The statement made by Ellis that the A.C. would be used for all further operations is a nebulous understatement. It should really say that the experts would operate in the area only through the A.C. They may receive their instructions from the Embassies, but these instructions are subject to approval by the A.C. as long as it has the responsibility now resting with it.

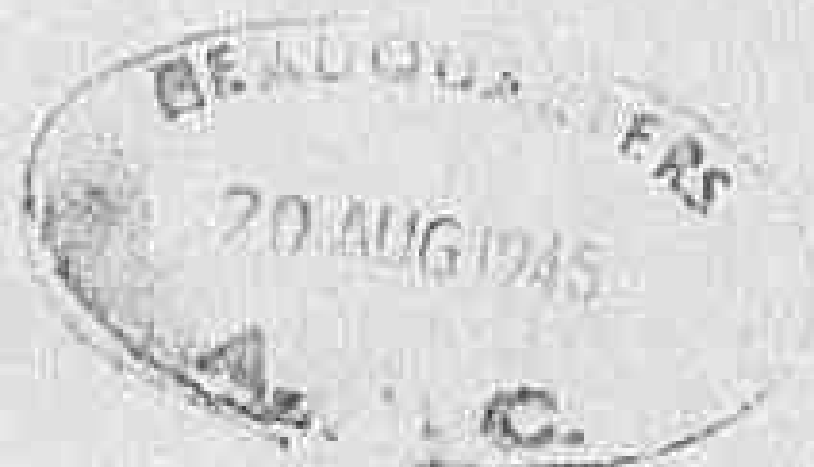

1. It is the policy of the Supreme Allied Commander's Secretariat (SACS), which is the co-ordinating Section at this Headquarters dealing with visits to this theatre, to reply within 6 days to each request for permission to enter the theatre. In many cases it is necessary for this Section, at the direction of SACS, to refer to you for your views on the advisability of allowing entry and it has been noted that your replies in some cases have taken from 7 to 10 days to come through.

2. It is appreciated that in some cases you may have to make enquiries of the field before you can reply finally to this Section but whenever possible it is essential that a specific reply should be given within 5 days. Should you be unable to reply fully within that time directions have been received that your reasons in writing should be given within that time in order that SACS may send a reasoned interim reply to the authority or agency requesting entry.

3. The following procedure will therefore be adopted in future cases:

a. This Section will signal (rather than write you) for your views in cases referred to it by SACS.

b. Your considered reply will be signalled to this Section whenever possible so as to arrive within 5 days of the time-date of our signal.

c. If you are unable to reply finally within the above time you will signal this Section so as to give, within 5 days of the time-date of our signal, the reasons why it is not possible to reply finally within that time with the earliest date by which your final reply may be expected. 4333

1. Lieut.Colonel ELLIS, who is visiting this theatre on general liaison duties from the War Office, discussed the following matters with me this morning:

- (a) Officials of British Ministry of Food and Supply. Normally these officials are attached to the Allied Commission. For various reasons he regards the situation as slightly anomalous. He points out that when competitive buying as between British and American (Government) purchasers, is brought into force, it will be anomalous to have competition between officials all belonging to one Commission. He therefore suggests that these officials should be attached to the British Embassy and should receive their instructions for purchasing Italian exports through the Embassy (Commercial Counsellor). They would then use the Allied Commission for all further operations. The US is at present a relatively negligible purchaser but Lieut.Colonel Ellis suggests that the same procedure should be adopted if and when they come into the Italian export market and understands that Mr. Antolini agrees. I have asked him to clear the matter with the British Embassy before taking it further.

- (b) Coal from SARDINIA. Lieut.Colonel Ellis considers that the reduction in output is due, not so much to political or labour troubles, as to the action taken by AFHQ in the middle of last year in compulsorily reducing the output owing to the large stocks held at Sardinian ports. He points out that it is very difficult to increase output once a policy of reduction has been affected and labour has been laid off. He is against possible measures to increase output and considers that it will gradually regain its old level.

- (c) Requisitioning of 361,000 tons of coal. He points out that there is some confusion as to the breakdown of the requisition for coal which has been included in Programme "A" (military needs). - (c) Civilianisation of British Personnel. He agrees that it is most improbable that any but a negligible number of British civilians will be forthcoming. I have pointed out to him that it will be prudent, if not essential, that we should be able to offer civilian terms and conditions of service to British officers who might wish to remain, say on the Economic side of the Commission, or whatever may take its place after the end of hostilities. Otherwise we shall be faced with a civilian American team and a British military team, or more probably, no British at all. He has asked that this should be represented to the War Office and will follow it up on his return. I will address a letter to AFHQ for your approval.
