TRANSLATION

THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

Rome, 31 May 1946.

Dear Admiral,

In reply to letter DE/LA/CA of 2 April 1946, I submit to you the situation of the Organizations mentioned in your note of 5 October 1945, same file, dividing them - according to the request contained in the aforesaid note - in four groups, considering whether it is a question of organizations to be suppressed, reorganized, separated or kept in life without the adoption of any measure.

Each of these groups is in its turn subdivided in as many categories as the number of State Administrations from which they depend.

1st GROUP - ORGANIZATIONS TO BE SUPPRESSED

- a) Presidency: I - Sezione Volontari d'Italia
II - Reparto Arditi d'Italia

These two organizations which have never been recognized juridically, have ceased functioning as organic entities with the Armistice and their activity will in fact be taken over by the "Associazione Nazionale Combattenti".

- b) Ministry of Agriculture and Forests:

- III - Ente economico della Viticoltura (vine)
IV - Ente per la Cerealicoltura (cereals)
V - Uffici per gli accertamenti agricoli.

Said organizations have ceased long ago any activity; they are presently being liquidated under the special administration of a Commissar who is quickly proceeding to the ascertainment of their patrimonial activities and passivities. They will be substituted in the center by the National Statistical Economic Agriculture Office (U.N.S.E.A.) and in the periphery by the provincial statistical economic Agriculture offices (U.P.S.E.A.)

- VI - National Forest Committee. It has been formally suppressed with the Decree of 22-2-1945, No. 261.

- c) Ministry of the Interior:

- VII - Ente Opere Assistenziali, has been disbanded with the same decree which suppressed the Fascist party (R.D. 2-3-1945, No. 704)

d) Ministry of Public Instruction: (Education)

VIII - University Groups (G.U.F.). These groups have been disbanded with the same Decree which suppressed the Fascist party (R. D.L. 2-8-1943, No. 704)

And finally all Fascist syndical organizations, to whatever State administration they were belonging for reasons of matter, have been disbanded with the Decree of 23 November 1944, No. 369.

2nd GROUP - ORGANIZATIONS TO BE REORGANIZED

a) Presidency: I - Opera Nazionale Dopolavoro.

This organization has assumed with the decree of 22-9-1945, No. 624 the name of National Organization for the Assistance to Workers, without however proceeding to its reorganization or to the specification of its new tasks inasmuch as in view of its assistance aims it is necessary to examine prejudicially whether it is convenient to keep it in life or whether it would not rather be advisable to proceed to its disbandment, distributing its tasks among the various syndical organizations. Owing to its complexity, the problem is still being studied.

II - Italian National Olympic Committee (C.O.N.I.)

III - National Organization for Mothers and Children

Because of their aims which are completely outside any political field, these organizations cannot be suppressed, but require a reorganization of their respective activities. To this end have been named apposite Special Commissioners who are working at a readjustment of the organizations and of their functions.

b) Ministries of War, Navy, Air Force and Finances:

IV - Detachments of arms and specialties

V - Groups Sailors of Italy

VI - Lega Navale Italiana

VII - Groups Airmen of Italy

VIII - Groups Financiers of Italy

All the above institutions are being reorganized as free Associations having only assistential, recreative and cultural aims, according to the adhesion to this idea given by the Allied authorities.

As far as the Groups of the Sailors of Italy in particular are concerned, it is being studied whether it would be advisable to incorporate that organization in the "Lega Navale Italiana".

Anyway it must be remembered that the epuration of the existing organizations has already taken place.

IX - U.N.U.C.I.

The Government intends to proceed also to the reorganization of the above institution and to this purpose, considering its considerable structure and the complexity of its functioning, measures have already been taken putting it under extraordinary administration, at whose termination it will be possible to make with due circumspection the final arrangements for its organic transformation. The obligatory subscription has already been abolished since 1944 and the voluntary nature of adhesions to the institution has again been instaurated. The epuration of the personnel of U.N.U.C.I. has already been completed.

3rd GROUP - ORGANIZATIONS TO BE EPURATED

- a) Presidency: I - Legione Gariboldina
II - Associazioni Nazionali Combattenti

These institutions are still being epurated according to the directives proposed by U.N.U.C.I. which in its time informed the Ministry of War that said organizations could keep functioning after the epuration of its members and the elimination of all Fascist influence.

4th GROUP - ORGANIZATIONS FOR WHICH NO MEASURE IS FORESEEN

- a) Presidency: I - National Association of Families of the Fallen
II - National Association of Disabled War Veterans
III - National Association for War Orphans

Said institutions keep functioning according to their previous organization and it is not considered advisable to proceed to their complete reconstitution (except the necessary adjustments of the respective statutes) in consideration of the fact that they were created in a period previous to Fascism and with aims fully independent from the same.

- b) Ministry of Agriculture and Forests:

IV - Provincial Alimentation Sections.

As these are not political, but technical organizations at the disposal of the Prefects in order to provide for the distribution of food to the populations, there is no reason to proceed to their suppression or substantial transformation (always excepting the due alterations to be made in the performance of the services). The personnel is still being epurated.

V - Ispettorati Agrari Provinciali.

These are peripheric offices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forests and have been recognized as such by the Allied Commission which has created there its own Liaison offices.

c) Ministry of Industry and Commerce.

VI - Organi provinciali dell'economia.

Apart from the denomination assumed during the Fascist period, they are the direct continuation of the ancient "Chambers of Commerce, Industry and Agriculture" created in Italy ever since 1862 and which were by and by transformed formally, however without ever losing their first attributions. For this reason, the above institutions have continued to function in force of the decree 21-3-1944, No. 315, resuming their old name and it is thought that also in future they can develop a useful activity, keeping their substantial structure.

VII - National Institute of Social Foresight

VIII - "Cassa Mutua" for Assistance to sick Workers

Owing to the importance of the duties performed by these two organizations, they cannot be subjected to substantial alterations in their functions, as has been recognized also by the Allied Commission.

d) Ministry of Transports:

IX - National Institute of Transports

In consideration of the work performed by this Institute which integrates the activity of the State railways in the zones where railroads are missing or where the laying of railway lines does not appear convenient, it continues its activity on the basis of the original organization without any alterations to its structure. The personnel has been submitted to separation proceedings.

It is finally necessary to consider the situation of the National Associations of Public Employment, of the School, of the Railroad Workers, of the Post and Telecommunications Workers AND of the personnel of the industrial organizations of the State. Provision is being made for these institutions depending from the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, naming apposite Special Commissioners who, among other tasks, are requested to submit within six months concrete proposals with regard to a transformation or eventual suppression of the above Associations.

Also the administration of the Italian Youth (of the "Littorio") whose tasks - according the already quoted decree of 2-3-1943, No. 704 - have been transferred to the Ministries of War and Public Education for their respective competencies, is presently entrusted to a Special Commissioner who is in charge of managing its moveable and immoveable assets.

MEMORANDUM ON EPURATION.

1. Subsequent to the issue of Decree No. 704 on 2nd August 1943 which suppressed the National Fascist Party, a number of decrees were issued dealing with various aspects of Epuration or Defascism.

The first Italian Government after the Armistice (Badoglio) made Epuration or Defascism the responsibility of a Minister who was later known as the High Commissioner for Sanctions against Fascism.

2. It was not, however, until 27th July 1944 when the Government issued Decree No. 159 entitled "Sanctions against Fascism" that comprehensive machinery was set up for Epuration.

Under this decree a High Court of Justice was instituted for the trial of members of the Government and of high ranking officials accused of Fascist crimes. Other officials were to be tried by Courts of Assize.

As regards purging of the Administration, the decree covered officials and employees of civil and military State Administrations, of local authorities and other public bodies and institutions, of special concerns operating under public authority and of certain private concerns.

Commissions of first instance presided over by a judicial official were to be set up in every Ministry to hear Epuration proceedings. In the Provinces, Commissions presided over by a judicial official were to be appointed to hear Epuration proceedings against local officials.

Between the issue of DL. 159 on 27th July 1944 and the Spring of 1945, some 120 subsidiary decrees or circulars were issued dealing with Epuration.

Under the decrees referred to above, there were four main categories of activity, namely, the punishment of Fascist crimes and acts of violence and high treason against the Constitution; the general purging of the Administration; the recovery of wealth corruptly obtained under Fascism and the forfeiture of property of Fascist organisations.

For the hearing of cases against statal or para-statal employees, it is estimated that the Italian Government appointed some 300 Commissions up to the Spring of 1945.

3. In November 1945, the Italian Government, with a view to speeding up Epuration, decided to make changes in the Epuration legislation and in the organisation for dealing with this subject.

Accordingly, Decree No. 702 was issued on 9th November 1945. The main changes brought about by this decree were briefly as follows: only officials and civilians of equivalent rank down to the seventh grade inclusive were liable to Epuration if they had shown activity as Fascists. New provisions enabled Epuration to be applied to those

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Employees of lower grades were not, however, liable to epuration unless they had shown serious Fascist bias or had committed certain named acts or held certain named offices.

The procedure for dealing with the professions was varied. Commissions which handled their cases were abolished and the professions made virtually responsible for their own purging.

A time limit, within which proceedings must be brought, was set. This was to 31st March 1946, or three months after the handing back of Allied Military Government territory to the Italian Administration. The date has recently been deferred until 30th April in the case of Northern Italy.

In other respects the provisions of DL.159 continue to operate.

The Government also decided on the abolition of the Office of the High Commissioner for Sanctions against Fascism. Epuration came directly under the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, and Ministers were made solely responsible for Epuration of their officials and employees. This involved the distribution of files of cases to the various Ministries.

The effect of these changes in procedure and organization, as stated by a member of the Government, was that the total number of officials of the first five grades who now became subject to Epuration proceedings numbered 393 out of a total of 4,984 officials.

The following tables are attached:

- (a) Appendix "A". Table showing results of Epuration in Grades 1 to 7 up to 28th February compiled from information obtained by the Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission in conjunction with the various Ministries.
- (b) Appendix "B". Table showing results of Epuration in all grades (excluding those coming under Provincial Commissions) up to 15th January 1946 received from Italian Government sources.
- (c) Appendix "C". Table showing results of Epuration in Provinces up to 15th January 1946, received from Italian Government sources.

4. The Allied Commission initiated discussions with the Italian Government on the abolition of Fascist organizations and institutions early in 1944 but it was not possible for the Italian Government to make much progress until it had established itself in Rome.

These organizations or institutions divided themselves broadly into three classes:

- (a) Those of a statal character whose objects had been wholly objectionable.
- (b) Those of a statal character whose objects had been partially beneficial but whose methods had been objectionable.
- (c) Those which were not purely statal in character whose

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- (a) Those of a statal character whose objects had been wholly objectionable.
- (b) Those of a statal character whose objects had been partially beneficial but whose methods had been objectionable.
- (c) Those which were not purely statal in character, whose objects had been partly useful (or at least not objectionable) but which had some objectionable features or connections.

It was agreed with the Italian Government that bodies within the first class (a) should be abolished and their property handed to liquidators, that as regards the second class (b), after epuration successors with an entirely different title were to be created.

Many of those in the third class (c) were not State bodies but were in the form of companies, in some instances with shareholders. In such cases the Receivers were to be appointed pending purging of their administrations.

It was recognised that some time would be necessary to complete the abolition, reorganisation or epuration. Of the twenty-seven Fascist organisations involved:

- 9 have been abolished,
- 11 have been epurated,
- 1 being non-political, continues under the care of the Vatican.

Of the remaining 6, no precise information is available as to the present position, but it is considered that it can be safely assumed that abolition or epuration is in progress, if not completed.

At Appendix "D" is a table giving particulars of these Fascist organisations.

Action was taken by the Italian Government to eliminate elements of the Secret Police, OVRA, on successive liberations of territory. More comprehensive action only became possible after the liberation of the North when full records of the organisation became available in the latter half of 1945: this led to a careful examination of the files, a listing of all persons concerned and to further arrests.

5. In assessing the results of the Epuration effected by the Italian Government, it must be borne in mind that the work had to be initiated by administrations that were, in many cases, disorganised, and that there was a great deficiency of experienced and qualified personnel and of facilities for dealing with cases speedily.

It must also be remembered that a considerable amount of Epuration was effected by means outside the law especially in the North of Italy at the time of the collapse of the National Socialist Republic. In some instances Epuration may have been carried to excess.

6. Although it is difficult to assess the degree to which Epuration has been either equitable or thorough, it is considered that the Italian Government has made a genuine and effective effort to carry out its obligations in implementing Article 30 of the Long Armistice Terms.
