1. From the Italian Army standpoint, the Italian POWs in France are civilians and therefore are not within the jurisdiction of MMIA.
2. MMIA does not consider any former Italian soldier or POW as being an "in fact effective" Italian soldier and does not recognize any Italian unit unless it appears on the Italian Army "Order of Battle" as published by this HQ.
3. Certain Italian officers have, however, been sent to France at the express wish of SHAEP and these officers will be taking care of Italian ex soldiers or P of W interests.

2. According to recent information, the condition of those soldiers have not improved; on the contrary, the fact that no alteration has taken place in the preceding state of affairs, the long privations and the belief that no practical assistance is being afforded them by their country, have inevitably produced a further deterioration in their already distressing material and moral situation.

3. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs beg to reassert their belief that an equitable and humanitarian solution of this latter problem can be reached only with the repatriation of the soldiers to Italy and they have again interested the French Embassy to this effect.

Dear Mr. Prime Minister:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of 7 November with reference to the question of the employment of Italian Prisoners of War in France.

It is my distinct impression that in the course of a conversation with Your Excellency on October 10th, when I informed you of the Allied intentions in this matter, that you concurred and, as a consequence of your having raised no objection to this course, I so reported to the Supreme Allied Commander on the following day.

From your letter under acknowledgement I assume that you have changed your view and that, at least, you desire the alternative use of these Prisoners of War in Southern France as purely Italian Units working for the Allied Armies and under the orders of Allied Authorities as far as their employment is concerned, but under Italian discipline and command, i.e. as Italian soldiers, as distinct from Prisoners of War co-operators.

This view, as well as your suggestion that a conference comprising the representatives of the Governments which are interested in this matter should be called to deliberate and solve as a whole and in detail the question of the Prisoners of War in the hands of the Allies, I have submitted to the Supreme Allied Commander.

A representative of the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs was, this morning, informed of the contents of Allied Force Headquarters letter G-5 383.2-6 of the 4th November 1944. He stated that the Ministry of Foreign Affairs were already engaged in discussions with the French representative on the Advisory Council in regard to the representation of Italian diplomatic and consular interests in France. It would be of great assistance in conducting these negotiations if Giuseppe Nitti and Antonio Secchi, or at any rate the former, could be permitted to come to Italy and could be provided with the necessary air transport, since the information available to the Italian Government in regard to the conditions in which Italian subjects are living in France, and the state of Italian material interests there is at present very inadequate. The Political Section would recommend that the application be granted.

1. A signal has been received from SHAEF stating that Giuseppe Nitti, the son of the former Italian Prime Minister, and Antonio Secchi, a former Italian Consular officer have requested permission to go to Rome for the purpose of informing Signor Bonomi "of the critical position of 800,000 Italians living in France who are deprived of all diplomatic and consular protection of their government." The object of the visit to be a discussion of the following:

a. Material assistance to Italian subjects in France on the ground that the Assistance Committee created for that purpose "does not dispose of sufficient funds to fulfill its task."

b. The defence of Italian interests stated to be seriously threatened by the application of official measures based on the inexistence of diplomatic relations between France and Italy.

c. The position of some 25,000 Italian soldiers who are stated to have escaped from German working and concentration camps and are utterly deprived of the means of existence.

d. The education of Italian children who formerly went to schools which are now closed for want of means.

2. It is desired that you will inform this Headquarters of the views of the Italian government on the proposed visit.
