Reference your memorandum at Folio 75, dated 29 February.

1. The Chief Commissioner's policy with regard to office space is that the offices of the Headquarters of the Commission could and should be housed in this building. He is also of the opinion that the numbers on the strengths of Sub-Commissions are excessive. This is borne out by your memorandum and you should make immediate recommendations to the Manpower Committee as to reduction, not only of Italian civilians but of Allied personnel. An overall cut of 25 per cent of Italian civilian personnel would make a good start.
2. You should then allot the office space accordingly. This could best be done by a tour of each Section and Sub-Commission. In this connection I have constantly suggested that the large corridor space in the Civil Affairs Section should be converted into offices. The material could be obtained from ARW in lieu of that promised for the Acting President's office.
3. I should be grateful if you would ensure that the HQ Commandant and his officers use reasonable care when arranging for moves of Sub-Commissions, etc. The treatment recently given to the IACB who were asked to move into an office which was almost completely unfurnished, was neither reasonable or tactful.

A/Ex C stated that he had visited the Esperia Hotel yesterday with Col. Parkin. He thought the accommodation was adequate and would arrange to open bathrooms on each floor. Eoon Sec criticised the accommodation provided for the female AC employees. They had certain obligations to their staff and did not consider they were getting fair treatment. All the rooms with baths at the Esperia Hotel had been taken by UNRRA personnel. In any case, Eoon Sec considered there would be far too much space left at the Flora Hotel for transient officers.

A/Ex C and CA Sec said there must be consistency and that all female staff should be moved from the Flora Hotel into the Esperia.

CSO to Ex C asked if it was necessary that any further moves be made out of the Flora Hotel and suggested that when the Northern Regions went forward there should be plenty of accommodation. Already as the result of UNRRA having moved out there was sufficient accommodation for transient officers. Eoon Sec supported this view.

The matter was left undecided and would be further discussed.

SUBJECT: Movement of Civilian Personnel from Hotel Flora

TO : Executive Commissioner.

1. Reference the Chief Commissioner's inquiry, attention is invited to par 1(a) of the Minutes of the Executive Commissioner's meeting of 13 March, which state:

"Executive Commissioner ruled that the following would be moved from the FLORA Hotel:

- (1) All personnel not members of the Allied Commission
- (2) All female civilian Allied Commission personnel
- (3) All Allied Commission officers below field rank"

2. Hq. Commandant states that phases (1) and (3) have nearly been completed, and that, by so doing, some fifty transient beds have been made available in the Flora. He does not expect that the completion of phase (2) will prove so productive of additional space. Additionally, Brigadier Lush asked for a report upon the completion of phase (1), (which will be rendered shortly), before going ahead with phase (2). The situation, in brief, has been considerably bettered.

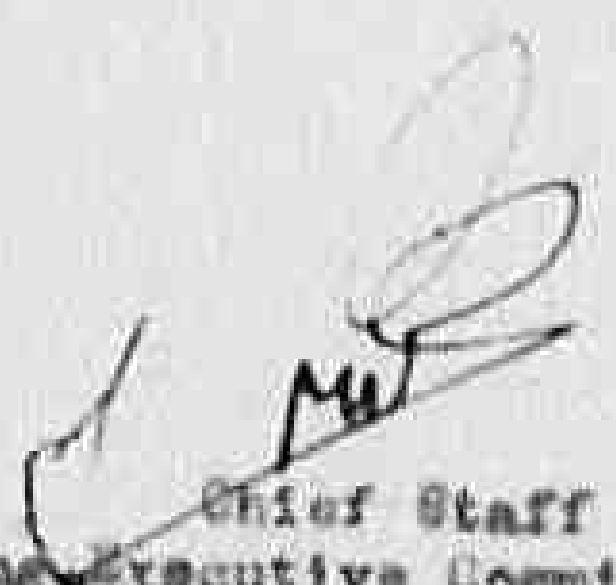

Land Forces Sub-Commission representative agreed that this would meet the requirements of his Sub-Commission. Any removal of furniture by Agriculture Sub-

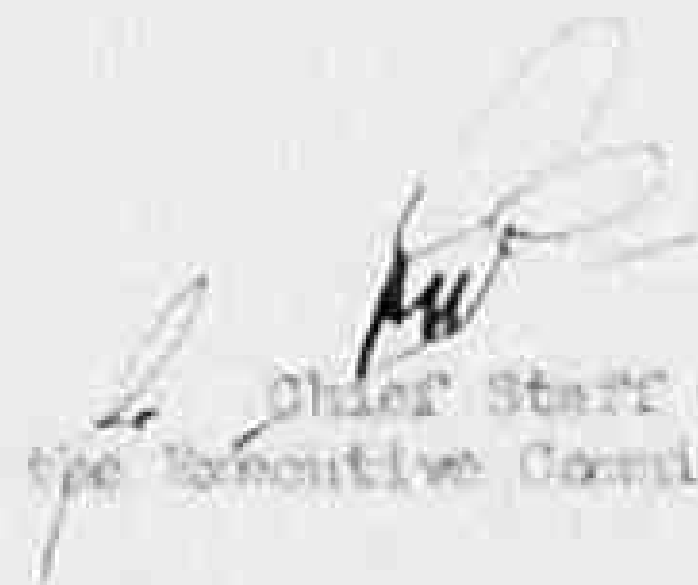

1. Reference your letter, file AFSC/931/PC, dated 14 March 45, subject as above.

2. A careful investigation has been made of the unauthorized posting of one of your civilian clerks to another section of this Headquarters. It is understood that this matter has now been satisfactorily settled to the effect that the proposed transfer was cancelled. While it is standard practice not to effect transfers without the mutual consent of all parties concerned, it is regretted that this rule was inadvertently overlooked.

3. In regard to the present policy concerning the employment of additional civilian personnel, the Establishment Section is governed by the decision reached at the Executive Commissioner's meeting of 2 March (paragraph 2, minutes EO's meeting) which stipulated that steps should be immediately taken to effect, so far as possible, a 25% reduction in the Italian clerical staff in this Headquarters. Accordingly, all additional hiring has been suspended and any "special case" clerical staff increases will be effected through transfer.

As stated in my letter AFSC/304/ORG dated 13th March 1945 to you about office accommodation, my staff here has been increased by the addition of 2 American Officers and 2 British Officers, and we are becoming very hard pressed for clerical staff. There is no possibility of obtaining Service personnel since I understand that on the British side alone the Command is deficient of 1,300 Clerks/GD, and I therefore approached the Civilian Personnel Section asking for another clerk.

2. Not only have they told me that no civilians will be employed by this H.Q. until further notice, but they have arbitrarily posted one of the clerks which I have had since we came to Rome to another section, without any reference to this Sub-Commission.

3. I shall resist most strongly any attempt to post any of my existing personnel away, and I should like to be informed as to the policy as regards the employment of civilian personnel. It will be realised that the work of this Sub-Commission has got to proceed, and that if increases are made in the Officer establishment, it is for a good reason, and that they cannot work to full effect without having adequate clerical staff.

1. I understand a committee representing the various Sub-Commissions is meeting on Monday 19 Mar to consider the re-allocation of accommodation resulting from the relinquishment of rooms on the 7th floor.
2. As I stated at the meeting on 16 Mar, the provision of the necessary accommodation for the additional personnel of the 33 Military Mission is a matter of extreme urgency as the Officers and other ranks are now arriving.
3. It is unlikely that any further demands for accommodation will be made as the present needs arise from a War Establishment which has been most carefully considered in the light of the present and immediate future functions of the Mission.
4. I have to point out however that as stated in this HQ A.C./J of 23 February 45 our request is for the whole of the 7th floor (21 rooms) to cover an increase of 18 Officers and 63 OR's.
5. The question of accepting, as an alternative, accommodation in the Annex was reported by me to Gen BROOKING. He regrets that in no circumstances can he accept this. The upset to the vital work of this Sub-Commission in connection with the actual war effort at the present time rules the idea out of court and he is certain that it could not be agreed by either CAG or CUS AFM, who personally initiated the increase in WMA to themselves and ordered that it should be rendered effective at the earliest moment.
6. In view of all above Gen BROOKING directs me to request that the matter be settled at the earliest possible moment.

1. The problem of allocation of office space in head quarters building is intensified by the increase in personnel of the Land Forces Subcommission. This Sub-Commission is being increased by 23 officers and 63 ORs and General Browning has requested that additional space be allocated to him by 1 March, to provide accommodations for this personnel. For your information, I attach a table showing by Sections and Independent Subcommissions the number of officers, M/CI and Italian civilians, together with the number of officers presently allocated. In this table, Allied civilians of officer status are listed as officers. Allied civilians not of officer status are shown simply as Allied civilians. The Italian civilians shown thereon are Italian civilians occupying office space and do not include maintenance personnel, messengers and receptionists.

2. You will note the exceedingly large number of Italian civilians occupying office space; the number which I think could and should be materially reduced. Various proposals have been made for moving certain elements of the Commission outside this building. I do not believe this is necessary or desirable. I feel, rather, that the headquarters of the Commission can in fact reduce itself to the size of the building. A fair average density on a sectional basis appears to be three persons per room. I recommend, for your consideration and decision, the following:

a. To solve the immediate needs of the Land Forces Subcommission, the "Field Regions" now occupying offices in the building, be required to vacate them, with the exception of two rooms which will be set aside and properly equipped for visiting Regional Commissioners and their staffs. That the number of rooms allocated to the various Sections and Independent Subcommissions be determined for the present on the density of three persons per room and that the elements of the headquarters which are now occupying more than that proportionate number of rooms be required to vacate them.

b. That progressive reduction in the number of Italian civilian employees occupying office space be undertaken at once on a percentage basis, to be determined by the Manpower Committee.

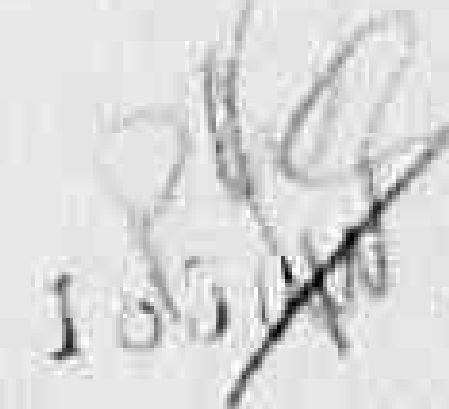

1. As you know I am planning to concentrate the Provincial Teams of some five (5) provinces in the general area between Rome and Naples. It obviously will be an advantage, if we can locate these officers and men near Rome. Such a location would enable me to keep in touch with these Provincial Teams, while they are forming and would make it easier for us to absorb newly arriving officers, who may be expected to report first to the Headquarters, Allied Commission in Rome.

2. I understood that there is desirable accommodation available at Castel Gandolfo. This is within the boundary of ROME ALLIED AREA COMMAND and cannot be put at our disposal, unless we have your authorization. That it is operationally necessary for these Provincial Teams to form within the boundary of the Command.

3. I do not think this is an overstatement, for the reasons which I have already given. Would you please, if you think fit, give the necessary authority.

4. Colonel FARREN is bringing this letter to Rome, for it is urgent, that we secure some accommodation at an early date, as officers and men will commence shortly to arrive from the outlying stations and we cannot accommodate them in Naples.

1. (a) On the orders of C.G.S. and C.A.O. AFHQ, proposals for a revision of the W.E. of MMIA are going to AFHQ today. These include a new Trg Branch and a new "A" Branch and amount to an increase of 18 Officers and 63 OR's. We were ordered by C.G.S. to treat the whole matter as URGENT.

(b) It will thus be necessary for MMIA to have increased office accommodation to correspond.
2. Any move outside this building by MMIA would be detrimental to our association with the rest of A.C. and would entail considerable dislocation in its work and a hiatus in control of the Italian Army at this critical time. I feel that this cannot be contemplated and I am sure AFHQ would feel the same. ~~Moreover~~, Accommodation within this building is thus indicated.
3. The obvious solution is that MMIA should take over the whole of the 7th floor i.e. the 21 rooms occupied by Labour and Agriculture Sub-Commissions.
4. I request that these be made available on 1 March.
5. I may say that the whole of the 7th floor was originally allotted to MMIA when we arrived in ROME in June 1944.

We gave up these 21 rooms at your request to meet an emergency, as we were able to do without them by concentrating (in fact, rather overcrowding) our staff. We, however, stated at the time that we would want them back if we expanded at a later date.

When I was at AFHQ the other day I saw the D.A. ... General MacLeod, who told me that it was the intention to make AQUILA a joint Anglo-American rest centre for the troops of 5th and 8th Armies and that he was most anxious to have at the disposal of the rest centre the main hotel in which your officers are living. I attach a letter subsequently received.

2. A survey has been made of the Roma - Lido di Roma area by an officer of this headquarters familiar with the space and facilities required by the AMG units now located in Chianciano, with the following results:
 - a. Headquarters, Rome Area Allied Command states that there is no accommodation available in the Roma - Lido di Roma area, nor is there any prospect that any will become available in the future.
 - b. Reconnaissance was also made of Fregene, Ladispoli and Santa Marinella. There is no available accommodation at any of these places.
3. The following additional points are for consideration:
 - a. The available water supply at Chianciano is barely adequate for the needs of the present occupants.
 - b. No accommodation is available to the North through Fifth Army or Fifteenth Army Group.
 - c. The tactical situation makes it imperative that these units not move to the south.
4. Under the circumstances, it is not considered practicable to move the units in question.

1. Due to unforeseen changes in the tactical situation, this Region was notified to move from LUCCA on Wed. 27 Dec. 44. On Thursday afternoon I proceeded to Siena and Friday morning conferred with the DCCAO with AAI. There I learned that Hq. AG desired Headquarters, Toscana Region to go to Firenze; that, if Firenze was not possible, the Region could count on getting into Siena with certainty.
2. On Friday I went to Fifth Army Headquarters, saw G-4, who has overall charge of billets and accommodations. I explained at length the reasons and necessity for locating Hq. Toscana Region in Firenze. I made every effort to obtain a favorable decision; but was told that the orders G-4 had gave little hope of our getting into Firenze at this time. G-4 said he would look into the question further and let me know the decision thru AMG Fifth Army. In a few days I was informed that Fifth Army would authorize our moving to Montecatini; but not to Firenze. Montecatini was initially suggested by G-4 and not by me.
3. I decided to accept the Montecatini offer and made the necessary reconnaissance and all detailed arrangements. Region orders were issued for the move to begin Thursday morning, 4 Jan. 45. Late Wednesday afternoon, 3 Jan. 45, I received word that the Chief of Staff, Hq. AG, wanted my headquarters to go to Siena and that some preliminary steps had been taken in that direction. I was told to send my requirements to the Town Major, Siena. That word came too late to stop our movement without causing much useless confusion, expense and loss of time.
4. My division heads are agreed that this Region can function from a location along the autostrada connecting Firenze, Pistoia, Lucca, Pisa and Livorno, much better than it can from Siena. We have been both places.
5. The Provinces in the north create the greatest problems and most work in legal, supply, public health, labor and finance. For the same reason and also because they serve Army AMG better there, the remaining nine divisions of Region Headquarters are already in Firenze, at the request of AMG Fifth Army, or their predecessors, AMG Eighth Army.
6. While, at the moment, our accommodations and facilities in Montecatini are not as good as we have had elsewhere, the Region Executive Officer, the heads of divisions, and I, are agreed that Toscana Region Headquarters can function better here than in Siena. Approval of Montecatini as the location of Toscana Region Headquarters is requested.

My dear Colonel,

Since your visit to the Area Commander things have taken an ugly turn as regards prospects of AMG accommodation. What has worried me more than anything is the extraordinary attitude adopted by the Brigadier.

Forgive my worrying you again, but since the consequences may have important results and you are seeing Brig. Lush this weekend, I think it well to let you know what is in the wind.

This morning at about 11 o'clock the Area Comd went to the S.P.F.S.O.'s office with the A.P.M. and demanded to see all over this building, the Provincia, which as you know is full to the brim with ASB, AC Port Detachment and Prefettura etc. This without reference to me or to Robert Mount. He burst into my room in an extremely rude manner, saying "I've just come in to look round this building as I may have to take it for a Servicemen's Club". Robert and Chadd were both in with me and we were spellbound. All I could say was "where am I to go?", his reply was "that's not my problem I don't know".

This afternoon he sent a Corporal from the Town Major's office to look all over our mess, where we have been for 6 months - this again without reference to me or to Robert. We have told the Corporal, Town Major being sick, that we will furnish full particulars by tomorrow.

It is not that we cannot deal with the situation ourselves, but that if the Area Comd presses his demands we want you and AC HQ to be forewarned and ready with the support we feel confident we shall get.

I need not add that AMG accommodation in ANCONA is absolutely minimum and that if the Provincia were taken away we might as well pack up - the Prefect as well. The accommodation problem is already a big headache and we have always done our best to make things easy for the military.

To: 1- H.C.P., Bureau of Criminal Justice
1- C. United States Forces Division

From: 1- Truck Pool No. 3.

In the afternoon of 30 October 1974 at approximately 1600 hrs. I was visiting the above garage (which has been requisitioned and occupied by the Pescara Agency of this Truck Pool since 4 June 1974) on an inspection, when two Canadian Captains and a U.S. officer entered the garage and proceeded to talk around ignoring signals and the staff present. I ask them if I could be of any assistance and received the reply: "We are talking over this garage, JAC vehicles are coming in here tonight, You had better get your stuff out." I explained that this garage was occupied by 3 Truck Pool - Allied Central Canadian and was responsible for the food supplies for the Province of Pescara. These officers explained that they had been told to take my property they needed in Pescara by the Canadian Commander of Garrison. On requesting their written authority I was referred to Garrison.

As I did not wish to have parts, tyres etc., which were about the Garage with solely Italians in charge asked, I instructed the Director to load everything there into the truck and send it to return. I assembled returned to Chieti, and despatched the attached letter to the Garrison Commander by special messenger, who returned with a message from the duty officer to the effect that the matter would be placed before the Commander in the morning. In the meantime I reported the incident to the Provincial Commissioner who instructed him to order the Canadians to leave the Garage.

Accordingly at 5 P.M. I returned to Pescara and found that Canadian transport had already occupied the Garage. I ordered a Captain who was present to move his transport out, whereupon he was transported returned. Apparently later the same night another Canadian officer returned to the Garage and sent for the Director, who he grouped by the arm and ordered to vacate the Garage. The Director asking on my instructions did not do so but came in briefly and reported the matter to me.

I thereupon sent to Pescara accompanied by the Provincial Commissioner who after speaking to the Canadian Captain in charge, telephoned the Garrison Commander who replied that he did not understand that we were being turned out, but understood that there was even for both, he promised to send his staff Captain straight away.

In the morning 31 October 1974 arrived accompanied by the Staff Captain he at first insisted that we should have to go. I pointed out that this property was requisitioned by A.C.C. and that on return of this Province to King's Italy requisitioned powers were vested in the Prefect. I also explained that this Garage was essential for A.C.C. work and that estimates had been prepared by the

Director, in requesting their written authority I was referred to

As I did not wish to leave, with, turn etc., which were about the garage with solely Italian in charge alone, I instructed the Director to load everything there into the truck and send it back. I immediately returned to Trieste, and designated the attached letter to the American Director by myself. I also returned with a message from the city officer to the effect that the matter would be closed before the Commission in the summer. In the meantime I reported the incident to the Provincial Commissioner the Director, time to order the Canadians to leave the garage.

Accordingly at 7 P.M. I returned to Ferrara and found that Canadian transport had already occupied the garage. I ordered a Captain who was present to move his transport out, stating that my transport returned. Apparently later the same night another Canadian officer returned to the garage and sent for the Director, who he requested by the way and ordered to vacate the garage. The Director, acting on my instructions did not do so but came to Trieste and requested the matter to be.

I thereupon sent to Ferrara accompanied by the Provincial Commissioner who after speaking to the Canadian Captain in charge, informed the American Commander who replied that he did not understand that we were being turned out, but understood that there was room for both, he promised to send his staff back by straight way.

In due course T.A.C.M.G. arrived accompanied by the Staff Captain in at first insisted that we should have to go. I pointed out that this property was requisitioned by A.C.M.G. and that on return of this Province to Italy, the requisitioned property was to be returned in the present. I also explained that this garage was essential for A.C.M.G. work and that assistance had been provided by the Commanding Officer of the Coy, on advice of maintenance officer of A.C.M.G. for completely re-fitting this garage.

A Canadian was sent attempted thereby to secure the property for the short period (estimated to be two weeks) time the Canadians would be in town, this could not be agreed to as it was pointed out that if we were moved out there was no guarantee that, when the Canadians moved out another unit would not immediately enter. Finally at about 11 P.M. the Canadians moved.

During the time that Canadian troops occupied this garage the door handles of two Chevrolet were smashed off, apparently in an effort to remove them from the garage, the doors had been locked to prevent this, also on the day when the steel floor of a Chevrolet under repair and ignition key were taken to a Canadian soldier, this matter has been reported to the C.A.M.G.

A British Sgt. and 2 Cpl's R.L. have been put in this car 1800, of no consequence.
