Dear Admiral Stone,

In answer to your letter of July 2<sup>nd</sup> last, I inform you that the group of functionaries at the disposal of the Allied Control Commission for the reorganization of recently liberated territories has been chosen.

I enclose the list of the functionaries which constitute this body, grouped according to the administrations to which they belong.

In this list, the employees belonging to the administration of the interior (groups of prefects, vice-prefects, counsellors of prefecture; functionaries of the public safety, provincial doctors) are missing, because the functionaries belonging to this administration have already been given to the control sub-commissions for the affairs of the interior, for the public safety, and for public health and beneficence.

As for the personnel to be used for local administration, we enclose a list of the employees of the municipality and provincial administration of Rome, indicated by the ministry of the interior, which can give full particulars about the moral and political precedents of every individual.

Finally, I enclose a list of the military personnel belonging to the R. Aeronautica, the greater number being permanently in active service; this list has been proposed by the Air minister, who thought these people might be useful for the re-organization of recently liberated territories.

TO : The Secretary of the Under Secretary of State,  
Presidency of the Council of Ministers.

1. Replying to your memorandum dated 17 Aug 44 which referred to this HQ Letter A/CC 091.1 July 44, the conversation that subsequently took place on 21 Aug 44 in this office between Dr. Alessandro VARINO and Col. R.R. GRIPPS is confirmed except in respect to the answer given to your first question which in view of subsequent orders of military authorities has to be materially changed.

2. It was pointed out by Col. R.R. GRIPPS that the officials concerned would be taking up posts in Italian Civil Administration and would therefore from the time of arrival in those posts be housed and rationed as any other civilians in Allied Military Government Territory.

3. In answer to the two specific questions asked, the following answers can be given.

1sp.(a) The Allied Control Commission will be prepared to provide rations on payment for the period of the journey from Rome to destination to those Italian Government officials who are specifically called to go forward by the Commission

(b) Rations will be available if required for a period of 5 days after arrival at destination. They will be available at this HQ (Despatch Office) and will be issued only on prepayment prior to departure.

(c) Cost will not exceed 40 lire per diem.

(d) Ration will consist of:

Biscuit	4 oz per meal	(two per diem)
Meat	6 oz per meal	(two per diem)
OR		
Soup	6 oz per meal	(two per diem)

OR  
Meat and Vegetable 7oz per meal (two per diem)  
Other supplemental items of fresh food will have to be provided by travellers themselves.

2nd. Allied Control Commission cannot guarantee to provide billets either on journey or destination, but will advise Regional and Provincial Commissioners of the anticipated times of arrival and requirements, so that arrangements can be made in advance for your officials in transit. Regional and Provincial Commissioners will be requested to give every assistance in these matters both at final destination and at stopping places on the route, where these are necessary.

2nd. Allied Control Commission cannot guarantee to provide billets either on journey or destination, but will advise Regional and Provincial Commissioners of the anticipated times of arrival and requirements, so that arrangements can be made in advance for your officials in transit. Regional and Provincial Commissioners will be requested to give every assistance in these matters both at final destination and at stopping places on the route, where these are necessary.

With letter AGO 091.1 dated 25 July, Adm. Stone suggests to the President the formation of a Corps of Officials of the Italian Administration (Doctors, Engineers, P.S. Officers, agricultural Surveyors, "intendenti di finanza", Officials of the local administration), volunteering to go recently occupied territories to immediately start their reorganization.

This Presidency, having requested to the various Ministries list of names of such officials, would like to have the following points made clear:

- 1st) - Whether the Allies will supply such officials with rations, beginning from the time of their departure from Rome on to the whole period they will stay out of the Capital.
- 2nd) - Whether the Allies will furnish them billets during same period.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

As you may know, we have been trying to form a pool of Italian officials, doctors, engineers, police, Inspectors of Agriculture, Intendenti di Finanza as well as Local Government Officers to go forward to re-organize recently liberated areas.

These officers are often wanted extremely urgently. If we are to allow these waiting to go up to live meanwhile in some degree of comfort in Rome, they must be ready to move without delay when called upon. Otherwise, as it takes some time for a message to come back and more for us to send them forward, we may have to consider forming the pool further forward which would be less comfortable.

Will you please impress on the Ministries concerned the importance of their assistance in supplying the names of officials willing to go and ensuring that they will keep themselves able to move on at least 24 or better, 12 hours notice.

1 Following the meeting at AAI Adv HQ 19 Jul when Admin Section was charged with organising pools of Italian officials to go forward into liberated territory to fill vacancies in the administrative organisation of I have held a meeting to discuss the matter, a copy of the minutes of which is attached.

2 One difficulty by all with experience of the organisation of such pools, is that the Italian officials when alerted are slow to move or find excuses at the last minute for not moving.

3 I therefore submit for your approval and despatch a draft letter addressed to the P.M. asking his assistance in the matter.

MINUTES OF MEETING

1. Col. Upjohn explained that at the meeting held on 19 July at Adv.HQ....1. with representatives of 5th & 8th Armies AMG and Regions IV(Z) V, VIII, IX, that a request was made for the organisation of pool of replacements for essential civilian administrative officials to take over vacancies in town in the North.

2. Col. Spicer who had had considerable experience of supplying Prefects pointed out some of the practical difficulties to be met with in persuading officials to leave their comforts in Rome and move North. He had found it utterly impossible to get officials to move with less than 48 hrs notice.

3. Brig. Parkinson instanced one or two cases where he had sent up Italian Medical Officers in response to requests but in the meantime the original official sent up had reappeared and the official sent up had returned home. This made it very difficult to persuade other officials to go up as they thought they would only have 3 weeks of discomfort and be returned home.

Col. Upjohn said he would ask SCACs, AMG, and Regional Commissioners to appoint officials sent up in response to requests even if the original Holder of an office reappeared in the meantime.

4. It was finally agreed:

(1) Col Upjohn would ask the A/CC to write a letter to Bonomi stressing the importance of having officials ready to start at the earliest possible moment and the Prime Minister's cooperation in the scheme.

(2) Sub-Commissions as under would forthwith see their respective Minister with a view to arranging lists of at least 6 and if possible more officials as set out below in Rome who would be ready to move on 48 hours notice to the North. Sub-Commissions would be responsible for screening the officials and for seeing that they did not leave Rome and would be available on 48 hrs notice. As personnel in the list are used up Sub-Commissions must ask for more from us.

(3) Admin Section would be responsible for arranging transport for any officials going North and for communicating the needs of SCACs, AMG to Sub-Commissions.
