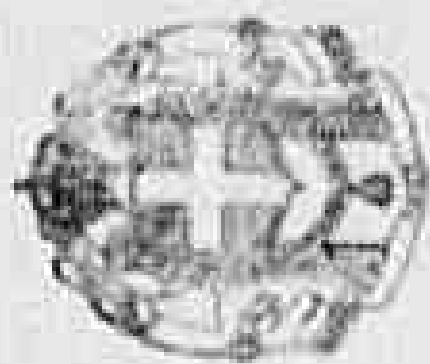

Capt. Bonybrake has asked me for my views on a possible membership of the Soviet & Yugoslav members of the Advisory Council, the H.C. Com. etc.

So far as the Advisory Council is concerned, I would say - speaking as perhaps the only confining foundation member of the body - that the functions of the Council are such that ~~the~~ a delegation of six persons (all ranks) ought to be the maximum. For instance, the British delegation consists of Sir Mark Clarke, Mr. Wilkinson myself or two others; if we had any Council work to do, there would be delegations to the only grounds for selection could be medical men - e.g. the strain imposed on their military services, for the production of food, transport, accommodation. We have to remember, moreover, that, in the case of the Yugoslav & Greek, the Advisory Council represents these whole titles of diplomatic representation in this country. Unlike the Americans, British, Russians & French, they have no relations with the British Govt. But whatever the legal position may be, the Yugoslav & Greek delegations are in practice Embassies &, as such, I do not see how we can attempt to limit their size. We might suggest that the Russians & French, having Embassies proper, should reduce the size of their delegations - in which case they will probably just transfer the surplus to the Embassies.

The H.C. Com. delegations are different & I think the decisions of the experts should be final.

1. I attach hereto a copy of a request from the Soviet Representative on the Allied Commission for the sum of 25 million lire to meet the expenses of the USSR Delegation on the Allied Commission for the first quarter of 1946.

2. The figures below indicate the amounts previously advanced during the last five quarters to the Soviet delegations to both the Allied Commission and the Advisory Council for Italy:

4th Quarter 1944	AC - 6,000,000 lire ACI - 7,000,000 lire
1st Quarter 1945	AC - 7,000,000 lire ACI - 9,000,000 lire
2nd Quarter 1945	AC - 7,500,000 lire ACI - 10,000,000 lire
3rd Quarter 1945	AC - 7,500,000 lire ACI - 10,000,000 lire
4th Quarter 1945	AC - 7,500,000 lire ACI - 10,000,000 lire
<u>Total for year 1945</u> - AC-29,500,000 lire ACI-39,000,000 lire	

3. It should also be noted that from the formation of the Advisory Council for Italy through 30 September 1945, advances to the USSR Delegation on the Advisory Council for Italy totalled 42,066,066 lire.

4. TAM 707, dated 30 October 1945, revoked as of 1 November 1945, our authority to advance lire to the national delegations on the ACI. Para 3 of TAM 707 states as follows:

"Reference paragraph 5 MAT 578, provision of funds to National Delegations on Allied Commission should continue same basis as heretofore with information being made available, in accordance with paragraph 10A, FAM 583, to Italian Government."

5. It will be seen that the current request for funds from the Soviet Representative on the Allied Commission is greatly in excess of the quarterly amounts advanced in the past to the Soviet delegations on both the Allied Commission and the Advisory Council for Italy. In view of TAM 707, and what I believe to be its intent, I do not intend to advance to the Soviet Representative on the Allied Commission an amount in excess of the maximum quarterly amount previously drawn, i.e., 7,500,000 lire, unless I receive instructions to the contrary from you.

TO: Executive Commissioner.

Colonel Buchanan has today been asking for some guidance on what sort of information should be given to the Russian Representative to AC. The Russians are asking for all sorts of detailed particulars regarding rolling stock, output of motor car factories, shipping, etc clearly directed at ascertaining what may be available for reparations.

I have been searching our files to find if we have any directive dealing with this and can only find AFHQ directives SAC(P) (45) 7 (Revised) of 26 February 1945 (flagged "A" in attached files), SACMPC's letter dated 26 January 44 addressed to General McFarlane (flagged "B" in attached files), AC Office Memorandum 16080/E-1 dated 31 January 44 (flagged "C" in attached files) and your letter 516/47/COS dated 11 October 44 (flagged "D" in attached files) which more or less say they can be shown everything at the discretion of heads of subcommission, sections etc. This doesn't help much.

In theory I feel we should show them everything they ask for; on the other hand we know quite well that we are never likely to get similar information out of them regarding their own country.

For the moment Colonel Buchanan is stalling them off by saying that he is awaiting a census being taken and I feel we can leave things as they are for the time being. However, I bring this to your attention in case the Russian Representative approaches you on this subject.

The Russians also want to see Monthly Reports of the Transportation Subcommission which contain a lot of detailed information extremely useful from the point of view of reparations and which Colonel Buchanan is very loathe to show them. I feel here that he should be told to use his discretion, i.e. not show them to the Russians.

1. There are at present as reported on 19 September within ITALY 101 Soviet persons with Soviet Missions as follows (A) Soviet Delegation to the Advisory Council for ITALY officers > other ranks 2 civilians 30 (B) Soviet Representation on the ALLIED COMMISSION officers 10 other ranks 1 civilians 3 (C) Soviet Military Mission sometimes called Displaced Persons Repatriation Mission officer 16 other ranks 34.

2. Not all of these are officially accredited to Headquarters ALLIED COMMISSION. Some have appeared in ITALY without the knowledge or consent of HQ ALLIED COMMISSION. In case of one (C) above numbers have been recruited from liberated Soviet Prisoners of War and have assumed without permission status of fully-accredited representatives.

3. All obtain food petrol etc from our supplies. Missions in one (A) and one (B) above have behaved properly but Mission in one (C) has given trouble by travelling widely throughout ITALY opening unofficial offices in various towns and carrying on extensive propaganda under the guise of caring for Displaced Persons of which very few can now remain.

4. It is considered essential that the numbers of personnel of these missions be reduced and that all remaining be properly accredited to Headquarters ALLIED COMMISSION by MOSCOW.

Maximum numbers considered necessary for Russian Missions total 40 of which only 2 officer interpreters and 4 other ranks are necessary for work of military Mission in para one (C) above as this is virtually complete.

5. Also essential that movement of members of Russian Missions is brought into line with all other Allied and UNITED STATES and British personnel. This means that no movement outside permanent location allowed without travel permit issued by AFHQ or HQ ALLIED COMMISSION. It cannot be agreed that permits can be issued for entry into 13 COMPS or any area where Polish troops are located.

6. Request you represent to Soviet authorities that numbers in excess of above be withdrawn and HQ ALLIED COMMISSION be furnished with list of officially accredited representatives it is desired to retain within total allowed. Also request you inform the Soviet authorities that those remaining must obtain travel permits as in para 5 above before movement will be permitted.

7. Stress that this control of movement means no victimisation of Russians but is the same treatment accorded British and American officers. Will be grateful any suggestions you have to make on this whole subject.

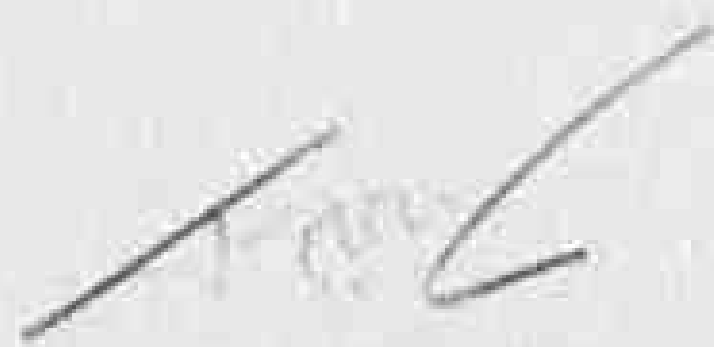

6. He has asked me and the Prefect for transport and offices, but these have not yet been granted.
7. I have asked him politely to obtain allied authority for his movements but these have not been forthcoming. Meanwhile we have maintained friendly relations.

I am obliged to say that you are lead astray for the officers Major MOSOV, Lt. JIGALIN, Lt. MIHAIL and Lt. Col. PODOBED / the name of whom was not known / as well as Colonel RIUMIN have the proper authority for working and entering Italy from the British and Italian Governments through their Ambassadors in Moscow.

Lt. LITOVKO, Lt. RAJEV and Lt. SMIRNIEV are drew to help in our work from the number of EX-POW by Col. RIUMIN in accordance to Clause 6 of the Agreement of 11.8.45. Col. RIUMIN himself had never been in Udine province. Other officers mentioned by you dealt with repatriating Soviet citizens in our Camps and accompanied / together with British and American officers / transports which were sent with our people to the receiving points of Austria.

Therefore I wish to inform you once more of the body of the Group of the Soviet Mission of Repatriation / or it is the same Delegate of the Representative CPC USSR for Repatriation of the Soviet Citizens from Italy /. The Staff of our Mission is as follows:

Nationals and ostensibly to investigate alleged Russian collaborators (sic) detained at GHEDI. These officers were in possession of regular travel orders issued by MFOUSA-351 Inf. Rgt. They called on Capt. GOODMAN, AMG Brescia City.

(5) On Saturday, 13 September 1945, a Russian Officer, who claimed to be a Lieutenant in the Russian Army, called on the Provincial Commissioner, Lt. Col. ROBINSON, and produced a document written in Russian, English and Italian. This was addressed "TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN" and signed by the Head of the Russian Military Mission, Corso Matteotti 10, Milano (Note: Probably Maj. MATVEY). This document certified that bearer was authorized to travel throughout the LOMBARDIA Region for the purpose of arranging for the repatriation of Russian Nationals. Col. ROBINSON refused to recognize his credentials and instructed him to obtain approval from Regional HQ. in Milano. He does not appear to have followed these instructions.

3. Attached hereto is a letter (Ref. 10/P-7) dated 18 September 1945 received from the Provincial Commissioner, GOMERIO PROVINCE, A.M.G., which is self-explanatory (Appendix N°3). The Russian Officer in question did report to the Displaced Persons Division these HQ. on Monday, 17 September 1945. He was asked to return the same afternoon but to date has not put in an appearance.

4. Above information was passed to AA & QMG, 59 Area on 18 September 1945.

1. In compliance with your telephoned request I set forth below what I can remember concerning the Russian Officer in question.

2. On Friday afternoon, 14 September, a young man who could speak no English, but spoke Italian fairly well came to my office and presented as his credentials a folded typewritten booklet with one page in Russian, one in English and one in Italian. The English version was about as follows :

To whom it may concern :

This will introduce

Lt. G. H. Liachovka

who is instructed to proceed to Lombardia, Piemonte and Liguria Regions to contact and assemble Russian civilians and POWs,. Any assistance which can be given him by Allied or Italian officials will be appreciated.

signed (by a Russian Colonel)

In the back of the booklet was a loose page intended for use as a vehicle permit which said in effect :

The vehicle has been assigned for his official use.

3. Having received no previous instructions in regard to a matter of this kind I telephoned Regional Hq. and was told by Corp. Paez, Capt. Neufeld's assistant, that he knew that a letter dealing with Russian Officers in this Region was in existence but since he could not find it he would ask Capt. Neufeld to call me.

4. I told Lt. Liachovka that I had asked for instructions from my headquarters, and that meanwhile he would be glad to provide him with mess and billets.

5. Saturday morning, I again called Regional Hq. but the letter had not yet been located.

6. Saturday afternoon I went to Milan and talked with Capt. Neufeld who said that this was a matter to be referred to the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Division. Fortunately Capt. George of this Division heard Capt. Neufeld's remark and asked if he could help me.

7. When I told Capt. George what my problem was he asked me to send the Russian Lt. to Milan as soon as possible with instructions to see him.

8. This I did Monday morning September 17. We saw very little of Lt. Liachovka while he was in Sondrio, but found him to be quiet and pleasant. We told him that our Questore informed us that there were only seven Russian nationals in the Province. He thought there were more, and we told him he might discuss the subject with the Questore. No effort was made to limit or to observe his activities while he was here.

9. Lt. Liachovka told us that he had come from Bergamo where his car had broken down. He thought it would require about three days to repair the car. He had come to Sondrio by private car. (I did not inquire as to whose car he came in).

10. He also said that he had spent some time at Brescia where the 361st Regiment (this is from memory) had been exceedingly helpful to him, providing him with bed, board, and transportation.

11. This gentleman is, I should say from 25 to 35 years of age, about 5 ft. 7 in. tall, weight about 160 lbs. blonde with blue eyes, ruddy complexion and a quiet, pleasant, relaxed manner. He wore American woolens and his insignia consisted of epaulets bearing three pink stars. He carried an American field jacket (old type). His only baggage that I saw was a small black valise bound with tan leather, about 15 in. long.

1. The investigation of this incident was delayed because of difficulty experienced in interviewing you and members of your party who were involved.
2. The final report of the investigating authorities shows that your car approached the Military Police post travelling at 50-60 miles per hour, at which speed recognition was, naturally, impossible. Your car did not stop when signalled to do so by the Military Policeman on duty at the post. In an effort to enforce compliance with his signals, the Military Policeman therefore fired several shots.
3. It is requested that, in order to avoid such incidents, you should ensure that your driver complies with signals made to him by Military Police in the course of their duties.

3. We would like to point out that this officer is not a recognised member of the Russian Mission and this is the first time his name has been brought to our attention.

1. Reference is made to my letter 799/14/20 of 2 May 45 on the subject of visits of Russian officers to Army areas and POW Camps. This letter laid down definite conditions under which members of the Russian Military Mission could travel in Fifth and Eighth Army areas and visit POW camps.

2. This HQ has now received a letter from AMHQ pointing out that during the month of July 45 the following officers were in UMBRE Province, then Eighth Army area, without proper authority :-

Colonel RIUMIN
Major ROSOV
Lieut. LETOVED
Lieut. RANOV
Lieut. GIGALIN
Lieut. SEMITALEN
Lieut. MIRAJI

In addition to one Lieut. Colonel whose name is not known.

With the exception of Colonel RIUMIN, there is no record that the officers listed above have proper authority to be in Italy at all.

3. The Supreme Allied Commander requires a full explanation as to why Russian officers were in UMBRE Province (Eighth Army area) during July and a report as to how and when the officers listed became attached to the Russian Mission and the authority under which they entered Italy.

4. It is requested that a complete letter of explanation be submitted to this HQ at your earliest convenience.

Clause 6 of the Agreement of II.2.45

"Ex prisoners of war and civilian subjects of each of the signatories to this Agreement can be used, before their repatriation, for the administration and maintenance of order in the camps or reception centres where they are located. They also can be used, on a volunteer basis, for such work in the proximity of the camps as agreed upon between the competent Soviet and British authorities. The question of retribution and of other working conditions must be determined upon agreement between these authorities. It is understood that the utilization of liberated members of the respective Armed Forces will take place according to military regulations and under the supervision of the respective officers."

1. The following is forwarded for information:-

(A) French Liaison Officers.

French Liaison Officers have now been withdrawn from Aosta and Turin Provinces, but still remain in TENDA (Cuneo Province).

(B) French Military Mission - Repatriation of Allied Nationals

A French Military Mission, resident at the Allied National Camp, Turin, which camp is controlled by Displaced Persons and Repatriation Subcommittee, deals with the entry of Italians and other nationals into France. Members of the Mission visit Montcalieri Camp weekly to deal with applications but the results are unsatisfactory in that repatriation of Italians to France appears to be at a standstill.

(C) Russian Military Mission

The Russian Military Mission, which was operating recently in Cuneo Province (see this Hq PR/ESO/126.1 dated 28 Aug 45) withdrew on the 31 August 45 for a destination believed to be Russian POW Camp, BRESCIA GHEDI. In the event of the return of the Mission to territory of this Region, action will be taken as directed by Hq 2 District.

1. Reference is made to the 29 August interview between Supreme Allied Commander and Gen. Basilov.

2. At this interview the Supreme Commander agreed to transmit to General McCreery the request of General Basilov to enter the British Zone in Austria for the purpose of visiting Soviet citizens and discussing their repatriation.

3. A reply of following tenor has been received to this request. As General McCreery has received, through Vienna, similar requests for the admission of Russian officers to his zone, he is not prepared to accept visits from General Basilov's mission. Any further necessary action along the lines in question will therefore be taken through General McCreery's contacts with Russian officers in Vienna.

4. Kindly inform General Basilov accordingly.

At an interview on 29 August between Supreme Commander and General BASILOV latter requested permission to visit British zone in AUSTRIA. Object in view was to visit Soviet citizens in zone and discuss arrangements for their repatriation to RUSSIA. Supreme Commander stated that he was not in a position to give this authority but that he would pass the request to General MURPHY. This was done and General MURPHY now replies that he has received through VIENNA similar requests for admission of Russians officers to his zone in AUSTRIA in order to visit Russians nationals. General MURPHY is therefore not prepared to accept visits from General BASILOV's mission but will take any further action necessary through his contacts with Russian officers in VIENNA. Request you pass this information to General BASILOV.

Reference your PX 41493 of 06. Subject is russians at UDINE.

1. General BASILOV arrived UDINE on 7. He protests strongly against proposed despatch of russians to RIMINI and states he did not agree with SAC that russians would be despatched southward from UDINE. He further states no russian camp at RIMINI he wishes russians from UDINE to be despatched earliest to NEUNKIRCHEN.

2. General BASILOV states Major NOSOV is representative of russian repatriation committees and not representatives of russian military mission. NOSOV is not however in possession of permit.

3. In view of foregoing am withholding action to move Russian party to RIMINI or Major NOSOV to ROME. Grateful your earliest instructions in order to clarify present embarrassing position.

4. General BASILOV wishes russian camp to remain UDINE to stage further parties of russians stated to total several thousands to be moved from ITALY to NEUNKIRCHEN

5. COMD is anxious to relieved of this commitment and would like present encumbrance cleared within 7 days and camp closed permanently thereafter as 13 CORPS Area is not politically desirable for this purpose
