STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED CIVIL AFFAIRS COURSE

1. It is the purpose of the Commission to give a brief course of instruction to several small groups of American officers, with a view to their eventual service as civil affairs officers with the armies and with the regions in Venetia and North East Italy.

2. The students will be officers of company grade who have been on combat duty here in Italy. They have been chosen not because of knowledge of any of the various specialties useful in military government but because of their fitness to serve as civil affairs officers in that echelon of military government where direct contact is had with the population and where the officer must deal at first hand with the varied problems that confront the officer must deal at first hand with the varied problems that confront the C.I.C.s at the communal level. The course is designed to make those officers well-rounded civil affairs officers, competent to deal with immediate and general problems at communal level, with only enough attention being given to higher echelons of military government to enable the officers to understand what they are doing and the relation it bears to the work being done at higher levels.

3. Visiting instructors are asked to bear in mind the fact that none of these students has ever served in ACO or AG, and that it will not be possible, in a two-week's period, for student officers to do more than grasp some of the fundamental principles of the problem of military government. They must get a glimpse into every aspect of civil affairs work. Experienced AG officers occupying the highest positions in ACO have been asked to make their contribution. It should be realized that too much detail will serve only to confuse these newcomers. Only enough background and detail is desired as is necessary to highlight and delineate closely those aspects of the work that have significance at communal levels.







THE WORK OF ACC IN ITALY

Maj. Driffield-White traced the history of Military Government back to the Roman occupation of Britain, and cited instances from that time to the present. He explained that Military Government was not a new thing, but that this experiment in Allied Military Government was new in that preparations had been made for the civil administration of the country concerned before the occupation began. He stated the desirability of a peaceful and cooperative community to the rear of the fighting forces in order both to relieve them of heavy administrative responsibilities and to ensure maximum possible advantage from local resources.

He gave an outline of the development of military government in Sicily and Italy, stating the reasons for the change from AMGOT to ACC, and explained the relationship between the Italian Government and the Allied Control Commission, defining the areas of responsibility.

A chart was produced on the black board (a copy of which is attached) showing the organization of the Headquarters of Allied Control Commission, and the duties and responsibilities of the various Sections and their subordinate Sub-Commissions were outlined. He drew a very clear distinction between the operating and "housekeeping" sides of the organization, and stated how necessary this latter was for the smooth running of the work of the Allied Control Commission.

Sjt. Packham asked that a slightly more detailed account of the chain of responsibility down to Regions and below might be given, as it would be useful basic information, and that future talks would better fit into the general picture presented at this first lecture.

Maj. Driffield-White then indicated which of the Sub-Commissions at Headquarters were represented at Regional Headquarters level, and mentioned the chain of responsibility down to Provinces. He then drew a comparison between ACC and AMG conditions, pointing out that two Governments could not operate satisfactorily in the same area; therefore in ACC territory the Allies acted only in an advisory capacity.

In answer to a question, Maj. Driffield-White gave the composition of the Advisory Council, which is also shown on the attached chart.
