Travel from Switzerland to Italy

Reference is made to the following letters
 relating to travel between Switzerland and Italy copies
 to you -

(a) 10/14030/21/28. Travel from Switzerland to
 Italy, dated 7 August 1945, which states that
 civilian entering Italy from Switzerland must
 be in possession of Allied force permits.

(b) 10/14030/21/28. Travel of civilians from and to
 Italy, dated 7 August 1945, which states that
 Allied systems of control are still in operation
 for the control of travel into Italy.

It is noted to travel from Italy to Switzerland
 and return. It is noted that the Swiss authorities have
 the following system has been instituted:

(a) Swiss and Italian nationals domiciled in Italy
 who possess the travel permit issued by the Swiss
 authorities or the Swiss authorities will not be subject
 to any special control when entering or leaving
 Italy for entry into Switzerland will be subject
 to leave Italy, and return to this subject
 without Allied force permits provided the
 entry into Italy is made within the time limit
 imposed by the Italian authorities and endorsed upon
 the passport.

(b) The time limit imposed by the Italian authorities
 during which entry may be made into Italy from
 Switzerland without Allied force permits will

- (a) AC/14000/11/15, dated 15/11/1945, forwarded to
Italy, dated 11/11/1945, which states that
civilian entering Italy from Switzerland must
be in possession of valid travel permits.
(b) AC/14000/11/15, dated 15/11/1945, which states that
Allied systems of control are still in operation
for the control of travel into Italy.

2. With regard to travel from Italy to Switzer-
land and return, the Swiss authorities have stated that
the following system has been instituted:

- (a) Swiss and Italian nationalities residing in Italy
who produce to the Travel Control Agents at
Chippa or Remondement valid passports or valid
visas for entry into Switzerland will be permit-
ted to leave Italy, and return to this country
without Allied force permits provided the re-
entry into Italy is made within the time limits
imposed by the Control Agents and endorsed upon
the passports.

- (b) The time limits imposed by the Control Agents
during which re-entry may be made into Italy from
Switzerland without Allied force permits will be

- (i) Holders of Swiss Passports
Periods not exceeding three months.

- (ii) Holders of Italian Passports
Periods not exceeding three months or the
periods of validity of the Swiss visas (whichever
ever are the shorter).

- (c) Passports will also be endorsed to show the cross-
ing points at which re-entry into Italy must be
made.

3. All concerned are reminded that persons travelling
to places outside Italy do not require travel orders unless

1. Military Travel Authorizations are no longer required for travel from Italy, and their issue has ceased. No further action will be taken at this Headquarters with regard to outstanding applications. *579/00*

2. Allied Force Permits are still required for travel from Italy to Austria. Letter AC/14425/ES, dated 30 June, 1945, as amended by letter dated 14 July, 1945, refers, copies to you.

3. Allied Expeditionary Force Permits are required for travel from Italy to U.S., British or French zones of occupation in Germany.

4. Travel to Austria and Germany will only be permitted if the journeys are in the direct interests of the Allied Administration. *75 V.I.I.*

5. Applicants for Allied Force Permits and Allied Expeditionary Forces Permits will complete MTA applications forms. The forms will be dealt with and submitted to this Headquarters in accordance with the provisions of Executive Memorandum 61/45, dated 6 June, 1945, copy to you.

6. Intending travellers from Italy to places abroad, should be advised that they will not be permitted to leave Italy without proper documentation for entry into countries of destination and transit. *77 V.I.I.*

7. They should also be advised that Allied systems of control are still in operation for the control of travel of persons leaving Italy. Letter AC/14425/ES, travel from Switzerland to

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My dear Mr. Ambassador,

I refer to your letter No. 721 of 21 July 45.

The present arrangements for French civilians, other than diplomats, who may wish to enter Italy are the same as for all Allied nationals.

Each visitor must be in possession of an Allied Force permit. Application for this permit is made in France through the Travel Permit Office. I have not yet been advised of the exact location of this office since the dissolution of SHAF, but I am taking steps to get this information although, no doubt, it can easily be obtained by any applicant in France.

The application is then sent to AFHQ which is the sole authority with the power to grant permission to enter Italy. Applications are usually referred to this Commission and, if necessary, the views of the Italian Government are sought.

At the moment applications for purely personal reasons are not encouraged unless there are strong compassionate grounds, neither are private commercial requests given special consideration.

In the case mentioned by you in your letter it would seem that five of the applications would be granted unless the business is of a purely private nature. The application from the person wishing to take up residence in Italy would probably be refused at this stage.

Diplomats may enter Italy on their diplomatic passport and no Allied Force permit is necessary.

I must add that fundamental changes in regard to travel restriction are expected very shortly, and that travel to and from Italy will be made easier. You will be advised of these changes directly they are announced.
