1 (a) Epuration is concerned with dismissal of fascists, and popular Courts do not deal with these.

In the interests of peaceful administration it is essential that AMG should take an immediate lively and active interest in the dismissal of fascists from positions in the North, in so far as this has not been accomplished before our arrival.

This is done by Executive Memorandum 67 and General Order 35. Under the latter the RC appoints one or more Italian Commissions in each province who apply the principles of the Italian Epuration decrees.

With regard to punishment of fascist crimes, although we implement the various decrees and are thereby responsible, in effect the decrees become part of the law of occupied territory and it is entirely an Italian responsibility. We are not responsible for these trials any more than we are responsible even in AMG territory for the sentences of ordinary Law Courts, or of the Military Tribunals which we are permitting the Italian Government to set up.

The position is really covered in my view by Article 364 of Amdt 12 to the Manual of Military Law :

"Therefore the civil and penal laws of the occupied country continue as a rule to be valid, the courts which administer them are permitted to sit, and all crimes of the inhabitants not of a military nature or not affecting the safety of the army are left to their jurisdiction".

In my view in which the DCLA concurs it is not necessary for the Military Governor to confirm ~~by~~ death sentences.

(b) This is an AFHQ responsibility. I saw a list of Italian War Criminals prepared by the United Nations War Crimes Commission when in London in December, but both G2, G5 and PM Branch AFHQ seem very vague as to whether they have received a copy. They are signalling London to send out 100 copies and will let us have some. They have a list of 150 which they have prepared themselves and are letting us have a copy.

AC does NOT try War Criminals in AMG Courts.


(c) Region Commissioners do NOT have lists of Italians interned for political (ie Security) reasons as political internees are dealt with by FSS CIC and send to Terni Internment Camp. Lists of security prisoners never have been sent to the Italian Government, but with the coming cessation of hostilities and probability of their release, I will raise the whole question with AFHQ.

(d) I saw GSL(b) 15 Army Group who controls FSS/CIC and their list of proposed internees is at 1b and 8b (file 6/2.2/CA)  
We added to it at 9b and 9c.

I do not think FSS/CIC will act unreasonably in this respect.  
Indeed I believe they will be overwhelmed with fascists offering themselves up to obtain the safety, comfort and rations of an internment camp.
