Thank you for your letter of 13 May 1945 and I appreciate that the closing down of your Region at this time leaves you with the feeling of a job uncompleted. However, I have drawn the attention of the Chief Financial Adviser particularly to the finance matters which need special attention and feel sure you will have every assistance.

I have also received your further letter of 15 May 1945 and your complaint that territory is often handed back to the Italian Government with insufficient notice is to some extent justified. It is not due to any omission that longer notice is not given, as almost invariably some factor arises militating against this. It may be due to a political reason, or a direction from higher authority, but whatever it is, it so often takes in a rush. I am bound to say, however, I subscribe to the view that the notice should never be long as the Italian administration will not pull its weight until it has to. Your criticism is no new one and I shall bear it in mind when the time comes to hand back some of the Northern territories, whose turn it will be next.

My dear *Brigadier*

Region V is dead and the effects of its last Will and Testament are being disposed of as rapidly as we can manage.

Closing down has been a rush job but I am satisfied with the hand-over with the exception of the Provinces of PERUGIA and TERNI. As I mentioned when I saw you last week, administration, from an AWC standard, had hardly begun when we came here. For instance, the Labour offices had not even been started and there were certain bad points about the Public Safety Dept. We have been here only five weeks and it was not possible in that time to put everything right.

Both myself and my Staff officers feel, therefore, a certain amount of disappointment that we have not been able to complete the job to our satisfaction, but I do know that the Prefect and his officials have been very pleased with what we have been able to accomplish while we have been here.

There are a number of *financial* ~~ancient~~ matters which have to be cleaned up, and budgets, which were rushed in when it was known we were closing down, have to be checked.

There are also a few other small matters outstanding such as handing back billets, requisitioned building, G1078 stores etc. But I hope to have everything completed within the next 10 days or so after which I will come in to see you and put myself again at your disposal.

MOVE OF REGIONAL HEADQUARTERS - MAIN BODY

1. The main body of Regional Headquarters will leave Aquila at 0730 hours on 4 April 1945.

2. Convoy will consist of 15 vehicles, four officers, 20 OR/EMs, 27 Italian soldiers and 12 Italian civilians. The convoy will be divided into two sections, A and B. Section A will leave at 0730 hours and Section B at 0830 hours. Lt W. A. ROBERTS, SA, (B), will be in charge of Section A, and Capt T. J. D. CANNON, SA, (B), will be in charge of Section B. Both officers 1/c of convoy will upon arrival at Perugia report to Major Roy for dispersal instructions.

3. Each convoy will assemble at Regional Headquarters prior to departure.

5. Discipline - Convoy

A 100-yard interval will be maintained by all vehicles in the convoys while travelling, closing up to 25 yards at halts.

6. Speed

Speed of convoy will not exceed 25 m.p.h. at any time.

7. Staging and Halts

The convoys will make a five-minute halt every hour. The stopping point for the midday meal (haversack rations) will be left to the discretion of the officer i/c, but it will not be longer than 30 minutes. Full water bottles will be taken by all personnel.

8. Petrol and Oil

The officers i/c of the convoys will assure that all vehicles have a full tank of petrol before departing and if necessary will refuel at the petrol point at Folligno. Sufficient oil for the journey will also be carried.

9. Baggage

Officers' heavy kit will be placed in the lobby of the Albergo Grande by 1400 hours on 3 April 1945 and will be clearly marked with the officer's name. Cpl Lampareys will be in charge of all officers' heavy kit. M/Os' baggage will be ready for collection by 0600 hours on 4 April 1945 at their respective billets. Sgt Russetti will be in charge of all loading.

10. Rations

All persons in Section A will breakfast at 0600 hours at their respective mess and the officers and M/Os in Section B will breakfast at 0730 hours at their respective messes. Haversack rations will be obtained for both sections by the officers i/c.

11. Stores and Equipment

All stores and stationery will be loaded on the vehicles allocated not later than 1800 hours on 3 April 1945, and a guard mounted as from that hour until the vehicles move to Regional headquarters at 0700 hours. It is the responsibility of the officers i/c to see that the above instructions are carried out. Rations will be loaded at 0600 hours 4 April 1945. Cpl Lewis will be in charge of all loading.

12. Italian Soldiers

Baggage of Italian soldiers will be collected at 0600 hours 4 April 1945 at the Italian billets. The officer in charge of the Italian detachment will be responsible for this collection and will also see to it that a haversack ration and water bottles are provided for all Italian soldiers.

13. Italian Civilians

All Italian civilians will be in front of the Bank of Napoli at 0700 hours on 4 April with all their baggage. On arriving, they will report to Capt Gansham, who will assign them to vehicles which will leave this headquarters at 0630 hours. Any civilian who is not present by 0730 hours may be left behind. Italian civilians must be prepared to eat one meal on the road. Haversack lunch must be carried by them, as none will be furnished by this command.

14. Loading List

A list of the loads to be carried by each vehicle will be prepared in triplicate, two copies to be handed to the officer or NCO i/c of each vehicle, who will be responsible for handling one copy to Maj Roy on arrival. All items are to be checked off when unloading and any discrepancies will be brought to the attention of the officer i/c of the convoy, who will in turn notify Maj Roy of the discrepancy.

15. Rear Party.

A rear party will be left at Aquila to obtain marching orders and on the property. The rear party will consist of the following 3 and 24/34. Major Mahoney will be in charge and upon completion of the above duties will proceed to Perugia.

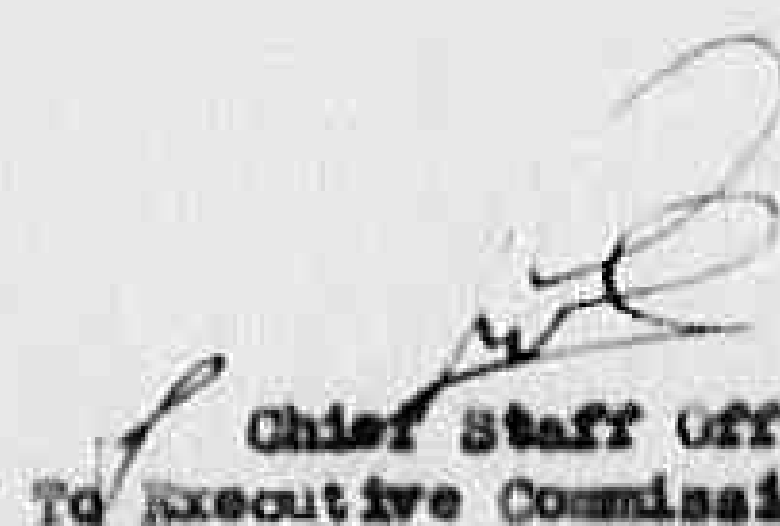

In compliance with Paragraph I, Executive Order No. 25, Headquarters, Allied Commission, dated 23 March 1945, this Region assumed, at 0100 hours on 29 March 1945, administrative control of the military government of the Umbrian compartment of Italy, comprising the provinces of Perugia and Terni. 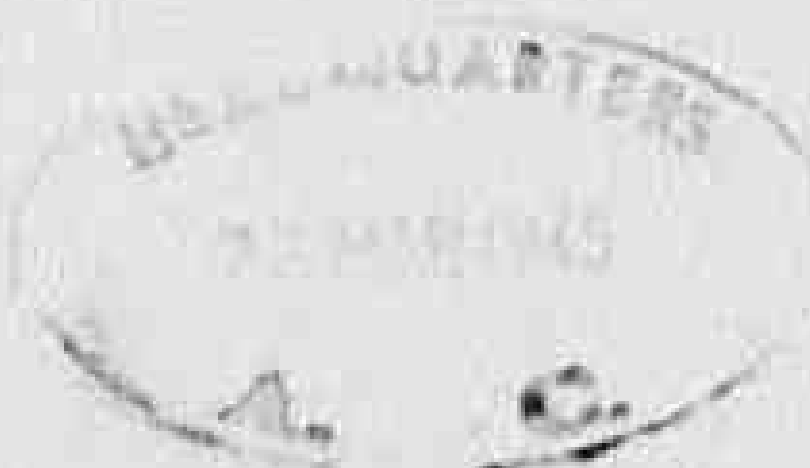

I certainly agree that Genl 61 Area acted wrongly in resisting the opening of shops in A.C.A. In my opinion the only shops regarding which he might have to make representations to the Provincial Commissioner are wine shops; if they were too numerous or selling bad wine to the troops. Even in such a case or as regards any shops he could put them out of bounds to troops.

I have already told Genl 61 Area he acted wrongly and will impress it on him again. I would like to add however that none of these difficulties ought ever to arise, provided a little good will and sense were used by all parties concerned.

Colonel Mansford, Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, 15 Army Group, has spoken to us about the action of your Area Commander at Ancona in resisting the opening of retail shops in Ancona. In his letter 136/2/9 of November 29th he suggests that the opening of retail shops in the town is not allowed pending certain information for which he asks.

The opening of shops in a town such as Ancona is, of course, a matter for the Provincial Commissioner to decide, subject to any instructions he may receive from his Regional Commissioner and unless the opening of shops interferes with the working of the port, I suggest that it is a matter which the Area Commander could well leave to the Provincial Commissioner, whose chief concern is to get a certain degree of normality resumed particularly with regard to the sale of food and other commodities.

Perhaps you would be good enough to have a word with Brigadier Bullbrook-Leggatt when you next see him.

For your own information, I have changed the Provincial Commissioner in Ancona and sent another officer whom I hope will work in close touch with the Area Commander so that things can run smoothly.

1. The following letter has been sent by HQ 61 Area to the Provincial Commissioner, Ancona (ref 136/2/Q dated 29 Nov 44).

Ref Your AC/96 of 24 Nov copy to this HQ.

- 1) Will you please furnish a statement of your policy in regard to the reopening of retail shops in Ancona City.
- 2) Information has been received that permits have already been issued by you in respect of approx 250 shops, though in a number of cases reopening is understood to be dependent on repairs to premises. In any event this number would seem to be excessive in view of the size of the present population of the town, viz., approx 25,000.
- 3) Pending your reply to para 1, reopening of the retail shops referred to in your a/q letter is NOT approved.

The question of how many shops should be opened in Ancona appears to me to be purely a matter for the Provincial Commissioner to decide, and should not be subject to the approval of the Area Commander, unless he can show that the opening of the shops will interfere with the working of the port.

2. It is suggested that HQ Allied Commission make bids now for future warehouse accommodation in the towns of Bologna, Modena, Reggio, Parma and Piacenza. It is not possible for Eighth Army and Emilia Region to make estimates, as supplies will probably be stored in these towns for Regions further North, and the towns will probably all be in Fifth Army territory. Eighth Army have bid for warehouse space in Ferrara - 3000 tons for local needs plus 10000 tons for the supply of areas North.
