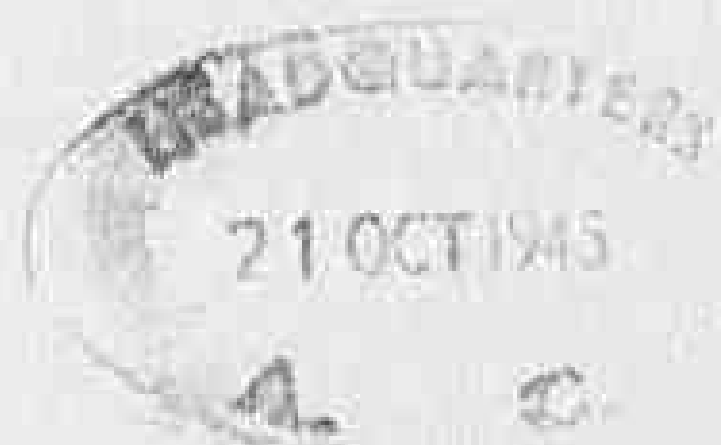

- 1 I do not know how the Chief Commissioner's copy of my Four Notes got back on my table.
- 2 As regards 2 (b), it is difficult to say why, in VERONA Region, the same policy was not followed as in other Regions. The policy on merging all Partisan Police into existing police agencies was never laid down in writing. It was a matter which appeared to emanate from Army AMs and whereas the policy was carried through in 5th Army it does not seem to have been fully implemented in the 8th Army Area.

So far as VERONA is concerned, it is hoped that the matter will be satisfactorily solved. Half of these auxiliary police are ex-Carabinieri and they are now being taken on Carabinieri pay-rolls. The A.C. is being instructed to disband the police by sending the Carabinieri element to normal Carabinieri units and by transferring the remainder to the Public Safety Agent pay-rolls.
- 3 As regards 3 (a), no letter had been received by XIII Corps on this subject because it is one which has only recently come under discussion. On 15 Sep 45 a letter was addressed to AFM by this Headquarters on the subject and they will presumably be taking the matter up with XIII Corps.

I merely discussed the matter with GOC XIII Corps because I knew it was a matter which was being raised and I thought it a good opportunity to obtain his views informally.

north over 1914 frontier to Dobbiaco and along
Foster valley (almost entirely Tyrolese).

August 31st, Friday

08.30 via Fieve di Cadore, Tolmezzo, Tarvisio,
luncheon with Civil Affairs Officer, AMG.,
then south through Plesio, Caporetto (Slovene,
and route almost entirely Slovene), Cliviale
(obviously Italian; attractive old frontier
town), then back through Slovene villages to
Udine (chiefly Italian). Tea with Regional
headquarters, AMG., Col. Knight, British and
American staff.

19.30 PADVA. Dined privately with Brigadier Dunlop
and his Deputy Commissioner, Col. Howell, (USA)

September 1st, Saturday

10.00 visited, accompanied by Italian director,
Giotto frescoes at Madonna del Arena and church
of S. Antonio, where I met the Papal Nuncio,
also on visit.

11.00 visited Regional Headquarters AMG., and
received Prefect, Sig. Sabbadin (Christian
Democrat).

11.20 received some twelve representatives of press
unofficially.

16.00 returned to Trieste and called on Col. Bowman
 AMG (American), who discussed Morgan line
 frontier and offered certain views on
 future frontier.

16.45 tea with Headquarters, 24th Guards Brigade,

 Leathwaite (Scots Guards); Lt.-Col. Oliver
 (Ruffs).

18.00 met General Harding who had just returned
 from United Kingdom and had longish talk
 with him regarding retention of province of
 Udine under AMG and also the solution of the
 Trieste problem.

20.15 dined and met Major General Whitfield,
 Commanding 56th Division.

September 6th, Monday

09.00 left for Udine by car and thence by aeroplane
 to FLORENCE.

12.00 met by Mr. Greenleaves, British Consul.

17.00 called on Prefect, Signor Paterno.

19.00 attended reception given by Mr. and Mrs.
 Greenleaves, where I met Prefect and his wife;
 the Mayor and his wife and the British and
 American Commanders in Florence.

20.30 dined with British Consul and met his
 American colleague.

September 7th, Friday
