A Having been advised by telephone that the subject of folio 106 was to be presented to this Commission, I cabled SDAO XIII Corps at folio 101, asking for particulars of the case. AME XIII Corps, replied at folio 102 saying that they were following AFHQ's letter G-5-911-03 of 23 Aug. '46, not to us. At folio 103 - cabled AFHQ asking for a copy of that letter. Their reply is at folios 107 and 108.
In this case I consider that a copy should automatically have been sent to us. Do you wish a letter drafted to AFHQ on this point, please?
With regard to the letter itself. As the "Dardah Canal" has been in office since 1929, he cannot be considered a "New Consul." (This para 2 of AFHQ letter.) Therefore suggest that the Danish Legation be advised to make official application to continue to operate (not open) a Consular Office in Trieste.

1. The attention of all persons concerned will be drawn to the fact that sovereign powers cannot be exercised without the approval of the Government of the Territory within which it is proposed to work and that, in so much as they have been either given or per se given, they will cause to remember that they have sovereign powers and will not exercise any sovereign function.

2. They will also be advised that during the Interim period to the establishment of the Free Territory no new diplomatic offices shall be opened at Trieste but that national agents should be left in the hands of a caretaker and arrangements made whereby for sake of national interests, if any特殊 circumstances arose which made a visit desirable, no objection shall be taken by the Italian authorities to a temporary visit to Trieste on purely necessary diplomatic business, but that each visit would require an individual application to you for permit.

Copy of the Allied Military Government's letter to Consul Katomeris, dated September 12th, is attached hereto. The Legation begs to state, that Mr. Katomeris was appointed Danish Consul in 1929.

With reference to the above, the Legation would appreciate to be informed, which procedure is being desired in this matter, whether the Legation, or eventually the consul himself, should make an application to the Allied Military Government in view of obtaining permission for continued exercise of Mr. Katomeris' functions as Danish honorary consul at Trieste.

Dear Sir,

I draw your attention to the fact that consular functions cannot be exercised without approval of the government of the Territory within which it is proposed to perform them.

No such approval has either been applied for or given in your case, and you are therefore advised not to represent in any way that you have any consular powers or are exercising consular functions in this territory. Action will include the removal of all consular signs from buildings and discontinuance of the use of consular letterheads.

It is not intended, during the period to the establishment of the Free Territory, to permit the opening of any new consular offices. National property will be left in the hands of a caretaker. Arrangements can be made with this headquarters for the care of national interests.

If special circumstances arise which make it desirable, no objection will be raised to an accredited consul, having offices elsewhere, making an occasional visit to Trieste to transact necessary consular business, subject to individual application to Allied Military Government for the necessary entry permit.



SUBJECT: Italian Yugoslav Relations.

TO : G-5 Section, AFHQ.

1. I discussed your G-5: 333.7/2 of 27 Feb 46 with the United States and British Embassies who are the chief diplomatic representations through whom Dr. Smidkova would communicate, under your interpretation. I have found however that your directions are at variance with the views of the two Embassies who in turn have received instructions from their Governments.

2. The original terms of reference of the Allied Commission included a directive to the effect that it would handle relations between the United Nations and the Italian Government in the absence of direct relations between Italy and the individual United Nations. (Admin. Memo 74 of 2 Nov 45).

3. The Yugoslav Government does not have direct relations with the Italian Government and it therefore seems questionable whether the Yugoslav representative could take up problems relating to the Italian Government "through diplomatic channels".

4. I consider that the recommendation made by the British and American Embassies should be followed, viz that problems be referred by the Allied Commission directly to the Yugoslav representative on the Advisory Council for Italy. Such problems etc., could be referred to Dr. Smidkova as Yugoslav representative in Italy and not to the Advisory Council as a body.

5. Moreover, such procedure may be a means, through which the Yugoslavs can, in reciprocity, be induced to take measures in Yugoslavia to the advantage of the Italian Government.

6. In this connection I have received a letter from the British Embassy dated 1 April, copy enclosed, stating that it is the policy of the United States and British Governments to endeavour to promote the resumption of direct relations between Italy and Yugoslavia. In pursuance of this policy the British and United States Ambassadors at Belgrade have recently been instructed to suggest to the Yugoslav authorities that the latter will doubtless wish to arrange with the Italian Government for the continuation of whatever Yugoslav consular

offices they wish to maintain in Italy. This decision has been reached by the Allied Government since the Allied Military authorities in Italy are no longer competent to sanction the continued functioning of consular offices of foreign powers in territory which has been transferred to the Italian Government's administration.

7. The following (other than questions arising out of the Allied occupation of Venezia Giulia) give an indication of matters which need to be transacted between the Italians and Yugoslavs.

- (a) The Italian Government frequently alleges that small Italian vessels are seized on the high seas by the Yugoslavs and retained by them, and that in many cases traces of the crews of these vessels are lost.
- (b) The Yugoslav Government has recently alleged that Italian fishing boats have been contravening the laws regarding fishing in Yugoslav waters.
- (c) The Yugoslavs, on many occasions allege that the Italian Government are wrongfully detaining Yugoslav subjects in prison or concentration camps. The Italian Government on its part, maintains that such individuals are not Yugoslav subjects, or that they are being rightfully detained.

3. I should be grateful if you would be so good as to inform the President of the Council of the foregoing.

The British Embassy does not feel that it is justifiable or necessary to put the French Consul at Venice under a greater disability as regards visiting Venezia Giulia than is suffered by private individuals. The request that he should be allowed to visit Trieste from time to time need not, in the British Embassy's opinion, be read as a request for a blanket waiver of the need for a permit, but rather as a request for an assurance that permits for occasional visits will normally be granted.

The British Embassy would certainly expect such permission to be granted to the British Consul General at Milan (who will be in charge of the Trieste Consular district from April 1st.) and recommends that the French consul at Venice should, on the same grounds, be assured of similar treatment.

1. The French representative has now informed us that the French Council in Venice will take over the duties normally performed by the French Consul in Trieste in addition to his present work. The archives of the Consulate are being placed in the care of a French inhabitant of the town, who has been officially employed by the Venice Consulate to protect French interests. (S)

2. As I pointed out in my 578/31 of 1 February 1946 the French Representative further asks that the Consul be allowed to visit Trieste from time to time, but, if that is impossible, he asks that permission be given to the Council to correspond with the French inhabitants in Trieste.

3. I presume you have no objection to the latter proposal, and I seek your authority to inform the French Representative that the former request cannot be granted.

I think I have mentioned to you, some time ago, that the Foreign Office had decided to appoint a Consul at Bolzano. The object of this appointment is to enable the government to keep themselves directly informed of political and other developments in the Province, particularly once the Allied Commission liaison team is withdrawn. It will also, they feel, afford representation to both the German speaking and Italian speaking population and provide an impartial observer through whom their views can be made known to the government.

The officer selected for this post is Mr. Keith Holbocher who was a former SOI officer at Verano. He went to Bolzano at the time of its liberation and he is understood to be respected by both German and Italian speaking elements as having a sympathetic and objective understanding of the problems of both sides. He has now arrived in one, having been to England for release from the Army, and he will shortly be proceeding to his post. I am giving him a letter of introduction to Colonel Miller but I think you may wish to send the latter a telegram informing him of the appointment. I have no doubt that Mr. Hap and Colonel Miller will be able to work together satisfactorily.

1. I have received the attached letter from the French Representative to the Allied Commission and have discussed the request with the US and British Ambassadors.

2. With their agreement I can only recommend that the request be not granted. There is little or no precedent for the appointment of Consuls in AMG territories directly under military command and in what could be justly called, an operational zone; in VENEZIA GIULIA the appointment would doubtless lead to applications from the Russian and other Embassies which could scarcely be tolerated. It is also fair to say that the US and British Embassies have been careful not to appoint Consuls and the representatives in VENEZIA GIULIA of the Political Advisers at AMG have been given instructions to restrict their duties to political advice and not to become involved in consular duties.

3. I therefore seek your authority to inform the French Representative that the request can not be granted. I should like also to add a refusal to the next request which will be for the French Consul at VENICE to visit VENEZIA GIULIA from time to time. This would also create a dangerous precedent.

4. At the same time a decision must be made as to who will take charge of French and other national interests in Zone "A" when the Swiss can no longer take charge of those matters.

With reference to the request of the French Representative that permission be granted for a French Consul to take up his appointment in Trieste (no. 43), it is my understanding that the United States Political Adviser to AFHQ informed the Department of State on October 1 that SACMED was at that time transmitting instructions to XIII Corps that it is the general policy that no consulate should be opened in Trieste while AMG is functioning, pointing out that British and United States representatives are not being given consular status. SACMED's telegram, as reported by AMPOLAD, Caserta, concludes that nomination of French Consul at Trieste which had previously been made was not approved and XIII Corps is instructed to so advise the French Representative.

I have received no indication of any change in this policy and it is therefore assumed that it will not be possible to grant the request of the French Representative.

Attached is a copy of a memorandum left with the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs about the future status and administration of the hitherto diplomatic officials of the former Polish Government in London. It will be seen that these Polish Missions and their personnel will, in so far as they are not yet to be liquidated, be controlled in effect by the British Embassy, together with the welfare services whose temporary maintenance is deemed essential.

2. Mr. A.S. Halford, second secretary of this Embassy has been designated to supervise Polish affairs and will be at the Allied Commission's disposal to discuss any points which in the Commission's view require consideration. In the same way the British Embassy trusts that the Commission will be good enough to examine any points raised by Mr. Halford on the Embassy's behalf.

3. The Sub-Commission most likely to be concerned are:

- (1) The Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission which will no doubt have to consider the position of numerous Polish civilians in this connection; and
- (2) The Liaison Division of the Executive Commissioner's Office. It is requested that the latter may forthwith be informed of the withdrawal of all cypher facilities hitherto enjoyed by any of the Polish Missions concerned and instructed to communicate this decision to the appropriate authorities.

A T T E M P T R S

As has been publicly announced, an interim Treasury Committee for Polish questions, consisting of officials of the British Treasury and Foreign Office and served by Polish officials experienced in various branches of administration, has been appointed to carry on for the present time a part of the administration of the former Polish Government in Great Britain, and for the administration of the welfare of Polish forces. It is essential that administration of the Polish welfare services abroad should also continue.

When recognition was withdrawn from the Polish Government in Rome, as well as the Polish Embassy to the Holy See are among the posts which have hitherto been financed from London with funds available to the Polish Government by His Majesty's Government. The latter have now taken control and will supervise the liquidation of the effects of these posts until further notice.

The Polish Embassy in Rome and the Polish Consulate General in Rome, as well as the Polish Legation in London, and for the maintenance of Polish missions entirely concerned with welfare and other services essential for the maintenance of persons hitherto financially and economically dependent on the London Polish Government, its staff will therefore be maintained in full for the time being.

The two Polish embassies, however, are to be liquidated as soon as possible, only purely subordi-nate, e.g., an embryonat and porters, being retained. All Polish missions and central schools, hospitals, etc., administered by the Polish posts in Italy, are now to be regarded as controlled by the Italian Government. The Polish provinces pending decisions and agreements with the Polish Government as to their future.

Government in London on July 5th, they informed their stations abroad that their diplomatic personnel was relieved from duty from July 31st, and would then receive a grant of three months salary. Heads of missions were told to remain at their posts meanwhile, and to make essential arrangements until further notice.

The Polish embassy in Rome and the Polish Consulate-General in Rome, as well as the Polish embassies to the Holy See and London, with funds supplied to the Polish Government by the Polish Government, the latter have now taken control and will supervise the liquidation of the welfare or these posts entirely concerned with welfare and other services essential for the maintenance of persons hitherto financially and economically dependent on the London Polish Government.

The two Polish embassies, however, are to be liquidated as soon as possible, only partly, being retained. All Polish missions and posts in Italy, are now to be regarded as controlled by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs pending discussions and agreements with the Polish government concerning their future.

The Polish posts and others to be retained, as proposed subsequently in diplomatic posts or diplomatic personnel, if the Italian government sees no objection however, it is proposed to be liquidated or treated by the British government as described above, will not be destroyed or altered in consequence of the consequences of the alteration of their status of service, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs may request the Italian government to do so as it did the competent officials of the Italian government.

Should the Italian Government be agreeable to this arrangement, the Italian Government will be allowed to retain in Italy its privately owned persons until their country of residence is determined. whose services are shortly to be dispensed with will be allowed to remain in Italy unconditionally until those of long standing require to be settled in consequence of the altered status of these Polish officials. It is proposed to instruct the Italian government to do so as it did the competent officials of the Italian government.

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The foregoing information is being communicated also to the Allied Commission in view of the fact that most of the Poles whose welfare it is desired to ensure by the temporary maintenance of the Polish welfare service are of potential interest to the Allied Commission, Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

It will be observed from this memorandum that the British Embassy proposes, as a matter of convenience, to administer the Polish Embassy to the Holy See as well as the Polish Embassy in Rome, owing to the very small staff of His Excellency's Legation to the Holy See.





Dear Sirs:

As an extension of the practice established in your letter of April 9, 1945 with respect to the interchange of information between this Embassy and the several Subcommissions of the Allied Commission, I should like to suggest that a similar degree of cooperation be recommended, if you perceive no objection, between Regional Offices of A.C. in forward areas and American consular establishments in those districts.

The American Consul at Florence, and later the Consul General at Genoa, Milan and other cities, must of course depend heavily upon the Regional Offices in these areas for information concerning conditions in their consular districts. I should be grateful, therefore, if Civil Affairs officers in those regions could be informed of our needs and could extend their cooperation in matters relating to citizenship, economic and other questions.
