Dear Admiral,

After eight months of government of the Province and other seven of not less important activity in liaison service, the Allied Officers are going to leave this city.

I feel that I would fail in a precise duty of mine if I would not draw your attention to the regret with which the population and the authorities of this Province see the departure of the Allies who have been very popular here for their incomparable personal qualities and particularly for the care taken of the local interests, always followed with careful attention and efficient promptness.

Whenever necessary, the assistance of the Allied Authorities, full of the highest sense of human solidarity, has never failed; and there has never been a particular local situation in which, if necessary, said Authorities did not intervene with clear understanding and perfect tactfulness.

I wish particularly to point out to you the special success of esteem and consideration achieved here by Colonel S.M. Miller, first Provincial Commissioner and then Chief of the Liaison Office of the Allied Commission. This officer has exceptional qualities of character, broadness of mind and exquisite tact and everybody here will remember him, especially for the perfect objectivity with which he fulfilled his task in a difficult local situation characterized by the co-existence of two distinct ethnical groups.

I believe that if you would express, to Colonel S.M. Miller particularly, your praise for these feelings of wide popularity which he and his officers are leaving behind in the Province, this would respond to the sincere desire of the whole local population.

I avail myself with particular and sincere pleasure of this opportunity to confirm to you the expression of my highest consideration.

Between the Piave and Timavo rivers lives a population including 15% Austrians, 7% 'Veneti', 31% Slovenians, and 58% Friulani. Such an area, with over a million inhabitants is the Friuli Mother Country. For centuries, its inhabitants lived in peace till race hatred was roused; it would therefore be natural to reestablish the order upset by geographical violations as well as ethnical ones, all based on questions of interests, and go back to the historical positions tested by centuries; the various nationalities shouldn't be divided but united by their mutual interests. Nowadays, Friuli is divided from zone A, and a Friulano requires a pass from A.M.C. for a trip of a few kms, just like an Italian coming from Sicily. We ask and propose that the Udine and Gorizia Governorship be replaced by one single Allied Administration under the name of PATRIA DEL FRIULI.

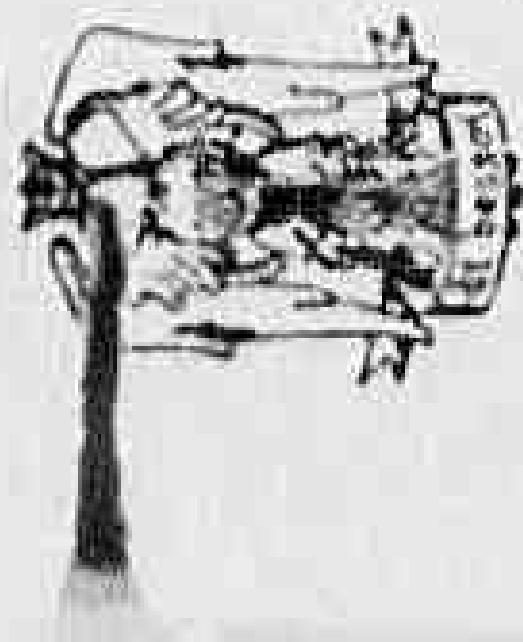

SUBJECT: Interrogation of Inhabitants of Tarvisio

TO : G-3, AFHQ

1. Herewith ~~are~~ extract from a report received from the Regional Commissioner Venezia Region for your information and any action you may wish to take.

"(a) On the 4th October it is reported that representatives of the Allied Commission in Austria accompanied by a delegate of the Austrian Government, went to the Municipality at Tarvisio and requested information concerning the nationality of the local population.

(b) It is understood that the Commission furnished certain data of which neither I nor the GAO had been informed.

(c) It is also reported that the Commission contacted a number of local people who had opted for Germany, and were still resident in the Mairiedomato of Portofino, and further sought to obtain information of those who migrated to Germany on or after the German sponsored plebiscite in that area in 1939.

(d) Subsequently, it is alleged, the Commission interrogated Heinrich Schomberg Arthur, Dr. Giuseppe and Furian Francesco, Austrian citizens now resident in Tarvisio, who had opted for Germany and acted as propaganda agents for that cause."

2. It is felt you will agree that such a method of obtaining information without the knowledge and assistance of Allied Military Government of this region, or of the responsible Italian officials of the Province, is most irregular.

3. We would be grateful if, in the future, we could be informed when representatives of the Allied Commission Austria wish to visit Italy officially. Were such information made available it is considered that incidents such as that described would not occur.

1. I have received a report from the Provincial Commissioner of Udine, as follows :-

I am prepared to deal with it by direct representation to Senior Civil Affairs Officer, Klagenfurt. On the other hand, it may well be that news of this may have reached the Italian Government from Italian sources, so that you might prefer to deal with the matter at your level.

Thank you for your interesting letter of the 23th October, 559/39/50 with its enclosure from Cervignano. The reference is to that small group of communes south east of Palmanova which were Austrian before the last war and were included in Friuli (Udine Province) after the last war.

I shall write you a longer report after I have got hold of a large scale map upon which I can mark the former and present boundary line.

In brief I can say that the writers are historically correct when they assert that these villages are traditionally linked with Gorizia rather than with Udine.

On the other hand the attempt to claim the generic term Friuli for their own little group is going a long way too far. The name Friuli is just as likely derived from "Forum Julii" which is the old name for the City of Cividale, founded by Julius Caesar.

I should say, as a quick estimate, that the writers have not a strong following. The names of the signatories are not Italian, and I should think they represent a Slovene national feeling that is not prepared to go pro-Filo.

The whole question is a left over from a piece of incomplete military history in the 16th century. At the time of the league of Cambrai, the Holy Roman Empire, in its counter offensive against the eastward penetration of the Republic of Venice, took Gradisca, and crossed the Isonzo, getting as far as Cervignano and Aquileia.

There they stopped, and the Venetians built Palmanova in 1593 to bar further progress. Palmanova was, in its time, one of the most famous fortresses in Europe.

So, from about 1500 to 1800, the Empire held this half open sally port across the Isonzo onto the Friulian plain, and

into the terrain of the Republic of Venice. When, in 1866, Venice was set free from the Austrian domination under which it had fallen, and became Italian, the new Kingdom of Italy fell heir to the same problem.

As you rightly say, there is food for much thought.

We further wish to point out that our district is a part of Venezia Giulia and like Gorizia and Trieste has, most unfortunately, been annexed to Italy following to the Peace Treaty of 1919 after the first great war, (the consequences of which have so seriously affected and still continue to affect this whole region of the former Austrian Monarchy), and we therefore ought to be included in the area of Allied jurisdiction, what seems not to have been done, to our entire disadvantage. Our farmers and tradesmen are thus prevented from carrying their products to Gorizia and Trieste, which are our natural markets, the outcome of this being a noticeable contribution to the shortage of food in both towns and especially in Trieste.

Our long administrative association with these towns has been brutally set apart by the Fascist Government for purely political

362)
 reasons, in spite of our protests, and we were put under the province of Udine. But we have little to do with that town, and nothing at all with Venice, the nearest larger one on Italy's side, some 75 miles away, whilst Trieste and Gorizia are only 24 and 12 in the average. Further it is to remark that both Udine and Venice have large productive areas around, whilst Trieste and Gorizia have none to supply them with agricultural products - their industries, on the other hand, are largely dependent upon us for the manpower.

It is not to be wondered that in these circumstances we are much concerned about the forthcoming events, and that we want and need to share with the fate of Trieste, as we did since we exist as an organised human society. All this, we believe, does count for more than something, and no wise man would venture to abruptly snatter with a dash of pen on a map such deeply felt and needed bonds. This, we hope will not happen, otherwise the most serious harm to the aforementioned towns, and the actual ruin of ourselves will result.

Some historical notices about our district may be of interest: Anciently, like the whole Trieste-Gorizia area, this was a part of the homeland of the Caras, a Celtic people, of whom, we, the Friulans or Furlans, are the direct descendants. It was conquered by the Romans in the year 182 B.C., and after the parting of the empire by Theodosius our land belonged to the Greek Empire of Byzantium. After Napoleon's fall, we enjoyed a long period of peace and welfare with Austria, to which we were loyal till to the end, and we might add that our annexation to Italy has taken place against the will of the enormous majority of our population.

Like the whole of this old Austrian territory, improperly named by the Italians "Venezia Giulia", we suffered decay and slavery

under their domination, and when the war came, our men, and even many women, went numerous to the partisans, where they joined the famous Furlan "Pontanot" brigade, which fought gallantly the Italians and their Nazi-German allies, suffering the heaviest casualties of all the units operating in this area. We are proud of them, but we know that they fought bravely, on your side, and died, not just to allow that the links of our chains be riveted again, but for freedom.

We rely on you, who had, and fought, the same foe, and trust that our claims will meet with due consideration. To this end, we request you to kindly inform of this appeal your respective Governments and the secretariate of the London Conference.

First of all, we want to be included in the "Venezia Giulia" Zone of Allied Jurisdiction, as we are entitled to claim, and furtherly we wish to join Trieste in the constitution of a Free Territory under your supervision.

 - (g) That it will be possible to close down the following existing Divisions at Headquarters in the period Sept. 1st - Oct. 1st:- Education, A.F.A.A., Patriots, Public Health and Welfare, Agriculture, Food, Commerce, Industry, and Labour.

4. It should be noted that the establishment as set out will not be large enough to "supervise the elections". It will, however, be strong enough to supervise the preliminary work leading up to the elections, as explained in my HALL/306.33B of 10th July. I consider that additional officers, from combat units, could be drafted in as temporary reinforcements some two weeks before the date of the elections. Much must depend on the date upon which the Italian Government proposes to hold these elections.

5. If you will let me have your comments on this draft I shall prepare tables for HQ/OK and transport.

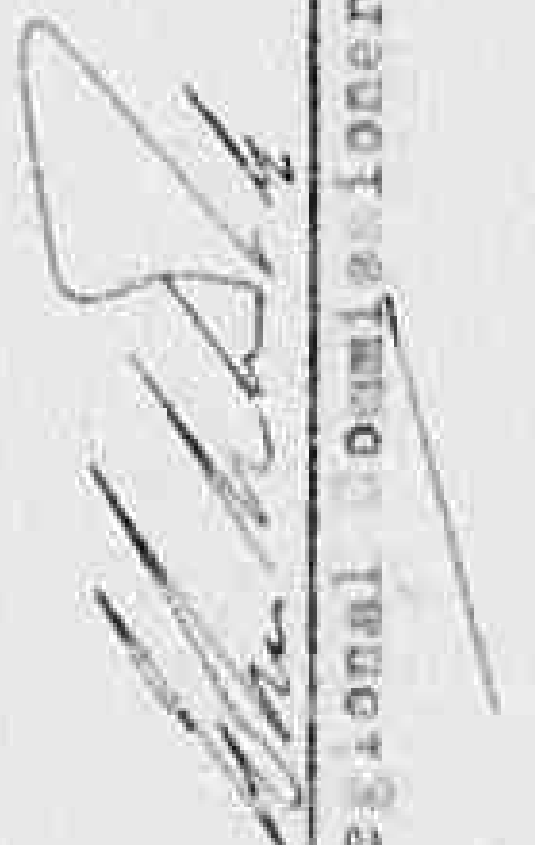

8. On arrival at Vietnam you will set up Allied Military Government in the normal manner.
9. You are to use such existing local administration as you find exists, provided that, but irrespective of whether it has been set up by the United States or by Thailand anti-Communist organizations.
10. If there is no local government in existence, you will then create, using suitable local people for the purpose, being particular not to discriminate against persons on account of ethnic background or religious affiliation.
11. It is extremely important to send my intention as to the status of Vietnam as my part of VIETNAM OFFICE.
12. In the event of any difficulty with the United States you will refer to the local military commander for instructions.
13. The Commander of United States military personnel from (original) 16th will be instructed to set up and pending further instructions.

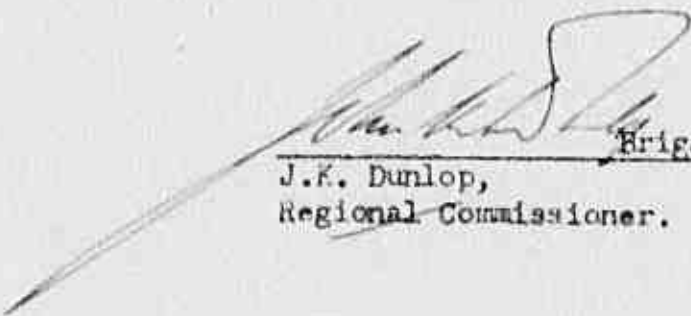
