1. The a/n two persons arrived in MILAN on the 3rd July, 1946, in possession of a 'Request for Air Priority - Passengers' form.
2. In the bottom left hand corner of each form were the rubber-stamped words - "Tariffa INTERA" but over the word 'Intera' - 'Gratuita' had been written in ink.
3. Major Bentley had signed on the line under the official rubber stamp, but had not initialled the alteration - or the word 'Gratuita', which could of course, have been written by anyone.
4. These two civilians requested an air passage from MILAN to ROME free of charge, but when I pointed out the irregularity on the original form, they were quite willing to pay the full fare!!
5. Please ensure that all forms are made out correctly and any alterations initialled as this HQs has to be guided by the original forms initiated by officials of A.C. HQs.
6. Will you please advise me as to whether the alteration was authentic or merely an alteration whereby the officials saved themselves a sum of L:22,000.

Referring to the attached letter from the British Council complaining of a lack of helpfulness from this office, this cannot be understood in view of the fact that the Council has received, and does receive, every possible assistance in the way of road and air transport both for passengers and freight. Mr Robinson of the British Council will no doubt testify to this.

With regard to the instances mentioned in the letter;

- (a) If Miss Hannon was given an appointment at 7-45 a.m. this was no doubt because the bus leaves for the Palermo plane at 8-00 a.m.
- (b) Mr Robinson informed me of the visit of Mr Parolassien and Mr Jenkins from London several days before their arrival and we discussed how to facilitate their travel in Italy. Civilian passengers have to appear in person as the indemnity certificate cannot be signed by another or the necessary information supplied.
- (c) Travel Authority forms can be obtained without difficulty from my office and are supplied to every traveller on receipt of a request from the different embassies, or on production of travel orders from military formations. As these forms serve as tickets, it can easily be appreciated why they are not distributed freely.

A little co-operation and understanding from passengers is also conducive to smooth running services. Two months ago a British soldier in the Air Booking Offices complained of the language used by a lady from the British Council during a spell of bad weather. This office is always pleased to help, and any inconvenience which may have been experienced by any member of the Council is regretted.

PERSONAL AND CONFIDENTIAL*My dear Jack,*

I am writing to ask if you could help us over the difficulty which we are experiencing as regards booking Air passages for British Council staff. I am sorry to seem to complain but the following instances have occurred within the course of the last few days:-

(a) Miss Hannon, my Secretary (a most efficient, pleasant and amenable person) was transferred temporarily at short notice to Palermo. She filled up the requisite forms and went round to Major Bentley's office one morning last week, but failed to find him there. She asked if she might leave the forms for attention but was told that she could not do so and must return again with them. She returned again that afternoon. Major Bentley was still absent. Eventually she was given an appointment by telephone with Major Bentley - at 7.45 a.m. the following day, which seems rather an unreasonable time to fix for someone who is working long hours and doing a rather arduous job of work in a busy organisation.

(b) On the 15th March it was necessary to obtain Air passages from Rome to Milan for Mr. Paroissien and Mr. Jenkins, who have come out from London on a special Foreign Office - British Council mission in connection with the exhibition and sale of British Books in Italy. Mr. Paroissien being already in Rome and Mr. Jenkins en route from Naples to Rome, the former went round to Major Bentley with the forms of application for these passages, but was informed to the effect that Major Bentley was prepared to consider the application of Mr. Paroissien only as he happened to have heard of him, but that he could not entertain the application of Mr. Jenkins as he did not know of him and must insist on Mr. Jenkins appearing with the forms in person (which I cannot help feeling was a little unnecessary and unhelpful).

(c) To run out of the forms which Major Bentley likes us to use and when Miss Hannon saw him about her own passage to Palermo, she asked him for some more. She gathered from him that he had none to give her and that he could not suggest how she could get any. Hazelton, then asked for the forms personally at the Hotel Reale and was told to get them from the British Embassy. He went on to the British Embassy but was informed that the forms could only be obtained from Major Bentley. I must say that this sort of "giving us the run around" is scarcely helpful in our work, which is sufficiently arduous without having to cope with lack of helpfulness and co-operation.

A.7.2. - LIMITATION OF THE AMOUNT OF MONEY WHICH MAY BE TAKEN OUT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM.

(A.800222/45/10 '5.1 - 26.7.45.)

1. Travellers carrying sterling and/or foreign bank notes - In the national interest, the amount of money taken abroad by any person must be reduced to the minimum. Under the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, and the Orders made thereunder, except with the permission of the Treasury, the amount of sterling bank notes and/or foreign currency which may be taken out of the United Kingdom by any person is limited as follows:

- (2) By service personnel (male or female) proceeding to Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg, Monaco or Norway. - Foreign currency not exceeding £10 sterling in value but not sterling notes whatsoever may be taken.
- (4) By civilian personnel proceeding to Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg, Monaco or Norway. - Sterling bank notes not exceeding £5 sterling in value and foreign currency not exceeding £10 sterling in value may be taken.
- (iii) By service or civilian personnel proceeding to Albania, Austria, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Estonian Republic, Finland, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvian Republic, Lithuanian Republic, Poland, Rumania or Yugoslavia. - Sterling bank notes not exceeding £5 sterling in value and foreign currency not exceeding £10 sterling in value may be taken.
- (iv) By service or civilian personnel proceeding to the Channel Islands and not proceeding via the Channel Islands to any other destination abroad. - Sterling bank notes and Guernsey currency may be taken without limit.
- (v) By service or civilian personnel proceeding to Eire and not proceeding via Eire to any other destination abroad. - Sterling bank notes and Irish currency may be taken without limit.
- (vi) By service or civilian personnel proceeding to any destination other than those named in sub-para. (i) to (v) above. - Sterling bank notes not exceeding £10 sterling in value and foreign currency not exceeding, when aggregated with any sterling bank notes, £15 sterling in value may be taken.

2. Travellers' cheques and sterling bank notes. - (i) The maximum amount of foreign currency which may be taken out of the United Kingdom is inclusive of the value of travellers' cheques expressed in foreign currency.

(ii) Sterling travellers' cheques may, if desired, be taken out of the United Kingdom, in addition to the sterling stated in para. 1 above but subject to the conditions laid down in para. 3 of A.M.O. 4.7.44/45.

(iii) Sterling bank notes of denominations higher than £1 are not to be taken out of the United Kingdom in any circumstances.

3. Exchange of sterling bank notes. - (i) Service personnel proceeding to the under-mentioned territories, viz. Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg, Monaco or Norway, may obtain foreign currency in exchange for sterling bank notes, up to the amount of £10 sterling, from the R.A.P. accountant officer or other service currency exchanging officer at the personnel despatch centre, or other service currency exchanging officer at the personnel despatch centre, if the amount of sterling bank notes is less than £10 may

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by any person is limited as follows:

- (i) By service personnel (male or female) proceeding to Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg, Monaco or Norway. - Foreign currency not exceeding £10 sterling in value but not sterling notes whatsoever may be taken.

 - (v) By service or civilian personnel proceeding to the Channel Islands and not proceeding via Eire to any other destination abroad. - Sterling bank notes and Irish currency may be taken without limit.
 - (vi) By service or civilian personnel proceeding to any destination other than those named in sub-para. (i) to (v) above. - Sterling bank notes not exceeding £10 sterling in value and foreign currency not exceeding, when aggregated with any sterling bank notes, £15 sterling in value may be taken.
2. Travellers' cheques and sterling bank notes. - (i) The maximum amount of foreign currency which may be taken out of the United Kingdom is inclusive of the value of travellers' cheques expressed in foreign currency.
- (ii) Sterling travellers' cheques may, if desired, be taken out of the United Kingdom, in addition to the sterling stated in para. 1 above but subject to the conditions laid down in para. 3 of A.M.O. A.744/45.
- (iii) Sterling bank notes of denominations higher than £1 are not to be taken out of the United Kingdom in any circumstances.
3. Exchange of sterling bank notes. - (i) Service personnel proceeding to the under-mentioned territories, viz. Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg, Monaco or Norway, may obtain foreign currency in exchange for sterling bank notes, up to the amount of £10 sterling, from the R.A.M. accountant officer or other service currency exchanging officer at the personnel despatch centre, airfield or port of departure from the United Kingdom. Not more than £10 may be thus exchanged and no foreign currency in excess of the equivalent of £10 sterling and no sterling bank notes whatsoever may be taken out of the United Kingdom.

(ii) Service personnel proceeding to any territory other than those stated in sub-para. (i) above will have their sterling bank notes exchanged into local

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foreign currency through official channels immediately on disembarkation overseas, and all sterling bank notes in their possession are to be surrendered for exchange accordingly.

(iii) On being placed under orders to proceed to any destination overseas, service personnel, therefore, are to take steps, before leaving their base station, to limit their cash holdings, so that the amount of sterling bank notes and/or foreign currency held by any individual on leaving the United Kingdom will not exceed the limits stated in the appropriate sub-paragraph of para. 1 above.

(iv) In view of sub-para. (iii) above, personnel proceeding to any destination overseas are advised to reduce their cash holdings by deposit in banks or savings accounts, by remittance by postal or money order, or by other suitable means. Exceptionally, airmen may, if they so wish, deposit their excess cash holdings with the accountant officer or trust holder of their parent unit or of the personnel despatch centre for credit to their pay ledger accounts. Each airman from whom excess cash is accepted under this sub-paragraph is to be furnished with a receipt as follows:

French francs, Algerian francs, French Moroccan francs, French West African francs, Belgian francs, Netherlands guilders, Austrian schillings, Danish kroner, German marks, Norwegian kroner, Italian lire or Tripolitanian lire.

(ii) Other travellers. - Any person other than those stated in sub-para. (i) above is prohibited from bringing into the United Kingdom any foreign notes (including military notes) expressed in the currencies stated in sub-para. (i) above, which exceed in the aggregate 55 sterling in value.

3. Exchanges of foreign currencies. - Service personnel returning to the United Kingdom may have their foreign currency exchanged for sterling as follows:-

(i) (a) Foreign currency derived from R.A.F. pay and allowances received in the aforementioned territories viz., Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg, Monaco or Norway, may, within prescribed limits, be exchanged into sterling by R.A.F. accountant officers or other service currency exchanging officers at the continental ports of embarkation before departure for the United Kingdom. The amount certified by G.Os. for exchange must not, save in exceptional circumstances, exceed the amount of drawings of pay and allowances during the preceding two months, as shown in the airman's pay book (Form 64, part II), or Officer's pay and allowance book (Form 31.)

(b) Any local foreign currency notes held by service personnel in excess of the amount permitted to be exchanged under these provisions must not be brought into the United Kingdom.

(ii) (a) Foreign currencies derived from R.A.F. pay and allowances received in territories other than those stated in sub-para. (i) above, may, within prescribed limits, be exchanged into sterling by R.A.F. accountant officers or other service currency exchanging officers prior to embarkation for the United Kingdom. Such exchanges will in all cases be limited to the unexpended balances of pay and allowances previously drawn locally by personnel, and will have regard to the probable requirements of the individual on the journey and to the over-riding limit of £10 on the amount of sterling which may be brought into the United Kingdom.
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(b) Unexpended balances of pay and allowances which have been drawn in local currencies and which are not exchangeable into sterling under the terms of sub-para. (a) above are to be disposed of by personnel through a bank or handed to the R.A.F. accountant officer for remittance to a nominee in the United Kingdom, deposit in a Post Office Savings Bank account or purchase of National Savings certificates, prior to departure for the United Kingdom. Exceptionally, such unexpended balances may be deposited by airman, if they so wish, with the accountant officer or landpost holder for credit to the pay ledger accounts as

Such exchanges will in all cases be limited to the unexpended balances of pay and allowances previously drawn locally by personnel, and will have regard to the probable requirements of the individual on the journey and to the over-riding limit of £10 on the amount of sterling which may be brought into the United Kingdom.

(b) Unexpended balances of pay and allowances which have been drawn in local currencies and which are not exchangeable into sterling under the terms of sub-para. (a) above are to be disposed of by personnel through a bank or handed to the R.A.F. accountant officer for remittance to a nominee in the United Kingdom, deposit in a Post Office Savings Bank account or purchase of National Savings certificates, prior to departure for the United Kingdom. Exceptionally, such unexpended balances may be deposited by airman, if they so wish, with the accountant officer or transfer holder for credit to their pay ledger accounts as stated in A.M.O. 4.742/45, para. 3, sub-para. (iv).

4. Exchange of foreign currency in the United Kingdom.- (i) The bringing into the United Kingdom of any foreign currency notes referred to in para. 2 above constitutes a civil offence and renders the offender liable to prosecution in the civil courts or to trial under the Air Force Act by court-martial. Also, any foreign currency notes so imported would be liable to seizure.

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(ii) Any other foreign currency still in the possession of personnel on arrival in the United Kingdom will not be exchanged through service channels unless adequate reasons are available.

(iii) The conditions and regulations stated in the foregoing paragraphs apply equally to persons arriving in the United Kingdom, whether by sea or air. If, however, service personnel are precluded by the exigencies of the service (e.g. when proceeding by air) from exchanging their local foreign currency notes into sterling under the conditions stated in the foregoing paragraphs, prior to their departure for the United Kingdom, their currencies may be exchanged on arrival in the United Kingdom, provided that -

(a) A satisfactory explanation is given as to the reasons for not exchanging and/or displaying of the currencies prior to departure for the United Kingdom;

(b) The amount tendered for exchange complies with the provisions stated in para. 3, sub-para. (i)(a) or (ii)(a), above, as appropriate;

(c) In the case of currencies other than those referred to in para. 2 above, provided that the provisions of sub-para. (a) and (b) above are satisfied, exchange may also be made of unexpired balances of pay and allowances drawn locally which were eligible for transfer to the United Kingdom under the procedure stated in para. 3, sub-para. (ii)(b), above.

5. This order is to be brought to the notice of all ranks, and relative extracts therefrom are to be prominently displayed on unit notice-boards.

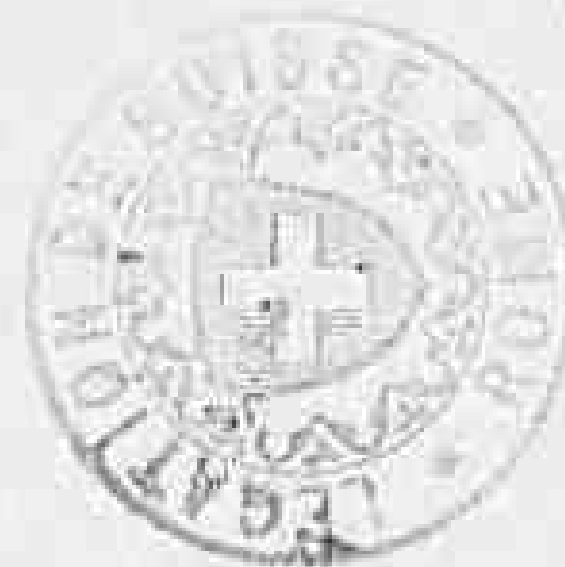

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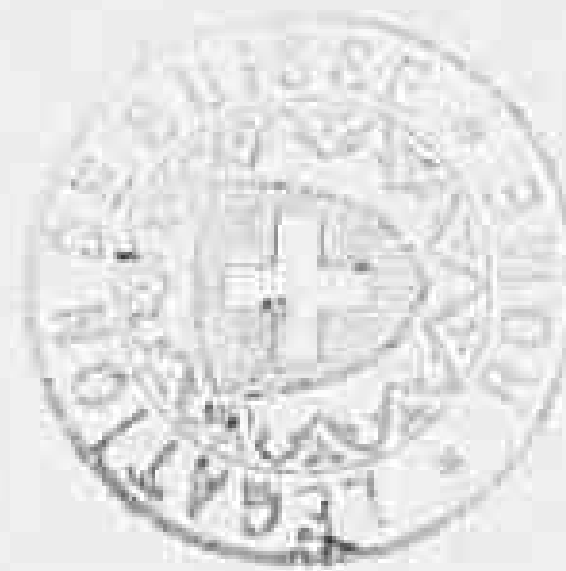
