It is however, pointed out that it is a principle of Staff procedure at this Headquarters that no letter that has political implications should be despatched from it without prior consultation with the Supreme Allied Commander's political advisers; who, if they consider the matter so requires, consult the Embassies before giving their advice or concurrence. The letter under discussion was concurred with by both Political Advisers."

The letter under discussion referred to in the last sentence of the extract dealt with the question of registration and repatriation of aliens.

1. Information copies of routine telegrams and reports are received in this Section from higher authority or outside agencies, such as USSR, and are circulated round the Branches. They may relate to movements and cargoes of ships, arrival of USSR supplies, coal, press reports, etc.

2. It would appear that cases occur where the receipt of this information is based on the former comprehensive organization and work of this Commission and that the information is not now required or made use of, or it may be received from another source.

3. There is also the question of internal distribution within this Headquarters or Section. A case has occurred where 13 copies of a wire dealing with sailings of coal vessels were circulated round this Headquarters, including 2 copies to Transportation Branch, 2 to Economic Section, 2 to Industry and Utilities etc., and copies to S.B.A. It does not appear appropriate that this Headquarters should be responsible for distribution to S.B.A.

4. All Heads of Branches please keep a close watch on information copies of routine telegrams and reports which are circulated to them and also on the internal distribution at this Headquarters.

5. Cases in which copies of the wires or reports are not required by the Branch or in which the Branch should be excluded from the internal A.C. distribution should be reported to the Chief Staff Officer.

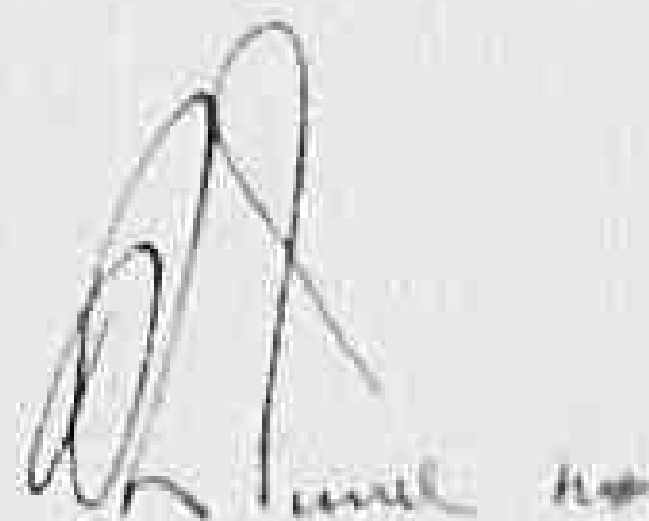

One wonders what is happening to the outstanding fines which are being paid or due say, in the Reghorn area and throughout the north generally.

Possibly the matter is all in order, but it is a matter which must be dealt with by the Economic Section, and it is no use then telling the Registry to send the papers to the Civil Affairs Section.

A complaint has been received from the British Postal Directorate, CMF, stating that personnel of certain liaison groups are using incorrect addresses on their private correspondence.

The main cause of this is that our office must obtain the information for our replies from the various Ministries concerned, who are not always in a position to supply it immediately due to the circumstances of the exceptional period through which we are passing.

The question raised in the letter of Admiral Stone H. DE/1 A/CA of the 6 October last required a somewhat lengthy examination of the position of the many public firms operating under the fascist regime, as regards their origin and successive development. The reply to this has already been drafted and it is hoped to obtain the signature of the President of the Council without delay.

Your letter No. 9006/235/23 of the 16 Feb last was replied to on the 3rd of the current month by No 68502/12000.

In the future special care will be taken to ensure that precedence is given to correspondence with the Allied Authorities and that it be treated with greater dispatch.

1. As I am sure you realize, it is the endeavour of this Commission assist your Government in every possible way, but there are occasions, caused, no doubt, through oversight, when we are barred from assisting further by lack of replies to our letters.

2. For your information I am quoting two examples.

(a) On 16 February 1946, I wrote to the Prime Minister under reference 9006/235/EC on the subject of Equipment for Italian Army (copy enclosed). This letter contained proposals for the inclusion in A.R.A.R. of a small number of Army officers to safeguard the interests of your Minister of War.

As this matter was of some urgency, a further letter, No. 9006/273/EC dated 23 March 1946 was sent to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers requesting a reply to the original letter.

In addition, on 9 April, the Italian Liaison Officer to the Allied Commission, Dott. Rosbassei and the Cabinet of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers were asked to expedite a reply, but to date without success.

(b) The second case to which I should like to draw your attention deals with the question of Operation.

On 6 October 1945, Admiral Stora wrote to the Prime Minister under reference 185/1A/GA (copy attached) asking for information regarding 4 groups of fascist societies.

A further letter under similar reference was sent on 10 November asking for an early reply.

On April 6, I wrote enclosing a copy of the original letter and asking for a reply with the least possible delay.

The assistance of Dott. Bombassei was requested in this case on 29 April but to date no reply has been received.

3. There are several other similar cases which I will not specify in detail.

4. I am sure that you will agree, that it is difficult for the Commission to give full assistance under these circumstances and trust that you will look into this matter for me.
