Abstract The purpose of this study was to determine the effect of a 12-week, 30-min, 3 times per week, low-impact aerobically and resistance training program on the physical fitness of 10-year-old children. The study was conducted in a school setting. The children were divided into two groups: an experimental group and a control group. The experimental group performed the program, while the control group did not. Physical fitness was measured at the beginning and end of the 12-week period. The results showed that the experimental group had significantly higher levels of physical fitness than the control group at the end of the 12-week period. The findings suggest that a 12-week, 30-min, 3 times per week, low-impact aerobically and resistance training program can improve the physical fitness of 10-year-old children.

I am sorry to have been so long replying to your official letter of 7th June (AFSC/707/P1) to the Chief Commissioner but there has been some doubt as to whether awards for activities after the cessation of hostilities will be entertained. On the US side it has been categorically stated that no American awards will be granted to British officers for activities after that date. In a minute which I have seen signed by the Military Secretary at the War Office in connection with another case, it seems that the same procedure will be adopted by the British.

In these circumstances I doubt whether it is worth while putting forward a case for Brigadier-General Lee. If you still desire to do so, the Chief Commissioner has suggested that a CBE is a more appropriate decoration for an officer of his rank: this is correct according to British rulings.

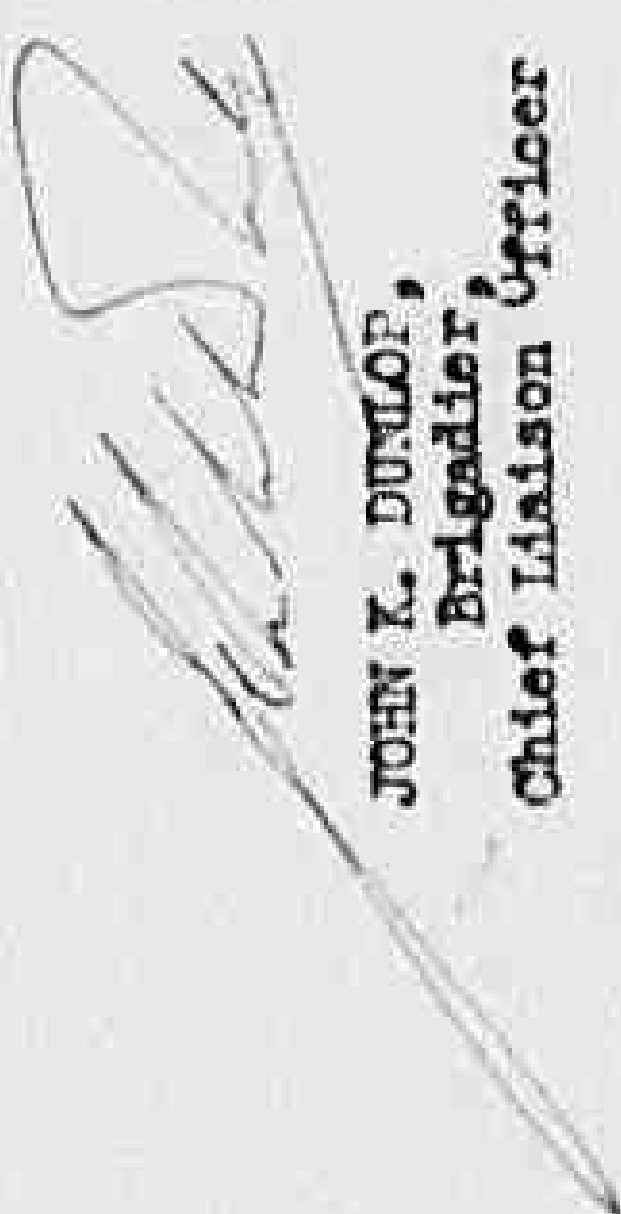

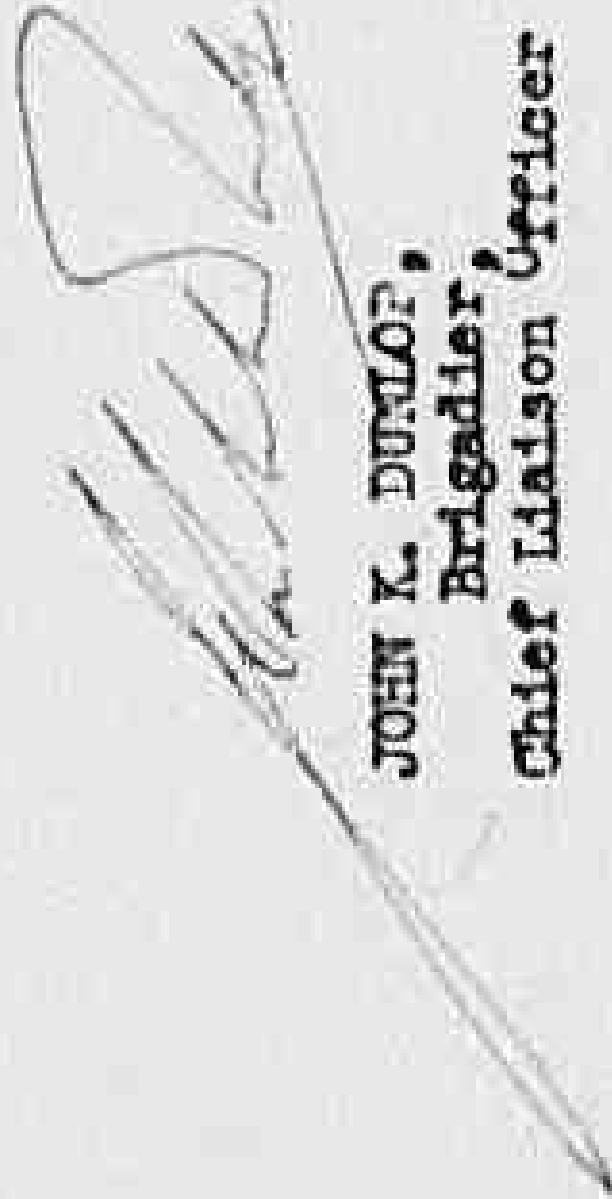

Some time ago you caused a circular to be sent out to Civil Affairs organisations on the question of awards. I replied to AFM that I thought we had been fairly generously treated by them and the War Office.

But the case of Brigadier G.S. PARKINSON, CBE, RAMC, fills me with apprehension as to the policy and procedure adopted in connection with recommendations for awards.

Brigadier PARKINSON was recommended by me in April 1945 and subsequently by SACRED for a CBE. He was eventually awarded the honour.

On 29th October 1944 Admiral STONE recommended him for a US honour, Legion of Merit, for work done since the Commission began. I happen to know that both the Admiral, the US Ambassador to the Quirinale, the US Representative to the Holy See, and Mr. MYRON TAYLOR - the President's Personal Representative to the Pope, all thought very highly of PARKINSON's work for ITALY, and with his US colleague Admiral STONE was most anxious that he should receive a most richly deserved honour from the US Government.

Judge then of his amazement and indignation when he was informed by MYRONA on 14th May that the "award was not favourably considered by the British War Office in as much as the previous British decoration CBE was awarded to Brigadier PARKINSON for the same period of service for which the Legion of Merit was recommended".

The effect of this ruling is that the President of the United States is debarred from granting an award to a British officer because His Majesty has rewarded him for the same outstanding work. I can imagine the right of the War Office to prevent Brigadier PARKINSON from receiving say the CBE and the CB for the same period - I can conceive no equity in their preventing him receiving a US decoration. Nor did their action result in any other officer receiving a US decoration in PARKINSON's place. It just hurt him without doing anyone else any good. And it is regarded as a rebuff by the recommending US officer and so may affect future recommendations. Moreover, it is not consistent with permission given to British officers who have received both British and US decorations for work done throughout the life of the Allied Commission.

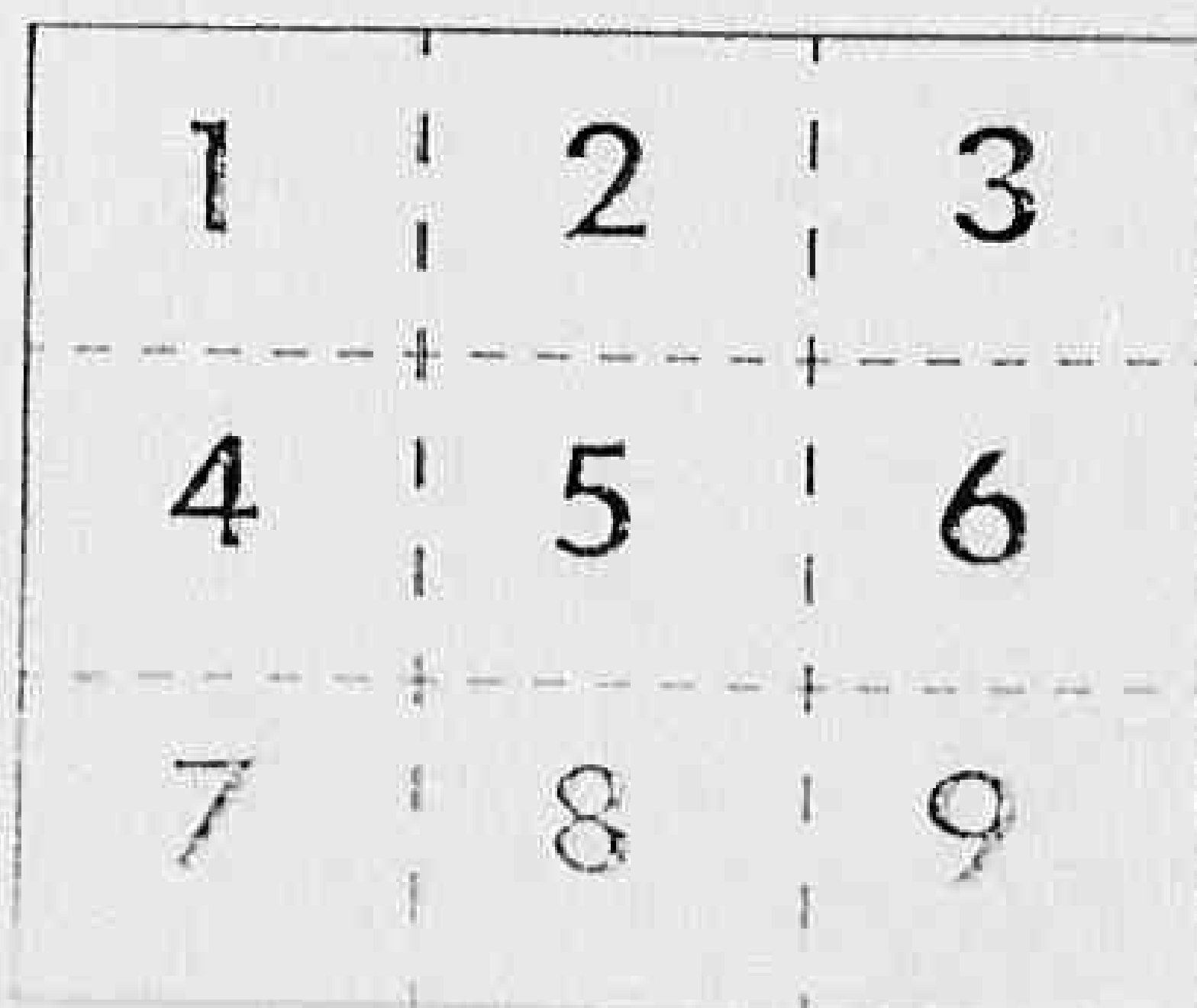
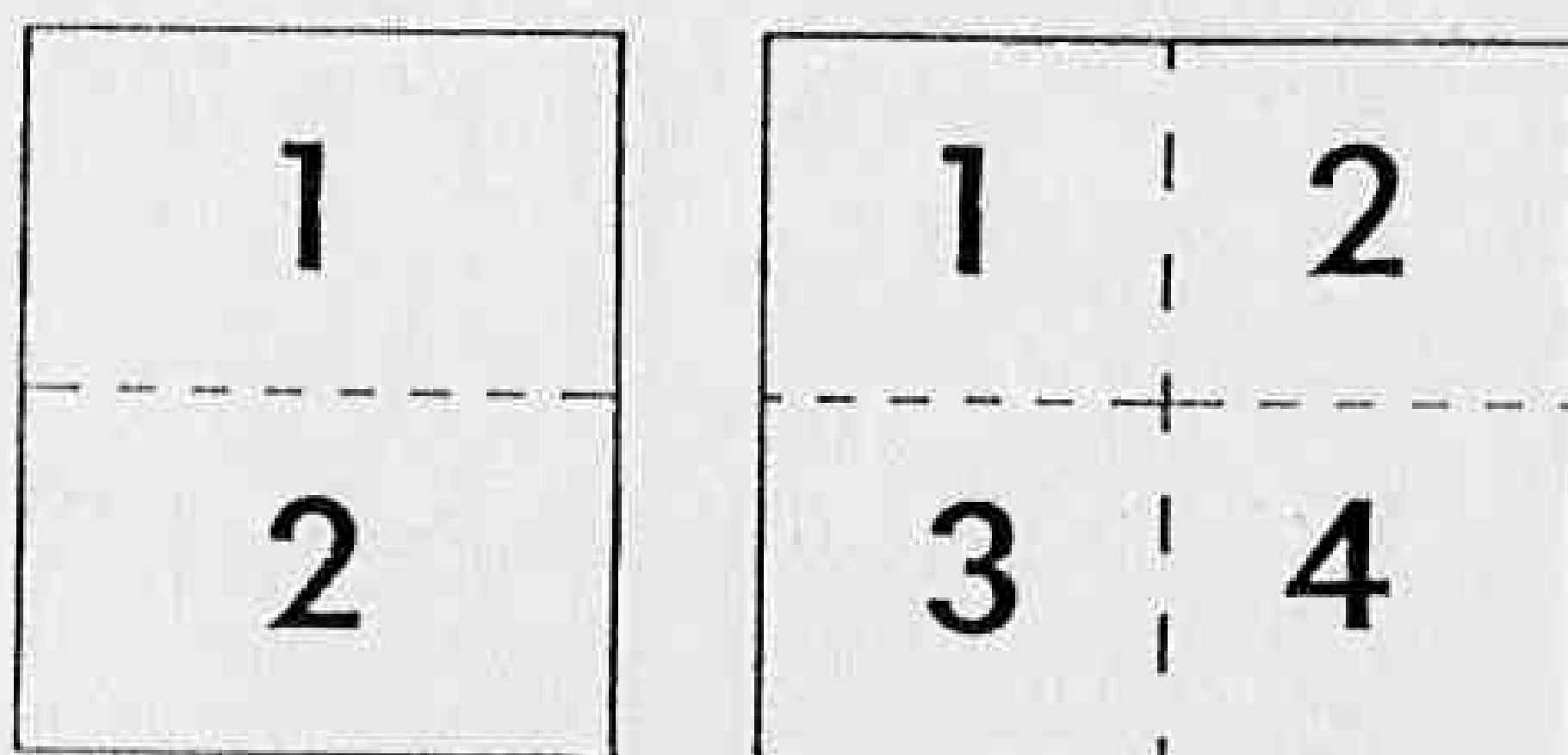

I Patrioti della "Maiella"

(Dal Sangro ad Asiago - 5 Dicembre 1943 - 1° Maggio 1945)

Il 5 dicembre 1943 si costituisce sul Sangro la Banda Patrioti della Maiella: 300 figli d'Abruzzo iniziano così, a fianco del 5. Corpo Inglese, che in quell'epoca operava nel settore Guardisagrele - Palombaro - Lama dei Peligni - Colledara - Pizzoferrato - Palena, i primi combattimenti liberando dall'oppressione tedesca importanti località delle Valli dell'Aventino e del Sangro.

Il 3 febbraio 1944 la sanguinosa e gloriosa battaglia di Pizzoferrato in cui cadeva eroicamente alla testa dei Patrioti della Maiella il Maggiore inglese Wigram.

Sono giovani e adolescenti di tutte le classi sociali che combattono soltanto per la libertà d'Italia in condizioni miserrime affrontando sacrifici e difficoltà di ogni genere.

Per le azioni suddette il Generale di Corpo d'Armata Alfrey il 4-5-1944 rivolgeva ai Patrioti il seguente messaggio:

« Vi ringrazio dell'opera sin qui svolta

« Salutando i soldati della « Brigata « Maiella auguro ad essi nuovi e bei successi nel combattimento e principalmente che il loro puro patriottismo e l'amore per la libertà spuntino alla loro bella Patria vera libera e felice città ». — Fdo. Col. Stato Maggiore Winowski. »

I primi di gennaio 1945, dopo un breve riposo a Modigliana, la Maiella è nuovamente in linea sul Senio, a rinforzare con eroismo leggendario ogni velleità nemica. La guerra precipita: I Patrioti della Maiella avrebbero bisogno di un periodo adeguato di riposo ma si rinunziano non volendo rimanere lontani dal fronte in un momento decisivo. Hanno il cambio dalla « Friulia » e sono spostati su altro settore.

Anche qui fanno miracoli. A marce forzate, sempre alle calcagna del nemico, all'alba del 21 aprile, tra le primissime truppe liberatrici, i Patrioti della Maiella entrano a Bologna accolti da manifestazioni di delirante simpatia. Ma non sostano perchè la guerra è ormai alla fine. Il 1. mag-

giore non si lascia scoraggiare. Intanto i suoi patrioti effettuavano qualche audace colpo di mano che dovette influire molto sull'atteggiamento britannico nei loro riguardi. Si aggiunga che alla fine del Dicembre comincia ad interessarsi della cosa il Maggiore Wigram, che poi doveva seguire la Banda e morire in combattimento, il quale riuscì ad appoggiare efficacemente le richieste, e finalmente, ai primi di gennaio 1944 il Troilo era autorizzato a costituire il Corpo dei Volontari della Maiella, nel quale incorporò alcuni reparti volontari che si erano venuti costituendo contemporaneamente nella zona.

Nacque così, per la tenacia e la costanza del suo capo, la Banda della Maiella. Al primo nucleo di quindici uomini si aggiunsero, da tutte le zone vicine, giovani e vecchi e dal Sangro iniziò la sua marcia il primo reparto organico e riconosciuto di patrioti italiani.

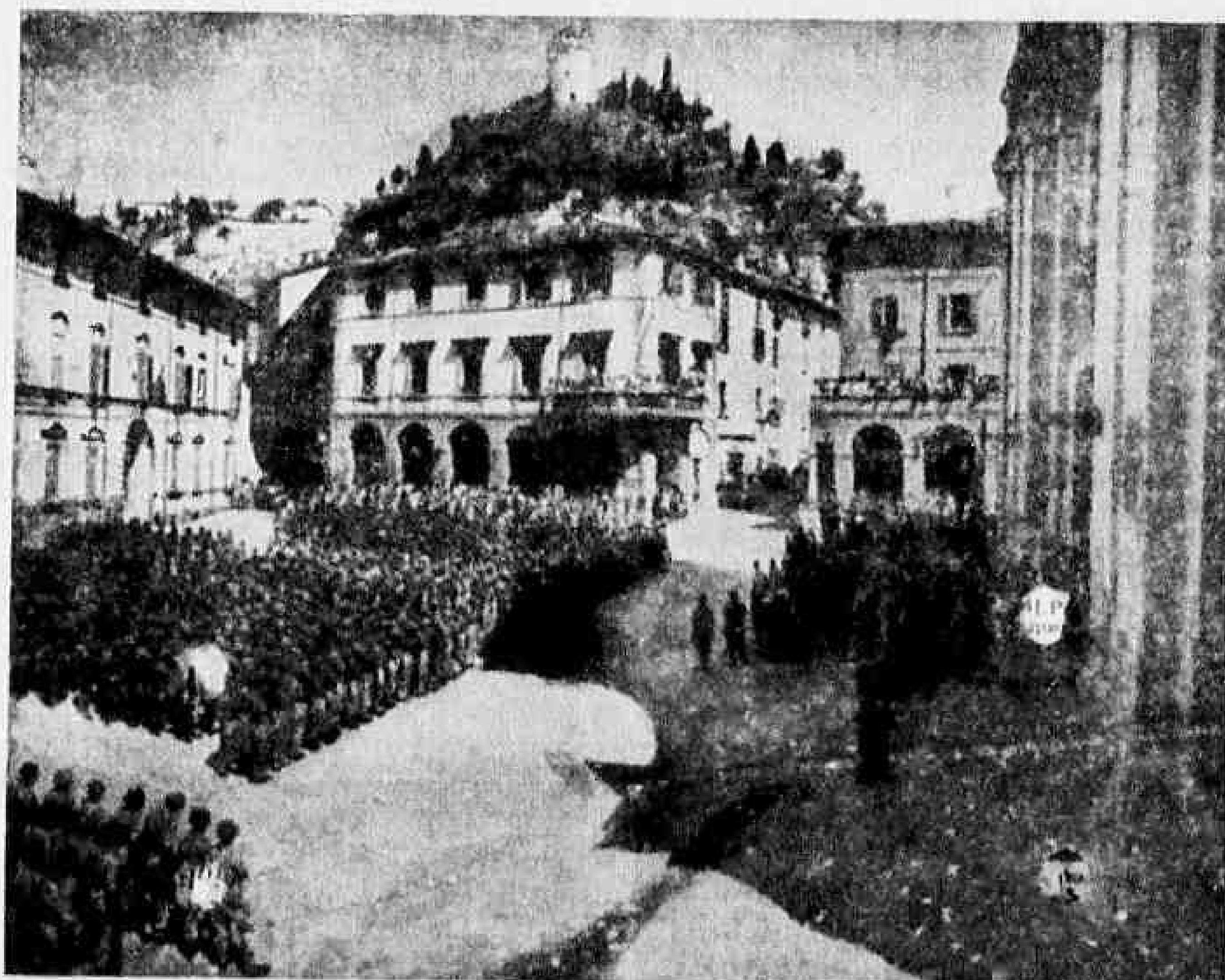

MESSAGE FROM GEN MCCREERY - COMMANDER OF THE VIII ARMY -
TO THE PATRIOTS.

At the end of the victorious campaign in Italy, I wish to express all my high consideration, estimation and praise to the Commander and to the volunteers of the Majella, who have all absolved the charges received by the Allied Command, with courage and abnegation, contributing efficaciously to the liberation of their country and to the defeat of the enemy.

The Patriots of the Majella after the period of the clandestine struggle on the Abruzzo's mountains, where during the German occupation defended the honour and the liberty of Italy, they later continued the fighting with the Allied troops.

Aggregate themselves with the 8th British Army, they fought on the Majella and at the Adriatic Sector and they took part to the successive phases of the campaign, before under the dependence of the 5th Corps of the British Army till on June 1944 and after of the Polish Corps in Marche and Romagna region, until the offensive of the Po, where the enemy has been definitely routed.

In each occasion Patriots of the Majella demonstrated their ideals and the real temper of the free Italian people.

Now that the war operations are finished they are going in to civilian life with the purpose to be still, as they have been during the war, the best sons of Italy. We send to them the gratefulness of the Allied soldiers in Italy who saw them at their side disciplined and courageous during the time of fighting.

I do ask for your help in getting some recognition for services in Italy - a mention in Despatches would be least bringing me in line with Officers who enjoyed the reputation of hotel life and good meals when I was in the field.

Major Scully, Colonel Re (who worked in Florence with me, as Partisan Officer) and Colonel Pollock would gladly speak on my behalf in this connection. All the above facts can be verified from AC records.

Dear Brigadier,

A little while ago I put before D.C.A. a minute, of which I enclose a copy to you, urging the claims of J.M.F.A. and A officers to some award or decoration for the very good work they've done. D.C.A. tells me that the recommendation had much better come through A.C. to the War Office, and that I should re-submit it in that form. So I am putting the matter in your hands. I know that you have a high opinion of John Ward-Jenkins' performance and imagine that the same is true of the other two concerned, and I very much hope that you will be able to take the initiative in this and put them up for what in my opinion they thoroughly deserve.

You will remember writing indignantly on the subject of the report "Losses and Survivals" of Italian monuments published by the Macmillan Committee. It will I hope be a relief to you that the committee has now, after a lot of pushing, agreed to publish the official Final Reports of the Sub-Commission. The fact was that they had been wholly unaware of what the Sub-Commission was doing in the matter of repair etc. and believed that their statement of damage was the last word on the subject, though I assured them that the report gave a quite false picture of the present condition of the monuments. Now they have seen the final Reports and announce that the results of the Sub-Commission work were 'positively miraculous' (so the Secretary put it to me) and I hope that the second volume they bring out will make amends for the first. There are still one or two regions to be accounted for, but they will probably be available soon.

Now that the work of the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Sub-Commission in Italy is drawing towards its close I should like to draw attention to the specially good work done by three of its officers.

1. Lieut. Colonel J. Ward Perkins, R.A.

This officer was first engaged to take temporary charge of the antiquities of Tripolitania and Cyrenaica; when he took over there was no organization in existence; in the space of three months he had built up an efficient department and had in a series of admirable reports described fully the condition of Monuments and laid down the policy to be followed regarding them. He was later transferred to Italy where he was deputy of the Sub-Commission until on the withdrawal of Lieut. Colonel De Wail (U.S.) he became Director.

He has recently been appointed Director of the British School at Rome, but he is still functioning in M.F.A.A. Lieut. Colonel Ward Perkins's work has been of an extremely high order and the success of the Sub-Commission is largely owing to his energy, enthusiasm and tactful direction.
