TO : The Provincial Commissioner,  
A.M.G., Udine.

Reference is made to your letter No. NU/131 dated 26th December, 1946.

1. The delay in forwarding a reply is regretted but was necessitated by the question being referred to AFHQ who in turn have referred it to GHQ and no decision has yet been received by this H.Q.

2. However, it is possible to state, for your guidance, that AMG ceases to exist upon the date of ratification and no form of "control" will be exercisable over the Italian administration after that date, nor will the payment of civilian employees from AMG funds be possible. If a liaison staff with the local Italian administration is required by GHQ, CMF, there appears to be no alternative but for its personnel to be on the War Establishment/PO of that HQ.

1. Enclosed is a copy of Allied Commission's letter  
2629/5/EC of 13 January 1947 and its enclosure and this  
Headquarters' reply.

2. AMG ceases to exist upon the date of ratification  
and no form of "control" will be exercisable over the Italian  
administration after that date, nor will the payment of  
civilian employees from AMG funds be possible. If a liaison  
staff with the local Italian administration is required, there  
appears to be no alternative but for its personnel to be on  
the War Establishment/TO of GHQ CMP.

3. Your views on this subject are requested and in  
particular the names of any personnel of AMG Udine whom it  
is desired to retain after 'R' Day as part of the above  
liaison staff.

4. This Headquarters will, of course, be glad to  
give any advice and assistance which may be required in  
connection with the setting up of the liaison staff.

SUBJECT: Abolition of Allied Commission.

TO : Provincial Commissioner,  
A.M.G. Udine.

1. In accordance with the instructions contained in the Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal PAN 711, the Allied Commission will be abolished w.e.f. 2359 hrs. 31st January, 1947.
2. In view of the fact that the CCS Signal is classified SECRET, the instructions contained therein have not yet been made known to the Italian Government and the information contained in this letter must not be disclosed to any Government Agencies pending further instructions. Permission to downgrade the Security Classification has been sought.
3. To facilitate the performance of the functions set forth in the Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal, it is tentatively proposed that AGOS, G-5, AFHQ, will be appointed Chief Civil Affairs Officer. A copy of the proposed directive, which it is expected will be issued shortly as an AFHQ Staff Memorandum, is attached.
4. Subject to final decision through service channels, Brigadier M. Carr and Colonel Walbach have been appointed respectively Chief and Deputy Chief of the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch (LAGAB) of G-5, AFHQ, to be located in Rome.
5. It is the intention that, notwithstanding its location, LAGAB will be an integral part of the G-5 Section and will be in no sense a lower headquarters, and that the present system, whereby civilian employees and certain essential facilities and equipment for Civil Affairs Agencies are provided by the Italian Government, will continue.
6. Instructions regarding the exercise of control, functions of supervision and direction of the Italian Armed Forces hitherto exercised by the Land, Navy and Air Forces Sub Commission, are omitted.

SUBJECT: Organization and Functioning Civil Affairs/  
Military Government.

G-5 AFHQ Organization of Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch.

1. In conformity with instructions contained in Combined Chiefs of Staff Signal FAN 711, dated 11 January 1947, the Allied Commission is abolished with effect from 2359 hours, 31 January 1947.
2. In addition to the functions set forth in Staff Memorandum 48, AFHQ, 14 May 1944, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, is hereby designated as Chief Civil Affairs Officer. He is charged with responsibility for:
  - (a) Technical control of and advice to all Allied Military Government Agencies, but not (insert designation of agency dealing with matters in paragraph 4 below). He will exercise operational command over such agencies outside of Zone A, Venezia Giulia. Operational command over AMG agencies in Venezia Giulia is vested in COC-in-C CMF.
  - (b) The final review over all Military Government Court cases which in conformity with existing instructions are referred to the Chief Civil Affairs Officer.
  - (c) The administration of Allied Civil Affairs agencies and camps for displaced persons, and for the repatriation of the inmates thereof.
  - (d) The programming of all AMG imports.
  - (e) The maintenance and disposition of files and records of the Allied Commission except those pertaining directly to the Armed Forces Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission. These latter records will be maintained and disposed of in accordance with instructions to be issued in due course.
  - (f) Liaison with the Italian Government in connection with the functions herein set forth or as directed by the Supreme Allied Commander.
  - (g) Such other matters pertaining to Civil Affairs and Military Government as may be directed by the Supreme Allied Commander from time to time.

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3. For the purposes set forth above, and for such others as may be authorised, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, will set up and operate a Branch in Rome to be known as the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch, G-5, AFHQ (short title LACAB, Rome), and will so adjust the duties and personnel of his Section as a whole, as to effect the maximum efficiency and saving of manpower.

4. As Chief Civil Affairs Officer, Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, is vested with the authority now pertaining to that office. He shall not be responsible for:

- (a) Supervision and direction of the Italian Armed Forces.
- (b) Control of the size and character of the Italian Armed Forces.
- (c) Control of the production of armaments by the Italians.

Reur cal 1580 not to all, this is NAF 1264. Subject is future maintenance of present AMG territory.

1. After "R" day no Allied machinery or authority will exist for the allocation of food and other disease and unrest supplies now being furnished by the CCS to Udine Province and zone A, Venezia Giulia it is therefore essential that all shipments designated for AMG territory shall arrive in time so that distribution can be completed by "R" day.
2. It is my view that after "R" day I have no responsibility for feeding or otherwise maintaining any civil territory. It is my opinion however that the territory now being maintained by CCS will suffer want unless a substantial supply of essentials remains in the various areas at the time sovereignty passes. This is particularly applicable to TFT. The free state has practically no indigenous supplies, and unless provisioning is arranged for, and actually on hand, at turnover, it will get off to a very bad start. Allied Troops will be stationed in Udine Province for a considerable period after "R" day. While I have every confidence that Italy and Uarva will do their best to fill the gap it would be a bad publicity for us to leave bare larder. AMG territory has lived a hand to mouth existence from the begining. There is now no reserve stock of food. Coal is practically exhausted and industries are closing down for lack thereof.
3. I have already called forward the Jan-March requirements by FX 73824 of 18 December. I recommend that the April-June requirements be forwarded without delay, so that the 6 months supply shall arrive by 15 March 47. This will permit distribution prior to 1 April 47 which for the purpose at hand I estimate as "R" day.
4. In view of the interest I have in Trieste while UK/US Troops are stationed there and particularly during AMG period prior to assumption of office by Governor I would like assurances that food and other essential supplies including coal to prevent disease and unrest are being provided from some source.



The G.O.C-in-C had stated that unless there was an op. commitment, there  
is no need for AMG Udine to retain control after ratification, it  
stipulated that the present facilities must continue and therefore some degree  
of indirect allied control will still be necessary."

If some form of control or liaison is required after ratification, it  
would not be possible without the retention of a suitable staff, including  
interpreters, clerks, telephonists and drivers. Moreover, as no military

SUBJECT: Liquidation of C.I.C. Functions

TO : Provincial Comptroller,  
Allied Military Government,  
UNION PROVINCE.

1. With the ratification of the peace treaty, all rights, duties, privileges and responsibilities of the allied forces in Italy will cease. This means that on the date of the coming into force of the peace treaty the administration of Union provinces will presumably be formally handed over to civilian control.

This Comptroller has been informed that steps are being taken to secure sufficient rights for the allied forces so that evacuation may be completed during the 30 days subsequent to the coming into force of the peace treaty.

2. You are therefore directed to prepare provisional plans for the termination of C.I.C. services and submit on conclusion of these plans to this Comptroller. For the purpose of provisional planning the effective date of the peace treaty will be assumed to be 1st January 1947. Developments during the next few weeks may well cause the forecast of the date to be changed.

It is to be assumed that after the effective date of the peace treaty no C.I.C. funds will be available to cover hire, purchases or payrolls and that only national funds provided by the allies will be available. It is, therefore, essential that prior to the effective date of the peace treaty, all civilian personnel and any constituents covered by C.I.C. funds should be cut down to a minimum compatible with efficiency.

With effect from the date of the coming into force of the peace Treaty, all payment under administrative arrangement No. 2 of January 1944 of men employees for officers' messes will cease and those said officers concerned will be responsible for seeking their own arrangements for payment of mess staffs. The same will apply to sergeants and other ranks messes.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I am writing to you with regard to the maintenance and efficiency during the critical period following the date of the coming into force of the peace treaty with Italy, of the civil administration of the Province of ~~UNRRA~~ which it is presumed will be handed over formally to Italian control on that date.

The rapid and orderly evacuation of the Allied Forces in north East Italy and across Sicily will depend to a great extent on the efficient cooperation of the Civil Authorities in meeting Military requirements, and it is of extreme importance that there should be no period of temporary disorganisation resulting from the discontinuance of Allied Military Government.

I should therefore be glad to have your assurance, my dear Prime Minister, that the Italian administration of the Province of ~~UNRRA~~ is fully organised in advance of the formal handing over of control, and that it is capable of functioning efficiently immediately Allied Military Government is withdrawn.
