he collaborated with the Economics & Supply Office - Bari Zone, and proved most useful during the time that the Bari Allied Control Commission directly supplied coal to the firms of the Bari Province, this because as an agent of the Anglo Italiana Carboni Co, of Venice, he wanted to collaborate with the Allied Authorities in bringing relief to the Italian population; he neither received nor asked for any compensation in money, and now asks the Commission whether it would be possible to obtain an 'honour reward' from the Italian Government in acknowledgement of his work.

The enclosures, copies of documents delivered by the Allied Commission in Bari, and the Bari Chamber of Commerce, prove that he collaborated with this organ, as belonging to the Commission for the allotment of fossil coal to the industrial firms of the Bari Province.

1. Reference is made to your letter 3/2352 dated 28 Feb 45 and attached correspondence on the above subject.

2. All captured German vehicles are the property of the Allied Military Authorities and may not be handed over to Civilians.

3. In this case Mario Napoli has no title to the truck and he should be so advised. It would appear too that he has little cause for complaint since he made a net profit of 272,183 lire against a repair outlay of 115,000 lire while the vehicle was wrongfully in his possession.

4. If you consider that the continued use of the truck by the Metefe Fire Brigade is justified, it may remain on loan. It must be clearly understood, however, that the vehicle is the property of the Allied Military Authorities.

5. For your information captured Italian Army Vehicles, if captured before the Armistice, are the property of the Allied Governments and can only be disposed of with authority of A.P.H.C.

If taken after the Armistice such vehicles are the property of the Italian Army and disposal is controlled by A.M.I.A.

2. All captured German vehicles are the property of the Allied Military Authorities and may not be handed over to civilians.

3. In this case Mario Nanoli has no title to the truck and he should be so advised. It would appear too that he has little cause for complaint since he made a net profit of 272,183 lire against a repair outlay of 115,000 lire while the vehicle was wrongfully in his possession.

4. If you consider that the continued use of the truck by the Katete Fire Brigade is justified, it may remain on loan. It must be clearly understood, however, that the vehicle is the property of the Allied Military Authorities.

5. For your information captured Italian Army Vehicles, if captured before the Armistice, are the property of the Allied Governments and can only be disposed of with authority of A.F.H.Q.

If taken after the Armistice such vehicles are the property of the Italian Army and disposal is controlled by A.A.I.A.

To Admiral Stone:

The undersigned, Adriano BENEDETTI, sculptor is asking for justice; for over a month, he has been working for Capt. Carl D. Clarke, American, who ordered him a bust in bronze. Captain Clarke agreed to pay Lire 5,000 and to give wares for an amount of L. 10,000. The Captain said he owned these things but had no money. Captain Clarke often came to the studio for sittings; he brought part of the payment which the undersigned refused, for it was American military stuff: shirts, towels, stockings; the undersigned kept the rest: soap, glasses, cigarettes, etc. The undersigned finished the bust with great care, producing a very nice piece of work. Capt. Clark said that the bust wasn't in bronze but in brass. The undersigned thought it wiser to have the man who had cast the bust with him when Captain Clarke came for the payment. Captain Clarke came to the studio bringing the stuff that the undersigned had already refused once.. He then abused the undersigned, saying the bust was ugly, and produced a bottle containing a liquid with which it was possible to change the colour of the military clothes. Either that or nothing. He then walked out taking the bust with him. The stuff he had left was worth 5,000 Lire.

The undersigned denounced Captain Clarke to Captain Stone of the Investigation Policy who was sympathetic; but when he came back a second time, Captain Clarke was there and Captain Stone told him he had accepted American military stuff which he shouldn't have accepted. The undersigned objected that he had refused it once and was now refusing it for the second time and denouncing it. Captain Stone then said that Captain Clark didn't like the bust and would give it back, that the undersigned would have to give back the military clothing, and that Captain Clarke would pay Lire 5,000 for the cast.

The undersigned protest that he has rights as an artist, that Captain Clarke saw 200 of his works in his studio, and could therefore decide whether he liked his art or not. Besides the likeness is good and the work has been honestly done and there is no reason why Captain Clarke should refuse to take it.

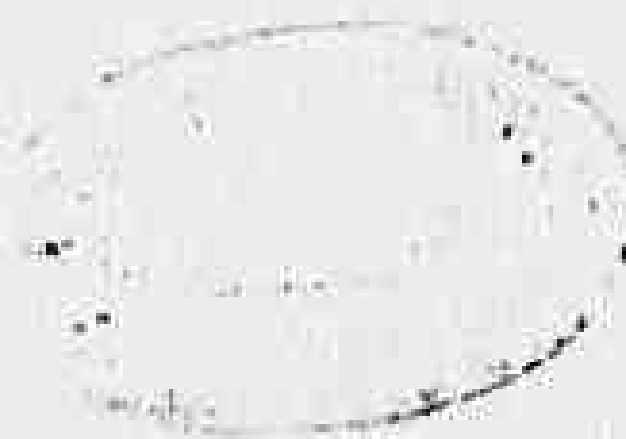

The payment of the Bills was several time urged as we find ourselves in the necessity to face a great engagement towards suppliers and creditors for whose payments we can only relate on the cash of the above mentioned credit.

We retain useful to remember same circumstances of the supply proceeding:

1. This firm avoided the requisition of the metals by the Germans with various measures which caused heavy responsibility for our managers and as soon as the Allied Forces entered in Rome, the 19 June 1944 this firm notice and offered to the Allied Military Government Region IV APO 394 - Industrial Branch the existence of the great quantity of his metal.

2. Various Commands to whom the metals were delivered provided to take it away and among them, your office. On the document you issued is clearly declared the supply conditions: A) - the prices are determined by the A.C.C.; B) - the payment is made by cash.

This document confirmed the verbal assurance that the payment should be made immediately, assurance given by Capt. Hughes to our representative before every delivery was made.

3. After the bill presentation this office addressed us to the A.C.C. - Industry & Commerce S/c (Col. Evans) for decision of the prices as per contract in our hand. To this office is known the long treatments we had and the documents we exposed.

The A.C.C. concluding retained that the presented bills were issued on right prices and told us (Capt. Murphy) to authorize this office to the bill payments.

4. Afterwards, to our great surprise, this office has beckoned to the possibility to sustain the thesis that the passage of propriety of metals is in consequence of requisition, that's why no compensation is to be paid.

The undersigned Firm cannot accept such a discussion as the rules of the international private right put the Italian citizen, living in Italy, under the protection of Italian laws. These laws if they effectively limit the right property for what concerns the war and public works utilities, establish that the goods can only be required through a "right compensation"

I had meant to remain silent till my strange and painful situation was cleared up, but the long duration of the same situation prevents me from doing so.

I was dismissed on July 18th, by order of Lt. Tasso, representative of the Allied Commission to the Istituto Nazionale per i Cambi con l'Estero, and on August 5th, I answered all his accusations. I shall lose time in explaining the nature and importance of these accusations, or the way in which I entirely refuted them.

I only want to draw the attention of Your Excellencies on the following considerations:

- 1 - Italian laws are in force in Rome since August 15th 1944;
- 2 - In case of suspension while waiting for a judgement of epuration - to which I haven't as yet been submitted, or simply in a case of disciplinary suspension, the Italian laws foresee the payment of the salary, or at least part of it.
- 3 - Since December 1st 1943, when I was dismissed from the Institute by order of the fascist pseudo government, I was entirely deprived of my salary, except during the month of June; moreover, my liquid money - the liquidation allowance which I had kept untouched, so that I could pay it back when I should be taken back, for I never doubted I should get my job again - was blocked; this measure prevented me from getting loans on my insurance policies, which were my only resource for my family and myself from starvation;
- 4 - Considered from the point of view of the Italian law, how can Lt. Tasso's treatment of myself be judged? In case the Government should have to endorse my being suspended, the necessary consequences must follow: I must get the allowance corresponding to the suspension position, and they must decide without delay on the steps which have got to be taken, for it isn't conceivable that a suspension should last three months without any steps being taken and even without clear knowledge whether steps are to be taken or not.

I hope that, considering what I have said, justice will be done to me, the justice promised by the new times. Only this can dissipate my impression if it is only an impression - of being victim of a group of people who, aiming at conquering high positions which they don't deserve, have abused of the good faith of the Allied, so that justice shouldn't be done to me.

## PRO MEMORIA

The Commissario of the Royal Academy, Professor Rivera, called on me today to express his concern over the use of the Palazzo Corsini for epuration trials such as those of Caruso and Azzolini, just concluded, saying that the Palazzo Corsini houses rare and costly books and documents, the safe-keeping of which is jeopardized by the use to which it is presently being put. He stated that he had protested to the Italian Government and was told that the Allies insist on its use for such trials. I told him that the decision to use the Palazzo Corsini was a joint one and that so far as I know the Italian Government had not requested us to move the trials to another building, but that I would be glad to request Brigadier Upjohn to take up the matter with Count Sforza, the Minister of Justice, Colonel Poletti and others concerned.

Thank you very much for your kind communication A/CC 091.3-1, in which you tell me that you have given the necessary instructions for the Central Institute of Statistics to get the fuel it requested.

Nevertheless, from what I have heard, the amount that the competent office put at the disposal of the Institute does not correspond to the requested amount, which had already been reduced to the indispensable minimum; it is in fact 10% less than that minimum.

Thus reduced, the allotment is quite insufficient for the needs of the Institute. This has unavoidable consequences on its working possibilities - which, as you well know - ought to be increased to the utmost for the most important works.

I should be very grateful to you, dear Admiral, if you would request the competent office to send the complete allotment of requested fuel.

Dear Admiral Stone,

As I have already informed you, because of the lack of transport, and because of the ~~serious~~ result of requisition, some Ministers in office are still without a car.

It is obvious that they need one, and their request is perfectly justified.

You are the only person who can help us to solve this problem.

Therefore, I indicate to you four cars, property of the Italian public Administration, which were taken care of by our functionaries during the Nazi period; they had taken them to pool of ministerial cars in piazza Verdi, to avoid their being taken by the Germans or used for going north by the fascists.

The cars in question are two Alfa Romeo, Roma 72682 and Roma 72681, and two Lancia, Astura type, Roma 73214 and Roma 73279, which in the first days of the liberation of Rome were requisitioned by the Allied Authorities, the first two by A.C.O. and the others by C.I.C. of via Sicilia n. 29.

It seems that the Alfa Romeo have been assigned to some superior Allied officers and that the Lancia have instead been given to the Italian patriots.

For the above mentioned reasons, I should be most grateful if you would kindly see that the cars were given back to the Italian Government.
