You will remember that Mr. Stokes was accommodated by Brigadier Lush and presumably this time he will have to be accommodated under civilian arrangements unless we get permission for him to be accommodated in requisitioned accommodation. There will also be the question of transport and if he wishes to tour round Italy, unless Disper have a suitable vehicle, it may be a question of referring the matter to GHQ for a vehicle.

I have spoken to Major WOODCOCK, out of which the following points emerge:

1. Col FIDELAY returns on Sunday next, and he and Mr STOKES work closely and will almost certainly go together on any tours of inspection which Mr STOKES may wish to make. This takes care of transportation.
2. Col FIDELAY will probably want Mr STOKES to stay at Victoria Hotel, in which case he can be accommodated there and no special authority is needed. If he does not do that, he will stay at the Grand Hotel and pay his own expenses.

It seems therefore that no further action is required at the moment.

1. General Mark Clark arrived in MILANO on the night of 25th June, 1946, accompanied by his wife and children, and a staff of four officers.

2. He attended a banquet organised by the Municipio at mid-day on 26th June, and decorated 59 ex-Partisans at a ceremony held in the Castello Sforcesco at 1800 hrs on the same day.

3. Colonel Hume arrived here on Saturday, 22nd June, 1946, and booked rooms for the General at the Principe di Savoia - these rooms were not used - or cancelled - the General staying at the Diana.

4. Colonel Fiske arrived in MILANO on Saturday, 22nd June, 1946.

5. No official liaison was made by any of the a/m officers with the Area Commander, the U.C. Screening Commission (who is responsible for organising ceremonies of this nature) or with this H.Q.

~~On Monday~~ <sup>TUESDAY</sup> mid-day the Area Commander telephoned to me asking if I knew any details of the visit as he had read of the impending visit in 'Tuesdays' (25th June) issue of the "Union Jack", and had been advised of it at 1230 hrs by the Sindaco.

7. I located Colonel Hume at 1700 hrs and conducted him to the Area Commander.

8. Colonel Fiske was supplied with aircraft, arranged by this H.Q., to convey him, and an Italian General's family to TORINO and then ROME to-day.

1. During his visit to AFHQ from 19-21 June 46, Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery will be briefed by the Chiefs of the General Staff Sections AFHQ. At 1545 hrs 20 June, the undersigned is scheduled to "Talk on functions of G-5 and Allied Commission." It is requested that you furnish either in outline form or in a form ready for discourse, matter which in your opinion should be made known to the Field Marshal. It is believed that it is not desirable to present a historical recitation, but to present the present problems confronting the Allied Commission (including AEC functions and responsibilities) and those residual problems which will confront the successors of the Commission. It is not unlikely that interest will be shown in the set-up and functions of the three service sub-commissions and the reasons for the preponderance of British personnel in these S/Cs. It would be advisable therefore to expand somewhat on these matters. In this connection it is noted that General Browning is to speak at 1500 hours on the Italian Army. Care should be taken to prevent duplication. The problem of the maintenance and dispersal of displaced persons, and the probable future commitments of the military in respect thereof should likewise be included.

2. Any statistical information which might be of value, including some facts about UNRRA food imports would be appreciated in case inquiries are made.
