SUBJECT: Establishment of Transportation Officers

TO : Economic Section

1. In accordance with G-1 B/31/3/A of 7 March 45 the ceiling for transportation officers in AC was fixed at 130; this included 121 on TO/WE and 9 Austria officers. Details of the allocations to Transportation Sub-Commission and regions are given at the end of this memorandum. These allocations were not fixed in consultation with this Sub-Commission and were, in fact, directly contrary to what had been recommended. The Regional Commissioners had also requested higher ceilings for transportation officers and since the G-1 British letter was issued have complained verbally and in writing about the number allotted to them.

2. Investigations have shown that even at the present stage when the existing regions are aided by the attachment of officers assigned to northern regions, we are not making full use of the transportation facilities allotted to us. Appendix A gives a copy of a strong letter from AFHQ showing how far we fail to utilize the rail capacities that are allotted to us each week by AFHQ. We have recently set up a new system for recording tonnages passing by rail as compared with that programmed; it is hoped that the first week's figures will be available shortly for the whole of Liberated Italy, but it is probable that they will confirm rather than confute the AFHQ complaint. In addition to this specific complaint, we have received a number of others, both written and verbal; for example a signal was received from AFHQ dated 15 March about the movement of Italian personnel from Elba where we had failed to utilize the facilities granted. In a letter of 17 March AFHQ submit a strong complaint from the Port Commandant at Brindisi of trouble due to lack of AC supervision. Verbal complaints have been received about the waste of shipping space set up for the movement of charcoal and

121 ON TO/WE and 9 Austria officers. Details of the allocations to Transportation Sub-Commission and regions are given at the end of this memorandum. These allocations were not fixed in consultation with this Sub-Commission and were, in fact, directly contrary to what had been recommended; The Regional Commissioners had also requested higher ceilings for transportation officers and since the G-1 British letter was issued have complained verbally and in writing about the number allotted to them.

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3. The Acting Vice President of Economic Section has recently stressed the grave economic situation in Italy and it is realized that transport is in some ways the key to the situation. Ocean-going transport is limited, and we must therefore make the best use of the shipping space allocated to us and we must see that there is no hitch at the ports.

Similarly, for international transport it is absolutely essential that full use should be made of existing road and rail facilities.

4. Consideration of the above factors forces us to the conclusion that most of our failures are due to inadequate supervision in the field. Although we are doing all in our power to allocate the maximum responsibility to the Italian authorities it would appear that these authorities are not competent to see that the best use is made of the capacity given to them unless they have considerable Allied Commission assistance and supervision. We cannot ignore their failures since in the field of transport they have a direct and immediate bearing on the war effort. It is felt that to provide proper supervision of transportation work in the field we should have further officers as shown in the table below. The basis for the calculations has been:

a. A Regional Headquarters' Transportation Section of at least 3 officers, consisting of a Chief Transportation Officer, a Deputy, and a Motor Maintenance Officer; in addition a Rail or Shipping Officer, in accordance with the geographical location of the Region, and the type of transportation work on which the emphasis lies; or will lie in future Regions.

b. One Transportation Officer per Province.

c. One Additional Transportation Officer per town of over 500,000 inhabitants.

d. Additional allocations where AC transportation responsibilities will be particularly heavy, e.g., Genoa.

1. It has become apparent that the whole of the traffic accepted at the POW Conference is not materialising for conveyance. A constant check of British Military despatches shows that these tonnages are being taken up, but detailed figures are not available for other traffics.

Officer Personnel for AC.

PRO stated he had been authorized an additional three officers by CC. Eoon Sec stated CC had given Brig. General ROBINSON permission to get in additional officers at the same time he was urging that personnel be reduced.

Communications S/C asked why they could not get an officer although they were under strength. Dep Ex C explained that AC as a whole was under strength and mentioned the low numbers allowed to the Commission compared with the allocations for AUSTRIA and GERMANY. He said the whole matter was unsatisfactory and would discuss with CC with a view to obtaining a ruling that all questions affecting personnel must be settled by the Manpower Committee.

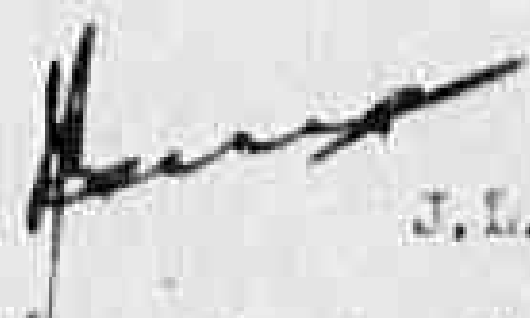

1. In consequence of several irregularities in the issue of Control of Civilian Movement Passes, the Executive Commissioner has decided that Public Safety Sub-Commission will be responsible for the issue of all passes emanating from this HQ for persons wishing to travel North of the Army Control Line. This will cause much extra work by Public Safety Sub-Commission.
2. In addition, the work of the Licensing & Registration Division of P.S. Sub-Commission is continually increasing, both in connection with Military Travel Authorizations, and in view of the withdrawal of AC officers from Italian Government territory.
3. The officer now dealing with such matters is already overworked and it is desirable that he should have assistance now. When the new procedure of issuing passes is introduced, which will be as soon as possible, extra assistance will be essential.
4. There is no officer available in P.S. Sub-Commission to assist in this work, and it is therefore requested that the calling for Public Safety Officers at this HQ be increased by one, such officer to be appointed to assist in the Licensing & Registration Division.

2. The minimum personnel with which such control can be effected has been agreed to by AMHQ as 2 Officers as supervisory staff and 3 EM/CRs per city in which a station or group of stations is allowed to operate.

3. AMHQ has now authorized return to Italian operation of a limited number of Radio stations in Rome and is arranging for the assignment to A.C. of personnel necessary for security control.

4. As exercise of such control is a technical communication problem it clearly falls within the scope of this Sub Commission personnel assigned to A.C. for such purpose should therefore be assigned to this Sub Commission. However when authorized strength of this Sub Commission was established, exercise of control of Radio stations was not envisaged. It will therefore be necessary to authorize an increase in strength.

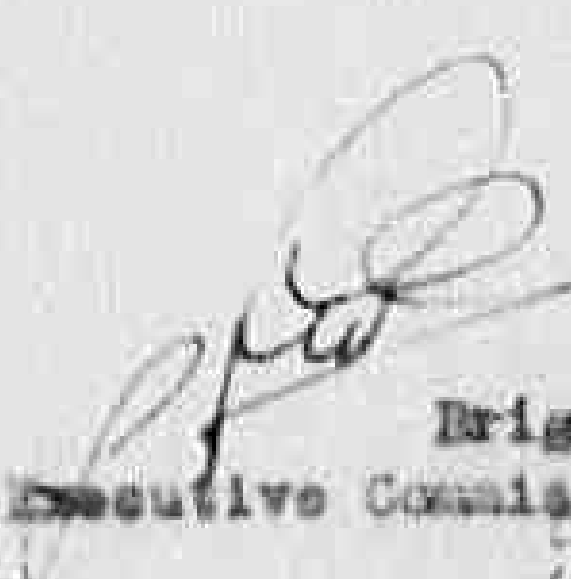

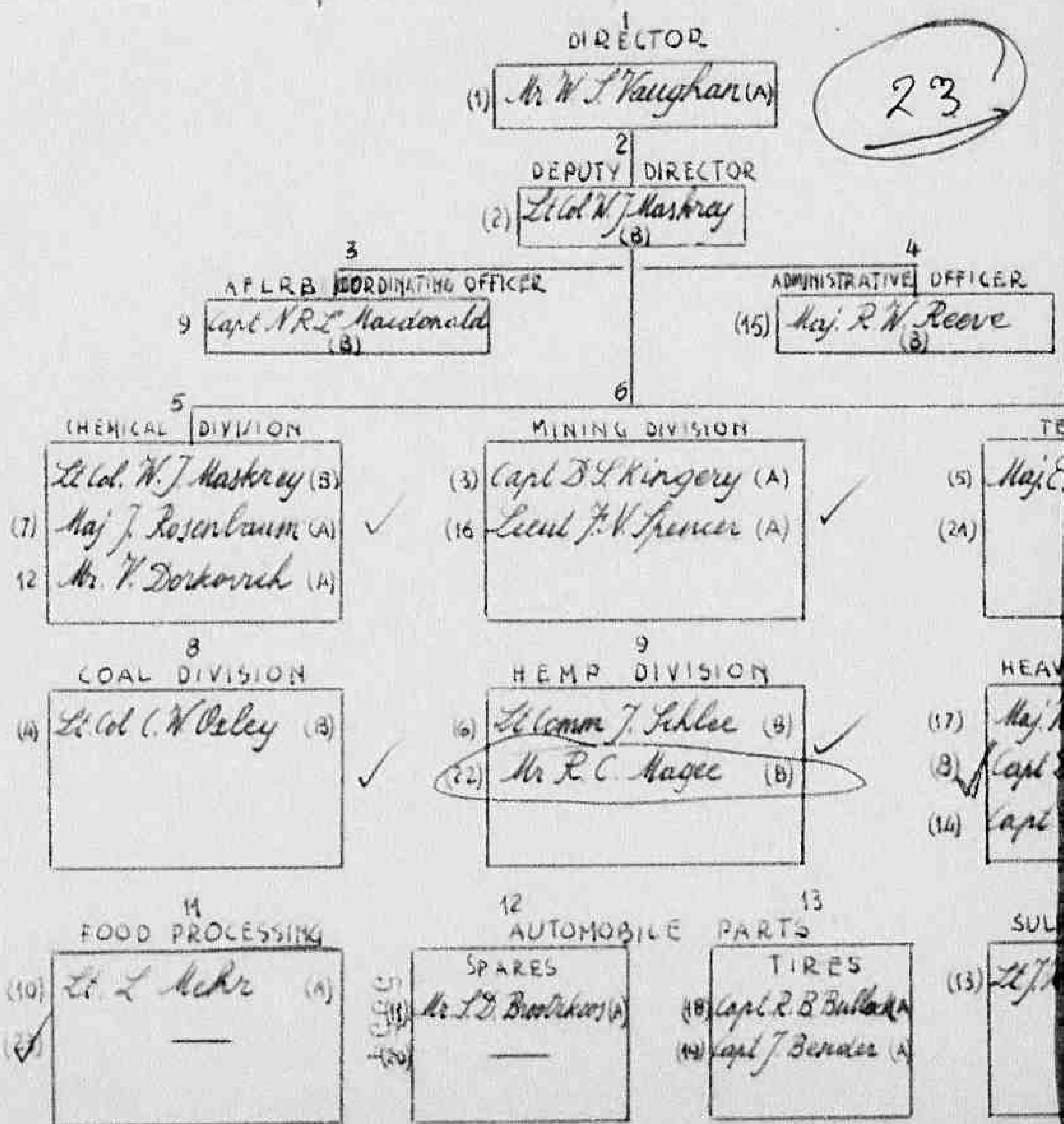

SUBJECT: Officer Personnel Requirements 10

TO : Man Power Commission through Economic Section

1. Arising out of meetings on the 5th and 6th of February, 1945, it is desired to state the situation of this Sub-Commission with regard to specialist officer personnel and in this connection it should be stressed that specialist industrial personnel are essential to the functioning of Industry Sub-Commission and that officers with specialist training only are suitable for the duties which they have to perform and the weighty decisions which they must take, once Northwest Italy is free.

2. It is realized that it will be extremely difficult to obtain from any existing officer-pool the number of specialist officers required. Attached as Appendix A is a list of officers at present engaged at H.Q., A.C. A number of these officers have been previously earmarked for work at regional level in Northwest Italy as industry officers, but since arrival at H.Q., and pending the activation of their regions, have taken on over-all industrial rehabilitation plans which would inevitably fail if they were withdrawn. It is therefore desired that of these officers, certain should be retained and that further officer personnel should be provided to fill vacancies in the regions. Even if it is agreed that these officers presently working in H.Q. may be retained, it should be pointed out that in no case has an officer an assistant who can deputize for him in the case of illness or in the case of other unavoidable absence from his duties. The proposed establishment for H.Q. is therefore a minimum. May urgent action be taken to increase the strength of this Sub-Commission so that provision for H.Q. operation and for the extremely low allotment of regional officers may be maintained? In this connection it should be pointed out that Industry Sub-Commission has taken over in the last two months from other Sub-Commissions responsibility for additional manufacturing activities as under:

Where blanks exist the nature of the duty to be filled is stated. It should be pointed out that of the officers shown on this Sub-Commission's present staff, Lt. Corwin is on leave in U.S. and Major Thornitt-Smith is on leave in U.K. Major Stockman, at present assigned to Southern Region, is due to go on leave at an early date.

1. at this date Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission hold 55 officers on their books with one officer (Lt. Col. KERR) awaiting re-assignment out of an Establishment of 97 officers.
2. Of the above 55 officers, 6 officers have been earmarked or assigned for Austria. (Appendix "A"). Major JUDGER and Captain YAMLEY have actually reported to the Austria Planning Set Up. I understand that further officers will be required for Austria and it is impossible to put with the above or give up more, unless replacements are forthcoming immediately. Camp Commanders require training like other men, and as their duty will be supervising Italian Military personnel it is essential that they be Allied Officers and NOT Civilians.
3. I have now studied in detail my requirements when North West Italy is occupied (Phase I), and the results are shown in Appendix "B" (under Phase I) a total of 64 officers.
 It will be observed that in Phase I, Five Group H.Q. are recommended for ten "Centres" (each of 5,000)
 They have the additional function of liaison with Military, Region and Provincial Headquarters.
- In Phase II they will control a further 12 Centres (each of 5,000) and 20 Frontier Repatriation Posts (each of 1,000)
4. For Phase II an extra 36 officers will be required for the 12 additional Centres and 20 Frontier Repatriation Posts as shown in Appendix "B" (under Phase II)
5. I consider that if these officers cannot be obtained from within the ceiling allowed to the Allied Commission, immediate application should be

assignment out of an Establishment of 57 officers.

2. Of the above 25 officers, 6 officers have been marked or assigned for Austria. (Appendix "A"). Major Stefan and Captain Zilber are actually reported to the Austria Planning Staff. I understand that further officers will be required for Austria and it is impossible to put with the above or give up more, unless replacements are forthcoming immediately. Camp Co. anders require training like other men, and as their duty will be supervising frontier military personnel it is essential that they be allied officers and NOT civilians.

3. I have now started in detail my requirements when North West Italy is occupied (Phase I), and the results are shown in Appendix "B". (under Phase I) a total of 24 officers.

It will be observed that in Phase I, Five Groups (A-E) are requested for ten "Centres" (each of 5,000)

They have the additional function of liaison with Military, Region and Provincial Headquarters.

In Phase II they will control a further 12 Centres (each of 5,000) and 20 Frontier Military Posts (each of 1,000)

4. For Phase II an extra 20 officers will be required for the 12 additional Centres and 20 Frontier Repatriation Posts as shown in Appendix "B" (under Phase II)

5. I consider that if these officers cannot be obtained from within the ceiling allowed to the Allied Commission, immediate application should be made to M.I.D.G. for further officers for this very important commitment.

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NOTES of Meeting of Manpower & Reorganization Committee held on.

Saturday 30 Dec 44.

Chief of Staff presided.

The first item under discussion was personnel required by Transportation Sub Commission and Mr. M.H. Taylor read a letter giving details of the requirements of this Sub Commission.

The demands submitted for numbers of officers and EM/CRs did not include those who would be required for operating certain HQ Transportation functions, as it was understood that they would be the responsibility of Establishment Section. A planning staff of 3 officers was suggested for the work of long range planning, liaison with various Italian Government officials, and all planning required for the M.A. Regions.

Rail Division. Mr. Taylor explained that it was necessary for these officers to keep in close touch, and in fact work by the side, of Italian railway officials, to concentrate on locomotive repairs, and on repairs of all rolling stock, and to maintain an active supervision in regard to the upkeep of the whole railway system of Italy.

Port Shipment and Warehouse Division. Personnel was discussed without adverse comments.

Road Division. Personnel was discussed without adverse comments. Administration Branch. The duties of the 2 officers required would be to collate all matters on personnel from Regions, to deal with operational problems of road transport on regional and provincial basis, and epuration of railway employees. Brig. Upjohn thought that perhaps Transportation Sub Commission was becoming too much involved in the Italian rail system. Col. Denmore stated that Transportation Sub Commission and Public Works & Utilities Sub Commission were alike in this matter and that it was essential in both cases for them to extend their activities in this direction rather more than other Sub Commissions. Brig. Upjohn then expressed the opinion that the one officer for epuration would not have a full time job and would have time for other duties, but generally speaking he was in agreement.

Shipping Division. It was unanimously agreed that a great deal more help could be given by this Division.

Stores, Accounting & Issuing Spare Parts and Motor Transport. The responsibility for the accounting and issuing of spare parts, tyres etc. for use on both military and civilian vehicles operated by the Transportation Sub Committee was discussed. At this point Col. Evans, Director of Commerce Sub Commission was called in to the Committee and asked whether he could undertake this responsibility in the same way as he was already handling locally manufactured articles. Col. Evans agreed to do this, and it was decided that Col. Denmore, Col. Evans and Mr. Taylor should discuss the whole subject.

Mr. Taylor stated that Mr. Vaughan, Director of Industry Sub Commission was willing to assume responsibility for supervision of factories

present handled by

these officers to keep in close touch, and in fact work by the side, of Italian railway officials, to concentrate on locomotive repairs, and on repairs of all rolling stock, and to maintain an active supervision in regard to the upkeep of the whole railway system of Italy.

DISCUSSION:

1. Transportation Sub-Commission has in the past carried field officers on HQ strength. It is assumed that all field officers will be assigned to the appropriate regions.

2. Transportation Sub-Commission has entered into certain manufacturing activities which will be transferred to Industry Sub-Commission.

3. Transportation Sub-Commission has conducted certain HQ transportation functions which it is proposed to transfer to Establishment Section. Should this not eventuate, it is proposed to set up new HQ operational functions under a separate command which will be treated on same basis as regional activities.

4. Transportation Sub-Commission has, from time to time, accumulated added responsibilities in connection with ports and warehousing facilities which have been transferred from other Sub-Commissions.

5. Transportation Sub-Commission, on suggestion from G-4 (Mov & Tr), HQ AFHQ, is setting up complete movement organization.

6. Responsibilities of Priorities & Movements Division, Economic Section, are being transferred to Transportation Sub-Commission.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Transportation Sub-Commission be composed of the following officers, expert civilians, and EMO/ORs.

Manpower Requirements

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28 December 1944

- a) A Director.
- b) A Deputy Director.
- c) Planning Staff - 3 Officers. These officers are now available in Priorities & Movements Division and will perform their present functions as members of Transportation Sub-Commission.
- d) Movements Division - 16 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer, 8 EMs/ORs. This corresponds to the British Army Movement Control. The division will be divided into rail, road, and shipping branches, which will be responsible for seeing that the priorities determined by the Priorities Board are carried out. The division will make programs of what is to be carried by rail, road, and sea and keep records of the tonnages transported; but it will not be responsible for the technical supervision of the carrying agency which is the concern of the Rail, Road, and Port Divisions referred to below. The set-up meets the requirements of G-4 (Mov & Tr), AFHQ. This constitutes an increase in personnel of Transportation Sub-Commission of 11 Officers and 6 EMs/ORs.
- e) Rail Division - 14 Officers, 4 EMs/ORs. This constitutes an increase of 4 officers and 3 EMs/ORs. This increase in officer strength is covered in Transportation Sub-Commission's memorandum 11 December 44, which has been previously agreed by the Manpower Committee. Additional EM/OR strength is necessary to conduct increased volume of clerical work.
- f) Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division - 7 Officers, 2 EMs/ORs. This constitutes an increase of 3 officers in addition to those presently available. It is proposed they be distributed as follows:
- 1) A Division Chief.
 - 2) Ports Branch - 3 Officers to plan for and give technical instructions to regional officers and inspect port operations.
 - 3) Warehouse & Forwarding Branch - 2 Officers, 1 EM/OR, to inspect and plan for procurement of warehouses; give technical instructions in this connection.
 - 4) Operations Branch - 1 Officer, 1 EM/OR, to formulate policy and give technical advice in connection with schooner and shipping operations; maintain liaison with CCGRNA and other shipping authorities.
- g) Road Division - 10 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer, 9 EMs/ORs. This constitutes an increase of 5 Officers, 8 EMs/ORs. The responsibilities of Road Division will be centralized at Transportation Sub-Commission HQ instead of being generally distributed between field and HQ operations. Proposed composition of Road Division is as follows:
- 1) Division Chief.
 - 2) Administrative Branch - 2 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer, 2 EMs/ORs. Administrative Branch of this size is necessitated by the large number of field personnel in the various

- regions and the paper work necessary to provide maintenance facilities and deal with operational problems of road transport on regional and provincial basis.
- 3) Maintenance Branch - 3 Officers, 6 EMs/ORs. This personnel will give technical assistance in maintenance matters, form inspection teams to assist regional and provincial maintenance officers, develop policies in connection with maintenance practice and maintain direct liaison with appropriate Italian officials.
 - 4) Operations Branch - 2 Officers, 1 EM/OR. This branch will assist Italian Government with placing in operation of ENAC plan and given technical advice concerning the efficient operation of highway vehicles to insure the maximum utilization thereof.
 - 5) Supply Branch - 2 Officers, 1 EM/OR. This branch will plan and accumulate regional requirements of supplies necessary for highway transport and will be responsible for the preparation of proper requisitions for supply and distribution thereof to the regions and other operating agencies.
- b) Administration Division - 3 Officers, 2 Warrant Officers, 7 EMs/ORs. This constitutes a reduction in officer strength of 2 Officers, 1 additional Warrant Officer, 3 additional EMs/ORs, or net personnel increase of 2. Functions of the administrative division cover the keeping of personnel records which will be done by the Chief Administrative Officer.
- 1) Accounting Branch - 2 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer, 2 EMs/ORs. This branch will keep all warehouse accounts and furnish necessary information to Principal Accountant, Finance Sub-Commission; accumulate and provide all necessary statistics to movements division.
 - 2) Chief Clerk Branch - 1 Warrant Officer, 4 EMs/ORs. This branch will operate the central files and will provide stenographic and secretarial services to other divisions and branches.

2. The total proposed strength of Transportation Sub-Commission constitutes an increase of 21 Officers, 2 Warrant Officers, and 21 EMs/ORs. Four of these officers have already been authorized, 7 are attached, and not yet assigned; 3 EMs/ORs are attached and not yet assigned. The attached and not assigned officers and EMs/ORs are composed principally of men supplied by G-4 (Move & Tr) AFHQ.

Investigation into desirability of organising D.P. & R. Sub-Commission on a Regional Basis.

TO: Secretary, Man power and Re-organisation Committee (G-1 Br.)

1. At the man power meeting held on Monday 4 December 1944 the Chairman directed that an investigation be carried out and a report submitted as to the desirability of organising the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission on a Regional basis.

2. After careful and thorough investigation by G-1 British, CA Section and this Sub-Commission, it is considered that it is not desirable to organise the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission on a Regional basis for the following reasons:-

(a) Policy regarding Displaced Persons and War Refugees would be dealt with by eight Regional Commissioners - Appendix 'A'.

(b) The demand for Camp Staff, Reception Centres, Accommodation Centres and Hospitals remains the same as shown in Appendix 'B'. The only saving would be (after U.S.A.R.A. has taken over Southern Camps) Sub-Section HQ. for Northern Italy 4 Officers and 12 OR/EM.

(c) Regions in which camps are in existence and are contemplated in as shown in Appendix 'C'. A total of eight Regions are affected which would require 15 Officers and 12 OR/EM. This would result in an increase of staff to deal with questions on Regional level.

(d) The DPM & R Officers would deal with many questions concerning organisation and set up of camps, Reception Centres, Accommodation Centres and Hospitals which cannot be decided on Regional level and must be referred to Sub-Commission HQ. resulting in a lengthening of the chain of Command. Otherwise Regions will have to undertake the added work of dealing with appropriate A.G. Sub-Commissions regarding:-

Food
Camp Equipment
Finance
Clothing.

(e) The organisation based on Sub-Sections working direct with this Sub-Commission's HQ. which has direct contact with other Sub-Commissions, AAI

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the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission on a Regional basis for the following reasons:-

(a) Policy regarding Displaced Persons and War Refugees would be dealt with by eight Regional Commissioners - Appendix 'A'.

(b) The demand for Camp Staff, Reception Centres, Accommodation Centres and Hospitals remains the same as shown in Appendix 'B'. The only saving would be (after U.M.R.A. has taken over Southern Camps) Sub-Section HQ. for Northern Italy, 4 Officers and 12 OR/M. 116

(c) Regions in which camps are in existence and are contemplated in as shown in Appendix 'C'. A total of eight Regions are affected which would require 18 Officers and 12 OR/M. This would result in an increase of staff to deal with questions on Regional level.

(d) The D.P. & R. Officers would deal with many questions concerning organization and set up of camps, Reception Centres, Accommodation Centres and hospitals which cannot be decided on Regional level and must be referred to Sub-Commission HQ. resulting in a lengthening of the chain of Command. Otherwise Regions will have to undertake the added work of dealing with appropriate A.C. Sub-Commissions regarding:-

Food
Camp Equipment
Finance
Clothing.

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(e) The organization based on Sub-Sections working direct with this Sub-Commission's HQ. which has direct contact with other Sub-Commissions. All and G-5 A.F.M.Q. results in speedy decisions and smooth and efficient dealing with the many important and urgent questions concerning Allied Nationals and Italian Refugees.

(f) A Regional Representative was appointed by this Sub-Commission to Region 2 and the Staff Officer merely became a post office, causing unnecessary delays.

Similar experience when the Sub-Commission had a Liaison Officer at A.C.H.Q.

In both cases the appointment was cancelled.

3. In conclusion no saving in man power would be achieved by putting Displaced Persons Sub-Commission on a Regional basis. This would be lost and chain of Command become confused. It is suggested that the organization as it stands is more efficient and workable than if placed on a Regional basis.

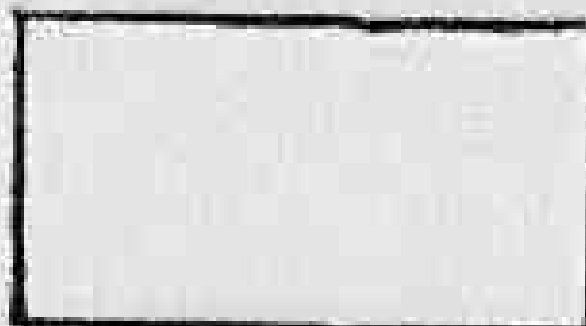

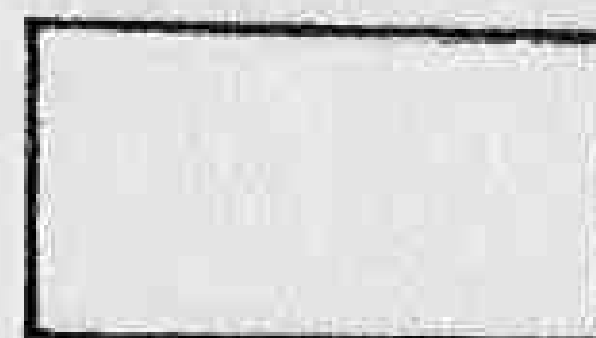

1. Subsequent to touring both V and VIII Army areas and having obtained agreement from both S.C.A.O's. I propose to inaugurate the following reorganisation:

- (a) Reception centres - two at PRACCHIA and LIZZANA in V Army area.
- (b) Patriot centres - two at LUCCA and FLORENCE.
- (c) In VIII Army area one Patriot reception centre only at FORLI.

2. Each Army will have a patriot officer on H.Q. Staff which they will assign themselves from their own establishments.

3. The centres and reception points require the following personnel:

- (a) Three reception centres - three officers.
- (b) Reception points in V Army area - one officer.

All these have been found and can be supplied from existing assignments.

4. This H.Q., Patriots Branch, however, will require a replacement to take the place of Lt. DI LORENZO who goes forward as Camp Commandant.

5. One extra enlisted man will be required as Quartermaster for one of the Patriot centres which V Army cannot supply.

6. For information, then, the position will be as follows:

- (a) Reception centres - two at PRACCHIA and LIZZANA in V Army area.
 - (b) Patriot centres - two at LUCCA and FLORENCE.
 - (c) In VIII Army area one Patriot reception centre only at FORLI.
2. Each Army will have a patriot officer on H.Q. Staff which they will assign themselves from their own establishments.
3. The centres and reception points require the following personnel:

- All these have been found and can be supplied from existing assignments.
4. This H.Q., Patriots Branch, however, will require a replacement to take the place of Lt. DI LORENZO who goes forward as Camp Commandant.
5. One extra enlisted man will be required as Quartermaster for one of the Patriot centres which V Army cannot supply.
6. For information, then, the position will be as follows:
- (a) PRACCHIA and LIZZANA V Army reception point - Lt. PATRUSI (A) and an E.M. whose name I have forgotten already on the spot.
 - (b) Patriot centre LUCCA - Capt. WOODWARD plus an E.M. not available 515
 - (c) Patriot centre FLORENCE - Capt. HAMMOND plus S.Q.M.S. DAVIES.
 - (d) Patriot centre FORLI - Lt. DI LORENZO plus Sgt. STARRIS.

SUBJECT: Finance Ceiling

TO: The Secretary,
Manpower and Reorganization Committee,
HQ Allied Commission.

1. Reference is made to conversation (Col. A.P. Grafftey-Smith - Lt-Col. J.L. Jones) and to this Sub-Commission's letters 13015/F dated 9 November 1944 and 30 November 1944 addressed respectively to Executive Officer (B) and to Deputy Chief of Staff, Establishments Section, copies of which are attached for reference.

2. Attached at Appendix 'A' is a chart showing present assigned strengths at Headquarters, in Regions and with AMG Armies; though it is pointed out that many of the officers assigned to Northern Regions are attached for duty to Regions in the South, subject to recall by their Regional Commissioners at 48 hours notice. The total finance officer strength is 145.

3. Appendix 'B' shows the proposed allocation of Finance Officers for the administration of the whole of Italy assuming a ceiling of 160 officers. It will be seen that the aim of this increased allocation is to strengthen the greatly weakened Provincial Finance Officer strengths in the Northern Regions. It has been the experience of this Sub-Commission that on taking over newly liberated territory, a Regional Commissioner endeavours to assign one Provincial Finance Officer to each Province in his Region, an aim with which the Joint Directors are fully in agreement. It will be seen that in the case of, for example, Venezia Region, the number of Provincial Finance Officers has been reduced to six, a number quite inadequate efficiently to administer the fifteen Provinces within that Region. The increase of two officers at Headquarters is assuming approval to the increase in Headquarters Officer ceiling strength applied for in 13015/F dated 30 November 1944.

4. The transfer to another theatre of at least nine officers leaves this Sub-Commission in the position that it would not be able properly to fulfil its functions were there a rapid evacuation by the enemy of the four Regions in the North of Italy. In these circumstances, it is stressed that every endeavour should be made to secure the services of suitably qualified officers for immediate assignment to Regional Finance Staffs for training, within a ceiling of 160 officers.

1. Reference is made to G-1B/349/O dated 7 November, 1944.
2. The total Finance officer strength of 129 is presumably made up as follows:

3. In addition, there are 17 Property Control Officers with Regions, bringing total Finance officer strength to 146.

4. It is not considered desirable by this Sub-Commission to differentiate between Finance and Property Control Officers at Headquarters and in the field; and it is requested that a new combined ceiling of 160 officers be allotted to Finance Sub-Commission for these functions efficiently to be carried out.

5. It is pointed out that all of the additional officers are not required immediately; but it is clear that when the whole of Italian territory is liberated, it will not be possible to withdraw sufficient officers from the South to staff the new Regions. As an example, the recent withdrawal from the strength of Venezia Region of Major Curtis and Major Nash has left this Region with but seven Provincial Finance Officers, a number that is totally inadequate and must be supplemented. It is felt, however, that if suitable officers can be found and assigned now to financial duties with the Allied Commission, this should be done within the ceiling of 160 officers.

6. In these circumstances it is urged that the Finance ceiling be increased to 160, and every endeavour made to obtain suitably qualified officers up to this figure.

SUBJECT: Request for Personnel.

TO : Deputy Chief of Staff,

1. The Allied Financial Agency, a sub-section of the Finance Sub-Commission, is now engaged in unloading an order of thirty billion A.M. Lire (approximately 3,000 boxes) in the ports of Livorno and Naples for shipment and storage at the Allied Financial Agency branches at Naples, Rome and Florence.

2. This A.M. lire is the sole currency available for paying Allied troops in Italy and for providing funds to the banking system in case of emergency. Early in January 1945 the Allied Financial Agency will be engaged in receiving, shipping and storing for the Italian Government 18,000 boxes of currency coming to ports in Italy from the United States in approximately 36 ships over a period of 3 or 4 months. These shipments total in bulk and entail more work than all the shipments of currency previously received in Italy to date by the Allied Financial Agency.

3. It is therefore strongly recommended that the officer strength of the Finance Sub-Commission be increased by two officers and the enlisted personnel strength be increased by four in order to handle this extremely large volume of currency with the necessary safeguards. The officers are required for arrangements, supervision and checking; the enlisted men are required for record keeping and particularly for guarding the currency in transit.

4. An urgent reply is requested.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Chief Staff Officer, Office of the COS

Reference our conversation relative to a possible change in the Chief of the Road Section, Transportation Subcommittee, the following information is believed to be pertinent.

From observation and verbal reports obtained from other units, including AFHQ, that are constantly dealing with the Road Section, it appears that there is serious need for a man with top executive ability in handling transportation problems -- an individual that is not so much a technical expert as one with practical executive operational experience in transportation. The present head of the Road Section is Colonel James J. Carnes, a Regular Army officer since 1923. His experience in the automotive field has been confined to the military. The Colonel's recent record is briefly summarized by the following extract from War Department AGO Form 66-1:

Technical ability is further indicated by various automotive inventions of his own such as an automatic pressure relief valve used in lubrication systems of light and medium tank transmissions, a piston-valve motor, and various other small mechanical devices. On the strength of his training and demonstrated performance, Colonel Carnes should more properly be considered purely as a top-flight automotive technician. His technical ability could be most profitably used by placing him in complete charge of all motor maintenance activities.

In view of the actual operating record of the Road Section, Transportation Subcommittee, and the continual difficulties in which this Section has been and is involved, it is believed that in the best interests of the Allied Commission a man experienced in an executive capacity in the transportation field should be placed in charge. At the present time there is associated

with the Economic Section a Mr. Charlie Ryan who was sent over for transportation activities by the Foreign Economic Administration. Mr. Ryan brings to this Commission fourteen years of practical executive experience in the transportation field. This may be summarized as follows:

April 1930-April 1932	Barber Steamship Line, Inc. (17 Battery Place, New York City) Cashier's Dept., Freight Manifest Dept., supervision of Atlantic Piers Co., and Atlantic Stevedoring Co., freight solicitation and booking for Clan Line Steamers, Osaka Shosen Kaisha Line and Union Mail Line.

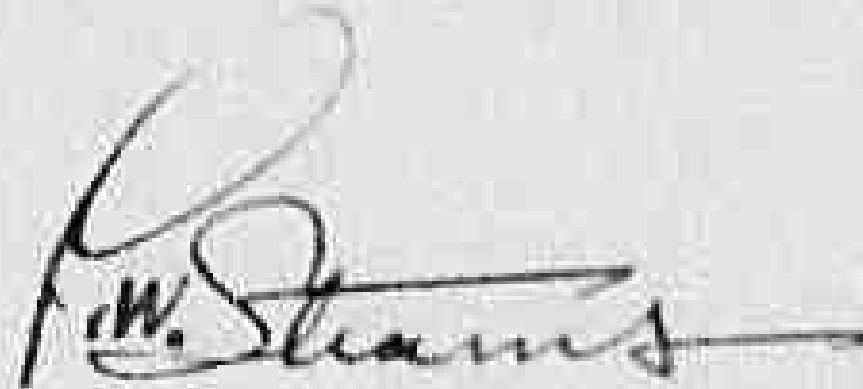
