Dr. Smolaka, the Acting Representative of Yugoslavia to the A.C.I. has requested that the following information be passed to you:

"1. The Yugoslav Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy have been informed from the Yugoslav Government that Mr. VISICKI Ijubica, former Charge d'affaires in Madrid of the ex-Royal Yugoslav Government in London, was still issuing passports in name of the Yugoslav Royal Government. These passports issued by him are ante-dated and valid until 1950. According to information received, these passports are considered as valid by the U.S., Swiss, Spanish, and French authorities.

Mr. VISICKI Ijubica was in Madrid at the time when Yugoslavia broke up the diplomatic relations with Franco's Spain. He remained there after that date and is still keeping open his so-called Legation in Madrid. Mr. VISICKI Ijubica was discharged of his duty and dismissed by the Yugoslav Government as an enemy of the country, on 8 May 1945.

2. By order of the Yugoslav Government I have the honour to inform you that the Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia do not recognize the validity of any passports released in name of the ex-Royal or of the ex-Royal Government of Yugoslavia in London, without any regard to the date of expiration of such passports."

Identity card was issued in first half of 1944 by the sous-prefect of Bastia Corse (To you Paleo-Austro-Americans that is Corsica!)

She was also issued a Laissez Passer to proceed to Paris in Ajaccio-Corsica in March 1945.
