2. To his query on the Allied Military Gazette, 13 Corps Venezia Giulia, the following information is available:
 - a) No. 1 - 6 in Italian and Slovenian languages are now available and will be forwarded at once by the Allied Commission Librarian.
 - b) No. 9- 13 are now available and in due time you will receive the complete English, Italian, and Slovenian editions also from the A.C. Librarian.
3. To his query on the availability of other AMG publications the A.C. Librarian informs that the Harvard University is on their mailing list and as various publications are made available they are immediately forwarded to the University. Hence, the Harvard University Law School should already have in their possession all AMG Regulations and Proclamations edited to date.
4. And lastly, in response to his query on the books and continuation of sets from the firm of Hardeochia, Rome, Mr. Insalton forwards his attached letter giving details of past shipments and his plans for future shipments to the Harvard University Law School.

In reply to your MA.2112 of 20 June, I am writing to say that my staff's enquiries about the possibility of AC acquiring a set of the Enciclopedia Italiana have so far been discouraging. There are no sets on sale in Rome and if there were, the cost would be prohibitive. It is believed that second hand sets are sometimes to be found. I have asked the Director of the Education Sub-Commission to make enquiries from the Italian Government to find out the possibility of a presentation but he seems doubtful of success.

I will let you know as soon as I have some definite information. A representative from the British Museum is here at the present moment and no doubt he will be able to help.

Dear Brigadier Lush.

This is an extract of a letter which I have received from H.A. St. George Saunders, who is the Librarian of the House of Commons:

"The Library of the House of Commons, of which I am the Assistant Librarian, has for long been anxious to acquire a set of the Enciclopedia Italiana. It corresponds more or less to the British Encyclopedia but is far more comprehensive and up-to-date. It was published between 1929 and 1937 in 37 volumes. It is quite unobtainable in the open market, and could only be bought at considerable expense - if at all - at an auction.

"Would it by any chance be possible for you to obtain a set for the Library? There are, I believe, many such sets available in Italy, and it has occurred to me that the taxpayer - who, of course, has to provide the money for the House of Commons Library - might be saved a great deal of expense if a set could be procured.

There seems to be no means of acquiring a set here in Naples and it occurred to me that perhaps the Italian Government might be induced to present a set to the Library of the House of Commons, or that there might be some other means of obtaining this publication in Rome.

I shall be very grateful if you could get someone of your staff to look into this and let me know if anything can be done - I think the ambition of the Librarian to save the taxpayers' money is a very laudable one!
