1. Reference is made to your letter No. 688/98/EC, dated 19 November 1946 and attachments wherein the Economic Secretary to the Yugoslav Delegation to A.C.I. requests authority for the issuance of POL for his privately owned automobile.

2. AFHQ letter, subject: "Supply of POL to Military Units of the Allied Nations", dated 31 October 1945, discontinued issue of POL to Yugoslav Military Units on a credit basis and suggested that these Military Units draw the same coupons, on a cash basis, that were issued to civilian contractors working for Allied Military accounts, and that sales to them will not be debited to the Civilian Allocation.

3. C.I.P. will supply POL to Yugoslav Delegation A.C.I. vehicles from the Diplomatic Corps allocation upon authorization of the Italian Ministry of Industry and Commerce. Other vehicles of the Yugoslav Delegation presently draw their petroleum products in this manner, and it is recommended that the same procedure be followed in this case.

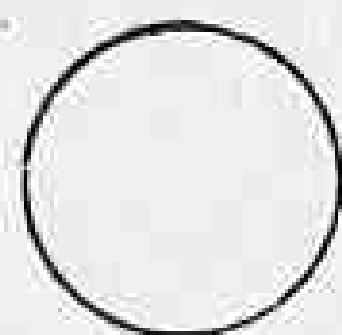

Soap rations used to be included in that general indent until some time ago, when our C.M. was advised that it was necessary to request MTOUSA particularly for the continuance of our soap rations, what we have done.

3. As amount of Soap (laundry soap in particular) per week and other details are concerned, it is requested that soap rations may be issued to our Delegation in future in the same way as it was done in past, i.e. including 40 regular soap rations to other rations authorized and including the price of the same in the indents, which we are regularly receiving and signing. If for any reasons it were necessary to make other kinds of indents for soap rations, apart from the general indents, we of course are ready to sign them in the same way and with the same formula as we are doing for the rest of our U.S. rations.

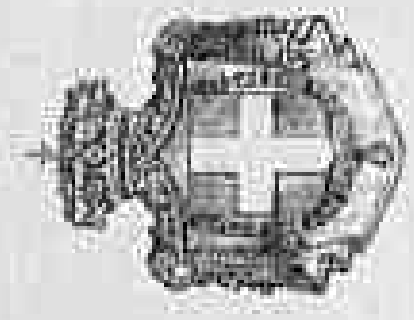

1. A. C. I.: Liaison Officer to A.C.I., Captain Riggio, consulted on this point, states that he is in no position to render recommendations as to size of groups necessary, in his opinion, for the activities of A.C.I. Delegations.
2. Representatives to A.C.: In view of size of French Representative's Staff, it is believed Staff of Soviet Representative could be reduced by half.
3. Displaced Persons and Repatriation Missions:

According to Major Smeock,

- a. the Russian Staff need not exceed 5 officers and 10 men;
- b. the Yugoslav Staff - 4 men. It is further remarked that Yugoslav Mission does not need a building of the present size;
- c. the French and Greek Missions are stated to be in course of reduction and will probably close in less than two months.
