Because of unreliability of LITERO airfield congressional party, if weather permits flying, will arrive and depart from CIAMPINO airfield. Air arrival at CIAMPINO will be at approximately 1600 hours, Thursday 14 December. The six sedans promised you to aid in transport in ROME will not repeat not arrive in ROME in time to help pick up party at CIAMPINO, as cars cannot leave NAPLES prior to take off at 1500 hours. These cars should arrive GRAND HOTEL in time for use that night. Air departure from CIAMPINO to FLORENCE will be at 1400 hours Saturday 16 December. If weather prohibits departure from FLORENCE by aircraft on morning of 18 December we will cancel scheduled program for that day and party will return by road from FLORENCE to ROME to remain overnight and leave at 0830 hours in 6 54's from CIAMPINO for CARABIA ROA and WASHINGTON. He will notify you from FLORENCE whether this emergency change in itinerary is necessary. Accompanying party on arrival in ROME in addition to committee members, 3 officers from WASHINGTON and correspondents and photographers previously mentioned will be fifteen individuals as follows; Brigadier General A J M CHRYSLER, Chief inc section, Colonel REAPP, Air Liaison officer, Colonel ROBERT CLARK, Deputy Pro; Lt Colonel WILLIAM NEE, Theater tour coordinator; Lt Colonel J P BAKER, G3 Liaison; Major FLOYD REIDMAN, G5 Liaison; Miss VIOLET BUCKET, Assistant to Chief inc; Captain BENJAMIN BARBER, Aide to General ROCKS; Captain LOUIS GRABOT, Aide to General ROCK; Captain TIMOTHY BRUGHERST, G9 Section; Captain LILLIAN HARRIS, WAG; Lt Colonel STUART, Aide to General WHITE; Lt ARTHUR BURKE, Press censor and two enlisted male stenographers, making a total party of 42. In addition there will be drivers for the six sedans and the crews of three transport aircraft who must be accommodated.

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
