Reference this HQ letter of even number dated 1 February 1946 to which no direct reply has been received.

1. The general question of release of Military Personnel for employment with UNRRA is becoming a matter of increasing urgency, since lack of suitable and experienced staff is holding up the handing over of DP Camps to UNRRA, and is likely to militate against the efficient running of such Camps as UNRRA have already taken over.

2. In view of the early implementation of a new P.M. for this Sub Commission, all personnel accepted for employment by UNRRA but not yet released or seconded, are being declared surplus and unless some positive action is taken for UNRRA to retain such personnel they will be posted elsewhere by 1-9 and 028.

3. Application is being made for Class "B" release in respect of those whose Agv/Service Group is not yet due, but previous applications in the past have not been favourably received.

4. The question of cancellation of deferment of release raised in para 4 of our a/c letter remains unanswered.

5. This HQ has expended much time and correspondence on this subject and it is requested that a clearly defined ruling be given.

You will remember that I spoke to you the other day about documentation of British officers seconded to UNRRA. I feel I must pass on to you my concern for their interests because so many of the officers who will come to you under GRC 120/46 will be from A.C. This is the excuse for what you might otherwise regard as gratuitous service.

The documentation of British officers hangs on the publication of Part II Orders, and you will have seen from para 9(c) of GRC 120/46 that Part II Orders in respect of seconded British officers are to be published by UNRRA HQ, LONDON. But this in turn means that Missions will have to feed the information to London, and it will evidently be very much better and easier for all concerned if this information is sent to London in a military form, suitable for copy without alteration. In fact I would go so far as to suggest that unless the information is put into the right form here, it will be impossible for London to publish accurate Part II Orders.

I am sure you will realise how serious a matter this is when I remind you that Part II Orders are the means whereby the whole of an officers personal administration is performed. Through Part II Orders an officer gets his basic pay and such increments or allowances as he becomes entitled to; through Part II Orders his location and status are known, and any change registered; if an officer marries, has an increase in family, sustains an injury, or becomes entitled to a campaign medal or other decoration, Part II Orders are the means whereby all concerned are notified, so that appropriate action may be taken on behalf of the officer. Inadequate or inaccurate Part II Orders mean, at the best, irritation, inconvenience and lack of confidence on the part of officers, with consequent lowering of morale; at the worst they mean hardship - a burden of debt, and possible disciplinary action being taken against an officer for something which initially was the fault of those who administered him.

It is impossible to exaggerate the importance of finding the right man to supervise this work, and I am sure, therefore, you will see what lay behind my suggestion that Colonel J.L. JONES was the man for the job. Colonel JONES was my Executive Officer on the British side and I know, therefore, the value which his experience and training as a result of many years in the Army will be to you.

TO : Executive Commissioner.

The subject is the employment of army officers with UERRA, i.e., the seconding to UERRA of army personnel, in contrast to the release under Class "A" from the army of personnel to work with UERRA as civilians.

I think you have already seen HQ 120/45, but I am attaching another copy, with portions marked in red for your attention.

The crux of the problem is documentation, and in para 9 (c) of the HQ it is proposed that casualties shall be recorded by UERRA Missions (e.g. ITALY) to UERRA HQ, London, where they will be reflected in Part II Orders issued by that HQ.

This is a scheme evidently devised for the total demotion of officers seconded to UERRA. I had some experience of this kind of thing when I was with S.O. (M) under M.O.I. (S.P.) War Office, and I can assure you that to have amateurs trying to render casualties and publish Part II Orders is the surest and most certain way to chaos and confusion. It is a job for an expert - someone with good military knowledge, background and training. Part II Orders are the means whereby all that happens to an officer on the "A" side is known and acted upon. General Dymallyers abroad, O I/c Officers Accounts (MILITARY) at home, the U.S. Branch abroad, and at War Office, London Gazette, and all the other people concerned take action on receipt, and only on receipt, of competent Part II Orders. Hence if they are either inaccurate or inadequate, an officer suffers, and chaos ensues.

What will happen at UERRA HQ. in London, I shudder to think, and in any case it is perhaps permissible to pass by on the other side. But since a number of our own officers will second to UERRA here, you may think that some local action is advisable, because if we can ensure that casualties are properly recorded and recorded to London, we shall at least have done all in our power.

If you agree so far, I have a concrete suggestion to make, Col. J.L. JONES (JONAH) has just gone to UERRA, and cannot yet have got too involved. He is the ideal person to take charge of local UERRA documentation. He has all the requisite knowledge and military experience.

He is the ideal person to take charge of local URMH documentation. He has all the requisite knowledge and military experience. My suggestion is that you should speak to the head of the URMH Mission, point out to him the implications of the documentation required (which I hardly expect he appreciates at all) and suggest JONES for the job. If if you thought it wise, you might get the Chief Commissioner to speak, after being suitably briefed on what is involved.

My interest in this is purely to safeguard our own officers. On this basis I have been indiscreet enough to speak to JONES, and he says he would take the job on.

EMPLOYMENT OF OFFICERS WITH U.N.R.R.A.

1. War Offices have ruled that the employment of officers with U.N.R.R.A. will now be regarded as military employment for all purposes except that officers will not be compulsorily posted to such employment. The following instructions will also apply to officers of the A.S.
2. Regular Army Officers on the Active List.
 - (a) Regular Army Officers accepting employment with U.N.R.R.A. will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank, will count the service for non-effective purposes and for time promotion, and for all mobilization benefits, including War Gratuity, so long as those benefits apply to Regular Army Service.
 - (b) Such employment should not normally prejudice their Regular Army career and officers will continue to be considered for appointment or promotion as though they were employed with the Army.
 - (c) If an officer serving with U.N.R.R.A. is required for an Army appointment, whether it carries promotion or not, the War Office will negotiate with U.N.R.R.A. for his return or replacement.
 - (d) If, during the course of his employment with U.N.R.R.A., a Regular Army officer is passed over for promotion, or becomes otherwise due for retirement from the service, he will retire as though he were in Army employment and from the date of his retirement may become a civilian employee of U.N.R.R.A. without further call upon Army pay or benefits.
3. Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers.
 - (a) Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers will likewise be available for employment with U.N.R.R.A. and will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank until the date upon which they due for Release under the Age/Service rules or until general mobilization is ordered.
 - (b) The time served with U.N.R.R.A. will count towards mobilization benefits.
 - (c) As from the date of their Release from the Army such officers will pass to a civil contract with U.N.R.R.A. should they and U.N.R.R.A. so desire and they will have no further call upon Army pay or benefits.

3. Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers.

- (a) Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers will likewise be available for employment with USRA and will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank until the date upon which they due for Release under the Age/Service rules or until general demobilization is ordered.

- (b) The time served with USRA will count towards demobilization benefits.

- (c) As from the date of their Release from the army such officers will pass to a civil contract with USRA should they and USRA so desire and they will have no further call upon army pay or benefits.

4. Procedure for obtaining employment.

- (a) Officers desirous of employment with USRA will apply in the first instance in writing to C-3 - Dep Mil Sec in the case of officers holding Staff Appointments, A-2 in the case of Regimental officers and A-3 in the case of AGO officers.

- (b) Officers who, on Release with their Age/Service Group, wish to apply for employment with USRA as a civilian will apply direct to USRA c/o AGO C-3, as heretofore.

- (c) Employment with USRA is for an indefinite period but applicants will not normally be accepted unless they are willing to serve for a minimum of six months to one year either as:-

- (i) An officer
(ii) An officer and a civilian.
(iii) A civilian

or

- (d) Officers who are within six months of their normal Release will therefore be required to confirm on their applications that they are prepared to accept the terms of employment outlined in sub-para (c) above.

5. Names of suitable applicants referred to in para 4 above whose Release from their present employment has been agreed by all concerned will be submitted to War Office who will consider and issue the necessary instructions. No postings of officers will be made to UMRA without first obtaining War Office authority for such postings.

6. Rank. Officers employed with UMRA will retain temporary rank where applicable on posting.

7. Pay and Allowances.

(a) Officers will continue to draw pay of rank and appropriate allowances from Army Funds.

(b) Officers employed with UMRA will not be eligible to draw command or staff pay.

(c) Where an appointment with UMRA carries pay in excess of Army pay and allowances the responsibility for payment of the excess will fall on UMRA.

8. Officers previously released to UMRA under Class "B".

(a) Officers who have previously been released to UMRA under Class "B" Release may now elect to be recalled for eventual Release under Class "A" provided that they agree to any benefits which they have already accepted being taken into account when Class "A" Release takes place.

(b) Names of officers so electing to be recalled will be cabled to HQ 2nd Echelon CWP, copy to HQ CWP, not later than 1 May 46.

9. Documentation.

(a) When an officer's posting to UMRA has been agreed by the War Office notification to this effect will be sent to his unit or formations by A-9 CWP, on receipt of which the unit or formation will render the necessary casualty on the appropriate Army Form direct to HQ 2nd Echelon CWP quoting the War Office authority in each case.

(b) HQ 2nd Echelon CWP will then forward the duplicate copy of A-9 HQ, in respect of such officers who are below the substantive rank of Colonel, direct to Director of Personnel, UMRA HQ, 11 Portland Place, London, W.1.

(c) Once an Army officer (Military and AG) is posted to UMRA, all

(a) Officers who have previously been released to WETA under Class "A" Release may not elect to be recalled for eventual Release under Class "A" provided that they agree to any benefits which they have already accepted being taken into account when Class "A" Release takes place.

(b) Names of officers so electing to be recalled will be cabled to HQ 2nd Echelon CTF, copy to HQ CTF, not later than 8 Mar 46.

9. Documentation.

(a) When an officer's posting to WETA has been agreed by the War Office notification to this effect will be sent to his unit or formations by A-9 CTF, on receipt of which the unit or formation will render the necessary casualty on the appropriate Army Form direct to HQ 2nd Echelon CTF quoting the War Office authority in each case.

(b) HQ 2nd Echelon CTF will then forward the duplicate copy of AF BL99A, in respect of such officers who are below the substantive rank of Colonel, direct to Director of Personnel, WETA HQ, 11 Portland Place, London, W.1.

(c) Once an Army officer (Military and AFS) is posted to WETA, all subsequent casualties affecting him/her will be rendered on the appropriate Army Form by that organization direct to WETA HQ, London so that such casualties may be promulgated in Part 11 Orders (Officers) issued by that HQ in UK in accordance with AFI 739/43. All casualties which are recordable will be entered on AF BL99A (Officer Record of Service) by WETA HQ, London in accordance with AFI 924/43.

10. Movement of Officers to and from Overseas Commands.

War Office have requested WETA HQ, London to notify all overseas Command HQs and HQs 2nd Echelon by letter the arrival and departure of officers whose duty involves a stay of 21 days or longer.

11. Release while in employment with WETA.

Arrangements for carrying out Release of Officers, other than Regular Army Officers, due for Release with their Age/Service Group will be notified in due course.

GRO/120/46. EMPLOYMENT OF OFFICERS WITH UNRA.

1. War Office have ruled that the employment of officers with UNRA will now be regarded as military employment for all purposes except that officers will not be compulsorily posted to such employment. The following instructions will also apply to officers of the ARS.

2. REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS OF THE ACTIVE LIST.

(a) Regular Army Officers acceding employment with UNRA will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank, will count the service for non-effective purposes and for time promotion, and for all demobilization benefits, including War Gratuity, so long as these benefits apply to Regular Army service.

(b) Such employment should not normally prejudice their Regular Army career and officers will continue to be considered for appointment or promotion as though they were employed with the Army.

(c) If an officer serving with UNRA is required for an army appointment, whether it carries promotion or not, the War Office will negotiate with UNRA for his return or replacement.

(d) If, during the course of his employment with UNRA, a Regular Army officer is passed over for promotion, or becomes otherwise due for retirement from the service, he will retire as though he were in army employment and from the date of his retirement pay become a civilian employee of UNRA without further call upon army pay or benefits.

3. RE-EMPLOYED REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS AND NON-REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS.

(a) Re-employed Regular Army Officers and Non-Regular Army Officers will likewise be available for employment with UNRA and will continue to draw the emoluments of their rank until the date upon which they are for release under the Age/Service rules or until general demobilization is ordered.

(b) The time served with UNRA will count towards demobilization benefits.

(c) As from the date of their release from the army such officers will pass to a civil contract with UNRA should they wish UNRA so desire and they will have no further call upon army pay or benefits.

4. PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT.

- (e) As from the date of their release from the Army such officers will pass to a civil contract with UNRRA should they and UNRRA so desire and they will have no further call upon Army pay or benefits.

4. PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT.

- (a) Officers desirous of employment with UNRRA will apply in the first instance in writing to GHQ-Des Mil Sec in the case of officers holding Staff Appointment, A-9 in the case of Regimental Officers and A-8 in the case of ITS Officers.

- (a) Officers who, on Release with their Age/Service Group, wish to apply for employment with UNRRA as a civilian will apply direct to UNRRA c/o GHQ CMT, as heretofore.

- (c) Employment with UNRRA is for an indefinite period but applicants will not normally be accepted unless they are willing to serve for a minimum of six months to one year either as:-

- (i) An officer
(ii) An officer and a civilian
or (iii) A civilian.

- (d) Officers who are within six months of their normal release will therefore be required to submit on their applications that they are prepared to accept the terms of employment outlined in para (c) above.

- 2 -

5. Names of suitable applicants referred to in para 4 above whose release from their present employment has been agreed by all concerned will be submitted to an officer who will consider and issue the necessary instructions. No postings of officers will be made to UNRRA without first obtaining War Office authority for such postings.

6. **RANK.** Officers employed with UNRRA will retain temporary rank where applicable on posting.

7. **PAY AND ALLOWANCES.**

(a) Officers will continue to draw pay of rank and appropriate allowances from Army funds.

(b) Officers employed with UNRRA will not be entitled to draw command or staff pay.

(c) Where an appointment with UNRRA carries pay in excess of army pay and allowances the responsibility for payment of the excess will fall on UNRRA.

8. **OFFICERS PREVIOUSLY RELATED TO UNRRA UNDER CLASS 'B'.**

(a) Officers who have previously been released to UNRRA under Class 'B' Release may now elect to be recalled for eventual release under Class 'A' provided that they agree to any benefits which they have already accounted being taken into account when Class 'A' Release takes place.

(b) Names of officers so electing to be recalled will be sent to GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF, copy to GHQ CEF, not later than 6 Mar 45.

9. **DOCUMENTATION.**

(a) When an officer's posting to UNRRA has been agreed by the War Office notification to this effect will be sent to his unit or formation by 4-9 GHQ, on receipt of which the unit or formation will render the necessary casualty on the appropriate Army Form direct to GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF quoting the War Office authority in each case.

(b) GHQ 2nd Echelon CEF will then forward the duplicate copy of AF B 1994, in respect of such officers who are below the substantive rank of Colonel, direct to Director of Personnel, UNRRA HQ, 11 Portland Place, London, W.1.

(c) Once an Army officer (Military and A.S.) is posted to UNRRA, all subsequent casualties affecting him/her will be rendered on the appropriate Army Form by that organization direct to UNRRA HQ.

3. OFFICERS PREVIOUSLY RELEASED TO UNRA UNDER CLASS 'A'.

(a) Officers who have previously been released to UNRA under Class 'A' Release may now elect to be recalled for eventual Release under Class 'A' provided that they agree to any penalties which they have already accepted being taken into account when Class 'A' Release takes place.

(b) News of officers so electing to be recalled will be sealed to GHQ 2nd Echelon GAF, copy to GHQ GAF, not later than 8 Mar 46.

9. DOCUMENTATION.

(a) When an officer's posting to UNRA has been agreed by the War Office notification to this effect will be sent to his unit or formation by A-9 GHQ, on receipt of which the unit or formation will render the necessary casualty on the appropriate Army form direct to GHQ 2nd Echelon GAF quoting the War Office authority in each case.

(b) GHQ 2nd Echelon GAF will then forward the duplicate copy of AF B 199A, in respect of such officers who are below the substantive rank of Colonel, direct to Director of Personnel, UNRA HQ, 11 Portland Place, London, W.1.

(c) Once an Army officer (Allied and U.S.) is posted to UNRA, all subsequent casualties affecting him/her will be rendered on the appropriate Army form by that organization direct to UNRA HQ, London so that such casualties may be incorporated in Part II Orders (Officers) issued by HQ in UK in accordance with JCI 739/43. All casualties which are recorded will be entered on AF B 199A. (Of War Record of Service) by UNRA HQ, London in accordance with JCI 924/43.

10. MOVEMENT OF OFFICERS TO AND FROM OVERSEAS COMANDS.

War Office have requested UNRA HQ, London to notify all overseas Command HQs and GHQs 2nd Echelon by letter the arrival and departure of officers whose duty involves a stay of 24 days or longer.

11. RELEASE WHILE IN EMPLOYMENT WITH UNRA.

Arrangements for carrying out Release of Officers, other than Regular Army Officers, due for Release with their Army/Service Group will be notified in due course.

It is desired to bring to your notice certain difficulties involved in the seconding or releasing of personnel for employment with UNRRA.

1 While ACI 1185/45 allows the secondment of officers to UNRRA, no provision is made for Other Ranks. The present ruling is that no Class B release will be allowed for Other Ranks who are wanted by UNRRA. The result therefore appears to be that the take over by UNRRA of Displaced Persons Camp and other commitments is delayed through lack of suitably trained Other Ranks personnel.

2 Letters are frequently written by the UNRRA Mission (Italy) to War Office, requesting the secondment of officers under ACI 1185/45, but, as far as is known, no replies have yet been received. This means therefore that at present only those officers released under Class A are available for UNRRA, which emphasises the delay referred to in para 1 above.

3 The question therefore arises whether such personnel as are required for D.P & R work, but who can not yet be seconded or released to UNRRA, shall be held on the War establishment of this Commission, or whether it is proposed to make any alternative arrangements for them.

4 It is in any case suggested that the following recommendations be considered.

- (a) that ACI 1185/45 be made applicable to officers and Other Ranks.
