INSTRUCTIONS

1. (a) The intention of this instruction is to detail the administrative changes consequent on the reversion of No. 1 DISTRICT to control of this HQ. The change of command will be notified through General Staff channels and this instruction will become effective from the date certain passes.
- (b) This instruction involves no change in the arrangements for the maintenance of US troops.

RE-ORGANIZATION NO. 1 DISTRICT

2. The organization of No. 1 DISTRICT and the revised boundaries are shown on the sketch map at Appendix 'A'.
3. The following are in reserve:-

CONTROL OF MILITARY SPACES

4. (a) This HQ will resume full control of the military spaces, Para 6 of LIT 15B INSTRUCTION NO. 90 dated 10 April 1964 is cancelled.
- (b) This HQ will take over the military spaces from GCHQ 441.
- (c) No. 1 DISTRICT will be responsible for the local administration and control of all installations and deposits at GCHQ 441 and LIT 15B and for the operation of LIT 15B part.
- (d) Services will be responsible for maintaining deposits at GCHQ 441 and LIT 15B to the required scale (para 5).

CONTROL OF MILITARY

5. HQ 441 will ensure control of LIT 15B remains. This control will be exercised through 1 DISTRICT and will be responsible for the operation.

MAINTENANCE OF THE AREA

6. (a) LIT 15B (part) will be maintained by HQ 441 and HQ 441 will

CONTROL OF BRITISH SERVICES

- 4. (a) This HQ will retain full control of the British services. Para 6 of the DISTRICTIVE INSTRUCTION No. 59 dated 11 May 44 is cancelled.
- (b) This HQ will take over the British depots from DISTRICT HQ.
- (c) No. 1 DISTRICT will be responsible for the local administration and control of all installations and depots at AGRA and AIZWAL and for the operation of AGRA port.
- (d) Services HQ will be responsible for maintaining depot stocks at AGRA and AIZWAL to the required scale (para 8).

CONTROL OF BRITISH SERVICES

- 5. In all cases control of British services will be exercised through DISTRICT HQ who will be responsible for its operation.

MAINTENANCE OF THE SERVICES

- 6. (a) FIFTH ARMY (or 1st) will be maintained by sea through ISKRAH and by air on line 50.

Should services be maintained through AIZWAL pass to command DISTRICT HQ they will continue to be maintained through that place.

- (b) BRITISH ARMY will be maintained by rail on line 56 and 65 (AGRA-ISKRAH). RAILWAYS will be developed by British ARMY as a network.

(c) DISTRICT will maintain themselves from AGRA and AIZWAL supplemented by pack through POLITHO. Composition of this pack will be arranged direct between Services HQ and Services DISTRICT.

- 7. (a) BRITISH ARMY and FIFTH ARMY (British Element) will submit demands for rail tonnage in accordance with the procedure given in Appendix 'B', which is revised to meet the changed conditions. The period for which this procedure becomes operative will be notified later.

- (b) FIFTH ARMY (British Element) will submit demands for sea tonnage in accordance with ALL ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No 59 dated 12 May 44.

7. (c) STATION and supplies for A.M.H.A. will be submitted for five-day periods
eighteen days in advance. Resubmissions for the first three periods have
already been submitted, and supplies have been set up.

RESERVES

8. The present holdings will be increased as provided for the following:-

12 Divs.
- AMHHA..... 3 days reserves and 2 days maintenance stores for

COMMUNICATIONS

9. Channels of Communication

The normal channel of communication will be followed for all matters,
in respect of all troops within the respective Army and District boundaries, with
the following exceptions:-

- (a) 13 GROUPS will communicate direct with DISTRICT HQ on all (RS) matters
except Welfare and local leave.
- (b) British troops in 225 Area North of the AMHHA boundary will be under
command of HQ No. 1 DISTRICT for all ^{LOCAL} matters beyond the powers of
British formation etc. Resubmissions come through. Courts Martial and Summary Trial
proceedings will be sent direct to HQ No. 1 DISTRICT. For all other all
matters the normal channels of communication to HQ No. 1 DISTRICT will be
followed. HQ AMHHA letter 3008/8/4(0) dated 21 Aug 44 is hereby cancelled.

Reinforcements

Offs and Reinforcement Corps in the AMHHA railroad area will come to
command No. 1 DISTRICT. When the question of priority of allotment of reinforcements
as between areas arises, decision will be made by HQ AMH.

Evacuation of War

The normal evacuation of W through Railroad to Base Camps will be
followed except that HQ. 1 DISTRICT will make best use of sea evacuation from
AMHHA to W or HANTS.

Medical

British and Dominion troops in FIFTH ARMY will be evacuated through

The normal channel of communication will be followed for all matters, to respect of all troops within the respective zone and District boundaries, with the following exceptions:-

- (a) Troops will communicate direct with HQ, War on all (55) matters except welfare and local leave. *See Para 2*
- (b) British troops in the area North of the 11th/12th boundary will be under command of HQ No. 1 DISTRICT for all local matters beyond the powers of British formation etc. matters concerned. Further British and Auxiliary Troop formations will be sent direct to HQ No. 1 DISTRICT. For all other matters the normal channels of communication to HQ No. 1 DISTRICT will be followed. On all other 500/5/1/1. Initial 21 Aug 44 is hereby cancelled.

10. Reinforcements

CH/4 and Reinforcement Centre in the British Reinforced Area will pass to Command No. 1 DISTRICT. With the question of priority of allocation of reinforcements to British or Auxiliary, decision will be made by HQ No. 1.

11. Evacuation of War

The normal evacuation of War through Reinforced to Base Camps will be followed except that HQ No. 1 DISTRICT will make best use of new evacuation from HQ No. 1 or HQ No. 2.

12. Medical

British and Dominion troops in FIFTH ARMY will be evacuated through normal British medical channels.

Evacuation (including those in respect of troops in the area North of the 11th/12th boundary) which cannot be conveniently evacuated as above will be dealt with by US Army medical units and evacuated to British Base Hospitals under arrangements already made between HQ No. 1 and Surgeon General and HQ No. 1.

13. Communications to provide administrative instructions

This instruction superseded previous administrative instructions as follows:-

- Para 15(b) of ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 43
- Para 5(b) and (c) of ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 50.
- Para 15 to 21 (a) inclusive of ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 53.

BUILDING CONTRACTS AND SUBCONTRACTS

1. 2. There will be set up in PLAZA a headquarters to be known as HEADQUARTERS PLAZA COMPANY. It will be commanded by Colonel L.A.... ALSTON, DSO, MC, with Lt. Col. R. A. GALT, DSO, VC as deputy commander. The date on which THE KING'S PLAZA COMPANY will take over its command functions will be promulgated by Commanding General, Fifth AEF.

4. CHARACTER OF COMBINED AND ADMINISTRATION

HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED will at present be under command of Headquarters Fifth Army, or such other subordinate command as may be decided by Commanding General, Fifth Army.

5. When your boundary Fifth Army is moved north of FLORENCE, HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED will pass to command Headquarters III.

6. The administration of IS personnel belonging or attached to HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED will be conducted as follows:-

- (a) G-2 matters through Headquarters Fifth Army to Headquarters III while under command Fifth Army. Direct to Headquarters III when placed under command Headquarters III.
- (b) Supply and maintenance by Headquarters Fifth Army, while under command Fifth Army; by Commanding General, SOS N. G. USA when placed under command Headquarters III.

7. The administration of US troops and installations within FLORENCE COMBINED, other than those placed under command HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED will be the responsibility of the US formations to which they belong.

8. For purposes of British administration (A(PS) matters), HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED will be under Headquarters No 1 District. In all other British administrative matters it will be under Headquarters Fifth Army. Present and under Headquarters No 1 District when it passes to command of Headquarters III.

9. STAFF SYSTEM

HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED will be organized on the British Staff system. A Table of Organization/Staff Establishment will be published shortly.

10. The functions of HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMBINED are set out below, but may be modified by Commanding General, Fifth Army at his discretion while FLORENCE COMBINED is under his orders:-

- (a) Making all requisition on behalf of the Allied Forces.
- (b) Allocation of accommodation to the Allied Forces.

- (c) Provision of power, water and light to the Allied Forces.
- (d) Local administration, as defined in British regulation, of all British troops.
- (e) Control of military traffic.
- (f) P.A.D.
- (g) Military security
- (h) Support of civil power if called upon by AAG/ACC.
- (i) Sanitation and hygiene as affecting Allied troops.
- (j) Fire protection of military installations.
- (k) Allocation of the labour and transport resources at the disposal of HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMMAND.
- (l) Discipline of allied troops in FLORENCE

11. RELATIONS WITH AAG/ACC.

HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMMAND has no responsibility for the political affairs in FLORENCE (including Patriot affairs) nor for feeding the civil population. It will however, co-operate to the fullest extent with AAG/ACC, rendering such assistance as lies within its resources. In particular it will maintain very close liaison with AAG/ACC in regard to the following matters:-

- (a) Co-ordination of the control of civil and military traffic.
- (b) Relations between troops and the civil population.
- (c) Control of supply of electric power, water etc.
- (d) Hygiene and sanitation.

12. HEADQUARTERS 71 GARRISON

The British portion of HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMMAND is being provided by Headquarters 71 Garrison, which will retain its own title for private postal purposes.

13. C-in-C's POLICY IN REGARD TO FLORENCE

(a) The C-in-C is aware that the many objects of historical and cultural importance in FLORENCE should be safeguarded to the utmost. While he has not been prepared to declare FLORENCE an Open City, he wishes to give the enemy the maximum justification possible for attacking it by air. For this reason he does not wish troops, Military Headquarters or depots to be established within the city limits of FLORENCE, unless their presence there is operationally necessary. Under present circumstances discretion in this regard is left to Commanding General, Fifth Army, but no troops or Headquarters will be established in FLORENCE with a view to their remaining there after the city is passed to command Headquarters A.I. without the authority of this Headquarters.

(b) The C-in-C, on the other hand entirely approves of the establishment in FLORENCE of suitable arrangements for the accommodation and welfare of officers and men granted leave to visit the City. As regards sleeping accommodation for enlisted men / other ranks he does not preclude the provision of this within city limits, but he does not wish men to be dispersed in hotels and private houses where proper control cannot be exercised. While arrangements should be

While he has not been prepared to declare FLORENCE an Open City, he wishes to give the enemy the minimum justification possible for attacking it by air. For this reason he does not wish troops, military headquarters or depots to be established within the city limits of FLORENCE, unless their presence there is operationally necessary. Under present circumstances discretion in this regard is left to Commanding General, Fifth Army, but no troops or Headquarters will be established in FLORENCE with a view to their remaining there after the city is passed to command Headquarters and without the authority of this Headquarters.

(b) The C-in-C, on the other hand entirely approves of the establishment in FLORENCE of suitable arrangements for the accommodation and welfare of officers and men granted leave, to visit the City. As regards sleeping accommodation for enlisted men / other ranks he does not preclude the provision of this within city limits, but he does not wish men to be dispersed in hotels and private houses where proper control cannot be exercised. While all reasonable freedom should be conceded, sleeping arrangements should be on a territorial basis and cooking arrangements should be centralized within each group.

(c) The location of hospitals in FLORENCE is approved.

(d) The provisions of guards for historical, etc, buildings should be undertaken as far as possible by ACC/ANG, but HEADQUARTERS FLORENCE COMMAND will co-operate with ACC/ACC to the fullest extent necessary in this regard.

SCOPE OF INSTRUCTION.

1. As a result of the advance of the Allied Armies in Northern Italy and the consequent lengthening of the L of C, it has been decided to establish an Advanced Base in the BOLOGNA Area. This instruction deals with the establishment of this Advanced Base and the method by which it will be formed.

INITIAL CONTROL AND MAINTENANCE.

2. (a) Para. 12 of this HQ Admin Instr No. 43 dated 26 July, 44, is cancelled.
- (b) The formation responsible for the capture of BOLOGNA will be responsible for its control and for the maintenance of the forces based on it until the operational situation permits the assumption of this responsibility by 59 Area under instructions to be issued by this HQ.
- (c) 59 Area will come under control of the formation mentioned from the time of the occupation of BOLOGNA, and will remain under such formation during the period of the latter's responsibility for BOLOGNA. This formation will call forward any portion of 59 Area when the fall of the city appears imminent.

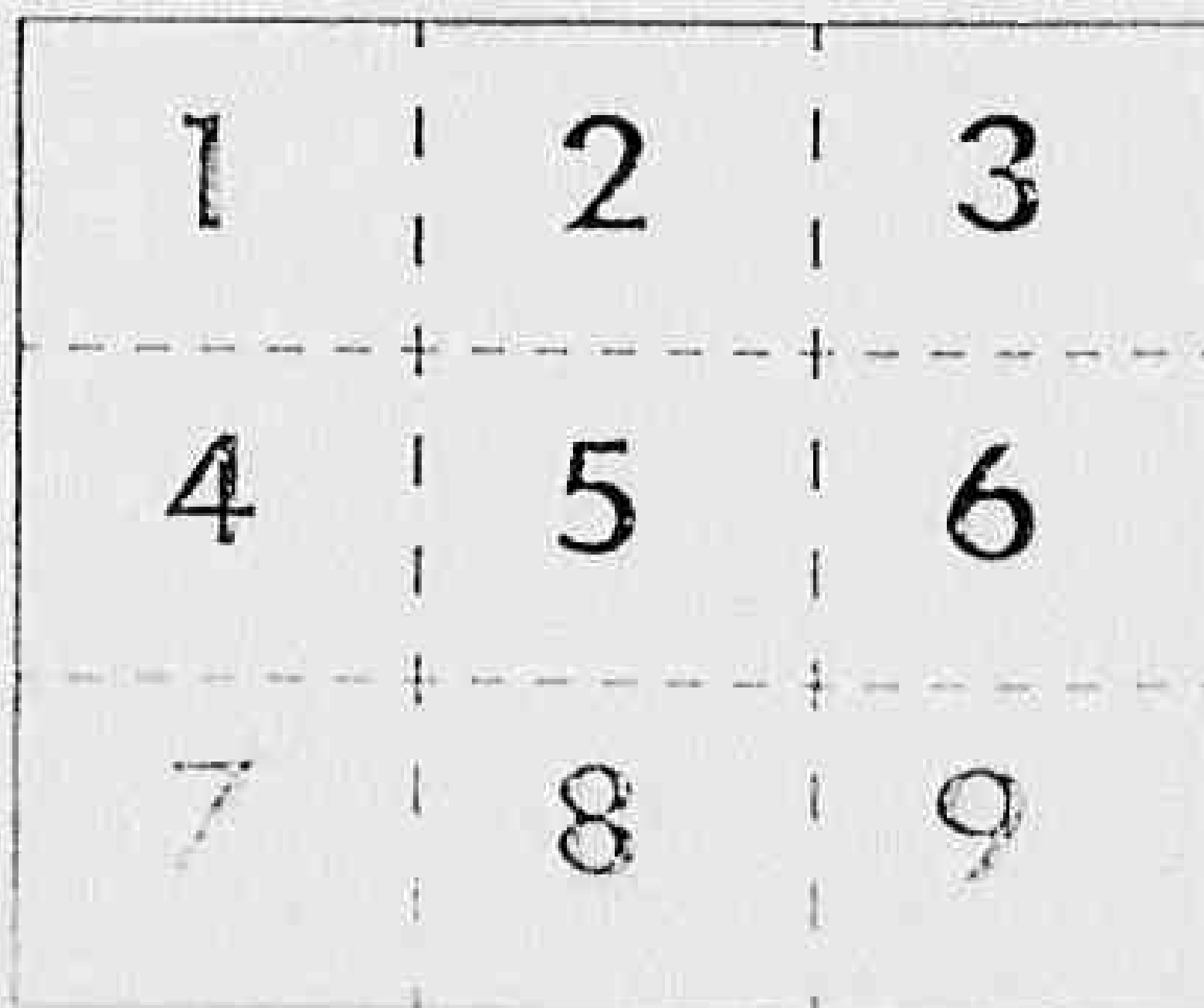
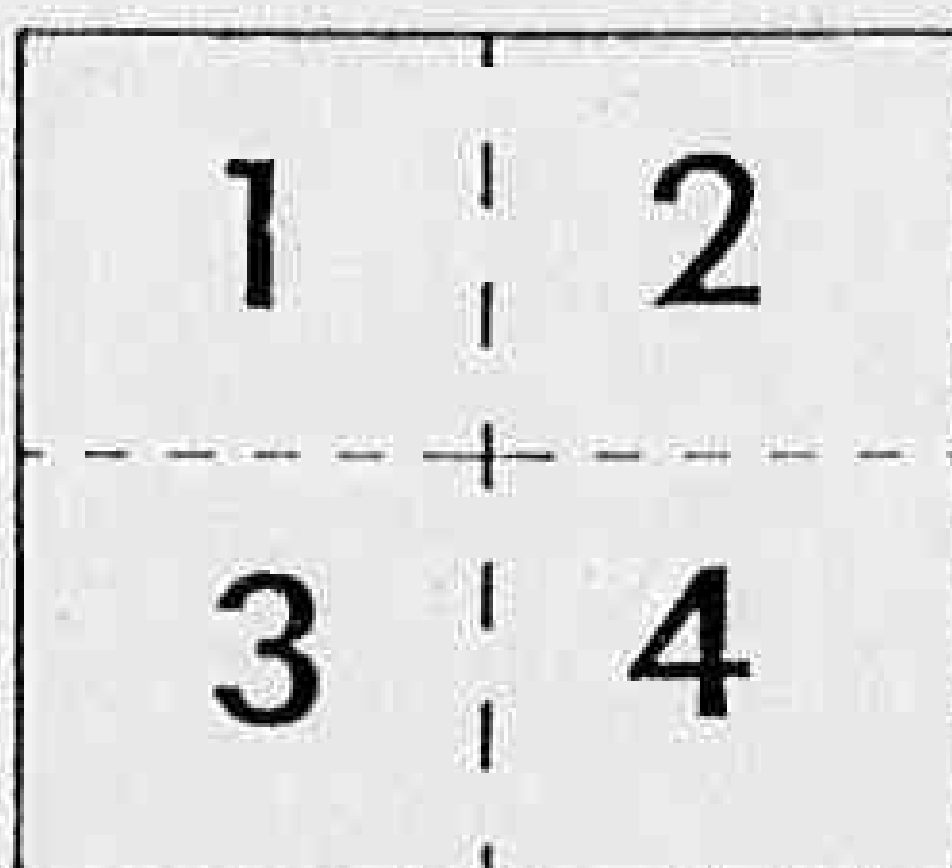
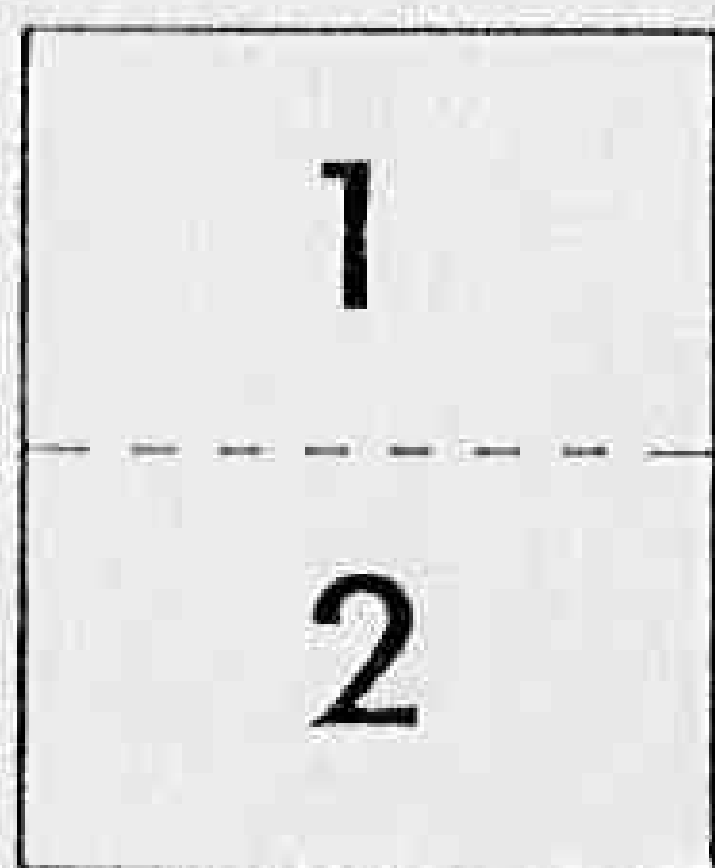

INTENTION OF THIS INSTRUCTION.

1. The intention of this instruction is to amend and amplify AAI Instr No. 43, dated 16 Jul. 44, and No. 50, dated 10 Aug. 44, consequent upon the transfer of 13 Corps to FIFTH ARMY.

MAINTENANCE OF THE ARMIES.

POWERS AND RIGHTS OF ALLIED FORCES AND ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT IN
UNOCCUPIED ITALY

This Instruction supersedes Administrative Instruction No. 4, reference
 AAL/300-1A(0) dated 15 Mar. 44.

General Policy file 125

1. Definition

For the purposes of this Instruction the term "Italian Government Territory" refers to territory forming part of ITALY, wholly and adjacent islands handed over to ITALIAN Government and jurisdiction, subject to the guidelines and instruction of the Allied Control Commission under the Chief Commissioner acting for the Commander-in-Chief, A.A.L.

2. General.

The object of this Instruction is to clarify the most important rights reserved to the Allied Forces by agreement with the ITALIAN Government, in such territory forming part of Italian Government Territory which may be handed over to the ITALIAN Government from time to time, in respect of which full powers of Government will otherwise be possessed by the ITALIAN authorities.

Apart from these reserved rights, Allied Military Government in ITALIAN Government Territory owes to an end. All Proclamations and Orders of the Military Governor and those made by his authority cease and are no longer operative; no such Proclamation or Order can be issued in the future.

Although there will be officers of the Allied Control Commission in ITALIAN Government Territory, they will be there to advise and control the ITALIAN Government, and not as Governors. One of the most important functions of the Regional and Provincial Offices of the ACC will be liaison between Allied Military formations in the area and the ITALIAN administrative officials. All but the most routine dealings between the ITALIAN administration and the Allied Military authorities must be conducted through the local ACC. When the ITALIAN Government is directly or indirectly in a control board or committee the Military may, of course, deal directly with that organization without the intervention of ACC.

For the purposes of this instruction the term "Italian Government Territory" refers to territory forming part of ITALY, directly and adjacent islands handed over to ITALIAN Government and jurisdiction, subject to the guidance and instructions of the Allied Control Commission under the prior Commander's ruling for the Commander-in-Chief, A.C.C.

2. General.

The object of this instruction is to clarify the main important rights reserved to the Allied Powers of agreement with the ITALIAN Government, in any territory forming part of Italian Government Territory which may be handed over to the ITALIAN Government from time to time, in respect of which full powers of Government will otherwise be possessed by the ITALIAN authorities.

Apart from those reserved rights, Allied Military Government in ITALIAN Government Territory ceased to be an end. All Proclamations and Orders of the Military Government and those made by his authority ceased and are no longer operative; no such Proclamation or Order can be issued in the future.

Although there will be officers of the Allied Control Commission in ITALIAN Government Territory, they will be those to advise and control the ITALIAN Government, and not its Government. One of the most important functions of the National and Provincial Officers of the ACC will be liaison between Allied Military Governments in the area and the ITALIAN administrative officials. All but the most routine dealings between the ITALIAN administration and the Allied Military authorities must be conducted through the local ACC.

When the ITALIAN Government is directly or indirectly supported on a control board or committee the Military may, of course, deal directly with that organization without the intervention of ACC.

3. Requisitioning

The Allied Powers have retained the power and right to requisition private and public property and services in ITALIAN Government Territory - this right must be exercised immediately and only for reasons of genuine military necessity. This right will be exercised through the ITALIAN authorities. If, for example, a building is needed by the Military, it should be requisitioned through the channels of the town where the building is situated, with the assistance of the Provincial Officer of the ACC. The usual formalities of requisitioning used in Military Government territory will be strictly followed in ITALIAN Government territory. The property of fascist properties, whether destroyed or not, must not be seized without giving a receipt, and then only if required for reasons of military necessity.

4. Allied Military Courts

As the Proclamation of the Military Government ceases to operate in ITALIAN

Government

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125

Government Territory, all crimes will normally be tried under ITALIAN law and in ITALIAN Courts. The Allied Forces, however, have reserved to themselves the right to hold Allied Military Courts in ITALIAN Government Territory for the trial of civilians who commit acts manifestly hostile to the Allied Forces and to punish them in accordance with the ITALIAN Penal Code.

The reservation of this right is not intended to encourage the trial of civilian offenders by Allied Courts, but to enable them to deal with the most serious offenses against Allied personnel or property which cannot be dealt with by the ITALIAN Courts. If such an offense has been committed the military authorities will give a full statement of the facts to the local representative of the AGC with the request that an Allied Military Court be convened to hear the charges. It will be the responsibility of AGC to bring the charges and constitute the Court. It is emphasized that only in the most exceptional circumstances will any case be referred to ITALIAN Government Territory to be referred to AGC Courts and then only on order of AGC.

Consent to reservation of the power to try such offenders shall be reserved to the Allied Forces the power to arrest persons who are believed to have committed such offenses. High ranking ITALIAN officials and officers of the ITALIAN Armed Forces should, however, only be arrested in collaboration with the appropriate ITALIAN official (i.e., the Prefect or the Commanding Officer of the officer concerned). In all cases of arrest the agreement of the local AGC officer will be obtained beforehand, except in an emergency, when he will be informed immediately after the arrest.

5. Military Zones.

The right is reserved by the Commander-in-Chief to declare specific areas in ITALIAN Government Territory to be Military Zones. When the issue of such a declaration, the right to exercise the powers of military government in the Zone is question becomes even more vested in the Commander-in-Chief. It is hoped that the need for the establishment of such Zones will never arise, but should the situation in any area become such as to require the limited Commander that such action is necessary, he should, after consulting the Regional Commander, report accordingly to AGC giving full reasons to justify his view. The Allied Forces may also recognize any part of ITALIAN territory, but the right to constitute a Military Zone will render it unnecessary to exercise this right in respect of any local disorders.

6. Military and Civilian Jurisdictions

The Allied Forces may continue to hold or require the ITALIAN Government to hold in custody military or civilian internees in ITALIAN Government Territory. If the Allied Forces require to arrest any person for security or other reasons such arrest should be carried out in collaboration with ITALIAN officials unless, in any particular case, it is thought that a request to the ITALIAN police to arrest a suspect would be ineffective. In all cases cases the local

5. Military Zones.

The right is reserved by the Commander-in-Chief to declare specific areas in ITALIAN Government Territory to be Military Zones. Upon the issue of such a declaration, the right to exercising the powers of military government in the Zone in question becomes also vested in the Commander-in-Chief. It is hoped that the need for the establishment of such Zones will never arise, but should the situation in any area become such as to convince the District Commander that such action is necessary, he should, after consulting the Regional Director, report accordingly to the AEC giving full reasons to justify his view. The Allied Forces may also re-occupy any part of ITALIAN territory, but the right to constitute a Military Zone will render it unnecessary to exercise this right in respect of any local disorders.

6. Military and Civilian Internments

The Allied Forces may continue to hold or require the ITALIAN Government to hold in custody military or civilian internees in ITALIAN Government Territory. If the Allied Forces require to arrest any person for security or other reasons such arrest should be carried out in collaboration with ITALIAN officials unless, in any particular case, it is thought that a request to the ITALIAN police to arrest a suspect would be ineffective. In all such cases the local AEC officer must, except in emergency, be informed of the intention to make the arrest, whether it is to be effected by the Allied or ITALIAN authorities. If he is not in agreement, the matter will be referred to higher authority. Normally such persons will be detained in 571 PS Camp.

7. Use of Troops in Aid of the Civil Power.

It may happen that the local ITALIAN authorities may ask for the assistance of Allied troops in quelling civil disturbances.

If such a request is made the local commander will point out that the quelling of civilian riots or disturbances is a matter for the ITALIAN Administration and he will refuse such assistance, unless he is of the opinion that it is necessary for the protection of Allied military interests. Furthermore, before rendering such assistance the local commander will warn the local official requesting his assistance that the territory in question will be made fortifiable in Allied Military Zone (see para 5 above).

If the points the local controller will consult the local AOC officer and such instruction that his reporting Commission before giving instructions; in any event he will inform his Superior Commander of any request made to him and the action taken thereon without delay.

8. Process in Italian Courts

No member of the Allied Forces may be presented or sued in Italian Courts.

9. Emergency Action

It is appreciated that an emergency may arise which requires immediate action by the Allied Forces for their protection and security, but except in such emergency all action required from the Italian Administration should invariably be taken through the medium of the local or Provincial Commission. Where immediate action is taken without previous reference to AOC for emergency reasons, the appropriate AOC officer will be informed as soon as possible.

10. Assistance to Italian Authorities

Apart from the powers and rights described above, it should be remembered that the transfer of territory to the Italian Government is made as part of the policy of the Allied Governments.

It is the duty of all Allied officers to assist the central and local Government authorities in acquiring and maintaining authority, not to avoid transactions, acts which may undermine the authority of the police, the Gendarmerie or the prefects.

MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE FOR FORWARD ITALIAN PORTS

GENERAL

1. This instruction defines the procedure to be followed for maintenance through forward ports in ITALY. Maintenance will be derived from the following sources:-

- (a) Direct loadings from UK/USA.
- (b) Direct loadings from ME/MA.
- (c) Outloadings from ITALY.

In order to minimize the strain on port acceptance capacity and to avoid double handling, all possible tonnages will be set up from outside ITALY. Any reasonable inconvenience caused thereby will be accepted in view of the overall saving.

- (a) Long Term Maintenance.

this port will be fixed by this Headquarters from time to time. For planning purposes it may be assumed that the amount of British tonnage required will be 1,200 tons per day on opening, rising to 2,000 tons per day later. British resources to handle this tonnage will be placed at the disposal of F.B.S. These figures for British tonnage do not include supplies for HULL ALM LASH. Commanding General, F.B.S., after investigation into the position at LASHORH regarding availability of civilian stevedores, etc, will report to this Headquarters and to Headquarters S.O.S. MATONS, what additional resources, if any, he requires to enable him to develop the port to the discharge capacities mentioned above.

PIONING is being operated by FIFTH ARMY. The amount of British tonnage required through this port at present has been fixed at 800 tons per day, but this will be increased to 1,200 tons per day from 10 August 1944. The quantities out of these amounts available to EIGHTH ARMY are as follows:-

SAL STEELING will continue to be used for the import of bulk petrol until suitable arrangements for this are available at LASHORH.

CIVITAVECCHIA is being operated by F.B.S. for supply to FIFTH ARMY, Air Forces and Allied Control Commission. It is intended to close CIVITAVECCHIA as a military port when LASHORH has been developed. It will probably be required subsequently for the import of civil supplies by Allied Control Commission, in which case HQ

be increased to 1,200 tons per day from 10 August 1944. The quantities out of these amounts available to EIGHTH ARMY are as follows:-

18,000 tons up to 5 August 1944.
900 tons per day thereafter.

The balance of the British tonnage at BOMBINO is required for maintenance of British troops in FIFTH ARMY. When LAMHORN is available to receive British tonnage the quantities scheduled for BOMBINO will be discharged there. BOMBINO will be closed down when LAMHORN has been in operation for sufficient time to permit the accumulation of adequate stocks. The decision as to when this is to take place will be made by FIFTH ARMY with P.B.S.

SAN SEPIAMO will continue to be used for the import of bulk petrol until suitable arrangements for this are available at LAMHORN.

CIVITAVECCHIA is being operated by P.B.S. for supply to FIFTH ARMY, Air Forces and Allied Control Commission. It is intended to close CIVITAVECCHIA as a military port when LAMHORN has been developed. It will probably be required subsequently for the import of civil supplies by Allied Control Commission, in which case HQ Allied Control Commission will be required to take over full responsibility for its operation.

ANCONA will be British operated and will be developed for the discharge of 2,500 tons per day initially, 4,500 tons per day eventually. Instructions for the development of ANCONA have been issued in HQ ALLIED ARMIES IN ITALY Administrative Instruction No.32 dated 18 June 1944.

RAVENNA is estimated to have a capacity of 1,000 tons per day, but it is possible that the enemy may be able to deny the use of it to us by blocking and demolition. The development of RAVENNA and of any other minor/...

minor port between ANCONA and the mouth of the RIVER PO is left to EIGHTH ARMY who will communicate their requirements for transportation units for this purpose to this Headquarters. Other resources required will have to come from those already allotted to EIGHTH ARMY. It is unlikely that any operational landing craft will be available.

SP2221A is primarily a Naval port. There are no present plans for the use of SP2221A or of other ports further West for the discharge of military supplies. If it proves desirable to open any of these ports, Commanding General, P.B.S., will be asked to do so, but the tonnage capacity which he will be asked to meet will be in deduction of that to which he is committed at LEGHORN.

Supply of Food to Italian Civilians

2. 1. 1. Recd

1. This instruction cancels HQ AAI letters 1047/4/3 dated 24 May 44 and 20 Jun 44, respectively.

2. Authority is given to provide food, as hereafter provided, during each shift of eight hours or more for Italian civilians performing heavy labor for the benefit of the Allied Forces. The authority is applicable to civilians employed directly by the Allied Army, Naval and Air Forces and by contractors on their behalf and industry operating for the Allied Forces.

RESPONSIBILITY.

3. Army, Base Section, District and Area or equivalent Commanders will be responsible for the provision of the facilities necessary to prepare and serve meals where the employee works directly for Allied Armed Forces and in conjunction with AOC to assure proper disposition of supplementary ration cards for purchase of additional food as hereafter referred to.

RATION SCALES.

4. (a) In consequence of the two basic Ration Scales for civilians now applicable in Italy, it is necessary to have two different scales for the Midshift Meal and Supplemental Rations. These have been calculated so that the sum of the Basic Scale plus Supplemental rations are the same irrespective of the part of Italy in which the worker is employed. Given below are the details for Midshift Meal and Supplemental Rations for:-

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8. (a) The provision of flour element shall be referred to in para 4 Part I will be an AOC responsibility under central arrangements. Bread making ingredients other than flour will be provided by AOC on demand, when available, in the same manner as flour. There may be initial difficulties in the supply of certain items, in which case the supply of bread will be left to the discretion of the Army, Base Section, District, Area or equivalent commander. Baking of the bread will be the responsibility of the Services. Detailed issues of flour made from service stocks will be replaced by HQ AOC. For this purpose Army, Base Section and District or equivalent commanders will present a consolidated monthly total of the amount issued to HQ AOC who will arrange immediate replacement. The dehydrated soup will be supplied by AOC. If service stocks are used, replacement will be in the same manner as for flour.
- (b) The supply to the normal civilian channel of the food referred to in para 4 Part II will be the responsibility of HQ AOC.

FRESH VEGETABLES.

9. Provision of fresh vegetables will be the responsibility of the Services from local resources under existing arrangements, requirements being demanded and accounted for by the Services concerned through regular channels.

PAYMENT.

10. (a) There will be deducted from daily wages an amount equivalent to the cost of the food furnished under para 4 Part I. This amount will be as follows :-

HQ AAI ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 38 (Issued in conjunction with HQ AAI Administrative Instruction No. 35 dated 28 Jun 44)

1. SCOPE OF INVESTIGATION

(a) This instruction lays down the general policy for the maintenance of the Allied troops in the Rome Area and such other troops outside the boundaries of the ROME Area which may from time to time be placed under ROME Area for maintenance.

(b) Details in connection with the implementation of this general policy are the responsibility of ROME Area in conjunction with services at this HQ or Base Section concerned.

2. ADMINISTRATION AND MAINTENANCE (US)

(a) The administration of US personnel belonging or attached to HQ ROEZ Allied Area Command will be conducted as follows:-

- (1) 3-3 matters to HQ AAI
- (11) Supply and maintenance by Peninsular Base Section.

(b) The administration of US troops and installations within the FCM/E Area, other than those forming part of HQ ROME Allied Area Command, will be the responsibility of the US formations to which they belong i.e., FIFTH ARMY or Peninsular Base Section.

1. ADJUTANT GENERAL'S BRANCH (BRIEFING)

Channel of communication for all AG matters will be through HQ 3 District except that all matters of policy concerning the administration of ROME Area will be referred to HQ AG.

4. MAINTENANCE (BRITISH TROOP) (80001)

(a) Maintenance requirements for British troops (other than 6083)

2. ADMINISTRATION AND MAINTENANCE (US)

(a) The administration of US personnel belonging or attached to HQ ROME Allied Area Command will be conducted as follows:-

- (i) D-1 matters to HQ AAI
- (ii) Supply and maintenance by Peninsular Base Section.

(b) The administration of US troops and installations within the ROME Area, other than those forming part of HQ ROME Allied Area Command, will be the responsibility of the US formations to which they belong i.e., FIFTH ARMY or Peninsular Base Section.

3. ADJUTANT GENERAL'S BRANCH (BRITISH)

Channel of communication for all AG matters will be through HQ District except that all matters of policy concerning the administration of ROME Area will be referred to HQ AAI.

4. MAINTENANCE (British Troops)

(a) Maintenance requirements for British troops (other than ⁶⁰³³ will be obtained from base depots by rail, up to and including deliveries 9 Jul, to MINTURNO. Deliveries from 10 Jul onwards will be made to TOR SANTIENZA.

(b) Responsibility for clearing railheads rests with ROME Area.

(c) Demands for maintenance or the responsibility of ROME Area. Detailed instructions are at Appendix 'A'.

5. POL.

(a) Until Line 90 is open to ROME, MT 80 is being ferried by road centers from pipe head TERRACINA at Rate of 24,000 Gallons per day. Belonging items and additional requirements MT 80 in barrels are being drawn from ANZIO depots.

(b) When Line 90 is open to ROME, Fuel oil and DERY for Lower Station and MT 80 for WD requirements will be sent in Rail Cisterns.

 - (d) The supplying agencies will supply MOVWIT with their loading programmes showing depots from which stores will be provided. MOVWIT will inform supplying agencies by what time and in what time and in what form this information is required.
 - (e) MOVWIT will then produce a rail programme to cover the complete seven-day period, and issue to all concerned.
 - (f) Any alteration to the pack or rail programme during the seven-day period required by ROME ALLIED AREA COMMAND will be notified by then direct to the supplying agencies concerned. MOVWIT and this HQ. Requests for alterations must be received at least 3 days before delivery.

(a) ROME ALLIED AREA COMMAND will submit their tonnage demands for seven-day periods to reach MOVWIT (Movements; AIRTRANS ITALY) and "Q" Branch this HQ eight days in advance of each seven day period. Annexure 1 gives a suggested proforma for the submission of these demands.

(b) By the same date as in (a) above, Services of ROME ALLIED AREA COMMAND will submit direct to Services at this HQ, with copies to supplying agencies, their detailed breakdowns the tonnage allotted at (a) above.

(c) Services at this HQ will then issue executive supply orders to the supplying agencies after consultation with Q (Mov).

(d) The supplying agencies will supply MOVWIT with their loading programmes showing depots from which stores will be provided. MOVWIT will inform supplying agencies by what time and in what time and in what form this information is required.

(e) MOVWIT will then produce a rail programme to cover the complete seven-day period, and issue to all concerned.

(f) Any alteration to the pack or rail programme during the seven-day period required by ROME ALLIED AREA COMMAND will be notified by then direct to the supplying agencies concerned. MOVWIT and this HQ. Requests for alterations must be received at least 3 days before delivery is required at RH - five days notice should be given wherever possible.

7. Existing installations of 10th AFHQ, Eighth AFHQ and Peninsular Base Section now within the above area will be permitted to remain there until no longer required by those formations.

COMMITTEE OF COMMAND AND ADMINISTRATION

8. HQ RCEC Allied Area Command will be under command of HQ 14th.

9. The administration of 10th AFHQ (or) 10th AFHQ will be under command of HQ 14th. The administration will be conducted as follows:-

- (a) 2-4 matters to HQ 14th.
- (b) Supply and maintenance by Peninsular Base Section.

10. The administration of 10th AFHQ and installations within the RCEC area, other than those forming part of HQ 10th AFHQ Area Command, will be the responsibility of the HQ 10th AFHQ (or) 10th AFHQ, which they belong, 10th AFHQ, FIFTH

HQ or Peninsular Base Command.

11. For purposes of British administration, HQ ROCE Allied Area Command will be under HQ 3 District.

STAFF SYSTEM

12. HQ ROCE Allied Area Command will be organized on the US Staff System. A table of Organization/War Establishment is awaiting approval by AFHQ.

13. There will also be incorporated within HQ ROCE Allied Area Command certain specially British Staff Branches and Services to carry out the functions of administration of British troops, as laid down in paragraph 4 above. These Branches and Services will work under the Deputy Commander, subject to the overriding authority of the Commanding General on matters of Allied policy and internal discipline.

RELATIONS WITH ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

14. When the administration of ROCE is finally handed over to the Italian Government and the minimum of control is retained by the Allied Military Authorities, the officials exercising that control will operate directly under the Chief Commissioner, Allied Control Commission. HQ ROCE Allied Area Command will then have no responsibility for civil administration, except that of co-operation.

15. In the present stage, however, it is recognized that the administration of the City must depend in large measure on the military administration. This surveillance concerns such matters as the preservation of law and order, the control of traffic, the rehabilitation and upkeep of public utilities, the rationing of electric power, water, etc, and many other aspects of administration.

- (c) CG ROME Allied Area Command will consult Regional Commissioner, ROME, on all matters of policy, and will take no action involving policy without such prior consultation. In the same way, Regional Commissioner, ROME, will consult CG ROME Allied Area Command before taking any action involving policy.
- (d) Any matters of major policy or difficulty will be referred to this HQ.
- (e) Regional Commissioner, ROME, will receive detailed direction regarding methods for the execution of policy from Chief Commissioner, Allied Control Commission.
- (f) CG ROME Allied Area Command will leave to Regional Commissioner, ROME, responsibility for the execution of policy once it has been determined, and will only intervene if he considers that the policy itself is in question.

HQ 59 AREA

17. HQ 59 Area will remain in ROME until CG ROME Allied Area Command notifies this HQ that its presence there is no longer necessary because its functions have been taken over by this HQ. It will then be withdrawn.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO 2

ADMINISTRATION OF CIVILIAN INTERNEES

1. GENERAL

The following instruction deals with the administration of civilian internees in ITALY and will be read in conjunction with this HQ letter reference ACSE/1401/7/G1(b) dated 2 Feb 44, (not to all addressees). Civilian internees will continue to be a military responsibility.

2. STATUS

Civil internees are not covered by the terms of the Geneva Convention. They will continue to be a military responsibility in the GCE. The policy will be to accord them ordinary humane treatment and make adequate provision for their accommodation, feeding, clothing, hygiene and exercise.

3. PAY

Internees are not entitled to pay.

4. CANTEEN AMENITIES

Internees are not entitled to any canteen amenities.

5. RATIONS

PW scale of rations will be issued.

6. CLOTHING

(a) the provision of clothing and necessities for civilian internees is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees, however, who are in need and unable to provide their requirements from their own resources, may be supplied free with essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the Scale detailed in Table D, Appendix VI, War Clothing Regs 1943.

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2. STATUS

Civil internees are not covered by the terms of the Geneva Convention. They will continue to be a military responsibility in the CIG. The policy will be to accord them ordinary humane treatment and make adequate provision for their accommodation feeding, clothing, hygiene and exercise.

3. PAY

Internees are not entitled to pay.

4. CANTINE AMENITIES

Internees are not entitled to any canteen amenities.

5. RATIONS

PW scale of rations will be issued.

6. CLOTHING

(a) the provision of clothing and necessities for civilian internees is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees, however, who are in need and unable to provide their requirements from their own resources, may be supplied free with essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the Scale detailed in Table D, Appendix VI, War Clothing Regs 1943.

(b) Demands for clothing will be made through normal OS channels. All items will be supplied from army stocks with the exception of caps, greatcoats, jackets and trousers. These articles will be obtained by the ADOS concerned under arrangements to be made by DDO3, HQ AAJ (Adm Ech).

(c) All articles of clothing will be entered in an account kept by the Commandant, Internee Camp and issue will be supported by a receipt signed by the internee. On transfer from one camp to another, articles supplied from the camp stores which are not considered essential for retention will be withdrawn, conditioned and put into stock for re-issue.

7. POSTAL

The following postal facilities for private mail will be granted to internees.

(a) Internees may send the number of letters normally permitted for military PW (2 letters or 1 letter and 1 postcard, or two postcards weekly, both of which may NOT be posted on the same day), to addresses in that part of Allied occupied ITALY where civil postal facilities are available (i.e. South of the Northern boundaries of the provinces of BARI, POTENZA and SALERNO, including the enclave of NAPLES city).

Confidential

- (b) Mail will not be accepted for destinations in Italy, or anywhere overseas other than SICILY or SARDINIA.
- (c) All such mail will be despatched by the Commandant of the Internee Camp to the Forward Control, HQ IAI (Adm Ech).
- (d) Free postal services will be extended to internees. A supply of envelopes bearing the words: "CIVILIAN INTERNEE MAIL FREE POSTAGE" in English and Italian will be supplied by HQ ACC to the Commandant Internee Camp for distribution.
- (e) Families of internees may write to the latter the normal number of letters allowed in the case of military PW, (see para 10.1.1) provided they live in that part of Allied occupied ITALY, SICILY, and SARDINIA, where civil postal facilities exist.
- (f) Incoming mail will be accepted post free provided it is addressed to "374 PW Camp, ~~Security Branch~~". This incoming mail will be scrutinised by the Commandant in accordance with normal PW practice.
- (g) Detailed arrangements with the Italian postal authorities will be made by HQ ACC, Security Branch.

8. CHARGE OF COMBAND

Commandant 374 PW Camp will deal direct with GSI(b) HQ IAI on all matters concerning the security of the internees, releases, admissions and visitors.

LOCAL RESOURCES IN ITALY - BALKANS AND THAI

1. Further to AAI Administrative Instruction No. 1 and with special reference to para 2, the following procedure will be adopted, as far as local conditions permit, by:-

AFIN (ITALIAN) BOARD
 AFIR (SINHALESE) BOARD
 AFIR (SINHALESE) BOARD

in order to co-ordinate the procurement and allocation of local resources within the territory under command HQ AAI.

2. This co-ordination will be performed by the Local Resources Section of this HQ. This Staff Section is responsible to the GAC, through the H/230 or H/231, for carrying out the policies laid down by this HQ or by AFHQ. It may correspond with and receive instructions from Allied Force Local Resources Section, AFHQ, direct in matters of a technical nature as laid down in AAI Administrative Memorandum No. 7 of 13 Nov 43.

Generally, this Section will supervise the activities of the three Boards in their respective territories and will co-ordinate their relations with one another and with HQ AAI.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions, as applied to commodities/materials required by the Procurement Services and Agencies of the Allied and Co-belligerent Powers, will be adopted in all communications regarding local resources:-

- (a) STOCKS. Stocks of a commodity/material in short supply, located in civilian hands, required by the Allied or Co-belligerent Powers, will be procured by AFHQ/AAC if so requested by the appropriate Committee of the Local Resources Board concerned, i.e., direct procurement by civilians will be prohibited.
- (b) CONTROLLED ITEMS are those the allocation of which to between all consumers, military and civilian, must be made by the appropriate Local Resources Board, or by a duly authorized Committee of that Board.
- (c) RESTRICTED ITEMS are those which can only be procured by the Allied

this HQ - this Staff Section is responsible to the HQ, through the G/Sec or HQS, for carrying out the policies laid down by this HQ as by AFHQ. It will coordinate with and receive instructions from Allied Forces Local Sourcing Section, AFHQ, direct or actions of a technical nature as laid down in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 7) of 11 Nov 43.

Generally, this Section will supervise the activities of the teams working in their respective territories and will coordinate their relations with the other and with HQ AFHQ.

3. DEFINITIONS

The following definitions, as applied to commodities/materials required by the Procurement Services and Services of the Allied and Co-Intelligent Bureau, will be adopted in all correspondence regarding local procurement:

(a) STOCKS. Stocks of a commodity/material in short supply, located in civilian hands, required by the Allied or Co-Intelligent Bureau, will be retained by AFHQ/Allied if so requested by the appropriate Committee of the Local Sourcing Board constituted, i.e., direct procurement by civilians will be prohibited.

(b) COMMODITIES. Items are those the allocation of which to between all categories, military and civilian, must be made by the appropriate Local Sourcing Board, or by a duly authorized Committee of that Board.

(c) RESTRICTED items are those which can only be procured by the Allied and Co-Intelligent Bureau after the essential needs of the civilian population have been met. Available supplies, within the territory, will be declared and allocated by the Board, or by a duly authorized Committee of the Board.

(d) UNRESTRICTED items are those in sufficient supply to meet both military and civilian needs, and, consequently, not included as either COMMODITIES or RESTRICTED.

Schedules of COMMODITIES and RESTRICTED items will be issued through Command Channels on the recommendation of the Board concerned and will be circulated, in triplicate, by each board to the other two boards. Separate lists of COMMODITIES and RESTRICTED items will be maintained in respect of each Committee established. Such schedules will bear a serial number, and every item in a schedule will also bear a running serial number. They will be frequently reviewed by the Committee, presented and every effort will be made to keep the lists as small as possible.

An item declared RESTRICTED or CONTROLLED in one territory need not necessarily be either controlled or restricted in another.

2/..... PROCEDURE:

5. PROCEDURE

The following procedure in connection with allocations will be adopted:-

(i) Applications for controlled and restricted items in regular demand will be submitted by interested Services and Agencies monthly on a day to be fixed, but not less than 72 hours before the date of meeting of the Local Committee Board or of the Committee concerned, as the case may be. Such limitation for civil requirements will be submitted by HQ AOC.

At the same time the organization responsible for the submission of figures of availabilities will issue particulars.

Applications for items not in regular demand, or emergency requirements, may be submitted at any time.

(ii) Applications will be submitted in duplicate on a proforma similar to that at Appendix "A". The stock on hand will be listed together with the estimated days of supply. To aid in assessing priorities, applications will indicate whether requirements are:-

- (a) Urgent operational
- (b) Normal maintenance
- (c) Stockpiling requirements

(iii) After allocation by the Board/Committee, the Board will issue release orders, in duplicate, signed by a Vice-Chairman, Chairman, where necessary, by AGC/AGS or other appropriate agency, to the Issuing Service or Agency, copy to AOC or other controlling agency. Any release not drawn within the specified period will be cancelled.

(iv) When Services or Procurement Agencies are unable otherwise to obtain stocks of items required by them which are manufactured by, or held under, the control of, a particular Service or Agency, the Board or Committee concerned may direct that such stocks will be held either in whole or part pending allocation. Such allocation will be effected by the issue of an official Release Note issued by a Vice-Chairman of the Board. This authority does not extend to the case of items imported from outside the command by Services or military stores.

6. In general, when assessing the relative priorities of demands for controlled or restricted items, the following table should be used as a guide:-

- (iii) After allocation by the Board/Committee, the Board will issue release orders in duplicate, signed by a Vice-Chairman, undersigned, where necessary, by AGO/ADG or other appropriate agency, to the Executive Service or Agency, copy to AGO or other controlling agency. Any release not given within the specified period will be forfeited.
- (iv) When Services or Procurement Agencies are unable otherwise to obtain stocks of items required by them which are manufactured by, or held under the control of, a particular Service or Agency, the Board or Committee concerned may direct that such stocks will be made either in whole or part pending allocation. This allocation will be evidenced by the issue of an official Release Note signed by a Vice-Chairman of the Board. This authority does not extend to the case of items required from outside the command by Services in military theatre.

6. In general, when assessing the relative priorities of demands for CONTROLLED or RESTRICTED items, the following table should be used as a guide:-

All proposals for acquisition of RESTRICTED or CONTROLLED items approved by any one of the three Boards will first be referred to the local Inshore Section, like 10, etc., for approval, will issue the appropriate release instruction to HQ AGO.

7. SURPLUS STOCKS

Stocks surplus to requirements under priorities 1 and 2 (para 6 above) of items appearing in lists of CONFISCATED and RESEIZED items issued through the intermediary of another Board, will be notified to the Interested Board on proforma as Appendix "A", with two copies to Local Resources Section, this HQ.

Interested Boards will notify their demands, in duplicate, for such items direct to Local Resources Section, this HQ, stating the purposes for which the items are required. Local Resources Section will collate such demands and make allocations between Boards as necessary.

Surplus stocks of items not appearing in any CONFISCATED or RESEIZED lists, but which might possibly be of interest to other Boards, should also be promptly notified to Local Resources Section, this HQ, in duplicate.
