four camps in the VERA area with a company of some 20,000. These were previously built with by the military mission, whose military functions in training of partisan soldiers has come to an end and their present problem is merely a refugee one. I cannot hope to do this with my present strength of personnel.

In addition I understand that JFM have requested me to accept responsibility and the staffing of the Partisan Reception Camp. I am prepared to take over this Camp provided I am given 2 additional officers.

11. My immediate requirements are:

- (a) agreement to hold additional to my establishment, officers who are posted to the 5th and 6th Armds in excess of the 8 which I agreed should be provided by me to 5th and 6th Armds out of my ceiling strength. 3/1/48
- (b) agreement that my total 20th establishment shall be 142. X
- (c) agreement that Allied National Officers and the will not count against establishment personnel. ✓ on file: 1/1/48
- (d) Further, I consider it is essential for me to hold 8 additional officers on my establishment to provide for the following:
 - (i) to reinforce Transit Camps to deal with emergency repatriation to and from Italy.
 - (ii) to provide combatting teams to and from Italy as has occurred recently
 - (iii) to provide forward representatives to Military Commissions as and when necessary. I now have 3 officers and 4 PAs as forward representatives. This was not anticipated in the original appreciation.
 - (iv) to allow for leave and illness.

12. My future requirements, if Northern Italy is liberated prior to my heading over South Italy Accommodation Centres to VERA, are at least an additional 15 officers and 30 PAs.

13. I request that the personnel question of this Sub-Commission be reviewed and strong representation be made for the increase in the ceiling strength.

TO : R.C. & M.C. Section,
(attention: Brigadier Bush)

1. With reference to verbal instruction from Colonel Fick to amalgamate I. & D.P.C.C. and I.M.C. branches.

2. I wish to emphasize once more what I stated in Day 1233/44 dated 27 August that:-

- (i) It is not possible to run ~~general~~ ~~conditions~~ on the "field side" with 45 duty Allied Officers excluding medical Allied Officers from this figure. It is possible to run it on 12 Officers, excluding medical Allied Officers.
- (ii) It will not be possible to carry out commitments north of the Dutch line unless more officers and NCO's are forthcoming or U.S.A.A.C. takes over the Southern Sector.
- (iii) It is not possible to run efficiently and supervise the large civilian staff with 50 O/Ns on the field side. Every endeavour will be made to approach this figure.

EXTRACT FROM IEP/XXX/44 OF 17 AUGUST 1944

Mr. Fawcett

(a) It is agreed that it is possible to run the combined HQ. on 12 Allied Officers, 1 C.O. and 12 G.S.'s, excluding medical staff. I consider it is essential to retain an Allied Officer in the Security Bureau. I propose a proposed HQ. layout.

Field side.

(b) It is agreed that it is just possible to run present commitments on the "Field" side, with 45 Allied Officers excluding medical staff. This assumes that A.S.G. 5th and 8th Armies do not demand more than the 8 officers as shown at present with them on I.S.S. report.

It is not agreed that it is possible to reduce the HQ overhead of the present "Field" commitment to 20 G.S.'s.

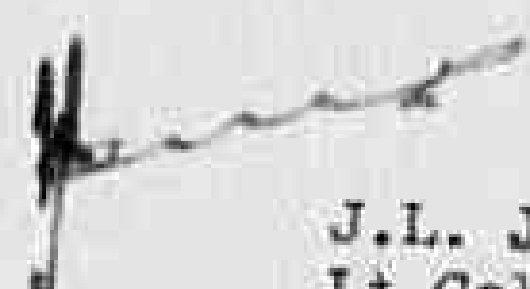

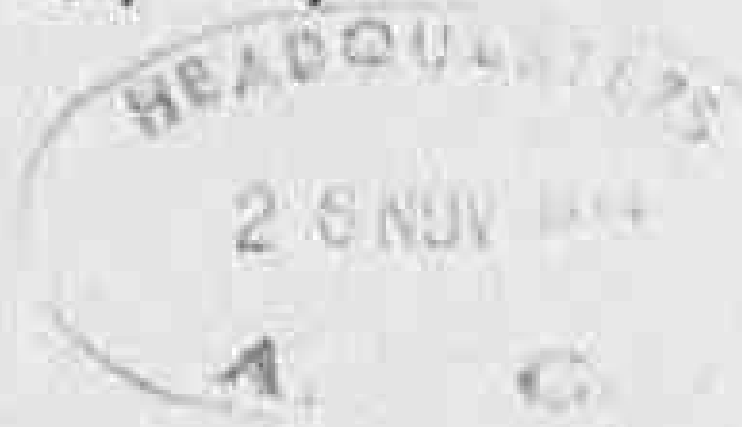

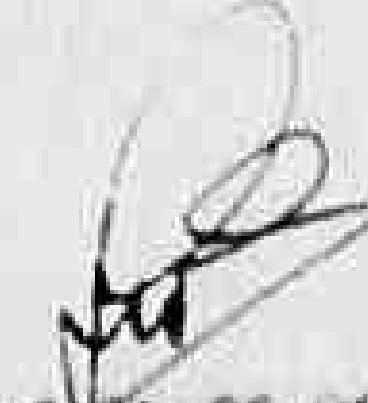

TO : Secretary Personnel Organisation Committee.

1. The personnel of the Office of the Chief of Staff are all Staff Officers in the accepted sense, and as an introduction to an examination of their duties it is proposed to give an overall picture of the staff work entailed and common to each of them, as follows :

- (a) Primarily to coordinate the work of the Headquarters.
This involves not only constant study of correspondence and reports emanating from both inside and outside this Headquarters, but also visits to sections and sub-commissions, as coordinating work cannot be done from the desk alone.
- (b) To carry out such work as is necessary to implement the decisions made by the Acting Chief Commissioner or the Chief of Staff on matters of major policy, or to pass downwards matters emanating from the Acting Chief Commissioner or Chief of Staff as the result of DO letters, visits, or conferences.
This frequently means spending much time on minute scrutiny of a subject, possibly with the assistance of the specialist officer concerned, in order to prepare a draft letter for submission.
- (c) The Office of the Chief of Staff is informed broadly on all matters dealt with in the Headquarters and therefore, apart from visitors to the Acting Chief Commissioner and Chief of Staff, the Staff Officers must find time to receive a variety of visiting officers both from inside and outside the Headquarters who come for information.
- (d) No Staff Officer can properly carry out his work unless he is aware of conditions in the field. Therefore, there must be allowance made for visits to Areas and Regions.
- (e) The work is on a high level and must be first class in every respect, but good work is useless unless it is done in time. If pressure of work in the Office is such that time cannot be spared to prepare, for example, a brief, at a time when it is required, it is so much work wasted.
- (f) At least one Staff Officer must be available to accompany the Chief of Staff to conferences for the purpose of taking minutes, etc.

- 2 -

This particular duty does not end with the conference, as careful preparation of the minutes of the conference has to be carried out afterwards. These conferences may be at this Headquarters, or elsewhere.

2. The organization of the Office consists of :-

- (a) A Chief Staff Officer.
- (b) A S.O.2 who understudies the CSO.
- (c) Five other Staff Officers comprising 1-S.O.2, 4 - S.O.3 (includes 2 J/Mr ATS).

3. It will be seen from Appendix "A" that the work of the Office is divided into four Sections, two in charge of a S.O.2 and two handled by a S.O.3 with the assistance of a Junior Commander.

4. After a month's operation the officer personnel have settled down as a team and the distribution of work decided upon has proved equitable. The organization of the AG resulted initially in very heavy work for the Office of the Chief of Staff and the available staff worked long hours to cope with it. Now a smoother flow has been achieved it is possible to suggest an economy. J/Mr Hopkins-Padulovic is due to proceed to U.K. within a month having served her maximum allowable service overseas and it is not intended to apply for a replacement. With this reduction it is considered the Staff will be the very minimum which can handle the work of the Office commensurate with efficiency.

Dear *Brigadier Lush*

When the Commission first came to Rome I discussed with Commodore Stone the question of having an officer of the Sub-Commission with each A.M.G. Group, to which he agreed. Prior to this I had been promised a Field or Senior officer as my assistant.

I have, since 12 July 1944, the date on which the Sub-Commission as a whole arrived in Rome, been without any increase in staff, with the exception of Captain Derby (A) who was posted over assigned to me to assist in the Italian Prisoners of War Division of the Sub-Commission.

I have reported to the Acting Chief Commissioner, and stated in my Monthly Reports that if the work has to be carried out satisfactorily and the Sub-Commission has to function properly, that an increase in staff was absolutely essential.

Knowing that reorganisation was taking place, I continued to carry on as far as possible until the manpower committee has published its report.

It became obvious that the work of the Sub-Commission was not being carried out properly, or at any rate to my satisfaction, the entire fault being lack of staff, and I therefore discussed with Acting Chief Commissioner my position, which resulted in my memo WMD/18/34 dated 22 September 1944 stating what I thought was necessary in the way of staff and pointing out certain facts. I understand that the Acting Chief Commissioner agreed in principle.

I would also state that my own personal clerk whom I brought from North Africa a year ago was, on instructions, returned under protest to Allied Force Headquarters. I explained to G-1 (B) over one month ago that if he went, I must have a replacement - still no replacement has been received. *3470*

I have received no increase in staff nor have I heard one official word in reply to my memo of 22 September 1944.

I feel that under the circumstances, it is hardly to be expected that I should be held responsible for the efficient running of a Sub-Commission with two divisions which are growing daily - without one hour to give to planning or making reports. I do ask that it be noted that while I shall continue to do all that is possible, it is very difficult for me to accept responsibility for delay - noncompliance with instructions to time, getting out reports - planning, or for carrying out the work as I feel it should be done, until the increase in staff asked for reports for duty and extra permanent accommodations be allotted.

SUBJECT: Reorganization of Labor Sub-Commission
TO : Economic Section

1. Reference General Orders No. 43 HQ, AGO 1 October 1944, and specifically para 25 of Appendix B regarding the reorganization of the Labor Sub-Commission. Reference also to letter from Economic Section 2 October 1944 signed by Col. Seamore, on the same subject.

Exception is taken to the determination made by the reviewing Committee at which Col. Bain and the writer were present, that the Labor Sub-Commission can operate with 2 officers and 5 Allied civilians. So such picture was presented by ourselves and it is well known that many of the members of the Reviewing Board have known full well for many months the importance and the scope of our activities and the absolute impossibility of performing even the most urgent tasks with the present complement of personnel, either military or civilian.

2. It has been generally agreed for a considerable period that of all the Sub-Commissions, the Labor Sub-Commission was at an irreducible minimum with respect to personnel, due wholly to the fact that urgent calls for help for the past 18 months have been largely ignored. It therefore would be exceedingly disastrous at this particularly critical stage in the labor field, when we are on the eve of tackling extremely important problems which will present themselves as Northern areas are attacked to eliminate any one of the present personnel from our plans of operation.

3. Proposed assignments and redistribution of the entire present personnel, both at Headquarters and in the Field, as listed hereunder, illustrate not only the pitiful shortage of bodies to handle this vast prepossession of all subjects in the Economic Field - Labor - but also the manner in which even with such a tiny group it is hoped that the work can be carried on in a measure. The assignments noted below in the Field are of course only projected and may be changed at a moment's notice.

Subject: Increase in Staff (as per our discussion 19 September).

A clear and concise Directive has yet to be issued with regards to War Materials Disposal.

From the experience of the past 2 months it has shown that both internally throughout the Commission and externally from the Italian civilian side the question of what is war material and how it should be disposed of and handled is one of considerable interest and magnitude. It has been found necessary in certain cases to arbitrate regarding the right to material claimed by civilians as their property, by Regions as Material necessary for operational reasons, and by the Ministry of War as Italian Armed Forces property.

The main question or one of the more important at the present stage concerns abandoned vehicles, which Allied Armies in Italy have agreed may be turned over to Allied Control Commission to recondition, and use for supply purposes. Once the vehicles are back on the road the question is really one for the Transportation Sub-Commission but during the interim period, the arrangements for the recovery of these derelict vehicles falls under the heading of War Materials Disposal and the action necessary has nearly in every instance to originate through this Sub-Commission.

As we go forward into Bologna, Modena, Parma, Pistoia and Alessandria we go into towns all of which have workshops, depots etc. of the Ministry of War and it is in these towns if quick action is taken, that we should be able to find military equipment of considerable value which will help towards the equipping of the Italian Army.

I have discussed a number of questions with the Economic Section regarding War Material and in my opinion a great improvement can be made with regard to the recovery and disposal of such material provided I am permitted to reorganize the War Material Disposal Division of the Sub-Commission, and am given the necessary staff to carry out the work.

Apart from the growth of the War Material Disposal Division, the work in connection with Italian Prisoners of War has increased out of all proportion to the staff. One is at present handling an average of 30 to 50 letters per day in addition to which the number of personal enquiries is considerable. I know that you appreciate the position, but on the other hand, it is impossible for you to be aware of the great increase in detail work which follows in the wake of repatriation of sick and wounded, questions regarding welfare, requests from private individuals for repatriation of Prisoners of War on compassionate grounds; and other matters with regard to Italian Prisoners of War in Italy, India, America and the United Kingdom, all of which require some sort of action. Questions on Policy pile up and examples of some of the problems on Italian Prisoners of War were set out in my Monthly Report for August.

The High Commissioner for Prisoners of War has again returned to the charge regarding what will happen to Italians taken prisoner while fighting with Germans in Italy, and what the position will be regarding Italian prisoners in Germany (and other countries) as and when they are freed; as these prisoners will immediately try to reach their homes in Italy.

The foregoing are my reasons for requesting an increase in the number of officers as laid down for the War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission in the Executive Commissioner's letter of 31 March, 1944.

To: Executive Commissioner.

I am concerned about the future operations and T/O of this Branch. Here are the facts:-

1. We were originally given a T/O of "one Director, two Deputy Directors, and an establishment of Public Relations Officers, Conducting Officers, and EM/OR of which a table of personnel will shortly be published". Actually no table was ever published, but General MacFarlane agreed to 7 officers and 2 EM/OR in the then circumstances and on the understanding that additional personnel would be given as conditions required.
2. As you know our responsibilities have enormously increased since that time. They can be divided under four heads, viz:- (a) relations with the Italian Government, including apuration and future structure of press, films and radio (b) routine work including Allied, neutral and Italian correspondents, daily digest and trend, and weekly bulletin (c) forward operations and (d) political correspondents.
3. We have now six officers here. Major Bergin and Lieut Braydon have their hands absolutely full with the digest and trend of copy - each of which takes about six hours - and also handle neutral correspondents, press clippings and photographs and various routine matters. They cannot do more. Lieut Atkinson handles the Italian press, permits, apuration, transport and enquiries, and has all his time filled. Major Losacco handles all ACC news releases and the collection of news from sub-commissions and needs more help badly. Capt Howard-Owen is handling the wants of political correspondents, transport, office accommodation and the business of getting the stamps extra re-established. I don't think he can do more. I myself try to handle the almost insoluble problems of radio, cinema, Allied Publications Board, as well as seeing a stream of correspondents, and I have uncomfortably too much to do - because I would like to be free to get around more and get more information.
4. In these circumstances I have tried for some time past to get additional experienced staff: inexperienced staff, for our purposes, is nearly useless. Three years ago I found two officers, Capt Gregson and Capt Ellison, who were ideal both in experience and in personality: both want very much to come to this Branch, in neither case is there any serious bar, but we do not get them. I know that G-1 is busy and has its difficulties, but I think we need initiative and

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4. I feel sore about it and I should be grateful if you would stir up G-1. I attach letters from Capt Ellison which show his position.

5. Colonel Farren has sent me two Colonels - Oliver (B) and Booth (A) - who want to come into this Branch. They are I think quite useful, though not flyers. But I am a little apprehensive about being out-ranked by my own staff.

6. Several PWS civilian workers are applying to me for jobs. Some are useful.

7. As far as I can see the future we need here at HQ:- **SEE 21**

- ✓ x1 officer for liaison with Italian Government
- ✓ x1 officer for daily press digest
- ✓ x1 officer for daily trend of copy
- ✓ x1 officer for Allied and particularly political correspondents
- ✓ x1 officer for Italian press liaison
- ✓ x1 officer for our own press releases and the collection of information

and

and a Director () should be free enough for routine to have some time to organize and travel.

That is to say, 7 officers - each of whom has fixed duties to perform and plenty of them. On the top of this, we need more staff for translation work, to replace officers when sick or absent, to write up the AGO history for the Archives, and so on. We also need, very urgently, 2 more officers in the field, one for 5th and one for 8th Army; and I think that these two, with Major Bullock in charge of them, should form a more or less autonomous unit linked with our AAI echelon. In this way we shall be able to keep our records and information services going when we get to the North.

8. I am asking therefore for a minimum of 10 officers for Public Relations Work only and I do not think, in view of the activity and territory we have to cover, that this is unreasonable. Some posts at HQ might perhaps be filled by civilians.

9. I am leaving the question of EM/OR until the reorganization scheme is through.

10. Lieut Braydon has asked to be considered for Austria as he speaks German and is interested in that field. He has done good work here and I feel bound to forward his request (without knowing whether such a request can be considered) though it will be extremely difficult to find anyone to do the trend of copy as well as he does.

Brigadier Lush's letter asking salvage for my release arrived a few days ago. The situation at present is that the Sub-Area Commander has passed the letter to H.Q. No. 2 District with his comments which are that as far as he is concerned he is willing to release me and that he requires no replacement.

I know that my people at District have rather disgruntledly passed the letter to AAI and as in that particular formation I am very definitely non persona grata. I fear that my sources of information have become somewhat limited. It will probably progress from AAI to AFHQ where a decision will be taken. As the matter is being passed through staff channels and as Salvage is only being asked to express an opinion at each stopping place I think the situation is optimistic. I also think that the Sub-Area Commander has helped considerably by saying that he does not require a replacement for me as this will prevent Salvage pleading that they have not enough officer personnel to replace me.

I am very grateful to you for this further attempt and I have great hopes that it will bear fruit. I did not realise that my "piece" would produce results of this type and I am very glad that I sent it. If I can get any further information on the progress of the application I shall let you know. Personally I think we have a very good case and Salvage will have to put up an exceptionally strong story -- which I do not think they possess -- if they try to hold me.

The age of operational files of the Office of the Chief Commissioner will be maintained by the Office of the Chief of Staff. The Archives Division of the Secretary General's Office is hereby transferred to the Public Relations Branch, HQ AGC.

IX -- TRANSFER OF INFORMATION BRANCH TO PUBLIC RELATIONS BRANCH

The Information Branch, HQ AGC, is hereby transferred to the Public Relations Branch, to be known as the Information Division of the Public Relations Branch.

X -- ABOLITION OF A.C. M.M.S. SECTION

The Regional Control and Military Government Section, HQ AGC, is hereby abolished and the functions and responsibilities formerly assigned thereto are hereby transferred to and made the responsibilities of other sections and offices as hereinafter indicated.

VII -- DESTINATION OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER

Announcement in order of the designation of Colonel NELSON W. HANFORD, O-501537, AGS, as Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer.

VIII -- ABOLITION OF OFFICE OF SECRETARY GENERAL, HQ AGC

The Office of the Secretary General is hereby abolished and the functions and responsibilities formerly assigned thereto are hereby transferred to and made the responsibilities of the Chief of Staff, with the exception of maintaining the files of the Deputy Chief of Staff and the Assistant Division. The files of the Deputy Chief of Staff are now known as the "A" files will be maintained by personnel assigned to the office of the Deputy Chief of Staff. The operational files of the office of the Chief of Staff will be maintained by the office of the Chief of Staff. XI -- TRANSFER OF THE SECURITY BRANCH TO THE CIVIL AFFAIRS SECTION

The Security Branch of the present A.C. & M.G. Section is hereby transferred to the Civil Affairs Section where it will become a division of the Public Safety Sub-Commission, and will be known as the Security Division of the Public Safety Sub-Commission.

XII -- ABOLITION OF CIVIL AFFAIRS BRANCH, A.C. & M.G. SECTION

The Civil Affairs Branch, A.C. & M.G. Section is hereby abolished and the functions and responsibilities formerly assigned thereto are hereby transferred to the offices of the Chief of Staff, Economic and Civil Affairs Sections, in accordance with the reorganization herein set forth. The Liaison Branch is hereby transferred to and is made a part of the office of the Chief of Staff. The Pool of Interpreters is hereby abolished.

The Medical Supply Branch of the Public Health Sub-Commission is hereby transferred to the Economic Section where it will become a part of the Housing Branch of the Food Sub-Commission.

XVI - DESIGNATION AND REORGANIZATION OF THE CIVIL AFFAIRS SECTION

The present Administrative Section is hereby designated as the Civil Affairs Section. This section will continue to be responsible for those functions now operated by the present Administrative Section less Property Control Sub-Commission, and in addition will assume the functions and responsibilities of the Patriots Branch, Italian Refugee and the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, presently under the A.C. & M.C. Section. The Patriots Branch, Italian Refugee Branch and the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission are hereby transferred to the Civil Affairs Section.

XVII - AMALGAMATION OF ITALIAN REFUGEE BRANCH AND THE DISPLACED PERSONS SUB-COMMISSION

XVIII - DESIGNATION OF DIRECTOR OF DISPLACED PERSONS AND REPATRIATION SUB-COMMISSION

Announcement is made of the designation of Colonel C. B. FIDELAY, as Director, Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

The Judicial Supply Branch of the Public Health Sub-Commission is hereby transferred to the Economic Section where it will become a part of the Manufacturing Branch of the Food Sub-Commission.

XVI -- DESIGNATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CIVIL AFFAIRS SECTION

The present Administrative Section is hereby designated as the Civil Affairs Section. This section will continue to be responsible for those functions now operated by the present Administrative Section less Property Control Sub-Commission, and in addition will assume the functions and responsibilities of the Patriotic Branch, Italian Refugee and the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, presently under the I.C. & M.C. Section. The Patriotic Branch, Italian Refugee Branch and the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission is hereby transferred to the Civil Affairs Section.

Announcement is made of the designation of Colonel C. R. FIDELITY, as Director, Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

XIX -- DESIGNATION OF CHIEF LEGAL ADVISOR

The Director of the Legal Sub-Commission is hereby designated as Chief Legal Advisor to the Chief Commissioner, in addition to the functions and responsibilities of the Legal Sub-Commission.

XX -- DESIGNATION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUB-COMMISSION

The present Interior Sub-Commission is hereby designated as the Local Government Sub-Commission and will retain its present functions and responsibilities and remain a part of the Civil Affairs Section.

XII -- ESTABLISHMENT AND DESIGNATION OF PERSONNEL AND ORGANIZATION COMMITTEE

Announcement is made of the establishment of a Standing Committee to consider problems on personnel and organization and to make recommendations with

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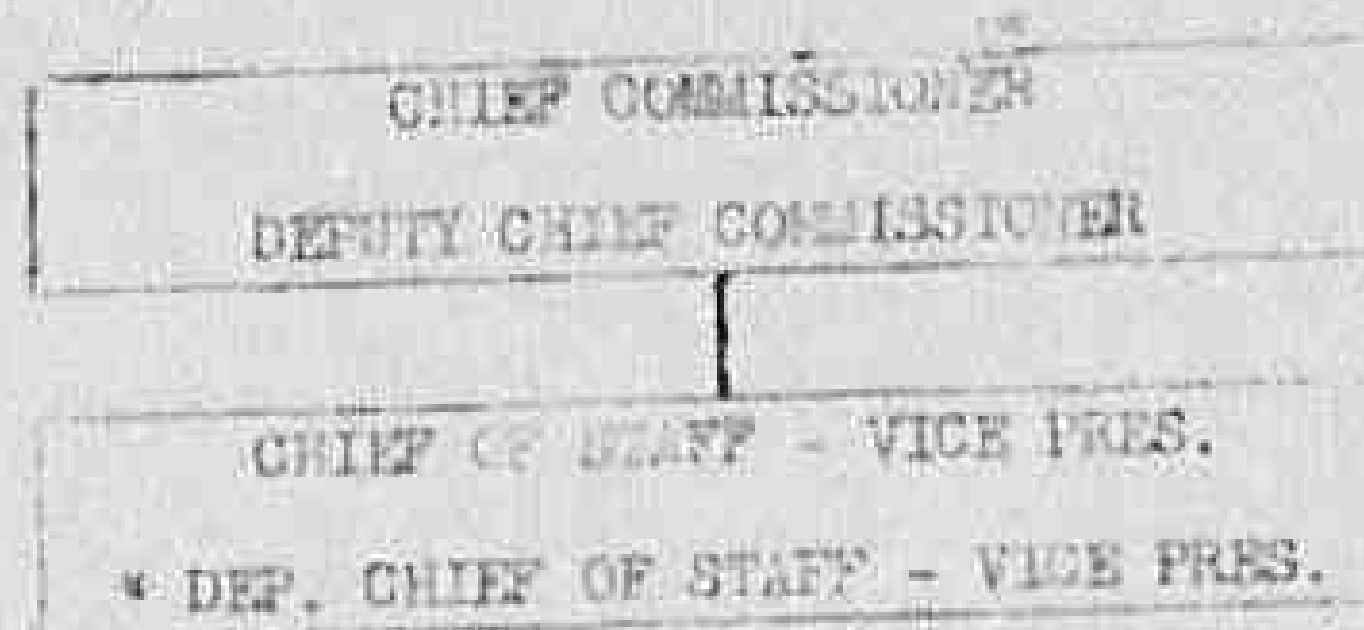

The Committee examined the reports of all Sections, Sub-Commissions
and Branches of the Allied Control Commission, except those of the Service

The Committee now submits its report.

In the opinion of the Committee the present organization of the Headquarters of the Commission, although suitable for the initial stages of the amalgamation of AMG 15 Army Group and the Allied Control Commission, has, by the experience of the last seven months, entailed certain redundancy of work and personnel which, now that the Headquarters are concentrated in one place and in view of the present situation, could and should be avoided. 5493
2. In the opinion of the Committee the existence of four parallel Sections and several independent Sub-Commissions, all having direct channels to the Chief Commissioner, has placed on him too heavy a burden of administrative detail. Furthermore, there appears to have been confusion of thought and practice with regard to the channel of command.
3. In order to overcome these difficulties the Committee recommends the institution of an Office of the Chief of Staff in the line of command from the Offices of the Chief Commissioner (and his Deputy) and the Sections and

and Service Sub-Commissions.

4. The Committee recommends the abolition of the Section now called Regional Control and Military Government Section and the setting up, under the Chief of Staff, of four Sections, the heads of which will be equivalent to Deputy Chiefs of Staff, viz:-

Civil Affairs Section
Economic Section
Political Section
Establishment Section

5. The Committee recommends that the Civil Affairs Section shall deal with those functions now operated by the Administrative Section together with the Patriotic Branch, Italian Refugee Branch, and the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, now dealt with by the present R.C. & M.G. Section: that the Economic Section be responsible for its present Sub-Commissions and in addition the Communications Sub-Commission and the Property Control Sub-Commission: the Political Section to remain with its present functions: the Establishment Section to deal with the matters now dealt with by the same Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section, with the exception of domestic transport and the Message Centres: the Regions for command purposes and the Army AMG's for functional purposes to depend from the Chief of Staff.

6. In view of the present military situation and the distance of All HQ, and Army AMG's, and in the future the Northern Regions, from Rome, the Committee recommends the establishment at All HQ of a Deputy Chief of Staff (Forward). This officer, with a small staff representative of the Sections, will administer to the immediate needs of the Army AMG's and Forward Regions.

7. Channels to the Chief Commissioner from the Sections will be through

with those functions now operated by the Administrative Section together with the Patriots Branch, Italian Refugee Branch, and the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, now dealt with by the present R.G. & M.G. Section: that the Economic Section be responsible for its present Sub-Commissions and in addition the Communications Sub-Commission and the Property Control Sub-Commission: the Political Section to remain with its present functions: the Establishment Section to deal with the matters now dealt with by the same Branch of the R.G. & M.G. Section, with the exception of domestic transport and the Message Centres: the Regions for command purposes and the Army AGS's for functional purposes to depend from the Chief of Staff.

6. In view of the present military situation and the distance of All HQ, and Army AGS's, and in the future the Northern Regions, from Rome, the Committee recommends the establishment at All HQ of a Deputy Chief of Staff (Forward). This officer, with a small staff representative of the Sections, will administer to the immediate needs of the Army AGS's and Forward Regions.

7. Channels to the Chief Commissioner from the Sections will be through the Chief of Staff: from the Regions and Army AGS's through the relevant Deputy Chief of Staff to the Chief of Staff. Communications from the Service Sub-Commissions (Navy, Army and Air Force), will be through the Chief of Staff to the Chief Commissioner.

8. The Committee recommends that a change in nomenclature is desirable in the title of the Administrative Section in order to describe the proper functions of that Section, and to remove confusion of thought, especially among other military organizations, which has arisen from its present title. The Committee considers that the title "Civil Affairs Section" best describes its functions. The Committee also recommends a change in title of the Interior

Sub-Commission to the Government Sub-Commission.

5. In order to avoid confusion which might arise from other changes of title, the Committee recommends that the following titles be adopted:-

Chief Commissioner.
Deputy Chief Commissioner.
Chief of Staff and Vice President.
Deputy Chief of Staff and Vice President, Civil Affairs Section.
Deputy Chief of Staff and Vice President, Economic Section.
Joint Vice Presidents, Political Section.
Deputy Chief of Staff and Director, Establishment Section.

The Committee recommends that the Director of the Legal Sub-Commission shall also carry the title of Chief Legal Adviser to the Chief Commissioner.

10. Subject to approval of the above basic change in organisation, the Committee recommends the changes, amalgamations and reductions in the Headquarters Staff of the Allied Control Commission shown in Appendix "B" attached.

11. The plan of the re-organisation recommended is defined graphically on the attached chart (Appendix "A").

12. The most important changes are:-

- (a) the absorption by the Chief of Staff of the Secretary General's Office;
- (b) the absorption by the Public Relations Branch of the Information Division and Archivist;
- (c) the amalgamation of the Public Safety Sub-Commission and the Security Branch to be called Public Safety Sub-Commission;
- (d) the transfer from the Public Health Sub-Commission of the Medical Supply Branch to the Warehousing Branch of the Food Sub-Commission;
- (e) the absorption by the Finance Sub-Commission of the Property Control

10. Subject to approval of the above basic change in organization, the Committee recommends the changes, realignments and reductions in the Headquarters Staff of the Allied Control Commission shown in Appendix "B" attached.

11. The plan of the re-organization recommended is defined graphically on the attached chart (Appendix "A").

12. The most important changes are:-

- (a) the absorption by the Chief of Staff of the Secretary General's Office;
- (b) the absorption by the Public Relations Branch of the Information Division and Archives;
- (c) the realignment of the Public Safety Sub-Commission and the Security Branch to be called Public Safety Sub-Commission;

13. In considering the amalgamation of the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and the Italian Refugee Branch, the Committee has recommended reductions in the field as well as in HQ.

14. The Committee, at your request, reconsidered its original recommendation made in its interim report that the Communications Sub-Commission should come under the Economic Section. The Committee fully appreciated the unique position of this Sub-Commission and its responsibility for civil censorship. Nevertheless, the Committee maintains its recommendation that this Sub-Commission should be absorbed into the Economic Section. If you do not agree to this proposal, the Committee recommends that it be placed in the same position as the Service Sub-Commissions. See para 15.

15. The Committee fully appreciates the special position of the Service Sub-Commissions, who are under the operational command of their respective service commanders, but considers that channels of communication to the Chief Commissioner on Allied Control Commission matters should be through the Chief of Staff.

The Committee therefore strongly recommends that the Director of the Establishment Section should be the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, provided that the Director is an American officer. If this can be done the amalgamation of G-1(a) and G-4(a) of HQ, 2675th Regiment will be possible. This will make a balanced, economical and practical organization for the Section. The Committee realizes that the approval for this change will have to be obtained from NATOUSA and recommends that representations should be made as soon as possible.

17. The Committee has taken into account the Allied civil officials now serving with the Allied Control Commission: it recommends that the introduction of any further Allied civilian staff should be in substitution of officers now holding the posts who will then be available for services in the field.

18. Certain re-organization in the Economic Section is still under consideration by the Vice President (vide 12(f) above) and will affect the final figures in Appendix "B". The Committee has thought it wise not to wait for the conclusion of these considerations.

19. The Committee recommends that a standing Committee be maintained for the periodic review of the organization and internal administration of the Allied Control Commission.

20. The Committee wishes to record its appreciation of the invaluable work performed by the Secretary, Ident. Colonel J.L. Jones.

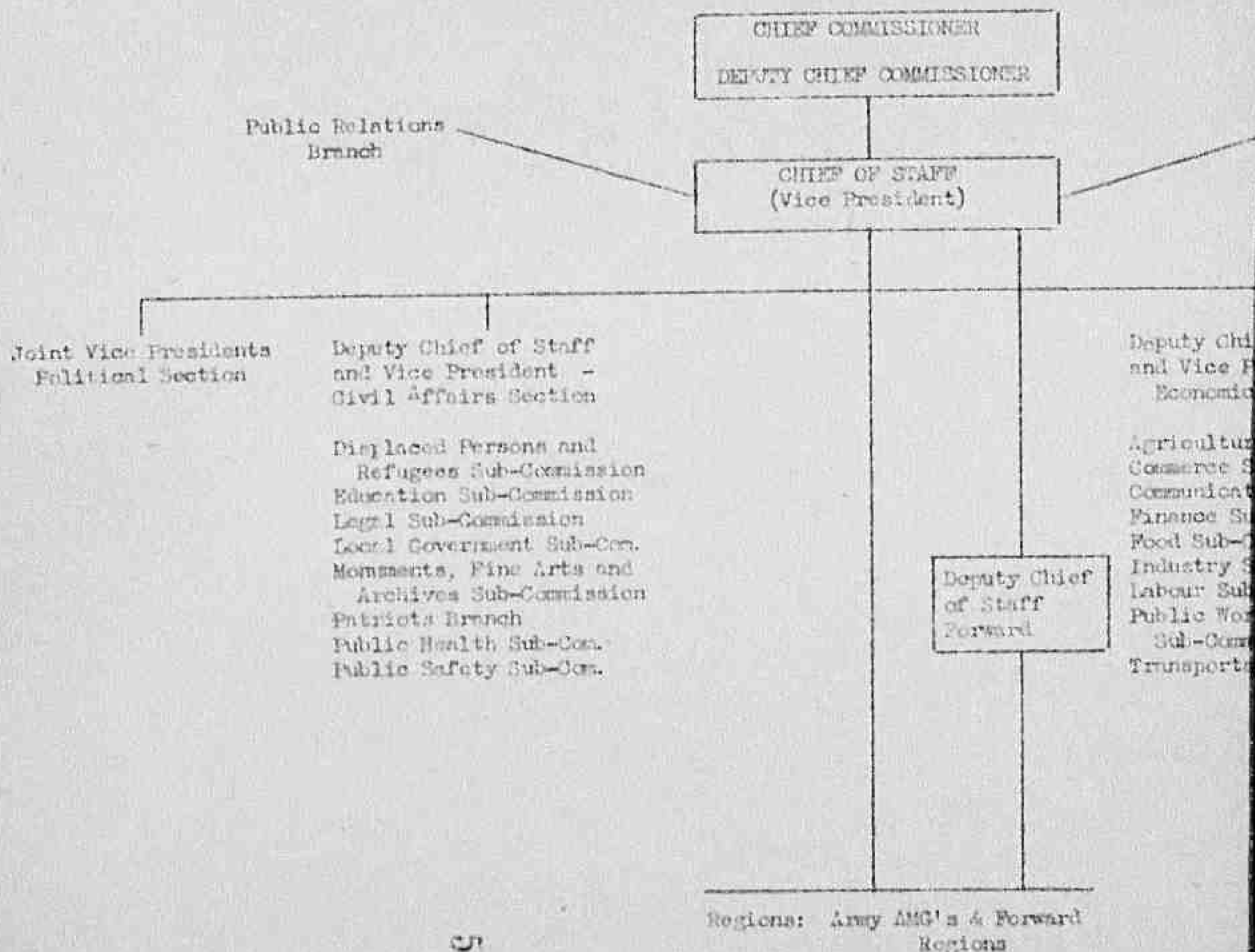
