My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I am writing to confirm certain points in regard to my meeting with you this morning.

As soon as the Allied Commission is abolished, all matters presently handled by the Commission will be dealt with by Allied Force Headquarters.

In order to facilitate liaison with the Italian Government in all but Italian military matters, there will be set up in Rome a Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch which will be a branch of Allied Force Headquarters. All such matters should therefore be referred to the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch which will be located in the same building now occupied by the Allied Commission.

As was stated in the Press release which I read to you, Brigadier R. Carr of the British Forces and Colonel J. de E. Balbach of the American Forces, will be appointed respectively Chief and Deputy Chief of the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch.

Questions affecting the Italian Armed Forces will after the abolition of the Allied Commission be handled by me as Chief of the Italian Military Affairs Section of Allied Force Headquarters.

Ministers of the three Service Ministries, or of any Ministry which succeeds those Ministries should deal direct with the heads of the Land Forces, Naval and Air Force Sub-Sections, under the same procedure which was applied in the case of the three Service Sub-Commissions.

Any military matters which arise on a governmental level or which the Italian Government desire to have taken up with Allied Force Headquarters should be referred to me as Chief of the Italian Military Affairs Section.

I should be glad, my dear Mr. Prime Minister, if you would inform all Ministries of your Government accordingly.

1. In accordance with the instructions contained in Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal FAN 711 of 11 January 1947, the Allied Commission will be abolished with effect from 2359 hours, 31 January 1947.

2. You will operate on the directive contained in the attached draft, AFHQ Staff Memorandum, which is being published shortly.

3. Your directive as Chief of the Italian Military Affairs Section, AFHQ, (IMAS), is contained in this Headquarters letter G-3 AFHQ/131/1 of 26 January 1947, enclosed herewith.

4. Pending a reply from the Combined Chiefs of Staff to this Headquarters Signal NAF 1266 of 17 January 1947, the French representative now accredited to the Allied Commission will continue to be accredited to IMAS.

5. The announcement of the appointments of Rear Admiral ELLERY W. STONE, USNR, as Chief of IMAS and of Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, as Chief Civil Affairs Officer, will be made shortly in an AFHQ General Order.

6. It is possible that the instructions regarding the downgrading of the security classification of the contents of Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal FAN 711 may not be received prior to the date and time ordered in paragraph 1 above for the abolition of the Allied Commission. In that event, coincidently with the abolition of the Allied Commission, you will notify the Italian Government that, with the Peace Treaty in sight, the usefulness of the Commission is considered to be exhausted and that it has been wound up as part of the general reduction of military establishments in Italy. At the same time, you are authorised to communicate to the Italian Government such parts of the directive attached to this letter as you consider necessary in order to make the future position clear to them.

ABOLITION OF ALLIED COMMISSION, ITALY

1. Abolition of Allied Commission

In conformity with the instructions contained in Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal PAN 711, dated 11 January 1947, the Allied Commission is abolished with effect from 2359 hours, 31 January 1947.

2. Reorganization of Office of Chief Civil Affairs Officer

a. In addition to the functions set forth in Staff Memorandum 49, AFHQ, 14 May 1944, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, is hereby designated as Chief Civil Affairs Officer. He will assume the duties of that office coincidently with the abolition of the Allied Commission. He is charged with responsibility for:

(i) Technical control of and advice to all Allied Military Government Agencies, but not of the Italian Military Affairs Section, AFHQ (see paragraph 4 below). He will exercise operational command over such agencies outside of Zone A, Venezia Giulia. Operational command over AMG agencies in Venezia Giulia is vested in G.O.C.-in-C., CMF.

(ii) The final review over all Military Government Court cases which in conformity with existing instructions are referred to the Chief Civil Affairs Officer.

(iii) The administration of Allied Civil Affairs agencies and camps for displaced persons, and for the repatriation of the inmates thereof.

(iv) The programming of all AMG imports.

(v) The maintenance and disposition of files and records of the Allied Commission except those pertaining directly to the Armed Forces Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission. These latter records will be maintained and disposed of in accordance with instructions to be issued in due course.

(vi) Liaison with the Italian Government in connection with the functions herein set forth or as directed by the Supreme allied Commander. 22

(vii) Such other matters pertaining to Civil Affairs and Military Government as may be directed by the Supreme Allied Commander from time to time.

b. As Chief Civil Affairs Officer, Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, is vested with the authority now pertaining to that office. He shall not be

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responsible for:

- (i) Supervision and direction of the Italian Armed Forces.
- (ii) Control of the size and character of the Italian Armed Forces.
- (iii) Control of the production of armaments by the Italians.

3. Organization of Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch, G-5, AFHQ.

For the purposes set forth in 2a above, and for such others as may be authorized, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, will set up and operate a Branch in Rome to be known as the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch, G-5, AFHQ, (short title LACAB, Rome), and will so adjust the duties and personnel of his Section as a whole, as to effect the maximum efficiency and saving of manpower.

4. Organization of Italian Military Affairs Section, AFHQ.

a. Coincident with the abolition of Allied Commission, together with the Service Sub-Commissions, including Allied Military Mission to the Italian Army, (AMIA), there is established, in ROME, the Italian Military Affairs Section, (short title IMAS), of AFHQ.

b. Under the Chief, IMAS, there will be established Land Forces, Naval and Air Forces Sub-Sections, each under a Director.

c. The Sub-Sections of IMAS will continue to operate under the existing directives for, and practices of, the present Service Sub-Commissions.

d. The relationship of IMAS and its Sub-Sections with AFHQ (and in the case of the Naval Sub-Section with the Allied Naval Area Commander (C-in-C Med)), the Italian Government and its agencies and with representatives of other Allied Nations will remain unchanged from those now obtaining with the Service Sub-Commissions.

SUBJECT: Establishment of Italian Military Affairs Section  
of AFHQ.

TO : Rear Admiral Ellery W. STONE.

1. Coincident with the abolition of the Allied Commission and its Service Sub-Commissions, including the Allied Military Mission to the Italian Army (MMIA), there is established, in NAME, the Italian Military Affairs Section (IMAS), AFHQ, of which you are designated Chief.

2. You will operate IMAS with the absolute minimum of Staff.

3. To assume the functions of the Land Forces (including MMIA), Naval and Air Forces Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission, there will be established the Land Forces, Naval and Air Forces Sub-Sections of IMAS, each under a Director.

4. IMAS and its Sub-Sections will continue to operate in accordance with existing directives for, and practices of, the Service Sub-Commissions. The relationship of IMAS and its Sub-Sections with AFHQ (and in the case of the Naval Sub-Section with the Allied Naval Area Commander (C-in-C MED)), the Italian Government and its agencies and with representatives of other Allied Nations will remain unchanged from those now obtaining with the Service Sub-Commissions.

5. One of your primary functions as Chief, IMAS, will be to plan for the early handover of the Sub-Sections complete with their then existing functions to AFHQ. This handover will be effected at the proper time pursuant to AFHQ instructions. Upon this handover IMAS will be abolished and the Sub-Sections will become Italian Land Forces, Italian Naval and Italian Air Forces Branches of AFHQ, respectively. They will then be answerable to SACMED through the appropriate General Staff Section of AFHQ, their relationship with Allied Service Commanders being unchanged from those of the Service Sub-Sections of IMAS.

(a) Evaluating a strength of 45 officers for the Displaced Persons Division, the responsibilities of which are, under present plans, increasing a strength of 46 officers is proposed.

(b) No provision has been made for the continuation of the residual functions of the OCM Division.

(c) No allowances has been made for the continuance of the present MC activities in regard to Allied Force Labour and Wages Committee.

(d) A HQ has been included under the Co-ordinating staff of the Chief of Branch. He will be assigned to other duties. There are other Allied HQs in Rome, but it is understood they deal only with Allied matters with Allied newspapers and Allied news agencies and do not cover the Italian Press or normally have dealings with the Italian Government. It is suggested that this matter should be considered by the HQ AMHQ.

3. As regards the proposal that the British War Establishment should be compiled in accordance with normal procedure, experience has shown that approximately 3 months will elapse after detail work has started before the War Establishment is finalized.

It is considered essential that the strength of LAGAB should be fluid so that it can be reduced in the light of experience and as and when outstanding functions decrease or are terminated. It will, in any event, cease to exist on 1st day. It is strongly recommended therefore that every endeavour be made to induce G(SD) GHQ CHP to agree to the proposal that the present HQ of the Allied Commission (W/CY/266/5), after necessary de-implementation should be the vehicles used to carry the British personnel required for LAGAB, rather than to accept production of a new establishment.

Your attention is invited to this HQ letter C-1(3)/32/4/A dated 26 Nov 46, addressed to War Office (CMA) copy to you. This letter shows how the establishment of this Commission was split into four parts and also how the HQ staff element has been gradually reduced by non-implementation. If it is not proposed to abolish all the War Establishments which bear the title of this Commission (e.g. Wine and Venetia Giulia) it would appear illogical to state that there is an obligation to singles out one particular establishment for abolition. It is strongly recommended therefore that the present establishment (W/CY/266/5) be further de-implemented but be allowed to remain in existence to carry LAGAB with the exception of MP and R Divisions. 

1. In accordance with the instructions contained in Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal PAM 711, it is planned to abolish the Allied Commission with effect from 2350 hours, 31 January 1947.

2. The Combined Chiefs of Staff are being asked for instructions as to the status of the Advisory Council for Italy and whether France and Russia are to be represented in one of the subsidiary branches of AFHQ to be set up on the abolition of the Allied Commission.

3. The Combined Chiefs of Staff are further being asked for permission to downgrade the security classification of their signal referred to above, so that the instructions conveyed therein can be made known to the Italian Government.

4. Instructions regarding the exercise of control functions of supervision and direction of the Italian Armed Forces, hitherto exercised by the Land, Navy and Air Force Sub-Commissions, referred to in paragraph 2 of the Combined Chiefs of Staff's signal, will be issued by this Headquarters at an early date.

5. To facilitate the performance of the functions set forth in paragraph 3 of the Combined Chiefs of Staff's signal, it is tentatively proposed that AGOS, G-5, AFHQ, will be appointed Chief Civil Affairs Officer. A copy of his proposed directive, which it is intended to shortly to issue as an AFHQ Staff Memorandum, is attached. *5006*

6. Subject to final decision through service channels, Brigadier M. Carr and Colonel Walbach are appointed respectively Chief and Deputy Chief of the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch (LAGAB) of G-5, AFHQ, to be located in Rome.

The appointment of Colonel Walbach as Deputy Chief is primarily for the purpose of assuring an Acting Chief during the absence of the Chief. It is contemplated that Colonel Walbach will retain his functions as Head of the Economics Branch.

7. It is the intention that, notwithstanding its location, LACAB will be an integral part of the G-5 Section and will be in no sense a lower headquarters.

8. You will instruct Brigadier Carr, in consultation on U.S. service matters with Colonel Walbach and Lt. Col. (b) That LACAB will continue as at present to furnish certain essential administrative overheads for the Service Branches, AFA and ASAA.

(c) That the present system, whereby civilian employees and certain essential facilities and equipment for Civil Affairs Agencies are provided by the Italian Government, will continue.

9. The WE/TO will be accompanied by a Table listing the officers now with the Allied Commission who are available and recommended to fill specified appointments therein, together with a detailed statement of the functions to be performed by each branch and sub-branch of LACAB.

10. The British War Establishment will be compiled in accordance with normal British procedure.

11. The instructions regarding the run-down of the Allied Commission, already included in this Headquarters' letter G-5: 910.13-3 P (TS) of 3 January 1947 will remain in force. You will, moreover, furnish this Headquarters as early as possible with your recommendations regarding any additional functions now being performed which can be discontinued or transferred to other agencies when the Allied Commission is abolished.

(f) Liaison with the Italian Government in connection with the functions herein set forth or as directed by the Supreme Allied Commander.

2. It is my view that after "R" day I have no responsibility for feeding or otherwise maintaining any civil territory. It is my opinion however that the territory now being maintained by CCS will suffer want unless a substantial supply of essentials remains in the various areas at the time sovereignty passes. This is particularly applicable to TFT. The free state has practically no indigenous supplies, and unless provisioning is arranged for, and actually on hand, at turnover, it will get off to a very bad start. Allied Troops will be stationed in Udine Province for a considerable period after "R" day. While I have every confidence that Italy and Unrra will do their best to fill the gap it would be a bad publicity for us to leave bare larder. AMG territory has lived a hand to mouth existence from the

3. I have already called forward the Jan-March requirements by FX 73824 of 18 December. I recommend that the April-June requirements be forwarded without delay, so that the 6 months supply shall arrive by 15 March 47. This will permit distribution prior to 1 April 47 which for the purposes at hand I estimate as "R" day.
4. In view of the interest I have in Trieste while UK/US Troops are stationed there and particularly during AMG period prior to assumption of Office by Governor I would like assurances that food and other essential supplies including coal to prevent disease and unrest are being provided from some source.



1. Reference is made to your G-5: 910.13-3P of 5 December 1946.

2. A Co-ordinating Committee to make recommendations in regard to the liquidation of the functions of this Commission has been set up under Executive Order No. 39 of 13 December 1946, copy of which is enclosed.

3. (a) Taking the officer strength of the Commission as a gauge of its present activities there are now at Headquarters a total of 152 Officers (61 (A) and 91 (B)).

(b) Of this total, 72 officers are with the Service Subcommissions. Separate plans are being submitted for the run down of the Land Forces Subcommission (IMIA) (with a strength at Headquarters of 40 Officers), in accordance with your G-5: 910.13-3P of 9 December 1946. As regards the Navy and Air Forces Subcommissions, pending decisions from higher authority, I am unable at this stage to make any recommendations as to any advance reduction in their personnel or functions, although they will of course cease to function as such on "R" Day.

(c) As regards the remaining total of 80 officers, 10 are with Displaced Persons Division (which Division has also 24 Officers in the field) and 6 are with Archives Division, the functions of which are not considered in this letter. This leaves a balance of 64 Officers engaged on various activities which have been considered in regard to preliminary action with a view to facilitating the closing down of this Commission.

4. I do not consider it practicable to draw up at this stage a phased plan for the liquidation of all functions presently carried out by this Commission or for the run down of its Divisions. All existing Divisions will have functions to perform up to "R" Day especially in view of the continuance of Allied Military Government up to that day.

All Divisions have been directed to bring all outstanding matters to a conclusion, as early as possible, and are processing their records in preparation for their eventual transfer to Archives.

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- 2 -

A  
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As a first step I am enclosing a schedule containing recommendations in regard to the termination of certain functions or their transfer to permanent civil authorities.

These and other functions will be kept under constant review with the object of making fresh recommendations to master procedure as regards the run down of this Commission.

5. Consideration is being given to the special problems set out in the Annexure to your letter under reference and also to others of a similar nature. Special action is also being taken with GHQ in regard to disposing of the outstanding functions of the Captured Enemy Materials Division and copies of all correspondence on this question will be sent to your Headquarters.

6. I recommend that consideration should be given to the establishment in due course of an office in ROME under your Headquarters which will be responsible for the final disposal during the 90 day period (perhaps even longer) of personnel, stores, equipment and any outstanding matters connected with the Commission and other agencies such as AFA and ASAA. Moreover there will be the question of a channel of communication between the Italian and Allied authorities in matters of detail such as when Allied military absentees are found in territory not covered by any Allied military headquarters. In discussing with permanent civil authorities the matter of taking over functions, which in most cases are executive, such authorities are reluctant to agree or to give decisions owing to uncertainty as to securing the necessary staff which in many cases they hope to obtain from the Allied Commission after the termination of its functions. The question of appropriations also concerns the American Embassy in particular.

In view of the reluctance or refusal of these authorities to take over certain responsibilities (in particular see AGMA liquidation plan) it may be that it will be necessary for the office proposed above to continue to operate after the termination of the 90 day period. Approach would have to be made to the Italian Government seeking approval of such operation since even if this office were civilian in character the question of immunity for its personnel would arise. I do not anticipate that the Italian Government would raise any objections to such a proposal but the continued administration and maintenance of such an office might well have complications without the Government's concurrence.

7. I would appreciate your views on the matter raised in para 6 above and at an early date your comments on or approval of the recommendations contained in the schedule enclosed.

To : Provincial Commissions,

UNRWA Territories.

1. With the ratification of the new Treaty, all rights, duties, privileges and responsibilities of the UNRWA under its Treaty will come. This means that on the date of the coming into force of the new Treaty the administration of UNRWA services will permanently be formally handed over to Italian control.

The Commission has been informed that steps are being taken to secure sufficient rights for the UNRWA so that operation may be conducted during the 90 days subsequent to the coming into force of the new Treaty.

2. You are therefore directed to prepare provisional plans for the termination of UNRWA services and submit no later than 15 days prior to this Commission, or the purpose of provisional, to advise the effective date of the new Treaty will be assumed to be 1 January 1947. Developments during the next few weeks may well cause the forecast of the date to be changed.

It is to be assumed that after the effective date of the new Treaty no UNRWA funds will be available to cover hire, purchase or payment and that only national funds provided by the UNRWA will be available. It is, therefore, essential that prior to the effective date of the new Treaty, all civilian personnel and any contractors covered by UNRWA funds should be cut down to a minimum compatible with efficiency.

From the effect from the date of the coming into force of the new Treaty, all payment under administrative provision C. 1 of Treaty shall of these employees for UNRWA funds will cease and those not otherwise concerned will be responsible for making their own arrangements for payment of these staff. The same will apply to servants and other UNRWA

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I am writing to you with regard to the maintenance and efficiency during the critical period following the date of the coming into force of the peace treaty with Italy, of the civil administration of the Province of Trieste which it is proposed will be handed over formally to Italian control on that date.

The rapid and orderly evacuation of the Allied Forces in north East Italy and Venetian Giulia will depend to a great extent on the efficient cooperation of the Civil Authorities in meeting Military requirements, and it is of extreme importance that there should be no period of temporary disorganisation resulting from the discontinuation of Allied Military Government.

I should therefore be glad to have your assurance, my dear Prime Minister, that the Italian administration of the Province of Trieste is fully organised in advance of the formal handing over of control, and that it is capable of functioning efficiently immediately Allied Military Government is withdrawn.

1. In connection with the Peace Treaty, very early consideration should be given to the question of the necessary handover documents in respect of A&G territory.

2. There would appear to be four territories involved:

- (a) Udine Province
- (b) that part of Zone "A" of Venezia Giulia which passes to Italian control.
- (c) that part of Zone "A" of Venezia Giulia which passes to Jugoslav control.

(I am not clear yet whether any small part of the N.W. corner of Udine is affected.)

- (d) that part of Venezia Giulia which passes to the control of the International State of Trieste.

It may be that there are no existing directives covering documents for (c) or (d) and that instructions will have to be sought from AFHQ.

3. The question of the actual time and date of handover, of the signing of the documents, of the notification to all A&G and Italian authorities concerned of the actual time and date, and of the circulation of the documents may present an intricate problem.

4. So far as is known at present, the date of the coming into effect of the Peace Treaty will be that on which the ratification documents of the Four Big Powers are deposited in Paris. It is not known whether such documents will be deposited by the Four Big Powers simultaneously on one agreed date, or whether the documents will be deposited independently thus making the effective date of the Treaty the date on which the last Big Power to ratify deposits its documents.

It is not known, therefore, how much advance notice (if any) there will be of the actual time and date on which the Peace Treaty comes into effect.

It is considered that, while the functions of the Land Forces Sub-Commission in connection with the enforcement of the Armistice Terms must continue until the Armistice is formally abrogated, its functions as MMIA in connection with the training and equipment of the Italian Army can properly cease prior to "R" Day, on a date to be decided by this Headquarters. For planning purposes, this date will be fixed at R - 30 days.

2. Planning for the liquidation of the Land Forces Sub-Commission, in both its capacities, will accordingly be based upon the above premises. Plans will be designed to ensure that the Sub-Commission is closed down and its personnel and equipment prepared for evacuation within the shortest possible period after R Day.

They will include the preparation of files for hand-over as follows:

(a) Files containing information of value to the quadripartite body to be set up under Article 75 of the Draft Peace Treaty for the purpose of supervising its execution.

(b) Files containing information of value to any agency which may be appointed to assist in the training and development of the Italian Army.

3. An outline of the above plans, including a phased programme, will be forwarded to reach this Headquarters not

2. With reference to para 2 (a) of letter dated 9 Dec.46, the statement that there will be a quadripartite body is not accurate. Under Article 75 of the Draft Peace Treaty the U.S., U.K., French and USSR Embassies, acting in concert, are charged with the supervision of the execution of the Peace Treaty for a period not exceeding 18 months.

As regards the American and British Embassies, presumably each Embassy will set up some type of service panel for this purpose. It may be that such service panels will be quite distinct from normal Service Attachés.

3. Files, if Allied Commission files, can only be issued on loan to outside agencies. The question as to whether any files falling under the categories mentioned in para 2 of AFHQ letter of 9 Dec. will be required in quadruplicate, in view of four Embassies being involved, will require consideration.
