Dear Captain Tunnard,

With reference to our telephone conversation this morning I enclose herewith a copy of a letter from an Austrian Dr. Gorlitzer at New Delhi asking permission to enter Italy.

2. We are informed that his object in coming to Italy is to endeavour from here to return to Austria to resume work as a Doctor. Before the Anschluss he was the head of a big hospital in Vienna, but being a friend of Schuschnigg he was obliged to leave his country, and eventually settled in India where he is well-known to the Archbishop of New Delhi, and has achieved a brilliant reputation.

3. As you suggest, it would therefore seem advisable first to request clearance for him into Austria, and only when this has been obtained to ask for a transit visa for Italy.

4. I should therefore be grateful if you could let me know whether clearance for Austria can be granted.



I am replying to your letter of 29 March 1946, addressed to Admiral Stone, in which you enquire about the documentary permission required for entry into Italy from countries where no Italian Diplomatic or Consular representation exists.

With effect from 25 March 1946, the Italian Government has reassumed responsibility for control of entry into Italy and it is therefore suggested that the matter be taken up by the American Embassy directly with the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

It is understood, however, that the Egyptian Government has agreed to accept an Italian Diplomatic Representative who will be authorized to issue visas. It is expected that this official of the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs will leave for Cairo at about the end of the present month.

My dear Admiral Stone:

I enclose paraphrases of telegrams exchanged between this Embassy and the American Legation at Cairo relative to the abolition of the Military Permit System as it affects the entry of persons into Italy from countries such as Egypt where no Italian Diplomatic or Consular representation exists.

From the enclosed paraphrases, which are believed to be self-explanatory, it will be noted that the American Legation at Cairo has requested specific information, now that it is not possible to obtain either Allied Force Permits or Italian visas in Egypt, regarding what documentary permission, if any, will henceforth be required of persons who are traveling from that country to the United States by air and who would be transient at Italian airfields until their onward flight would be resumed.

While the enclosed message from the Legation refers to the passenger traffic of Transcontinental-world Airways, it is presumed that civilians also entering Italy on allied military aircraft from countries such as Egypt where it is not possible to obtain Italian visas will be similarly affected. I should, therefore, greatly appreciate urgently receiving from you a precise indication of the regulations which have been established with respect to the required documentation of civilians entering Italy in transient air travel status so that appropriate information may be given the Legation at Cairo and to American mis

PARAPHRASE OF TELEGRAM

FROM: American Embassy, Rome

To : American Legation, Cairo

March 16, 1946.

Repeated to Amemb, Caserta,  
and Department of State, Washington.

In answer to your enquiry, you are advised that either Theater Permits issued by appropriate Military Permit issuing officials or Italian passports or visas issued by Italian Consular officers are required of civilians entering Italy. Persons in Egypt should obtain Permits through C.M.F. Cairo, since there exists no Italian representation from which passports or visas may be obtained. It is understood, however, that the Theater Permit system will be abolished on or about March 25th. However, applications for Theater Permits made at C.M.F. prior to the date of the discontinuance of the system will be acted upon. Thereafter, the entry of civilians into Italy will depend upon their being able to obtain appropriate documentation from Italian Consular officers or possibly upon presentation of their requests to enter Italy through foreign diplomatic channels to the Italian Government.

Restoration of normal diplomatic and Consular representation between countries, such as Egypt, and Italy which has not yet occurred should be expedited by the development of this situation. Only the cases of American civilians who happen to be in areas where there is no Italian diplomatic or Consular representation and whose entry into Italy is important or urgent will be presented by this Embassy to the Italian Government. Advice should be given American citizens who are proceeding to countries which have not resumed relations with Italy and who eventually intend to proceed to Italy, that they should obtain their Italian visas in the United States or in other areas where Italian diplomatic or Consular offices have been established.

PARAPHRASE OF TELEGRAM

Beginning the first part of the month of April, Transcontinental-World Airways expects to initiate a regular service to the United States from Cairo.

Besides American citizens, the passenger lists will include a considerable proportion of Egyptians and other persons whose travel would be considered to be in the national interest and who are citizens or subjects of countries which have no representation in Italy. Practically all passengers will be booked without stop-over privileges in Italy on through tickets to the United States from Egypt. Does your telegram dated March 16, 1946 apply to such transient passengers? If so, because of the impossibility of obtaining clearance for certain non-American passengers whose travel would be in the national interest and because of the inevitable delay involved in obtaining clearance for Americans, would it not be possible to make arrangements by virtue of which Transcontinental-World Airways passengers who are booked through to the United States would be permitted, at least pending the establishment of an Italian visa issuing authority in Egypt, to pass through Italy in transit without documentation?

# Spanish Planes Cloud Ciampino Atmosphere

CIAMPINO, Mar. 14.—Maj. John B. Harding, executive officer at Ciampino air base, today declared "untrue" the report that Army personnel had refused to cooperate in servicing Spanish planes using

Maj. Harding explained that all Spanish planes using Ciampino have had clearance from AFHQ and that there was "nothing illegal about it at all."

He said that approximately six Spanish planes have landed at Ciampino in the past few months, those carrying Spanish cardinals to and from the Convent and those labeled diplomatic. "All this has been explained to personnel here and they are satisfied now," Harding said.

Maj. Ralph Slater, head of operations at the field, said that "we go out of our way to prevent any unpleasantness" with the Spanish and that he had personally handled such planes, giving them extra service.

Harding added that any dissatisfaction among weather station officers had been ironed out and there was no "official" trouble from any of the other sections.

Subsequently Maj. Slater asked Capt. Arnold P. Schueler, second in command of the weather station, whether he had "control" of his men, and described the seven lieutenants as "schoolboys and politicians."

### DEFINITE POLICY

When asked his opinion, Capt. Schueler declared that he felt that use of the Ciampino field by Spanish planes should be given publicity, and a definite policy on the use of Army personnel to service civilian planes should be announced.

Capt. Schueler said he had no idea whether the demand for all weather station personnel names and MOS had any relation to a statement by Maj. Slater that he would "clean out" the whole weather station crew and get new men, if necessary, in order to get full cooperation.

Allen said that following the incident of the cardinal's plane, he was told to ask for a transfer to another base. Allen refused.

He was then told he would have to go to Naples for a psychiatric examination. The orders which he received, however, read that he was to report to Naples for "coordination of weather supply activities."

Allen said that he did not "coordinate weather supplies" while in Naples. He reported to the psychiatrist for examination.

### DOCTOR SURPRISED

"The doctor was very much surprised that they would allow someone sent down for a psychiatric examination to drive alone in a jeep. I don't know the result of the examination," Allen said, "but they let me drive back alone, too."

Upon ~~Mar. 13~~<sup>Mar. 14</sup>, Allen was officially informed he was being transferred to Weisbaden, Germany, weather station headquarters for the ETO, MTO and Africa. The orders came through while Lt. Allen told his story.



I have the honour to inform you that:

1. The Greek national, Mr. Emmanuel VINTIADIS, a shipping agent and the representative of many Greek ship-owners, was established in Genoa since 1924.
2. Following the declaration of war by Italy against Greece, Mr. Vintiadis left Genoa for Athens. Being a Greek subject, all his property was subsequently seized by the Italian authorities. He is, since then, ignorant of its fate.
3. Mr. Vintiadis has, on the 24th May 1945, submitted an application to A.E.T.O., through the British Military Police, 212 Area, in Athens, in order that authority be granted him and his family to return to Genoa.
4. As Mr. Vintiadis has not yet received the necessary authority and, following instructions from my Government, I would be very grateful if you would kindly intervene with A.E.T.O. for maintaining the granting of this authority, given that he has to return to Genoa for the settlement of questions relative to the interests of Greek ship-owners.

To: All Commanders,

1. Pursuant to current U.S. Department Instructions on account of Lend-Lease it is directed to United Commanders in the provision of Department Orders Nos. 92 and 451, 1944, the following policy is announced:

a. (1) Only military and civilian personnel of United States Forces may travel by United States aircraft, motor vehicles, rail, or surface vehicles under present Lend-Lease arrangements, when the cost of such travel is to be charged to the United States.

(2) Only so much of the above means of transportation will be authorized under Lend-Lease if arrangements can be made to prevent undue hardship to the individual and country involved.

b. (1) Non-military civilian personnel of United countries - States citizens, who desire to travel by United States Army trains - Corp Command or Naval Air Transport Service facilities or by rail or surface vehicles must make arrangements with the State Department or State Legation in the United States to represent their interest and costs of such importance (see Justify air travel). (See separate Air Circumstances Order 421, 1944, for details).

In addition, United States Army trains - Lend-Lease Air to United countries, will be referred to this Headquarters for final action.

c. All requests for United States Army travel or United States Army personnel to travel by United States facilities involving Lend-Lease Air to United countries, will be referred to this Headquarters for final action.

d. The above requirement does not change the existing procedure for obtaining prior approval of United States or United Forces Headquarters for the entry of United States citizens into Italy or the Balkan countries, including Greece.

1. Transiting to current War Department instructions on account for Lend-Lease furnished to Allied countries in the form of transportation facilities, and in accordance with the provisions of War Department Circulars 350 and 451, 1944, the following policy is announced:

(1) Only military and civilian personnel of United States forces may travel on United States aircraft, motor vehicles, rail, or similar facilities under present Lend-Lease arrangements when the cost of such travel is to be charged to the Allied country concerned.

(2) Only so much of the above means of transportation will be authorized under Lend-Lease arrangements as is necessary to prevent undue hardship to the individual who is traveling.

b. (1) Non-military civilian personnel of Allied countries who are authorized to travel by land and sea routes facilities will be required to pay the cost of transportation at the time the transportation tickets are issued.  
(2) In addition, all such civilians, including United States citizens, who desire to travel by United States Army Transport Service facilities are required to obtain clearance from the nearest State Department representative that such travel by aircraft is in the national interest and is of such importance as to justify air travel. (See Circular 10, D. Circular Number 451, 1944, as changed). The individual must obtain this certificate prior to requesting military travel orders.

2. All requests for intra and inter-theatre travel of all Allied Armed Forces personnel by United States facilities involving Lend-Lease aid to Allied countries will be referred to this headquarter for final action.

c. The above requirement does not cleanse the existing procedure for obtaining approval of US head quarters of Allied Force Headquarters for the entry of foreign nationals into Italy or the Balkan countries, including Greece.

scuserai il modo brusco, con il quale, dopo anni di silenzio, mi sono fatto vivo presso di te.  
Ti ringrazio vivamente dell'interessamento che hai subito preso al mio caso, e spero che esso portare, al più presto, i suoi frutti, dato che, come ti racconterò, ne ho proprio estrema necessità.

Dal 26 di agosto dell'anno scorso sono passato attraverso gli Ospedali di Asmara, e dalle mani dell'uno all'altro dottore. 

SUBJECT: Italian Mission in Albania

1. Reference is made to Allied Commission's verbal communications concerning the dismissal of the Italian Mission in Albania.
2. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs beg to inform that, according to a cable received on the 10th, inst. from Signor TURCATO, Head of said Mission, the latter was notified that same day by the Albanian Mission the permits to proceed to Italy, the diplomatic passports of signor Foni Cirko and of his secretary had been withdrawn by their Government, and that the question should be submitted to new consideration.
3. However, as the Italian Mission was subsequently compelled to repatriate, at the Albanian Government's request the Italian Government feels now that the despatch to Rome of the Albanian Mission should be withheld, until the time when it will be possible to send back to Tirana a similar Italian Mission.

The request states that Niven von der Leyen suffered a nervous breakdown following the death of her son Wolfgang. She would return to Germany after a period of convalescence of a few weeks in Italy.

Prince Ruffo Ruffo would also request the liberation of his nephew, Oberwachtmeister Rudolf Graf von Schonborn, P.G. Nr. 1416311, Depot Des P. G. Nr. 87, Belfort.

In this request the prince points out that Rudolf Graf von Schonborn was expelled from the National Socialist Youth Organizations because he refused to attend their meetings. His 64 year-old mother is sickly and is practically confined to bed. His presence in the home, Prince Ruffo asserts, would be of great assistance and solace to her.

In reference to my letter of January the 5th 1946, concerning His Grace the Archbishop of Simla, I have today had a letter from the Archbishop, Most Reverend Dr. Sylvester Nulligen, O.F.M. Cap., from Cathedral House, New Delhi, India, giving the approximate date when he would like to be able to report at the Vatican. He says:-

" I intend to pay my Quinquennial Visit to the Holy Father this coming Spring and report on my Mission in India. I would like to leave about the end of February or the beginning of March 1946. There is just one difficulty in the way; it seems I must first have the permission of the Commander of the Allied Forces in Italy to visit Rome. His presence in Italy is deemed essential, for, he will be given all the legal powers to represent our society in Assab.
