1. Reference your letter above subject file VG/AMG/260 dated 2 January 1947. The following documents, which further inform you in connection with the turn-over of your functions have recently been forwarded to you.

1. Instruments for Provisional Regime TPT.
2. Peace Treaty Article 4, (Boundary) and Article 5.
3. General Provisions concerning the status of TPT.
4. Property and Debt Provisions relating to TPT.
5. Technical Guarantees.
6. Permanent Statute of TPT.
7. Instrument for the Free Port Trieste.
8. Map - French Line.
9. Map - Boundaries of TPT.

2. You have already been furnished the following letters pertaining to this subject:

1. Evacuation of Italians from Jugoslav to Italian Territory - file, 0-5: 902.40, dated 3 January 1947. N.R.

2. Evacuation of Italians from Territory to be ceded to Jugoslavia, file, 0-5: 902.40, dated 3 January 1947. N.R.

3. Copy of HAF 1256, dated 31 December 1946, addressed to the CGS is attached hereto. 19

4. So far as practicable, the paragraphs of your VG/AMG/260 are considered separately, and numbered in agreement with the letter.

18A 5. Agreed, but it is doubtful if the present committee is briefed or interested in many of the problems confronting you. It is interested only in TPT and not in the overall AMG finances. In this connection see paper noted in para 1 (4).

18A 4. The security grading of planning papers must conform to instructions from higher authority. Most of these papers come from ACOAH already classified. CGS, CWP, has made recommendations in connection with security classification which do not conflict with your views of down grading. As this Headquarters has the same problem, you can be assured that down grading will be accomplished as expeditiously as practicable.

5. It will be assumed that Venezia Giulia Police will not function in any territory including Pola after "N" Day, which is to be turned over to either Italy or Yugoslavia. While it is probable that present members of Venezia Giulia Police will operate in TPT after "N" Day, they will operate as TPI Police and not as Venezia Giulia Police. A new oath presumably will be required. The suggestions in 5d - 5e - 5f- and 5g are agreed. No machinery for discussing details with the Yugoslavs has however been set up. This matter will be further studied at AFHQ.

6. If prison warders do not elect to stay, they must be evacuated with the police. Pola can be no exception. 19

7. This para has been partially answered. NAF 1256 refers. So far as is known, there is no possibility that Allied Troops will remain in Pola after "N" Day. Unless the CCS reply to contrary affect, to NAF 1256, it may be assumed that the Allies will not be responsible for the evacuation of Italians except as covered in our Signal FX 74181 of 8 January, if the Italian Government desires to procure a ship, it will be assumed that it will so indicate to proper authorities. It is considered that no action should be taken by the Allied military authorities to sponsor the evacuation of Italians or their goods from Pola by train. No such request has been received from official Italian sources. In any event, it is extremely doubtful if the Yugoslavs would clear such a train even if the passengers and freight were covered by AMG permits. However, while you should not at this time sponsor such trains, you should not prevent any evacuation made on any trains unless such evacuation may result in your having to care for or maintain the evacuees. You will not set up facilities for this purpose. In this connection your attention is invited to Section VI Article 13 of the proposed Peace Treaty. This Section does not contemplate mass migration. Until reply is received to NAF 1256 the attitude of the CCS will not be known.

8. Your remarks concerning paras 1, 4 & 5 of our 3-5: 910.13 SP of 8 Dec. 1946 are noted. Any information secured from the Finance Commission now assembling in your Area, in connection with para 4, should be promptly furnished this Headquarters. 18

9. The basis of your recommendation contained in para 8 concerning maintenance of present AMG territory appears to be that the CCS is responsible for the maintenance of TPT. Such a premise cannot be accepted. It is the responsibility of United Nations. The question of shipment of CCAC supplies is being raised with the CCS. It will be recommended that advance shipments covering a possible three months needs be sent in time so that distribution could be completed prior to "N" Day. In case that is not practicable, it will be recommended that no shipments shall be made which cannot be distributed prior to "N" Day. The CCS will be notified that we will assume that United Nations will make proper provision for TPT. In connection with your para 8 (d), your attention is invited to para C of Annex IX (Technical Guarantees). 5076

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10. Reference your para 8 (Legal). The fundamental policy with regard to all records is that they should so far as practicable, remain in situ. As will be noted in Annex on property and debts, it is contemplated that records and archives are to be transferred between Governments after TPT is set up. It is apparently not contemplated that all records shall be finally disposed of prior to "D" Day. In any case, no duplication of records will be undertaken which is beyond the capabilities of completion by your reduced strength in personnel prior to "D" Day. The CCS have been queried as to the continued validity of our sentences after "D" Day. You will be informed of the decision. Your hasty opinion is agreed. Your intentions concerning review of Court cases are agreed. Reviews should be initiated without delay so that executive action to effect changes in sentences can be implemented expeditiously. /17A

11. The following remarks pertain to your planning Notes (no date) which accompanied such letter. Ref para 1(c) (1) of the problem. So far as is known here, there are not two problems involved. Pola is in the same category as the remainder of the territory to be ceded Yugoslavia. See Para 7 above.

12. Ref your para 3. — 17C

(a) The question is not fully understood. The physical transfer is made to the representative of the New Government at each locality where an AMG officer remains on "D" day. Wherever AMG officers and Venezia Giulia Police can be removed from a community to leave the control of that community in the hands of the civil authorities prior to "D" Day such removals should be made. In general, records should remain in situ.

(b) See (a) immediately above. Hanover must take place not later than D Day.

(c) Transfers of sovereignty all take place on "D" Day. Withdrawal of AMG and Venezia Giulia police personnel may be made prior to "D" Day if in opinion law and order can be maintained.

(d) This appears to be a rhetorical question. Your example is agreed. 17E

13. Until you have had a chance to study the recent documents furnished you, no decision will be given the recommendations made in your para 5. It appears however, that such changes are contrary to the spirit (and so far as TPT is concerned, perhaps the letter) of the Peace Treaty and its complimentary papers. Furthermore, the British Chiefs of Staff have signalled to their Washington Staff that the taking over of Civil administration by the Italians and the Jugos is from AMG must in the first place be agreed between Governments and it is then for SACAG to implement. It is therefore unwise to take steps which might well corroborate the actions of the Governments.

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14. Your para 6(a), (b), (c). Such action is premature. Instructions have already been issued that no lists would be prepared by AMG on possible evacuees.

15. It is desired that this Headquarters be kept up to date on your planning, and that you submit for decisions any questions beyond your authority to act.

It is therefore desirable that any such negotiations be made through diplomatic channels between states, in view of their property and needs. Further, it is best to operate Governmental machinery ready to take place prior to ratification. It is also appropriate to establish liaison with which I will be unable to cope. In addition, it is necessary to have liaison with other countries, a situation may arise between Europe and Asia.

In addition to the areas concerned of the international level to inform Italian population early action is taken in a timely manner which is better than population under martial law. On the other hand, I feel that further, it is necessary to take steps to protect interests of its own nationals.

Subject is implementation of Italian Peace Treaty.

1. As a condition of returning territory to Italian Government, I have previously required certain understandings, including legalizing acts of AMG and confirming sentences of AMG Courts. Presume that undertakings are invalidated upon ratification of Peace Treaty. No handover documents will therefore be submitted for territory now under AMG, which is to be returned to Italian control when Treaty comes into force, unless so directed by you. Same problem is involved in territory to be ceded to FRANCE, JUGOSLAVIA and TRIESTE Free State. Each state is presumably free to invalidate AMG Court sentences and other acts performed under armistice regime. Request confirmation that above presumptions are correct.

2. New subject. Italian Prime Minister has enquired as to means of safeguarding interests of Italians in territory destined to be ceded to JUGOSLAVIA, particularly POLA. Anticipated that many such people will desire to move to Italian soil with their moveable property. In my view it is responsibility of Italian Government to protect interests of its own nationals. Moreover, although territories concerned are under AMG, I do NOT consider that Allied Military Authorities should undertake responsibility for organizing any migration arising out of the Peace Treaty. On the other hand, I feel that, unless early action is taken on a governmental level to inform Italian populations of the areas concerned of the arrangements which are being made to safeguard their interests, a situation may arise between signature and ratification of Treaty with which I will be unable to cope. In addition, if officially sponsored migration is to take place prior to ratification, Italian Government will presumably require transit facilities, and permission to operate them, in AMG Territory for emigrants, their property and needs. Earliest possible notice of any such requirements will be necessary. It is therefore desirable that early agreement be made through diplomatic channels between Italian and Jugoslav Governments regarding migration of persons and property either before or after ratification of Treaty and that I be instructed as to extent to which I am to facilitate operation of any mutual arrangements which may be made.

1. Migration of governmental employees must be controlled. Probable most public servants will migrate to ITALY to protect their pensions or to avoid victimization on account of having assisted ANC. Important from viewpoint of both ANC and successor administration that mass migration of such persons does NOT take place prior to ratification of Treaty. In order to prevent complete breakdown of law and order and public facilities, recommend that arrangements be made on a governmental level and that they be made known as early as possible.

2. Question of movement of industrial plant and facilities also arises. Under authority of your PAB 636, such movement is at present permitted between one part of Zone "A" of VENEZIA GIULIA and another. From annexure 3 of draft Peace Treaty, dated 18 July 1946, it appears that there is to be NO restriction on the movement of any property from territory to be ceded by ITALY to other states except state and para-statal property. If this is so, recommend that arrangements be made through diplomatic channels whereby, effective from date of signature of Treaty, existing restrictions will be lifted and movement to any destination will be permitted of any property the removal of which is to be allowed under its terms.

3. I am anxious to have an orderly turnover of my responsibilities. As I shall be without authority over the agencies which assumes sovereignty over territory in which I now have an interest under the armistice terms, I desire assurances that the handing over procedure will be arranged through diplomatic agencies and that I be given guidance as to any responsibilities which I may have for affecting negotiations between the various interested states.

4. The questions raised are intimately connected with my phase out planning. I shall be grateful therefore for early guidance on any one of them even though all answers may NOT be immediately available.

Reference your letter O-5 910.13/3P of 8th December 1946. The Delay is very much regretted but the Planning Committee has only recently been set up.

1. Planning Committee.

A Planning Committee under the chairmanship of the D/S.C.A.O. has been formed and all matters pertaining to the handover and the termination of Allied Military Government, Venezia Giulia, will be investigated and examined. Reports on the findings of the Committee will be forwarded to you together with recommendations and when it is considered your approval is required this fact will be stated.

2. Planning Notes.

In this connection I attach herewith the Preamble and Part 1 of the Planning Notes.

You will note that your approval is required for the division of Trieste and Gorizia Provinces prior to Ratification Day in order to create a territorial situation which it is considered will facilitate the transfer of the different Areas to the Taking Over Governments.

3. (Finance Problems)

It is known that a Finance Commission is arriving here shortly, and it is wiser to leave all finance problems to be handled by this Commission. The appropriate officers of Allied Military Government will naturally work hand in hand with the Commission and you will be kept in touch with the situation. It is also hoped that the Finance Commission will be able to give us

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1. Planning Committee.

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It is known that a Finance Commission is arriving here shortly, and it is wiser to leave all Finance Problems to be handled by this Commission. The appropriate officers of Allied Military Government will naturally work hand in hand with the Commission and you will be kept in touch with the situation. It is also hoped that the Finance Commission will be able to give us a lead on Economic problems. In this connection your attention is drawn to this Headquarters letter No. V9/AMO/23/315 dated 17th December 1946.

4. Reading of Planning correspondence.

One of the difficulties which the Planning Committee is encountering at the present time is to date all correspondence dealing with the future of zone "A" is either "Top Secret or Secret" and as such becomes practically impossible to consult civilian officials on matters which need the cooperation of the interested Governments and also of Local Government officials.

It is felt the time has now come when all Planning correspondence (except matters appertaining to the Forces) should be graded as unclassified. Everybody is well aware of the decision arrived at by the Big Four and the sooner unrestricted consultations can take place with the representatives of the Governments concerned many of the planning difficulties will be obviated.

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5. Police Force.

Up to date, considerable planning has been carried out in respect of the transfer of the Venezia Giulia Police Force to the Free Territory of Trieste but no action has been taken regarding the Public Order Plans in those Areas of Zone "A" which are being handed over to Italy and Yugoslavia.

It is presumed that the Venezia Giulia Police Force will not continue to operate after "R" Day in any part of Zone "A" with the exception of the Area becoming the Free Territory and possibly Pole. It is therefore essential that plans are now drawn up for the withdrawal of the Venezia Giulia Police Force from those Areas to be handed over to Italy and Yugoslavia and that the Italian and Yugoslav Governments make the necessary plans for the policing of their respective Areas on the withdrawal of the Venezia Giulia Police Force.

It is not anticipated that there will be any difficulty in handing over Public Order duties to the Italians but the handover to Yugoslavia may produce complications.

It is suggested that a few days prior to "R" Day the Venezia Giulia Police Force personnel situated in Zone "A" outside the Free Territory are thinned out as much as possible and only essential police remain.

In the case of Italy, small Capablini advance parties can be sent to all different police stations prior to "P" Day so that the Italian police are established when the main part of the Venezia Giulia Police Force moves out on "R" Day. In the case of the Yugoslavia Area it is felt that it would be unwise for the Yugoslav police to arrive in their new Area until "R" Day itself or on whatever day the Venezia Giulia Police withdraw.

It is therefore suggested that in the Yugoslavia Area the Venezia Giulia Police personnel are concentrated at the larger stations just prior to "R" Day under the command of an Allied Police Officer or a Civil Affairs Officer who will be made responsible for their withdrawal as soon as the Yugoslav police arrive and take over. The exact details of the replacement arrangements have not

not continue to operate in the Free Territory and possibly stay
the exception of the Area becoming the Free Territory and possibly
Pole. It is therefore essential that plans are now drawn up for
the withdrawal of the Venezia Giulia Police Force from those Areas
to be handed over to Italy and Yugoslavia and that the Taking Over
Governments make the necessary plans for the policing of their
respective Areas on the withdrawal of the Venezia Giulia Police Force.

It is not anticipated that there will be any difficulty in
handing over Public Order duties to the Italians but the handover to
Jugoslavia may produce complications.

It is suggested that a few days prior to "R" Day the
Venezia Giulia Police Force personnel situated in Zone "A" outside
the Free Territory are thinned out as much as possible and only
essential police remain.

In the case of Italy, small Carabinieri advance parties can
be sent to all different police stations prior to "R" Day so that
the Italian police are established when the main part of the Venezia
Giulia Police Force moves out on "R" Day. In the case of the
Jugoslav Area it is felt that it would be unwise for the Jugoslav
police to arrive in their new Area until "R" Day itself or on
whatever day the Venezia Giulia Police withdraw.

It is therefore suggested that in the Jugoslav Area the
Venezia Giulia Police personnel are concentrated at the last few
stations just prior to "R" Day under the command of an Allied Police
Officer or a Civil Affairs Officer who will be made responsible
for their withdrawal as soon as the Jugoslav police arrive and take
over. The exact details of the police handover can be fixed with
the Taking Over representatives when discussing the handing over
matters (see Part I, Planning Notes.)

It is emphasized that there should be no Venezia Giulia
Police in either the Italian or Jugoslav Area after the withdrawal
of the troops.

6. Prisons.

The question of prisoners is still under consideration.
Also see para 8 (Legal) below.

Prison warders are part of the Venezia Giulia Police Force
and presumably should be withdrawn at the same time as the police.
This may not however, be practicable especially in the case of Pole.

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With the exception of Pola there are no prisons being transferred to Yugoslavia. There is one prison situated in Gorizia being transferred to Italy.

It is suggested that the same procedure as for the police can be adopted in the case of Prison Warders in Gorizia but the question of Prison Warders in Pola must be left for further consideration.

There is a Dott. Manegonie living in Venice who is acting as the Italian Government representative for the evacuation of Pola. Several conversations have been held with this official.

The following impressions have been gained from conversations with Dott. Manegonie and other Italian officials:

- (a) The Italian Government has made the necessary plans for the reception of evacuees from Pola.
- (b) It is everybody's hope however, that the evacuation of Pola will be postponed until the Spring no matter what date the Peace Treaty is ratified and that the Allied Troops will remain in Pola after "P" Day and until such time as the evacuation is completed.
- (c) That the Allies will loan or rent a ship or ships of the Landing Craft type for the transport of fittings and furniture.
- (d) That the evacuees of Pola can be divided into two classes:
 - (1) Those who have homes or friends in Italy ready to accommodate them and their furniture.

Your attention is drawn to this Headquarters letter
number V6/AUG/211/1/70 dated 5th December 1946 which it is under-

1.4 and 8: Finance Officer reports as follows:

Nothing can be done regarding these matters until the Policy laid down by the Foreign Minister is disclosed. The present information is that so far they have not decided on a Policy.

It is true some territory now maintained will become Italian and Yugoslavia but the respective Governments should be expected to furnish these supplies of the new Territory retained or ceded to them.

(a) It is felt that C.C.A.C. supplies should not cease before the new Government review the supply programme now in effect and has expressed its desire to modify or abandon this present programme. It is essential that the civilian population be fed and that the essential supplies necessary to continue the most important services and industry continue.

(b) Supplies arriving after Trieste Day should become the property of the Government of the Free Territory and be handled by agencies of the New Government. For a short period certain items now being imported may be in excess of the needs of the Territory but such supplies can be deducted from future demands and deliveries. It is true some territory now maintained will become Italian and Yugoslavia but the respective Governments should be expected to furnish these supplies of the new territory retained or ceded to them.

(c) Unless otherwise governed by items of the Peace Treaty it is suggested that financial responsibilities for supplies arriving in the Free Territory after the Lay become the responsibility of the New Government through previous arrangements with C.C.A.C. or C.C.S. There should be no interruption of shipments of supplies at any time. Interruption would most certainly produce unrest and disease. It would also produce a complete break down in transportation, communications, Commerce, Industry and Food.

(d) At present, Trieste is dependent on Italy for a large part of its indigenous supplies. Recent actions by Italian provinces indicate that most of these indigenous supplies may be completely cut off. Some agreement should be concluded if possible from both Italy and Yugoslavia guaranteeing the continued flow of these goods.

Legal:

(a) Court records of Allied Military Government cases will go into Military Archives with such certified copies of pertinent papers as are necessary to enable prison officials to continue with the detention of the accused where such is practicable.

(b) The above would also apply in cases of sentences by the Territorial Courts, the Italian Government to retain the records and make a copy of records in cases of continued detention in Poles and Trieste prisons.

(c) A very complete review of all cases, Allied Military Courts should be undertaken prior to "P" Day to eliminate a large number of prisoners to be detained. Such review and sentence in excess of two years to be the responsibility of Allied Commission. It is suggested that Allied Commission submit an opinion as to whether any Allied Military Government sentences would have effect after termination of Allied Military Government. It is a hasty opinion that the sentence is advisory to the Government concerned.

(d) Territorial Court prisoners being sentenced by the then Sovereign Italy should be transferred to Gorizia or elsewhere, Italian prison. However, Legal Division wishes to reserve its opinion on this to consider a transfer to the Free State or permit prisoners to elect transfer to Gorizia, Fola or Trieste.

outstanding prison sentences. Their suggested duties to be as follows:

- (1) To review all sentences on the assumption that the detenent part must be eliminated.
 - (2) To review cases on a peace time basis making allowances for first offenders.
 - (3) To give adequate and generous reductions for good conduct.
- (iv) To grant conditional liberty.
- (v) Put into effect a form of amnesty without treating it as such.
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- (r) So far as this headquarters is concerned we are only concerned with cases up to two years. Those above two years are in the hands of Allied Commission. A rough guide of the sentences imposed is as follows:

The Problem:

PART I

(i) The Territory to be ceded to Jugoslavia lying partly in Gorizia Province and partly in Trieste Province does not include either of the capitals of the Provinces (seats of Local Government). Other considerations in connection with the handing over of the Areas:

(a) The carving up of zone ~~RA~~ has been a bone of contention between the countries concerned for some considerable time and the fact that some of the Territory is to become a separate Free State has not helped to diminish the discontent felt not only by the Government taking over but also by many of the people living in the Areas to be transferred.

2. It is my view that after "R" day I have no responsibility for feeding or otherwise maintaining any civil territory. It is my opinion however that the territory now being maintained by CCS will suffer want unless a substantial supply of essentials remains in the various areas at the time sovereignty passes. This is particularly applicable to TFT. The free state has practically no indigenous supplies, and unless provisioning is arranged for, and actually on hand, at turnover, it will get off to a very bad start. Allied Troops will be stationed in Udine Province for a considerable period after "R" day. While I have every confidence that Italy and Unrra will do their best to fill the gap it would be a bad publicity for us to leave bare larder. AMG territory has lived a hand to mouth existence from the begining. There is now no reserve stock of food. Coal is practically exhausted and industries are closing down for lack thereof.
3. I have already called forward the Jan-March requirements by FX 73824 of 18 December. I recommend that the April-June requirements be forwarded without delay, so that the 6 months supply shall arrive by 15 March 47. This will permit distribution prior to 1 April 47 which for the purpose at hand I estimate as "R" day.
4. In view of the interest I have in Trieste while UK/US Troops are stationed there and particularly during AMG period prior to assumption of office by Governor I would like assurances that food and other essential supplies including coal to prevent disease and unrest are being provided from some source.

1. Reference is made to your G-5:910.13-3P of 5 Dec 46.

2. The problems to be solved before this Agency may be finally deactivated were dealt with at length in our letter of the 21 Sept 46, same reference, subject "Run Down of CMP of A.F.A. Closing" to which was attached the "1st Key Plan for the Closing of A.F.A."

3. The main functions mentioned in the plan may be broadly divided into three Groups viz.,

- (1) Those which should terminate on "R" day;
(2) Those which should fade out during the 90 day period;
(3) Those remaining after 90 day period:-

Group 1

- (a) Provision of funds to Allied Armed Forces and duties attendant thereto,
(b) Preparation of statistical returns of reported disbursements by Allied Armed Forces and of AM Lire in circulation,
(c) Custodian of :
 (i) POW/SEP funds & valuables,
 (ii) Loot and Booty,
 (iii) Gold bullion,
 (iv) Confiscated Monies & Valuables.
(d) "Blocked" accounts, assegni, etc.

Group 2

- (a) Provision of funds to AC/AMG Accounting Officers
(b) Payment of "house-keeping" expenses of AC/AMG

- (a) Payment of "outstanding" bills incurred by AC/AMG

- (d) Preparation and submission of final accounts of A.F.A.

4. Our comments on these Groups are:-

Group 1

- (a)&(b) The cessation of these functions is dependent upon the Pay Services returning to normal banking procedure which, it is believed is already under consideration by D.P.I.C. and Fiscal Director.
- (c) Disposal instructions given by C.C.S will be implemented as soon as the American & British POW Accounts Office submit their respective claims.
- (d)&(e) Will pass to Italian Government.

Group 2

- (a)&(b) During the 90 day period of "clearing up", AC/AMG remains essentially an Allied responsibility. It is not yet known how funds are to be provided for necessary operations but, from whatever source these funds may come, it is considered that A.F.A. should administer the same.

Group 3

- (a) Our experience is that, notwithstanding the instructions that all accounts must be cleared prior to the closing of any Section of AC/AMG, bills for goods and/or services are invariably received at a later date.
- (b) It is assumed that the "unissued" new AM Lire will be handed to the Banca d'Italia. Tentative enquires to the Bank in regard to this hand-over elicited the response that it would require the notes be counted in the presence of 30-52 Allied officials. There are 6639 boxes in safe custody.

To open and check one box takes at least 30 minutes. So, if the Bank insists on this, the handing-over process will take several weeks.

(c)(d)&(e) TAM 69 states, inter alia, "Upon the termination of AMG in a given area, APA will wind up the affairs of the Sub-Agency of APA located therein and transfer the record thereof to APA HQ, in due course"

"Inter on when the Control Commission ends, all assets and liabilities of APA will be transferred to the Italian Govt. under terms and arrangements to be agreed upon between the Allied and Italian Government. There should be no transfer of the said assets and liabilities in advance of the above-mentioned arrangements"

5. In giving effect to this it should be stated that the processing of accounts takes some time after receipt of the same by this Agency. APA's "Statement of Receipts and Disbursements" is about two month's behind and the similar statement for AMG Venezia Giulia is about three month's behind. This cannot be avoided.

6. It is clear, therefore, that certain functions will remain after the 90 day period. These, it has been suggested should pass to the Embassies. It is very doubtful if the Embassies would be willing to assume this responsibility and, on careful consideration of all the implications written above, it is recommended that:-

(i) A.P.A. goes "In Liquidation" on "R" Day thus ceasing all activities in Group 1, and liquidating as soon as possible all those items mentioned in Group 3. The residual matters of ASAA could be absorbed, if necessary;

(ii) That A.P.A. be furnished with funds and maintain separate accounts covering items in Group 2 for Allied Account, during the 90 day period;

(iii) That an extension be requested of (say) one month after the 90 day period to wind up "APA In Liquidation" and the Allied Accounts.

7. The present military strength of the Agency is 3 Officers 3 EMs (A) and 3 Officers 5 ORs (B). We plan for a gradual reduction in numbers up to close of the Agency and our recommendations are made subject to no releases of military personnel without our approval.

8. Chief Commissioner A.C. (C.C.A.O.-A.M.G.) concurs in the foregoing.

In accordance with the directive contained in your letter of 5 Dec, 1946, 910, 13 - 3 P, we submitted a list of commitments of this Agency to the British and American Embassies and we enclose a copy of the Chief Accountant's draft letter of commitments and recommendations.

The Economic Adviser at the American Embassy was interviewed by Major Jobe, Deputy Chief Accountant and the Economic Adviser at the British Embassy was interviewed by the Chief Accountant. The result of the interview was as follows:-

Americans.

The American Embassy state that they have no trained personnel to carry out an accounting mission of the nature involved.

They state that the function would appear to be one of War Department and no funds exist to pay civilian employees, office rental etc. They also state that arrangements should be made to retain in Rome a sufficient number of military personnel to complete the mission of the unit.

British.

The Economic Adviser stated that as it was quite impossible for military personnel to be attached to the Embassy the only solution to the problem would be to seek the good will of the Italian Government in obtaining permission to retain in Rome a small number of military personnel to complete the functions of APA and ASA.

It would appear that the Embassies are not willing to have the unit attached to them and it is obvious that some other solution must be found. The Chief Accountant based his recommendations on the belief that all personnel in uniform would be out of the theatre by

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It would appear that the Embassies are not willing to have a unit attached to them and it is obvious that some other solution must be found. The Chief Accountant based his recommendations on the belief that all personnel in uniform would be out of the theatre by 8 plus 90 days and did not take into account the possibilities mentioned by both Embassies - that the unit should remain to carry out its functions. At this stage and in view of the difficulties arising from the military angle it would be as well to remember that on the British Establishment all posts may be held by civilians.
