

1. Regional Commission. It is suggested that civilian employment be reduced by one third, in Region as well as Provinces. The same applies to trucks and vehicles should be turned back to Region HQ for further disposal.

2. PROVINCES.

Cuneo. It is suggested that all correspondence intended for Italian agencies be translated into Italian at Region HQ, thus reducing the work which otherwise would have to be done individually at each Provincial HQ.
A demand for 3/4 months' hard rations for the Carabinieri was agreed to by AFED.

Asti. Italian officials appear to be objecting to the new POL scheme, AM Lire currency is being refused by shopkeepers and not a single AM Lire is at present circulating in the Province. All such money is held by the banks who are also reluctant to accept it.

Novara. Everything as normal as could be desired. Prices generally more modest than anywhere else.

Vercelli. Major Bertelli pointed out the threat of impending strikes due to scarcity of work and food.

Aosta. 4 death penalties were passed on political crimes, 3 executions carried out; one still pending.

Turin. Alessandria have nothing special to report.

Special Divisions.

Agriculture. Last week's amassing shows gains, but rather less than anticipated. Italian soldier labour arrived rather later than expected, but will commence work this Wednesday (under supervision by British MCO). This labour is not looked upon favourably by many farmers, especially Asti Province considers it could do better without. The wood harvest is increasing satisfactorily.

Agriculture. Last week's evening shows gains, but rather less than anticipated. Italian soldier labour arrived rather later than expected, but will commence work this Wednesday (under supervision by British NCO). This labour is not locked upon favourably by many farmers, especially Asti Province considers it could do better without. The wood harvest is increasing satisfactorily.

Finance. After a lengthy debate a decision was reached during the meeting on future procedure regarding AMB expenditure. P.Cs will have the option of either having their own imprest a/c (being Sub-Accountants) or submitting receipted pay-rolls to RPO prior to monies being handed over to them for payment to civilian employees etc. The suggestion of handing the RPO temporary receipt chits pending the arrival of receipted payrolls and P/Ps was rejected by RPO.

Public Safety. Only 6 counterfeit notes were handed in during one month. A suggestion was made to take legal proceedings against people who refuse to surrender voluntarily such counterfeit notes.

Labour. Criticism are made on the new wage agreements, especially as they are done by districts and not by industries. The allegations that all industries had brought their wage levels down to the Fiat basis have proved to be incorrect. These matters have been included in the Monthly Report of the Labour Division.

Local Government. P.Cs have done an excellent job with regard to the groundwork done in respect of the pending elections. Such work should be kept up, and it may be necessary to comment on observations made by Prefects.

In view of the pending elections, H.C. raised the question as to the population's attitude towards the Monarchy. Replies differed in the various Provinces roughly as follows:

- Asti - The armed forces and police are in favour of the Monarchy but officials are against.
- Torcello - 50% pro and 50% contra.
- Turin - The majority of the people preferred the Monarchy, but not the King.
- Novara - The majority are against the Monarchy, especially the farmers.
- Cuneo - The majority are in favour of the Monarchy.

RFSO added his own opinion based on a careful study made for some considerable time past: 25% are for and 25% against the Monarchy. The remaining 50% are indifferent, but could be swung easily one way or the other, influenced by small things.

4. GENERAL. It was decided that regular Meetings will be suspended and held on special request only.

Welfare - Dealie noted for the heating of hospitals, and linen and medical supplies, although here in warehouses, have been practically unobtainable. The Commerce Officer will aid in the procurement of these items.

80 (5) - Returns of outstanding expenditures have been requested, but have been slow in arriving, especially from the provinces. All were asked to make these returns as soon as possible..... The Prefects report from Torino and Vercelli has not been received.

1. Provincial Commissioners

Cuneo - P.S. Duneo reported that the massing campaign is still showing effects in the mounts which continue to come into the vacerouses. Over 1,000 quintals were massed during the first week of October.

Alessandria - A Prefect problem exists in Alessandria. The incumbent is a Member of the Constitutive at Rome, and consequently is not believed eligible to continue as Prefect. A ruling is at present awaited from the Local Government Sub-Commission before the appointment of a successor is made. 10,000 quintals of grain were reported massed in Alessandria during the first week of October.

Asti - The P.C. of Asti reported that rumors still persist regarding the uprising which will take place when A. leaves the area.

1. Provincial Commissioners

Alessandria - P.O. Lessan via reported that the Prefect of that province had returned from Rome, where he has served as a member of the Consulta. It is understood that he cannot continue to serve as Prefect, and efforts are being made to provide a successor. The Prefect of Asta was mentioned as a possible choice... 100 quintals of rice were recently confiscated at a road block in Alessandria.

Asti - P.O. Asti reported that a regiment of Italian troops of the Cremona Division had moved in and had created a good impression... For the third consecutive week, P.O. Asti deplored the workings of the Commissariato for fuel wood, and warned that the situation is fast becoming serious.

Torino - Approximately 300 representatives of industrial organizations gathered during the week to impress upon the P.O. the inadequacy of the amended bread ration. They were told of the shortage of grain, but it was promised to bring their petitions to the attention of higher authorities. Letters expressing fear of the consequences of the prospective turnover to the Italian authorities continue to be in the office of the P.O. in large numbers. Yearly all state that this fear is based on the fact that the P.O. are of insufficient numbers, are not mobile, and that the radical elements are well-armed.

Novara - Following an agreement between a local partisan leader in Novara and the public safety officer, a manifesto was circulated by the leader asking for the surrender of arms. At least 35 truckloads have been surrendered as a result... Considerable unrest was reported over the employment of German POW's in Novara province with consequent unemployment of Italian workers.

Asta - P.O. Asta reported that there is a feeling that province that the presence of troops to aid in the corn raising would be desirable. The Regional Agriculture Officer stated that the raising of corn is important enough in certain areas to war and special attention.

Vercelli - Cuneo - Nothing of general interest to report.

1. Provincial Commissioners

Alessandria - P.C. Alessandria reported that the Prefect of that province had returned from Rome, where he had served as a member of the Com. Militari. It is understood that he cannot continue to serve as Prefect, and efforts are being made to provide a successor. The Prefect of Asti was mentioned as a possible choice....100 quintals of rice were recently confiscated at a road block in Alessandria.

Aosta - P.C. Aosta reported that there is a feeling that provisions that the presence of troops to aid in the corn smashing would be desirable. The Regional Agriculture Officer stated that the smashing of corn is important enough in certain areas to warrant special attention.

Vercelli - Cuneo - Nothing of general interest to report.

2. Special Divisions

Transportation - The Regional Transportation Officer reported that Fiat military vehicles must be turned in to MIA. There are five remaining in use in the Region, which may be retained if Italian military personnel are used as drivers....It has been reported that Italian Air Force officers have been taking vehicles in the Region, not only those belonging to the Air Force, but Italian Army and civilian vehicles as well. This is not authorized unless they have previously cleared with MIA.

1. Provincial Commissioners

Cuneo - P.O. Cuneo reported that all Sindaci have been duly appointed except three, which are expected to be taken care of today by the Prefect of that province.

Alessandria - P.O. Alessandria reported all Sindaci appointed and confirmed. It was reported that the wood Commissariato is not serving its intended purpose. The post of Questura is not yet filled, the appointee having shot himself.

Vti - All Sindaci in list have been confirmed.

Verona - All Sindaci in Verona province have been appointed. The wood Commissariato is not functioning satisfactorily in this province, the Italian official in charge trying to get the wood to Turin rather than meet the needs of the province. It was also reported that many partisans in this area are still wearing Allied uniforms, with no marks to distinguish them from British or American soldiers.

Vercelli - Sindaci appointed and confirmed. 3 truckloads of hidden arms have been impounded.

Voghera - All Sindaci confirmed. Six Fascist prisoners were executed on Sunday.

Torino - Nothing of interest to report.

2. Special Divisions

20 Commandant - The 20 Commandant reported that the civilian mess at head quarters will close as of the 30th of Sept. Civilians may eat the mid-day meal at one of the Messes di guerra in the vicinity. It was requested that patrols in respect of civilian employees be reduced to a bare minimum before 30 Sept., so that no one remains after that date who is not absolutely essential.

Messandria - P.C. Alessandrini reported all Sindaci appointed and confirmed. It was reported that the wool Comisariato is not serving its intended purpose. The Post of Questura is not yet filled, the appointee having shot himself.

Vti - All Sindaci in Vti have been confirmed.

Costa - All Sindaci in Costa province have been appointed. The wool Comisariato is not functioning satisfactorily in this province, the Italian official in charge trying to get the wool to Turin rather than meet the needs of the province. It was also reported that many partisans in this area are still wearing Allied uniforms, with no marks to distinguish them from British or American soldiers.

Vercelli - Sindaci appointed and confirmed. 3 truckloads of hidden arms have been impounded.

Novara - All Sindaci confirmed. Six Fascist prisoners were executed on Sunday.

Torino - Nothing of interest to report.

2. Special Divisions

HQ Commandant - The HQ Commandant reported that the civilian zone at Headquarters will close as of the 30th of Sept. Civilians may eat the mid-day meal at one of the Mense di guerra in the vicinity. It was rumored that payroll in respect of civilian employees be reduced to a bare minimum before 30 Sept., so that no one remains after that date who is not absolutely essential.

Labor - The Regional Labor Officer announced a rather strong bid by the Consiglio di gestione for recognition. The Labor Officer will prepare a report for the Regional Commissioner on the movement, which is an attempt to place organized labor in the administrative and financial posts of industry.

Transportation - The Regional Transportation Officer announced that the provinces are receiving their tire and tube allotments today.

Public Health - The Regional Public Health Officer asked all to be on the alert for reports regarding the pilfering which took place in the recent distribution of drugs to Vercelli and Torino provinces. Public Health and Public Safety should be informed if any clue is uncovered as to the whereabouts of the insulin and insulin which was stolen.

Education - The Regional Education Officer announced that he will meet with the Provveditore agli Studi on Friday to discuss their problems, chiefly the question of heating the schools during the winter months. He also reported that he had received a request to form an Italo-Russian society, non-political.

Food - The Regional Food Officer reported that the food situation is about the same. Although the regional emergency campaign has been a success, this wheat will not supply the demands of the region for the winter. Free inter-provincial trade is therefore encouraged, and will in fact be required, so that surplus provinces may aid the deficient until such time as an import plan goes into full operation. Prefects and Army civilian officials of food-handling agencies must be impressed with the importance of this trade with other provinces, and made to understand that it is all a part of a national program.

Public Safety - Although weapons for CC PR have been requested many times by the Regional Public Safety Officer, it is reported that they have not yet been sent to him at a release. . . . Arrangements are being made to find a new Questura for Alessandria.

Adjutant - The Chief Clerk asked that all Provincial Commissioners comply with the instructions which have been issued regarding the closing out of files and their secure and indexed tabulation for the Archives Branch of AS E. Divisions were notified that they are not to box their files, but merely tie them in the required 12" bundles, and hand in to the Chief Clerk.

Displaced Persons - The Regional Displaced Persons representative asked all P.O.'s that charitable organizations be discouraged from importing refugees without his prior knowledge.

Agriculture - Regarding the wood situation, the Regional Agriculture Officer stated that, the Regional Forestry Officer reported a great deal of wood cut and stacked, but a lack of transport to bring it to the centers. . . . It was also reported that the provinces of Torino, Asti and Alessandria have Prefect's orders blocking the sale of hay.

Commerce - The Regional Commerce Officer announced that Glass and Glass substitutes are controlled by the Italian government. The North Italy Industrial Council have been informed of the glass situation and will make allocations at their next meeting. . . . PCI allocations have been cut, but there is nothing which can be done, as this also is controlled by the Italian agencies under a plan announced at last week's meeting. . . . The Commissariate for wood has been warned to give more attention to an equitable allotment of fuel-wood.

Foreign Missions - Because of the presence in the Region of missions representing various countries, the Regional Commissioner sought information as to how they might be dealt with, and the reply has come that they can be questioned and must have in their possession travel orders from AMF, giving names, destination, description of mission, etc.

ABC Currency - The Regional Commissioner requested the Finance Division to urge cooperation of the banks in creating a greater respect for ABC currency. It appears that reluctance to accept this currency is widespread, because of forgeries in 1000 lire denominations, and faith is not encouraged among the population when the banks themselves are wary of the notes.

Assessing - The R.C. congratulated P.O.'s for their part in the assessing campaign, which has been successful to date. Better than 65,000 quintals as a result of the campaign have been amassed as of 20 Sept, and this figure will rise until the final day of the campaign, 25 Sept. The general opinion has been that the services of the Italian soldiers in this regard has been desirable, and some provinces are considering carrying on under the plan after turnover to the Italian government.

Transportation - The R.C. expressed regret over the recent call for good vehicles, but announced that the order must be complied with.

Oruro - P.C. Oruro reported that a Russian Mission had appeared in his province for the alleged purpose of recruiting all Russians in that area. Advice was requested as to whether such Missions can be established without the approval of A.C. The Regional Commissioner will investigate.... It was also reported that Refugee Camps are being closed, and the P.C. asked what disposition is to be made of refugees who will be coming in in the future. The Regional DEER Officer stated that they should be sent to the center at Moncaliere.

Novara - P.C. Novara reported that as the result of an investigation into the Questura, the Prefect had been prevailed upon to dismiss 6 unqualified and questionable division heads in that organization. This he did, but followed closely with his own resignation. The resignation was not accepted, and it is hoped that the Prefect can be prevailed upon to remain in office.

Alessandria - A Prefect problem also exists in the province of Alessandria, with the Prefect having been granted a temporary leave of absence until 1 Sept. The Prefect and Provincial Commissioner of this province will discuss the situation with the Regional Commissioner on 30 August.

Verona - P.C. Verona stated that strikes in other disturbances have in the past been handled by the Public Safety Division, but all were advised that in the future any disorder of sufficient importance should be reported to the Regional Commissioner for a report to A.C. All P.O.'s and Heads of Divisions were asked to give special attention to the status of clearing up outstanding bills before the closing of the Region.

Agriculture - The Regional Agriculture Officer stated that a new agricultural device is about to be issued stating that farmers must slaughter 75 percent of their bovine stock, unless they have three animals or less. This device will seriously affect the building up of herds, but since it must be followed, every effort should be made to see that the meat which will be available finds its way to the legitimate market.... Citing facts and figures, the P.O. explored the results of the housing program in the Region to date. Some interest on the part of AM officers and closer supervision of the work in case services was urged. More police control is to be desired, with special attention given to the larger producers.

Public Works - The Regional Public Works Officer stated that contracts are being experienced in the matter of public works contracts. That materials cannot be bought for the prices which prevailed when the contract was made. In the absence of any control over prices, work is proceeding, with supplementary contracts being drawn up in cases where material cost is higher than had been anticipated.

Food - The Regional Food Officer announced that too much attention cannot be given the housing program, since there is no provision made for organized transportation of flour to various Regions. Prior to the occupation of the Region, A.C. funds, based on the fact that the Region had always been self-sufficient, made no provision for importing grain after 1 Aug.

Transportation - The Regional Transportation Officer announced that Sig. Sofia has been appointed Regional Transport Officer when AM learns the Region. Sig. Orlandi, or any organization which he represents, will not be recognized.... P.O.'s were asked to keep a roster of all their civilian cars, with thought given to the order in which they are willing to sacrifice the vehicles for de-mobilization purposes.

Citing facts and figures, the R.A.O. explored the matter of the dikes program in the Region to date. Some interest on the part of A.M. officers and closer supervision of the work in each division was urged. More police control is to be desired, with special attention given to the larger producers.

Public Works - The Regional Public Works Officer stated that difficulty is being experienced in the matter of public works contracts. Contracts for various projects have been let, but the contractors now find that materials cannot be bought for the prices which prevailed when the contract was made. In the absence of any control over prices, work is proceeding with supplementary contracts being drawn up in cases where material cost is higher than had been anticipated.

Food - The Regional Food Officer announced that too much attention cannot be given the training program, since there is no provision made for organized transportation of flour to Northwest Region. Due to the occupation of the Region, P.O. plans, based on the fact that the Region had always been self-sufficient, made no provision for buying flour again after 1 Aug.

Transportation - The Regional Transportation Officer announced that Sgt. Wolfe has been appointed Regional Transport Officer when Alf leaves the Region. Sgt. Greenfield, or any organization which he represents, will not be reorganized. P.O.'s were asked to keep a roster of all their civilian cars, with thought given to the order in which they are willing to sacrifice the vehicles for de-regularizing purposes.

2. Control by the Regional Organization

Weekly Meetings - The Regional Commissioner announced that meetings between heads of divisions and Provincial Commissioners would be weekly hereinafter in the future. The purpose is not to obtain reports of the people's activities, but to bring all P.O.'s and heads together to coordinate activities and make on-the-spot decisions on matters which might otherwise require lengthy correspondence.

Transportation - Anyone having civilian vehicles on loan or on any other official assignment, should be asked to return such vehicles at once. The R.O. requested that the "Car Driving Campaign" be brought to the attention of all drivers in the Region.

Civilian Officials - It is the wish of the Regional Commissioner that this office be supplied with a list of all civilian officials in the provinces who have been properly mobilized by Procedural Order. In the case of Producers, Vice-producers, Inventors and Artists, Teachers and Scientists, the names of the incumbents are desired. In the case of other officials, Deputations provinciales, Simato conatral, heads of UPRA, UPIC, the Comandante, etc., all that is required is a statement that the post is filled by recognized officials.


