

My dear Brigadier,

I desire to suggest a simple remedy for a situation which I think may be causing a certain amount of embarrassment, inconvenience and inefficiency. It relates to visits to Eighth Army AMG by Headquarters officers.

Many officers coming to this area, knowing that their time will be limited, notify only Main AMG of their proposed visit and proceed directly to that headquarters, apparently under the impression that they can obtain all relevant information and secure overnight accommodation, there.

Actually, there is usually no spare accommodation at Eighth Army Main AMG, and there are very few kinds of business which can be satisfactorily settled without a trip to this headquarters, which you must remember is also Administrative Headquarters Eighth Army AMG, and is distant about fifty minutes by road from Main.

The invariable result is that either (1) someone at Eighth Army Main calls us and asks us if we can take in the visitors, or can furnish the information or (2) the matter is overlooked until the visitor arrives, in which case he almost invariably has to come here anyhow, but we are not likely to be as well prepared with the necessary accommodation or information.

I hope that it can, in view of previous expressions, go without saying that we are not only willing but very eager to have visitors under any conditions, with or without notice, and we shall continue, as we have in the past, to supply both the accommodation and the information they need to the best of our ability.

It would, however, be conducive not only to the greater comfort of visitors but to the satisfactory accomplishment of their business if they would, when they notify Eighth Army AHS Main of their proposed visit, likewise advise the Administrative Headquarters (Emilia Region) specifying numbers, probable length of stay and nature of business to be transacted.

This is particularly true now, when both the SCAG and his chief staff officer are both required, in the performance of other duties, to be out of the area so much of the time.

If you think it appropriate I suggest that you advise potential visitors of the situation here and act in accordance with my suggestion.

Incidentally, I hope that you yourself will find it possible to visit us very soon.

I will not say more than to tell you how very much Mr. Taylor and Colonel Sieff regret not visiting your Region, a failure which was due to circumstances entirely beyond their control, and how very much they regret the trouble to which you and your officers were put. In war time, however, we must expect these disappointments and I am sure that missing you was as big a disappointment to Mr. Taylor as it was to yourself.

1. For information and guidance following is extract from Minutes of Staff Meeting 9 February.

Italian Government Territory

"a. COS has prepared a new paper on withdrawal from the South, which would leave 42 officers in Southern Italy, Sicily and Sardinia. Of these, 34 were AMG officers in Naples Commune and 2 AMG officers in Pantelleria and Lampedusa. Some of the balance of 6 officers would only be there for a limited period."

"b. COS ruled that the 5 officers at Civitavecchia would come under Economic Section.

"c. COS will discuss the whole subject of withdrawal from the South with Civil Affairs Officer, AFHQ today. The COS said we must consider the repercussions on the military and must warn AFHQ that the Italians will have heavy additional responsibilities.

"d. COS will try to persuade AFHQ to remove the Area HQ from Sicily.

AMG Territory

"e. COS reported that the posting of officers for Northern Regions was nearly complete. He pointed out that there was a tendency for everyone to forget Toscana, Emilia and Abruzzi-Marche Regions. This must be avoided.

"f. Establishment Section was directed to examine the possibility of moving Piemonte Region, HQ to Siena as Regional and Area HQs should be together.

"g. Lombardia Region will collect in Rome after Lazio-Umbria Region has gone on 1 March.

"h. This will leave only Liguria Region at Chiavari; Office of COS will obtain information as to which areas are to be in Liguria."

I quote a recent signal:

"TO EMILIA REGION FOR REGIONAL COMMISSIONER FROM
ALCOM (telegraphic gibberish omitted):
MR. HERRITT H. TAYLOR DIRECTOR AND LT COL
M.J. SIEFF COORDINATOR MOVEMENTS DIVISION TRANS-
PORTATION SUBCOM DESIRE TO DISCUSS TRANSPORTATION
MATTERS WITH YOU AT YOUR HEADQUARTERS ON THURSDAY
EIGHT FEBRUARY. PLEASE ADVISE IF CONVENIENT"

and my reply:

"CONVENIENT FOR MISTER HERRITT H. TAYLOR AND LT
COL M.J. SIEFF TO VISIT THIS HQ EIGHTH FEB"

We of Emilia Region are proud of our accomplishments
here. We enjoy showing them to our friends, and appre-
ciate visits by Headquarters officers which seem to indi-
cate some interest in what we are doing. Consequently,
it was only standard operating procedure to take the
following steps upon receipt of the quoted signal:

a. The Regional Commissioner postponed a planned
trip to the Fifth Army area.

b. The Regional Transportation Officer and his
assistants prepared displays of their workshops, forms,
methods and operations, not only at Regional Headquarters,
but at Rimini, Cervia, Ravenna, Cesena, and Forli.

c. Directors of all Autotrasporti were instructed
to be on hand all day Friday, February 9th for the purpose
of explaining plans and methods of operation to distinguished
visitors.

d. Every mechanic and clerk, civilian and military, in the Transportation Division was alerted to facilitate the rapid but effective inspection by the Director, of the product of the blood, sweat and tears which have been expended by these people for months in creating an efficient motor transport organization out of salvage, discarded loot and vehicles which have been literally buried in the ground for years.

e. Provincial Commissioners of Ravenna and Forlì, and their officers, were alerted to furnish proper information, entertainment and accommodation for Mr. Taylor and Lt. Col. Sieff, whatever their needs and inclinations might be.

f. The Mess and Billeting Officer "laid on" an exceptional menu and entertainment, and prepared for the reception of Mr. Taylor, the room in our Officers' Mess which we (once confidently, later hopefully, now whimsically) refer to as the "Admiral's room."

The arrangements for overnight accommodation and entertainment, and the Friday trip, were perhaps not altogether justified on the basis of the express language of the signal, but most of our visitors, having come this far, do at least stay overnight and spend part of a succeeding day with us. I think it was a fair inference that this was Mr. Taylor's intention.

Denouement:

Thursday passed, with everyone concerned expectant, but nothing happened. In the afternoon, Headquarters AMG 8th Army informed us that Mr. Taylor had stopped there for lunch and had said that he expected to spend that night in Florence. He had, it was said, made no reference to Emilia Region, the Regional Commissioner, the Transportation Officer, or any transportation matter, except to announce the probable early arrival of an additional G.T. Company -- a matter discussed with the Regional Commissioner at Headquarters three weeks ago.

Mr. Taylor and Lt. Col. Sieff did not even pause at this headquarters on their way through. Except for the fortunate circumstance that Hq AMG 8th Army had other

business with us in the course of which the fact of Mr. Taylor's brief stop there was disclosed, the entire Region Emilia Headquarters Mess would have kept dinner waiting for at least an hour in expectation of the arrival of these honored guests whose visit had been so carefully announced in advance and for whom such preparations had been made.

If it were not for the devastating effect on morale of the disappointment and chagrin of officers and men led to think that, at long last, the top people for whom they were working were going to exhibit a modicum of interest in the results achieved, only to have the original fear that there is no interest thus apparently confirmed, incidents of this kind could I suppose be regarded in essence as cosmically funny.

Perhaps this one is too, or will seem so when I recapture my perspective on the matter, which is missing today.

1. Permission is requested for the Deputy Director of this Sub-Commission, Lieut. Colonel H.H. Scudder U.S. Army, to visit the United States for a few days if air transportation can be obtained.
2. The visit is to urge the supply of essential telecommunication stores and associated equipment, to guarantee the possibility of sufficient restoration of telegraph and telephone services for the necessities of centralised Government control of this country.
3. Unless restoration of a minimum of telecommunication services can be guaranteed within a short period of occupation of large tracts of territory, the efficiency of any form of centralised control is very seriously handicapped and a very undesirable delay may be imposed upon its resumption.
4. Lack of personal contact and the inevitable priority always given to the military demands from the theatre have so far resulted in a practically negative outcome in respect of the supply of the signal stores, essential for this restoration.
5. It has appeared from the results obtained from visits by the Chief of the Electricity Division, the Director of the Food Sub-Commission, etc., that such visits are welcomed and fruitful of results.
6. Lt. Col. Scudder, Deputy Director of this Sub-Commission, being the International Telephone and Telegraph Company representative in Italy before the war, has exactly the most suitable contacts and knowledge to place the problem before the proper authorities and obtain sympathetic consideration.

1. Permission is requested for the Chief Postal Officer of this Sub-Commission, Lieut.-Colonel S.H. Head, to visit the U.K. for a few days, if air transportation can be obtained.

2. The chief reasons are:-

- (a) There has been no opportunity since the opening of the Italian postal service to confer with Allied civil postal authorities on foreign mail policy. Such a meeting would now be of considerable value.
- (b) There are at the moment many outstanding matters in relation to resumption of international services with liberated territories in France, the Balkans, etc., which require urgent settlement.
- (c) The postal situation on resumption of international commercial correspondence, parcel post and other matters requires urgent clarification.
- (d) The correct channel for permitted technical correspondence requires definition, which could be best arranged by discussion with the civil postal authorities concerned.

3. The time is convenient to spare this officer for a short period.

4. If you concur, it is proposed to request air transportation as soon as possible, and to permit a stay in U.K. of 7-10 days.
