- 1 The following instruction applies only to orders etc of general application and not to orders of appointment, suspension, etc which relate only to a particular individual or individuals or to a particular concern or concerns or to a particular place. It relates not only to current orders etc but also to orders previously and whenever issued.
- 2 50 copies of all Proclamations and General Orders, Regulations and Rules, for the drafting of which this Headquarters was responsible, will be sent forthwith to the Information Division by the Sub-Commission which sponsored the same together with schedules showing areas and dates of enforcement.
- 3 20 copies of all Proclamations, Orders, regulations and judicial or administrative rules (other than those mentioned above) which have been issued in a Region or any Province thereof, showing where and when they have been brought into force, will be forwarded at once by the Region concerned to the Information Division of the Public Relations Branch of this Headquarters.
- 4 All documents sent to the Information Division in accordance with this instruction will be accompanied by descriptive lists showing the quantity of each item forwarded.
- 5 Regions and Sub-Commissions respectively will in future supply the Information Division with the said number of copies of all the above described documents which may be issued hereafter as the same are issued.
- 6 Archivists will in far as they can, supply from the records of alleged Regions such copies of orders etc issued in such Regions as may be spare up to the above mentioned maxima.

1. Reference is made to implementation in Gazzetta Ufficiale n. 101 of 23 August of D.L.L. 1 March 1945 n. 177 and D.L.L. 26 April 1945 n. 343.

2. Because of time necessary for examining each claim before applying the increases provided in these laws, pensioners will not benefit from them immediately.

3. This difficulty was met last February in central and southern Italy by payment of a lump sum anticipation; and as regards territory under Allied Military Government, this was done by G.O. 37. Originally, this order was withheld from implementation north of the economic boundary.

4. Issuance of G.O. 37 has now been authorized by V.P., C.A. Section for Liguria, Piemonte, Lombardia and Venezia regions. Copies of this General Order and the accompanying instruction (13035/F of 21 February) were sent to these regions for eventual use, if necessary, on 28 February. Additional copies of the order are en route.

5. Some additional copies of the accompanying instruction are sent herewith, together with the original covering letter. The Directions General of the Institutes concerned (Istituto Nazionale della Previdenza Sociale and Istituto Nazionale per l'Assicurazione Contro gli Infortuni sul Lavoro) are also sending instructions to their provincial offices.

6. Sufficient copies of this letter are enclosed for distribution to Finance, Labour and Legal Officers down to Provincial Officers.

1. In your letter you state that the Chief Commissioner and the United States Ambassador are still very concerned about the problem of public security and of the GIM factory committees in the North. You ask me to send you a personal report.
2. It is my opinion that there need be no concern about the two problems mentioned. Law and order are being maintained without any troubles. Illegal killings have dropped way, way down. The GIM factory committees are behaving as well as one can expect at the present time. I have been bringing pressure on them through the Committee of Liberation - National Committee and Lombardis Region Committee. The factory committees understand that they have no more power and, in fact, haven't exhibited any in some days. We are still permitting them to hear complaints which are all being forwarded to the expropriation commission set up under General Order 35. In view of the delay in obtaining the final text of General Order 36 (expropriation in private industry), I had a press announcement put out explaining our plan and that General Order 36 will be formally enacted in a few days. I also had a meeting with the civil expropriation commission of Milan, together with representatives of the Committee of Liberation of Northern Italy and of Lombardis, and explained General Order 36 to them and they are all quite satisfied with the exception of the points on which I had Mr. Dickie refer to Brig. Upjohn.
3. In conclusion, I repeat that as far as Lombardis is concerned there need be no concern either to regards to public security or GIM factory committees. Things are in hand.

1. I have your letter of 6 June 1945, above sub-
ject.

2. I had previously received instructions on the
same subject from the Senior Civil Affairs Officer AMG
Fifth Army, by his letter of 31 May 1945, paragraphs
6 and 7 of which provide that:

"6. This order shall apply and be effective in
all territory now occupied by the Fifth Army.

7. The provisions of this order may be posted
as Regional or Provincial orders, or otherwise appro-
priately implemented at the discretion of the Regional
Commissioners."

3. Since five of my provinces are still in Fifth
Army Area, General Hume's letter was naturally regarded
as basic authority as to those provinces. The General
further advised me orally that I should not be required
to publish a proclamation along these lines but that the
instructions were given to me as a weapon to use if I
deemed it necessary.

4. Since the situation in Emilia Region was quite
different and, I believe, somewhat better, than that in
Lombardia, so far as relations with the Committees of
Liberation were concerned, and since our primary effort
from the very first day of liberation has been to make
it clear to the Committees that they had no legislative
or governmental powers (a position soon gracefully ac-
cepted), I did not at first think that I should publish

the order, or one like it, at all.

5. However, upon taking the matter up with my provincial commissioner, I found that they all felt that publication would be helpful, and for this reason alone decided to exercise the prerogative vested in me by the SCAG Fifth Army. In doing this, however, I leaned very heavily on the words, "or otherwise appropriately implemented" and modified the form of the order somewhat in order to eliminate the reference to the termination "as of May 28" of a condition which, in Emilia Region, never existed after liberation.

6. Two copies of the resulting order are attached for your information.

7. With the permission of the SCAG Fifth Army, I used the same form of order for the A.C. provinces of Forli, Ravenna and Ferrara, as for the Fifth Army provinces, merely indicating after the signature my dual capacities as Regional Commissioner and as Deputy Senior Civil Affairs Officer Fifth Army.

8. I know that, for reasons which he deems sufficient, Brigadier Dunlop does not plan to publish this order. I believe that all of Liguria and Piemonte, and portions of Venezia, are still in Fifth Army Area although I may not be completely up to date on this.

9. On the grounds that:

(1) there is bound to be resentment on the part of the SCAG's Fifth and Eighth Armies to this instruction issued across normal channels of command;

(2) the order, which implies that committees of liberation did exercise legal powers in certain places until May 28, is contrary to the terms of the agreement between the C.L.E.A.I., the Italian Government and the Supreme Allied Commander; and,

(3) Regional Commissioners should in any event in a matter of this kind determine whether conditions

in their region justify the proposed action,

I feel that the instructions in your letter were on the whole ill-advised and should be retracted, at least as to those portions of the four regions mentioned which are still under control of AMG Fifth and Eighth Armies.

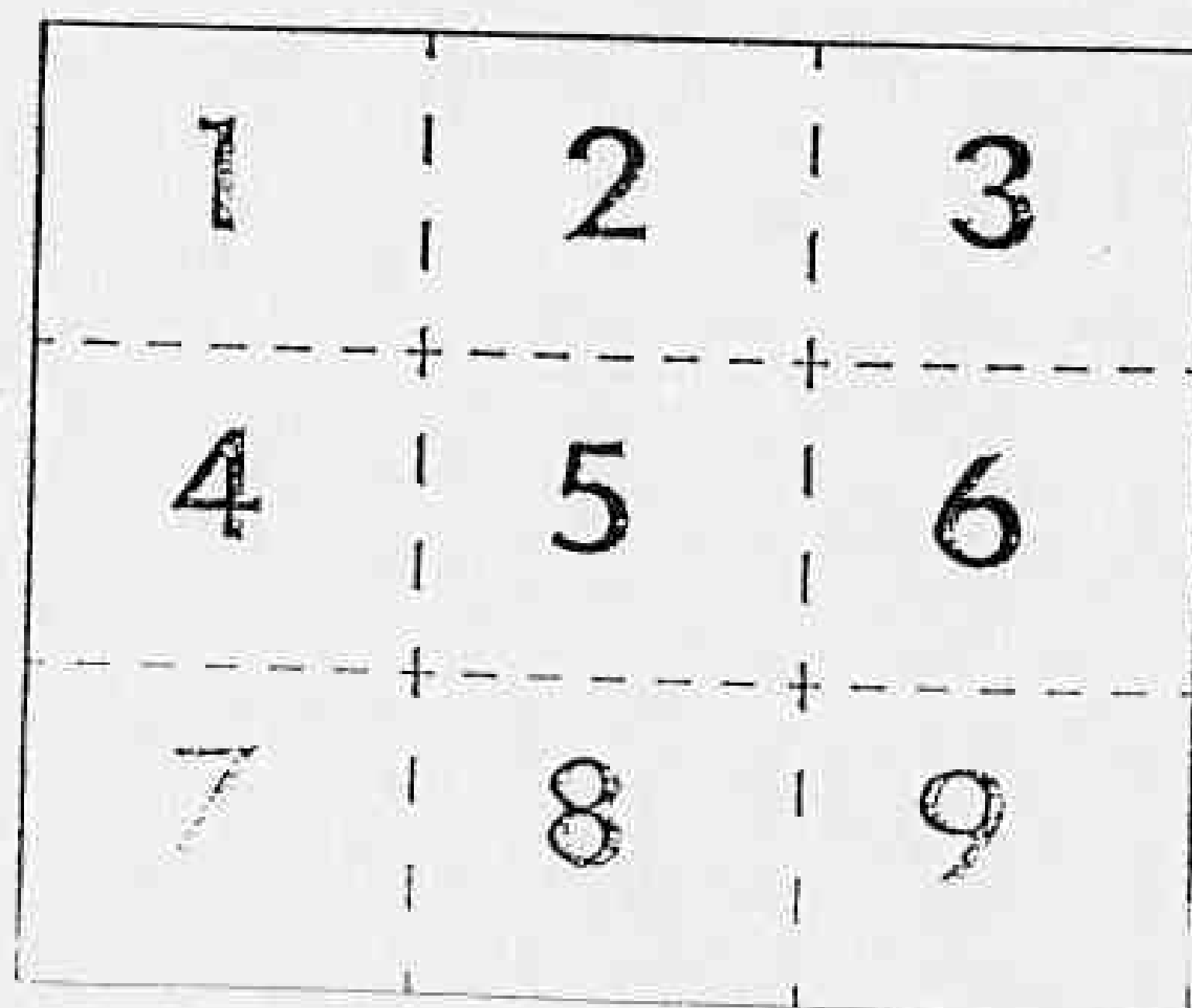
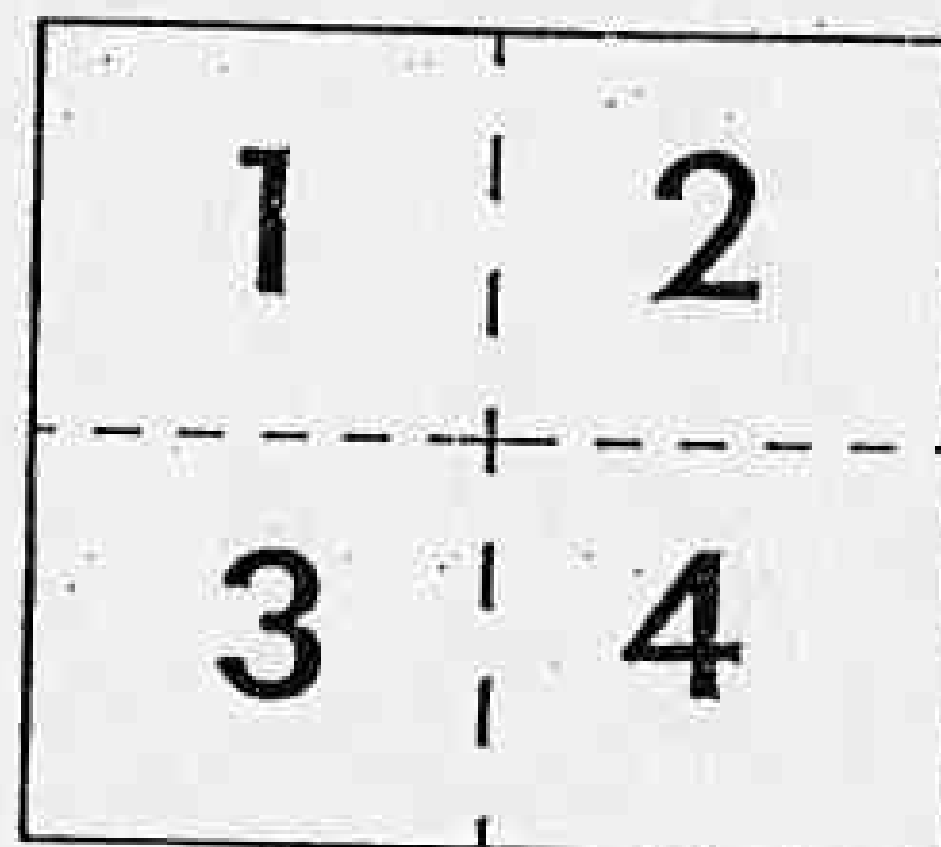

ORDER

After consultation with the Committee of National Liberation of Northern Italy and with its approval and in accordance with the agreement made between the Supreme Allied Commander Mediterranean Theater and the said Committee,

It is ordered that with respect to all the provinces in Lombardy:

1. - All decrees and orders heretofore made by the Committee of National Liberation of Northern Italy, the Regional Committee of Liberation, Provincial and Communal Committees of Liberation, or any economic, financial, industrial, or other committees or agencies of the said Committees of Liberation, shall cease to have any legal effect from the time they are superseded by decrees or orders of the Allied Military Government.
2. - All appointments to office of whatever nature heretofore made by the said committees shall cease to have any validity seven days after the publication of this order, unless legalized by order of the Allied Military Government.
3. - Any decrees, orders or appointments purporting to be made by said committees after the publication of this order shall be null and void.
4. - Allied Military Government is the only authority empo-

1. General Order No. 37 provides for the making of certain anticipatory payments in respect of increases which the Italian Government is about to authorize in pensions for invalidity, old age and survivorship and annuities for serious work accidents. The scheme of anticipatory payments is substantially identical with that which was ordered by the Council of Ministers on 23 December 1944 for Italian Government territory.

General Order No. 37 should be put into effect in each province immediately upon the completion of the arrangements hereinafter detailed which should be put in hand as soon as possible.

2. Annuities (Rendite) are granted to permanently injured workers and to survivors of fatally injured workers by Istituto Nazionale per l'Assicurazione contro gli Infortuni sul lavoro. They are paid by the provincial office in the provincial capital, at correspondent banks in other urban communes and at post offices in rural communes. Payment is authorized on an advice furnished the claimant at the time of the settlement.

3. A work accident claimant will draw the proper anticipation at the place at which he has been drawing his normal pension. No arrangements for this are required beyond allowing the provincial office sufficient time in which to prepare and deliver the necessary notification. The 30 day period provided in the order is sufficient for this purpose in the judgment of the Direction General. Finance Officers will assure that instructions from the Direction General have been received and that the provincial office is prepared to comply with them.

4. Pensions (pensioni) to various listed categories of invalids, retired persons and survivors are paid by Istituto Nazionale della Previdenza Sociale. They are sometimes paid by the provincial office and sometimes by post offices at the provincial capital. Elsewhere they are paid on order of the provincial office by the post offices. No such action is necessary as regards Infertuni the volume of whose disbursements through this agency is very much smaller.

5. For Previdenza claimants as for Infertuni claimants, the anticipations ordered will be paid by the same office as pays the regular pension to the claimant concerned. In the case of Previdenza, however, the payment will be made conjointly with the regular pension on the first due date following issuance of the order. Finance officers will assure that provincial offices of Previdenza Sociale have received and understand the instructions sent to them by their Direction General, that they have covered them to appropriate personnel of the provincial postal authorities, and that an agreement with the latter has been reached covering arrangements necessary for execution of the attached order.

6. It will be appreciated that the utmost possible consideration of the attached order is needed if suffering of pensioners is to be avoided, and if complaints of aggrieved pensioners regarding alleged more favorable treatment in other provinces are to be minimized. Although postal communications may not be everywhere available, or not in the normal measure, the order should not be withheld on this account. Such communications difficulties affect the payment of regular pensions as well as of anticipations; and the language of the attached order does not promise payments where regular pensions are not at present payable. Where alternative arrangements for payment of regular pensions have been made on account of communications difficulties, these will also be used for payment of anticipations.

7. Immediately the above arrangements are completed Provincial Commissioners will put General Order No. 37 into operation. Thereafter the matter is largely in the hands of the Italian agencies concerned each of which will be prepared to act in accordance with instruction of its Direction General at Rome.

8. This instruction is issued for distribution to Provincial Commissioners and Provincial Finance Officers.

ADVANCE PAYMENTS OF CERTAIN PENSIONS

WHEREAS the Italian Government has decided to increase pensions for invalidity, old age and survivorship and annuities for work accidents

AND WHEREAS the Italian Government has ordered that in anticipation of the passing of decrees to make such increases effective certain anticipatory payments shall be granted to pensioned workers in Italian Government Territory.

NOW THEREFORE I, ELIZABETH V. STONE, Rear Admiral U.S.N., for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE 1

The following anticipatory payments are hereby authorized:

- A. - An advance of L. 800 to persons entitled to invalidity old age and survivor pensions administered by Istituto Nazionale della Previdenza Sociale under the categories: V.C. (vecchiaia obbligatoria), I.C. (invalidita' obbligatoria), V.R. (vecchiaia meritata), I.R. (invalidita' meritata), F.R. (Episodio meritato), V.E. (vecchiaia trascurata), I.E. (invalidita' trascurata), E.E. (Episodio trascurato), V.C. (vecchiaia collettiva), I.C. (invalidita' collettiva), F. C. (Episodio collettivo).
 - B. - An advance of L. 800 to injured persons, with permanent disability of from 50 to 70%, who are entitled to annuities administered by the Istituto Nazionale per l'assicurazione contro gli infortuni sul lavoro.
 - C. - An advance of L. 1200 to injured persons, with permanent disability of from 80 to 100%, and to each family group of survivors, exclusive of sole-bodied widows without dependent children, who are entitled to annuities administered by the Istituto Nazionale Infortuni.
- Each of the payments authorized in Article 1 hereof shall be paid only to each person entitled to receive the same and shall be paid as follows:
- A. - The payment referred to in group A of Article 1 hereof shall be paid by the office where the pensioner normally receives his pension and shall be paid in conjunction with the first payment of the normal pension made after the coming into operation of this Order.
 - B. - The payments referred to in Groups B and C of Article 1 hereof shall be paid by the Provincial Seat of the Istituto Nazionale Infortuni within 30 days of the coming into operation of this Order.

ARTICLE 2

Each of the payments authorized in Article 1 hereof shall be paid only to each person entitled to receive the same and shall be paid as follows:

- A. - The payment referred to in Group A of Article 1 hereof shall be paid by the office where the prisoner normally receives his pension and shall be paid in conjunction with the first payment of the normal pension made after the coming into operation of this Order.
- B. - The payments referred to in Groups B and C of Article 1 hereof shall be paid by the Provincial Seat of the Istituto Nazionale Informale within 30 days of the coming into operation of this Order.

ARTICLE 3

All payments received under this Order shall be treated for all purposes as if they had been received under the above-mentioned order of the Italian Government.

ARTICLE 4

This Order shall come into operation in any province or part thereof within the Military Government Territory on the date of its first coming therein.

DECLARATION OF ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES AND FIXING OF PRICES

I, ELIERY W. STONE, REAR ADMIRAL, USNR, for and on behalf of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I

General Order No. 29 of 26 August 1944 is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE II

DECLARATIONS

SECTION 1--Any person, company or association owning or controlling any commodity specified in Article IV hereof in excess of the quantity shown therein shall, thirty days after the effective date of this order, make a declaration in writing of their entire stocks as of the date of such declaration to the officer of the Allied Military Government having jurisdiction over the area within which owners or controllers possess such stocks or the agency designated by such officer.

SECTION 2--Upon the first day of each succeeding month, such owners or controllers shall make a like declaration only if changes or alterations in their stocks have occurred subsequent to the initial declaration referred to in Section 1 of this Article.

SECTION 3--All such declarations shall bear the name and present address of the legal owner of the commodities declared and shall bear the signature or thumbprint and address of the person making the declaration.

ARTICLE III

DEFINITION OF PERSONS

For the purpose of making declarations, the person, company or association in possession of any premises or land shall be deemed to be in control of all commodities thereon.

ARTICLE IV

PROHIBITION AGAINST REMOVAL AND TRANSFER OF CERTAIN COMMODITIES

SECTION 1--From and after the effective date of this order, no person,

company or association using any of the commodities listed in Section 2 of this Article in excess of the quantity specified therein, or listed in any order or Notice hereafter issued, shall remove, sell, exchange or transfer any such articles without the permission in writing of the officer of the Allied Military Government referred to in Section 1, Article II hereof or his duly authorized agent.

SECTION 2—Schedule of Commodities to which this Article applies:

SECTION 3—This Article does not affect existing regulations pertaining to any commodities not listed in Section 2.

ARTICLE V

RATIONING, CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICES

Notion scales, schedules of charges for commercial services, rates and charges for public utilities and transportation and regulations for the rationing of electric power and the control and prices of foodstuffs officially in force in any locality on the date of the first publication of this Order therein shall remain unaltered until further order or notice of the Allied Military Government, and no person shall give, demand or receive rations or electric power in excess of such scale or limitation or shall demand, receive or pay any sum in excess of maximum prices so fixed.

ARTICLE VI

FURTHER ORDERS AND NOTICES

Notices or orders will from time to time be issued by the Allied Military Government revising the list of commodities referred to in Article IV hereof, and the ration scales, maximum prices, charges and other provisions referred to in Article V hereof. Such further orders or Notices shall be deemed to have the effect of amending this Order to the extent applicable and any violation of this Order as amended shall be punishable in the same manner as a violation of this order.

ARTICLE VII

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PENALTIES

Any person violating the provisions of this order shall upon conviction

ARTICLE VIII

CONSOLIDATING LEGISLATION

Any and all provisions of its laws or Orders of the Allied Military Government inconsistent or in conflict with the within Order are hereby repealed, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to abrogate or nullify any of the provisions of General Order No. 26 ("Consignment of Meat and Parley produced in 1944 to People's Granaries") or of the corresponding Ministerial Decree of the Italian Government dated 2 May 1944.

ARTICLE IX

EFFECTIVE DATE

This order shall become operative in each Province or part thereof within the occupied territory on the date of its first publication therein.

2. Pursuant to letter OA/23, dated 25 October 1944, and signal M665, AMG 8th Army, Ancona and Pesaro-Urbino Provinces are released to AMG/AC control under the jurisdiction of the Abruzzi-Marche Region.
3. Effective from 1000 hours 3 November 1944, Abruzzi-Marche Region assumes administrative control.
4. Normal security regulations and restriction of civilian movement in that part of the two provinces north of the Rear Army Security Control Line remain in full force and effect.

Reference is made to this Headquarters letter 623/50/3A of 23rd September 44.

1. All previous correspondence on this matter is cancelled and the following will apply.

- (a) SACs 5th and 8th Armies will be responsible for the initial publication of Proclamations 1 to 4 and General Order No. 1. General Order No. 2 will only be published by the Armies on the recommendation of the Senior Finance Officer.
- (b) The Publication of further General Orders and Notices will be at the discretion of SACs 5th and 8th Armies in consultation with the Regional Commissioners of the Regions concerned.
- (c) It will be the responsibility of Regional Commissioners as and when they take over new territory to publish all other Orders and Notices which have not been published by the Armies. Regional Commissioners should satisfy themselves that Procs 1 to 4 and G.O. No. 1 have been published on a sufficiently wide basis.
- (d) So that this HQ may know what Orders have been published within Regions Regional Commissioners will report to this HQ within two weeks of the taking over new territory what Orders they have published.
- (e) Attached is a list of current Orders which should be posted by Regions.

(c) It will be the responsibility of Regional Commissioners as and when they take over new territory to publish all other Orders and Notices which have not been published by the India. Regional Commissioners should satisfy themselves that Procs 1 to 4 and G.O. No. 1 have been published on a sufficiently wide basis.

(d) So that this may know what Orders have been published within Regions Regional Commissioners will report to this HQ within two weeks of the taking over new territory what Orders they have published.

(e) Attached is a list of current Orders which should be posted by Regions.

2. G.O. No. 33 and Notice No. 4 shown on the attached list are still in the hands of the Principal. Regions will shortly be distributed to Regions and should be posted on receipt.

3. Regional Commissioners will estimate the total number of all Proclamations, General Orders & C which will meet all their future requirements and order a return to this HQ within fourteen days of receipt of this letter. This will enable this HQ to run off now the required number of copies. Some Regions will hold all the copies they will require and they will render a nil return.
