1. With reference to your letter 6/1846/844 of 23 June 1945 it is pointed out that the conditions in the Valtellina area are not such as will facilitate the movement of agricultural workers across the border at the present time.

2. Apart from the fact that a strict control is still in force there is, as you know, a somewhat difficult situation in Aosta and in view of this it is proposed to defer consideration of your suggestion for the time being.

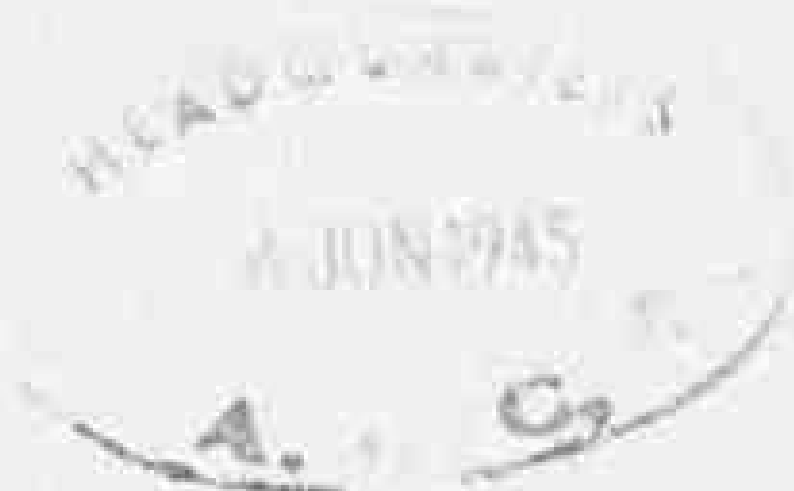

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I am glad to be able to say that the restrictions on civilian movement will be eased considerably as from 28 May 1945.

On that date the Economic Line will be lifted and, at the same time, movement throughout Italy will be free with the following exceptions:

- a) A pass, signed by an AMB officer, will be necessary to cross the Security Control Line. This line now runs from the mouth of the PIAVE up the river to the point where it is crossed by Route 13 - to CONSELLIANO - along Route 51 to PIVRE DI CAIONE - to SAN STEFANO DI CAIONE - and then due North to the AUSTRIAN FRONTIER.
- b) A pass, signed by an AMB officer, will be necessary to cross a line running parallel to the Northern and North-Western Italian Frontier at a distance of 25 kilometres from it.

I have given orders for a copy of the full instructions to be sent to you and for the information to be released to the Press at once.

It gives me great pleasure, my dear Mr. Prime Minister, to be able to do this as I believe that the fullest possible freedom of movement is essential to the rehabilitation of Italy.

I anticipate that the restrictions on civilian movement will be considerably eased in the very near future. I have given orders that you are to be advised of the decisions on this matter directly they are made.

In the meantime I am glad to be able to tell you that the necessary permission will be granted by this Commission to officials of your Government as your recommendation should you consider it desirable for them to go North on official business.

Such permission will not enable any person to cross the Security Control Line which runs from the mouth of the Stieve to Route 13, thence by Routes 17, 24, 31 bis and 32 to the frontier. Similarly, unless specifically requested, the permission will not enable travel to a point within 25 kilometers of the frontier.

1. A letter has been received from GHQ, MSF protesting at the arrival without their knowledge of one officer and 10 NCOs of an Italian salvage unit sent by order of the Air Force Sub-Commission to salvage aircraft engines etc. at CAMER BENTON. They state that these personnel caused confusion and difficulty as they claimed a status and privileges as "co-belligerents" distinctive from those accorded to "co-operators" alongside whom they were working. MSF point out that, under a War Office ruling, the term "co-belligerent" is applicable to free Italian troops under Italian jurisdiction who are outside British Territory and jurisdiction and does not therefore apply to Italian troops in Middle East. They ask that in future Italian service personnel (other than POW) should not be sent to Middle East.

2. The War Office has ruled that all Italian troops within British territory or jurisdiction must be classified either as co-operators or non co-operators, (the latter being treated in all respects as POWs).

3. In future therefore co-belligerents should not be sent to British territory or jurisdiction. If, however, it is essential for the war effort to do so, the consent of the receiving Command should be obtained and the Italian servicemen informed that they will be treated as co-operators while in British territory and jurisdiction. Movement of any personnel to an area controlled by another Command should, of course, be cleared with that Command through appropriate channels.

1. I refer to Part II para (g) of Monthly Report for October of AG Fifth Army.

2. In this reference is made to the control of civilian movement and it is obviously causing some anxiety to the GAC. The trouble appears to come under two headings:

(a) Laziness in the enforcement of the Rear Army Check Line by Army Police.

(b) Transportation of civilians by Allied officers.

3. I shall be glad if you will discuss this matter with G. AAI with a view to tightening up the control on the movement of civilians in the general interest.

4. In so far as reference is made to Allied Commission officers coming from COMZ and backward regions I am not sure that the blame can be laid in this direction entirely as I believe that such travel takes place between the forward regions and COMZ. It would be well, therefore, if you will bring this question generally to the notice of the forward regions, at the same time emphasizing that transportation to COMZ should be reduced to a minimum in the interests of economy. Regional Commissioners should also impress on their couriers, especially those having Italian drivers, that civilians will not be picked up.

1. Full consideration has been given to the question raised at the AMI Conference at SIENA on 17 Nov 44 concerning the security control of civilian movement.
2. It is proposed to move forward the Eastern sector of the Rear Army Control Line so as to follow the lateral road FANO-AREZZO-SIENA, thence as at present to CORTONA.
3. It is regretted that we are unable to agree at the present time to the control line being moved NORTH of FLORENCE. The latter city is a centre of such importance as regards road communications and operational troop movements, that we do not feel justified in making it readily accessible to the inhabitants of the South.
4. If there is no appreciable change in the position of the front "line" in the course of the next month, the question will be reconsidered at the end of that period.
5. In the meantime, in order to ease the food problem in FLORENCE and to reduce the large number of passes issued there, it is agreed that with effect from 25 Nov the 10 Km restriction should be lifted within that part of FLORENCE province which lies South of the river ARNO. This means that there will be free movement within this half of FLORENCE Province, thus allowing the citizens of FLORENCE city a greater degree of freedom to visit farms etc to the Southward.
6. As regards the transfer of VITERBO Province from the Restricted Zone to the Free Zone, we are referring this question to AFHQ, since the decision rests with that Hq.

1. A complete set of instructions (Executive Memorandum No. 77) dealing with restrictions on civilian movement is forwarded for the guidance of all concerned.

2. As the instructions are lengthy and involved, the following brief sketch may be of assistance in determining the broad outlines of the control, but officers incurring passage must refer to the detailed instructions which alone are authoritative.

3. Zones and Subdivisions.

Three zones and two boundary lines affect civilian travel in Italy:

- (i) The Army Zone (north of the Rear Army Control Line)
- (ii) Rear Army Control Line.
- (iii) The Restricted Zone (between Rear Army Control Line and Restricted Line).
- (iv) The Restricted Line.
- (v) The Free Zone (South of the Restricted Line)

(see diagram Appendix "A")

The boundary lines are liable to change.

4. A civilian cannot cross either of the boundary lines without a pass. As to movement within the zones, see para 5.

5. Restrictions within the Zones.

(a) Army Zone.

1. A complete set of instructions (Executive Memorandum No. 77) dealing with restrictions on civilian movement is forwarded for the guidance of all concerned.

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- (iv) The Restricted Line.
- (v) The Free Zone (South of the Restricted Line)

(see diagram Appendix "A")

The boundary lines are liable to change.

4. A civilian cannot cross either of the boundary lines without a pass. As to movement within the zones, see para 5.

5. Restrictions within the zones.

(a) Army Zone.

No civilian may travel more than 10 km. or enter or leave the zone without a pass approved by A.M.G. Fifth or Sixth Army. When, however, a province within the Army Zone has been handed over to Regional Control, the competent authority to issue a pass is the Provincial Commissioner of the Province concerned, and not S.M. with or 6th Army.

Requests for passes to enter the Army Zone will not be considered unless the journey is in the direct interest of the war effort.

(b) Restricted Zone.

No civilian may travel from one province to another without a pass issued at the point of departure.

It will be noted that the Restricted Zone is partly under the control of A.M.G. and partly under the control of the Italian Government. The same restrictions apply in both portions of the zone.

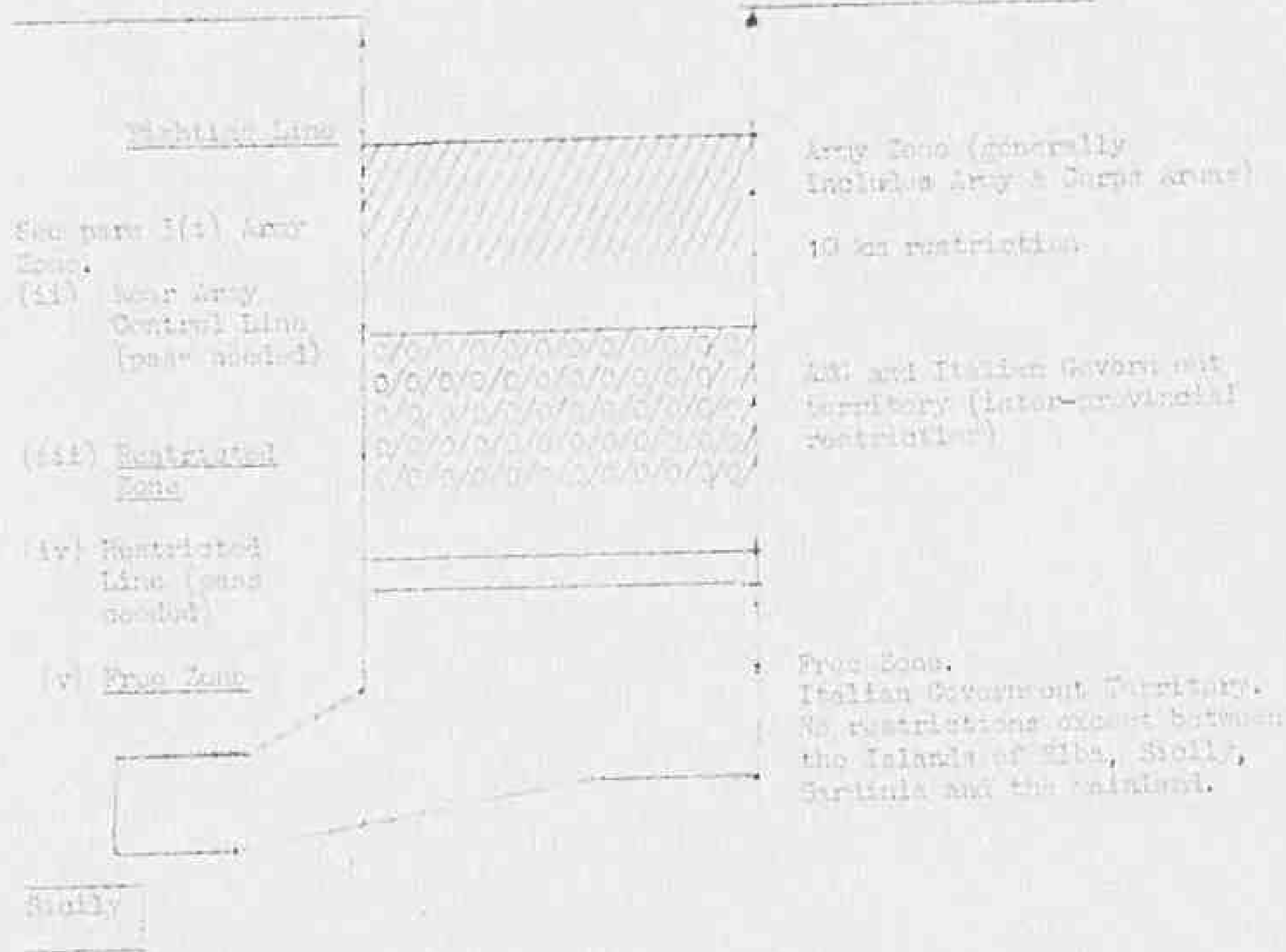
