Dear Admiral,

after the liberation of the regions of North Italy, it has become necessary to ascertain the situation of the 'Italian' Agency in these regions, and take immediate action to save the patrimony (real-estate and movable property) of the said agency. As a matter of fact, the funds, the ledgers, most of the technical material and of the furniture of the central seat in Rome, were transported to Salerno, Milan and Venice. Besides, there are also branches of the Agency in Bologna, Padova, Torino and Trieste.

It would therefore be necessary to take action to save them as far as possible, by blocking the funds deposited in the banks, affixing seals, etc...

I shall therefore be most grateful if you will kindly issue orders to the offices which do and from you, for Mr. Roberto Vignoli, Commissioner extraordinary of the 'Italian' Agency, to be enabled to proceed without delay to the above mentioned localities.

As you certainly know, the Italian Government, to suppress the newspaper organizations created purposely to make propaganda for the fascist regime, must, according to the D.L. of Feb. 1st, 1945, reorganize the patrimony of the 'white stamp' and of the newspaper organizations which belonged to it, as well as to the liquidation of the remaining personnel.

To this end, the appointment of commissioners of the government for the temporary management of the above mentioned organizations has been decided, by a regulation which is being issued.

I shall therefore be most grateful, my dear Admiral, if you will kindly see that the offices which depend from you issue without delay passes for the following officials of this undersecretariat, who will have to proceed to the cities of North Italy that we hereafter mention:

1. The Allied Commission is receiving applications from various diplomatic and semi-diplomatic institutions to visit the North. The delegate of the representative of the USSR for the repatriation of Soviet citizens has applied, General de Gevin is most anxious to go, the Greek representative and the Yugoslav Minister to the Holy See are all candidates.

2. Up to date we have allowed six French officers to go definitely attached to the displaced persons and property control sub-commissions with the full agreement of the sub-commissions. We have also allowed the Commercial Counsellors of the British and American Embassies to accompany Mr. Antolin.

3. I think our answer to the remainder should be in the negative and I think it would be advisable if a letter over your signature could be sent to all embassies and diplomatic posts pointing out that at the present time it is impossible to give permission.

2. This instruction was given at the Executive Commissioner's Meeting of 27 April, and VPs of Civil Affairs and Economic Sections are so informing their Sub-Commissions.

At the request of the Chief Commissioner I talked to Count Sforza concerning the attached letter to the Chief Commissioner.

I explained to him that the Chief Commissioner regretted that it would be impossible, at the present time, to grant permission for Countess Sforza to go to Mass. It was suggested to him that his brother, General Sforza, might be able to make his own arrangements in Switzerland to return to northern Italy; that the Commission was not in a position to help him.

Count Sforza fully understood the situation and did not press the matter.

Dear Admiral Stone,

As it seems still impossible for us to get to the Province of Massa e Carrara where our family properties are (three miles south of Massa) I take the liberty of asking if you would arrange for my brother, General Alessandro Sforza and his 18 years old son, who are now in Lugano (Switzerland) to come back to Italy as soon as possible and go to the said country place of ours. My mother escaped to Switzerland after having been imprisoned by the Germans, everything he and myself possess is at this country place, and although I hear it has been thoroughly looted and destroyed, I believe it is my duty to try to have the place protected and see if something can be saved.

If this solution of my brother's return is equally impossible, could my wife not be allowed to take a trip of a few days to the place, and see the situation by herself? which would enable her to take the indispensable protective measures. I feel I have a responsibility towards my brother on that behalf.

Of course my wife would have to go with an American car as I have no tyres for that trip.

My dear Lush,

I am forwarding herewith copies of two telegrams which have been received from your Headquarters. Would you also good to let one of your staff to look into this matter?

Re: [unclear] I am not at all clear about this case. I am at a loss to understand why the matter should be confidentially communicated to your telegrams. It is to be observed that one wire comes from your Public Health Commission and the other one from the Public Communications Commission. I am not clear why a nun who wishes to get to go from Sicily to Cyprus should proceed from Sicily to Rome. I believe that occasionally planes fly from Sicily to Cyprus. In any case if this nun is to proceed by air or sea I should have thought that it would not be necessary for her to go further than Naples. The attached wires presumably give me authority to dispatch this nun by Allied aircraft. It has been stated that this nun cannot travel alone. This move therefore may entail two air passages and one return passage.

I am waiting until this nun arrives in Palermo and has been interviewed by my Regional Public Health Officer before I take action as to her move. I shall then try and have her sent by the normal Italian courier plane but if this is not possible I may wait until I get clearance from your Headquarters as to the situation regarding this case is not at all clear to me. Could one of your staff please advise me if the way is clear and if Allied air transportation is intended, as this question may arise.
