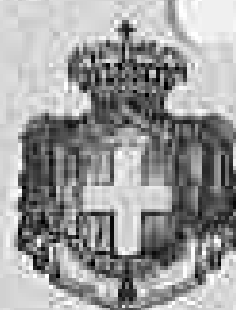

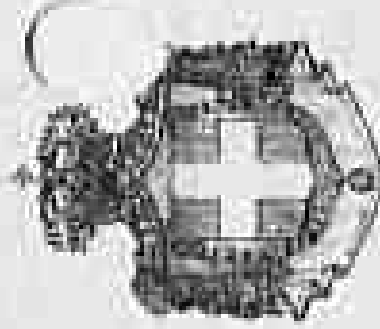

PROF. LUIGI COSATTINI, dispersed Italian national

First hand informations from a repatriated Dutch national (Dr. Tonny J.N.F. de Rijk, Hertog Reinoud singel 117, Venlo, Holland) authorize a presumption that Prof. Luigi Cosattini, previously an internee of Aschersleben concentration camp, may now be alive and in good health in central Germany, in the area under Soviet occupation.

Prof. LUIGI COSATTINI, son of Dr. Giovanni Cosattini, aged 33, a resident of Udine, Italy, tall, fair, wearing glasses, was deported to Germany in 1944 for political reasons. He was interned at ASCHERSLEBEN, near Weimar, a concentration camp depending from the larger one of Buchenwald, his number being 44267. Up to April 11, 1945, Prof. Cosattini was in a good state of health and spirits. He held the office of supervisor in the camp and his leadership was unanimously approved by and extremely valuable to his fellow prisoners.

On April 12, 1945, consequently to the Allied advance, Aschersleben prisoners were made to leave on foot towards the East, in three columns. They went past CONNERE and then ZORBIG (April 13, evening), 45 miles due East of Aschersleben. On April 14, Prof. Cosattini's party being separated from the other two, Allied advance followed at close range and the SS escort disbanded. After moving unescorted for some time, the party was put under German MP escort, which however soon after also disbanded. Prof. Cosattini then took control of the party (150 men and 500 women) and proceeded unescorted through BITTENFELD. Having received a new MP escort, party reached MUHLBECK (April 15, evening). Prisoners refuse to walk further. German MPs, who were in full psychological breakdown, gave in. They ordered lorries for transport of prisoners to Torgau destruction camp, but could not secure any. Party enjoyed quiet rest at MUHLBECK for several days (April 16 - April 20), with warm assistance from village people. On April 18 lorry arrived for transport to Torgau. Great resistance from prisoners. Driver shows solidarity with prisoners, drives one load of women to Torgau and comes back with them to starting point. Prof. Cosattini personally supervises sojourn at Muhlbeck, which is spent in good conditions of lodging and food.

On April 21, 1945, party is made to leave on foot. Prof. Cosattini succeeds in hiding with small group and is left behind. Later in the day he is recaptured and made to rejoin the party by car, under escort of MP patrol. Party reaches SCHWEMSAU on April 21, at night, and takes lodging in a "I.G. Farbenindustrie" plant. Prof. Cosattini makes quick plans of escape, which he relates to his friend and fellow prisoner who is the author of this report. He leaves the plant to inspect the surroundings and nothing further is known of him after this moment. Circumstances at that moment were as follows: Prof. Cosattini was in perfect conditions of health and spirits; the small MP guard was psychologically broken down and exercised little control or vigilance over prisoners' party; Prof. Cosattini, according to previous agreements, was in no way bound to his friend in his decision and movements.

Prof. Cosattini speaks German fluently and Russian quite correctly. He is a man of talent and initiative.

Considering present conditions of Germany, one can assume that: a) chances he may have gotten killed are no greater than in ordinary life, b) he was alive and well as late as April 21, 1945, c) there were no extensive military operations in that area, d) he may be settled in Soviet occupied area, unable to send news and to attempt a journey back.

It seems that at that time Tariciotti was ill, and that there were already allied troops at Preveza; the said troops were repatriating Italian soldiers.

According to the intention of His Royal Highness, I bring the request of the poor father to your attention, for he is very anxious about the fate of his son. Whatever you will deem it fit to do will be greatly appreciated.

The undersigned, Carmela Innamorato-Grosso, of the late Giacomo, residing in S. Massimo, province of Campobasso, brings the following facts to your attention,

On June 19th, 1944, her only son, aged 13, Grosso Nicola, of Carmine, left his mother's house to join an allied unit. By doing this, he hoped to be able to join quickly and without difficulties his father who is in North America. Therefore, he went to Campobasso, and saw a British Major who was then in charge of the refugees, and after giving his real name and surname, he added that he was born at Campobasso, and that his mother and sister were killed by a bombardment and that his brother, a soldier in Albania, had been deported to Germany by the Germans.

The British officer then sent him to the Foggia Camp, where assistance was given to the refugees. However, from the inquiries that have been made, it appears that he never arrived to the said camp.

The undersigned, knowing her child's character, supposed that he ran away during the trip, and managed to join some allied unit, as he firmly intended to do. Since that date she received no news, and the investigations, undertaken everywhere with great activity, gave no result.

The undersigned appeals to the Presidency, asking to have all possible investigations made, and also to ask for the support of the Allied Commission, which may give a definite answer about such a matter.

The undersigned gives the following data about her son: height about 1m, 60 black eyes, black hair, dark complexion, sturdy-looking. He has a scar on his nape (from an operation) one on the right ear, and one on the neck, corresponding to the same ear.

He was born in 1931, but looks older than he actually is.

Trusting that the Presidency will take the necessary action and contact the Allied Commission to help the undersigned who has no news from her only son and is in great sorrow, she remains,

I hope you will forgive me bothering you but there is a certain Mr. May of the British Embassy, a friend of Col. McNairy, who is very worried about his personal effects. These consist of eight crated cases which were embarked on S.S. "NADRIA" leaving London on November 7 bound for Naples. She, however, was diverted and docked at Venice about 20 November where she unloaded all Naples cargo.

Do you think it would be at all possible to find any military lorry going from Venice to Rome on which they could be loaded and delivered to the Embassy? The cases will be labelled "J.G. MAY, British Embassy, Rome."

If this is not possible, do you think anything could be done to relieve Mr. May's mind, who fears that the cases may just be abandoned on the dock and subject to pilferage, weather etc.

We would be most grateful for any help you can give.
