TO : Ministry of Foreign Affairs

1. Reference is made to your memorandum No 5/2863/3103,
dated 1 December 1945, relative above subject.

It is to be regretted that due to some misunderstanding
the Nicotti family suffered mistreatment while in Tripoli as ex-
plained in your letter and in the letter, dated 10 November 1945,
sent by Mr. Sidney NICOTTI to Rear Admiral STONE.

2. Accordingly, Rear Admiral STONE, has forwarded to d-5,
AFMC, a copy of the letter of Mr. NICOTTI with the recommendation
that a thorough investigation be made of this matter.

3. A letter of regret was also sent to Mr. NICOTTI by Rear
Admiral STONE on 13 December 1945, expressing therein the action he
was taking.

4. Another letter of explanation was previously sent to
Mr. NICOTTI on 5 December 1945 by this Headquarters. In this
letter it was proposed that this office would be glad to process
the authorization to leave Italy. This will be done accordingly
upon the receipt of correspondence from AFMC clarifying this
situation.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

183

Subject: Sidney and Cesare RICOTTI, visit to Tripoli.

1. With note ACR/510.3, of 17 October 1945, the Allied Commission (Economic Section) sent to this Ministry Travel Orders (Authority: cable AFHQ, F 469837 3 October 1945) authorizing Sidney and Cesare RICOTTI PRIMA, to proceed to Tripolitania.
2. The above named landed in Tripoli on October 25th, but though in possession of said Travel Orders, they were immediately sent to a concentration camp. To explain such measures it was alleged that their travel permits had no validity because the Colony's Military Government's approval was missing. After a two days detention the RICOTTIS were compelled to embark for repatriation.
3. In view of the circumstance that the RICOTTIS had been supplied with authorizations which, as far as it is known by this Ministry, are necessary and sufficient to visit Tripolitania, the reasons of the restrictive measures to which they were submitted cannot be understood. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs will be very grateful to the Allied Commission if they will kindly make the reasons for such treatment clear.

4. At the same time the Ministry for Foreign Affairs wish to point out that further reports received by the parties concerned, lay stress on the urgency of their presence in Tripolitania to take all necessary measures in view of the forthcoming season of tuna fishing campaign. Essential decisions of a financial and organizing character which required the owners' presence on the spot, have to be taken in time. On the other hand the Allied Commission is aware of the great interest that tuna fish supplies - and consequently the good functioning of the important tuna fisheries belonging to

Subject: Sidney and Cesare RICOTTI, visit to Tripoli.

1. With note AOR/510.3, of 17 October 1945, the Allied Commission (Economic Section) sent to this Ministry Travel Orders (Authority: cable AFHQ, F 459837 3 October 1945) authorizing Sidney and Cesare RICOTTI PHINA, to proceed to Tripolitania.
2. The above named landed in Tripoli on October 25th, but though in possession of said Travel Orders, they were immediately sent to a concentration camp. To explain such measures it was alleged that their travel permits had no validity because the Colony's Military Government's approval was missing. After a two days detention the RICOTTIS were compelled to embark for repatriation.
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5. In view of the above considerations the Ministry for Foreign Affairs submit that all suitable steps be taken in order that the temporary sojourn in Tripolitania of Sidney and Cesare RICOTTI PHINA - which has already been authorized by the Allied Commission - actually take place.

6. An early reply will be greatly appreciated.

referring to my letter dated 10th inst., I now explain the motives which make it so necessary for the Ricotti brothers to proceed to Tripoli and be allowed to remain there freely.

Though we found it in order from the point of view of accounts and real property, the tunny-fishery, as we thought, lost all its replacement material, i.e. such material as we, owners, were in the habit of replacing yearly. The people who financed the concern - and quite naturally so - had no interest in supplying funds to the concern beyond what was strictly necessary for its exploitation.

Such a situation, which, I repeat, we had foreseen, has been made much worse by a new fact of the greatest importance, for what concerns such supplies as are immediately required and indispensable for the incoming fishing season. The local authorities lately granted to a new commercial Co. in Quara the right to establish a new tunny fishery, which, undoubtedly, will absorb all the material which is available on the market, so that next year, we won't be able to hire what we needed from the other tunnu fisheries.

Thus, one of the 'vascelli' (a large and very special boat for tunny-fishing) was sunk by the soldiers during the occupation; during all these years, we replaced it by the 'vascello' of Pace (Gargaresse) who already informed us (and we couldn't understand why) that we should no longer rely upon his boat for the next fishing season, for he will use her for other purposes, i.e. most probably hand her over to the new Quara Tunny fishery. For many technical reasons, it was never possible to build a 'vascello' in Tripoli, and it is now more impossible than ever; we should therefore get one from Pizzo Calabro, where, foreseeing such an emergency, we have one in readiness, which we took from another of our tunny fisheries. However, such a transport is most difficult in winter and by sea, and requires several months; we therefore need to be free to come and go, to be able to organize everything.

Besides the 'death net' must be completely re-made this year, as well as the moorings that haven't been replaced for three years and also the tunny-fishery net. Such purchases require a great technical ability and imply an expense of several millions; to carry out such delicate work, we must be able to proceed at once to the colony and reside there freely.

This without mentioning that the new tunny fishery organization at Quara, considering the inconsistency of the local market, is likely to make arrangements with all the head fishermen of the place. The labour of ice is well aware of the difficulties of the situation in the colony because of this technical man-power, that the colony must import every year from Italy, with considerable difficulties, because it is completely lacking on the spot. We must right now look for another man (technical head of the crew); and we may say that the results of the whole fishing organization depends on this most difficult and delicate operation. We must therefore be able to study

such problems on the spot, and if necessary take action for this difficult replacement, which would certainly paralyze the tunny fishery if it was attempted at the last moment.

This is why we lately asked for the permission to proceed to Tripoli, and for one of us at least to be allowed to reside there for about ten days; we trust that the Tripoli authorities will not refuse us the permission of staying there, if they want our concern to carry on its activity.

Will you kindly obtain for us the permission to make a new trip there, keeping in mind that our industry is of great interest for the colony, and that this is a matter of a most valuable foodstuff production, especially in consideration of the present difficulties of the world market.

1. This will acknowledge your letter No. 851 of 28 September 1945 concerning the journey to Libya of Sig. Ricotti and other owners of tuna fisheries in Tripolitania.
2. Since writing that letter you probably have received a letter from Admiral Stone dated 25 September 1945 discussing the above subject. A copy of that letter is enclosed for your convenience.
3. Military travel authorizations are no longer required of people desiring to leave Italy unless their destination is Austria or Germany. However, all persons should be in possession of valid military travel orders.
4. A request has been submitted to AFHQ for the authority necessary for the Allied Commission to issue appropriate travel orders to Cesare and Sidney Ricotti-Prins of Rome and Prince Ugo Paterno of Palermo to proceed to Libya.
5. You will be notified when this Commission has been granted authority to issue these orders.

Prince Interno and Mr. D'Amico were notified by our letter of 18 March 1945 that their travel request had been refused and on 12 May the Ministry of Foreign Affairs was notified that the request of Mr. Sydney Nicotti could not be granted.

We have no record of the reported visit to Tripoli by Mr. D'Amico and do not know from whom he may have obtained permission for such a trip.

1. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has again applied to the Allied Commission for permission for the brothers, Cesare and Sidney Ricetti-Prins, of Rome, and Prince Ugo Paterno, of Palermo, to proceed to Libya where they own tuna fishing industries in Tripolitania. As it is understood they will provide their own transportation, clearance only is required for their entry.

2. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs states it is especially anxious that permission be granted because of the fishing industry's importance to the economies of Libya and Italy and because it is a potential source of food production for the metropolitan population.

3. Application for permission for the above-mentioned men to enter Libya was first made in February 1945 but was not approved by AFHQ because of the refusal of British authorities in Libya to permit their entry.

4. With the end of the war it is recommended that further consideration be given to permit these owners of fishing interests to return to Tripolitania as requested by the Italian Government.

Dear Admiral Stone,

On August 14th last the Liaison Office has addressed to the Allied Commission a note, filed 6/2754/1273, asking for Countess Vannutelli Rey, wife of a former Italian Ambassador in Belgium, the authorization to travel by air from Rome to Brussels via Paris, but the General Headquarter has refused the permission esteeming that the case is not within the essential categories.

I beg to point out, on the matter, that Countess Vannutelli Rey (a Belgian citizen before her marriage) is the daughter of Count de Broqueville, who gallantly supported the Allies, as Prime Minister and Minister of War of the King of the Belgians, during the whole World War 1914-1918.

Her father having died during the present war, Countess Vannutelli Rey has extremely pressing reasons for reaching Belgium, owing to her family affairs, inasmuch as her estates, lying in the Belgian country between the Canal Albert and the Dutch frontier, have been severely damaged by the fighting forces and need a prompt and careful restoration.

These peculiar personal circumstances might perhaps induce to take Countess Vannutelli Rey's request in further benevolent consideration, and I should be very grateful to you if you would kindly recommend it to the proper quarter.

The undersigned, appointed Commissioner of the S.A.I.B. by Ministerial Decree n. 305, 12/3/1940, published on the Gazzetta Ufficiale del Regno on 15/3/1940, submits the following facts to your kind attention;

The S.A.I.B. - Cattle Import and Export Co., Ltd, is a Company financed and controlled by the State, (and therefore by the Treasury Department, to which the benefits of the balance must go), its activity was and is still exercised on a national plan.

The imports from abroad which formed its main function have come to a standstill because of the war, the activity of the S.A.I.B. has now concentrated in the sector of oxen and pig slaughtering, for the production of conserved or refrigerated meat for the requirements of the civilian population.

This task has been re-conferred by ordinance n. 5 of the C.L.N.A.I., as soon as Milan was liberated.

The S.A.I.B. has therefore very great interests in the provinces of the North. As an example, we can mention: 1) Peripherical Offices working in Bologna, Reggio Emilia, Cremona, Milan; 2) Slaughter-Houses, in full or joint property in Corridonia, Senigallia, Regio Emilia; 3) Private Slaughter Houses, about 40, the largest in North Italy, which are working for S.A.I.B. are scattered chiefly in the various provinces of Italy, Lombardy and Piemonte.

It is therefore quite necessary for the new Commissioner of S.A.I.B., placed at the head of this important organization by the trust of the Minister, to proceed without delay to the above mentioned provinces, to take the organization well in hand and give at once the necessary orders, better to adapt it to the serious food requirements of the present moment, in conformity with the mandate entrusted to him by the C.L.N.A.I.

To exclude, serious interests, not only of the S.A.I.B., but also of the Ministry entrusted by which it is controlled, are at stake.

The S.A.I.B. - Gattile Import and Export Co., Ltd., is a Company financed and controlled by the State, (and therefore by the Treasury Department), to which the benefits of the balance must go; its activity was and is still exercised on a national plan.

The imports from abroad which formed its main function have, come to a standstill because of the war, the activity of the S.A.I.B. has now concentrated in the sector of oxen and pig slaughtering, for the production of congealed or refrigerated meat for the requirement of the civilian population.

This task has been re-conferred by ordinance n. 2 of the C.L.N.A.I., as soon as Milan was liberated.

The S.A.I.B. has therefore very great interests in the provinces of the North. As an example, we can mention: 1) Peripherical Offices working in Bologna, Reggio Emilia, Genova, Milan; 2) Slaughter-Houses, in full or joint property in Corridonia, Senigallia, Reggio Emilia; 3) Private Slaughter Houses, about 40, the largest in North Italy, which are working for S.A.I.B. are scattered chiefly in the various provinces of Italy, Lombardy and Piemonte.

It is therefore quite necessary for the new Commissioner of S.A.I.B., placed at the head of this important organization by the trust of the Minister, to proceed without delay to the above mentioned provinces, to take the organization well in hand and give at once the necessary orders, better to adapt it to the serious food requirements of the present moment, in conformity with the mandate entrusted to him by the C.L.N.A.I.

To conclude, serious interests, not only of the S.A.I.B., but also of the Treasury Department by which it is controlled, are at stake, and correspond perfectly to the even greater interests of national economy, in the broad sense of the word, for the rapid materialization of an organic plan for supplies, in the alimentary sector, the need for an inspection is getting more and more urgent, for we are getting urgent requests for instructions from the various Offices in the North, which cannot reasonably be given unless the equipment, the remaining organizations, and their immediate possibilities of reconstruction and rehabilitation can be the object of an accurate examination on the spot.

The undersigned trusts in the comprehension of your Excellency to obtain a pass for the North, in consideration of the urgency of the case.

He will forward the names of the functionaries which should accompany him on this journey and the particulars of the car which will be employed.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

I have your letter of 15 May 1945 requesting approval for the Minister of Finance, Professor Antonio Pesenti, to visit Brescia and Verona. On 7 May I replied to a letter of 3 May from Professor Pesenti informing him that his request to visit Verona could not yet be granted due to the orders of the Army Commander. I agreed to advise him as soon as the visit could be authorized.

I regret that for the moment this request cannot be favorably considered, and your Excellency will, I am sure, fully appreciate and make it clear to H. E. Pesenti that it would be most undesirable at this moment if we were to break the agreement which was made with the representatives of the CLM and the CLN at Rome that two leading representatives of each of the six political parties should be given permission to go North. To avoid further complications, this is a rule which must be scrupulously observed for the moment. I have the greatest sympathy with the Minister in his desire to see his family, but I would again ask that he contain himself in patience for yet a few days longer, when I have every hope that travel restrictions will be lifted.

1. During the last few days, I discussed with Brigadier Grafftey-Smith the opportunity of extending to North Italy the issuing of the loan in 'Buoni del Tesoro' 5% with a premium, which is at present taking place in the provinces of the South.

This extension might bring over 20 milliard lire to the State which needs them very much, to face, without resorting to inflation, the urgent requirements of the Treasury for a few months, i.e., till it will be possible to draft a broader financial plan.

Brigadier Grafftey-Smith fully agreed that it would be advisable to extend the loan.

However, no final decision can be made on the subject before hearing the bankers of North Italy.

2. From news which lately came from the North, it seems that the Treasury is faced with a very serious threat, considering that the banks of North Italy have a tendency to ask not the renewal, but the reimbursement of the ordinary 'Buoni del Tesoro', as they fall due, perhaps because they are afraid that the Italian Government might not acknowledge such obligations.

If it cannot be stopped at once, this panic might be very prejudicial to the credit of the State, and have most unfavourable repercussions on the monetary circulation and on the prices.

It is therefore necessary to discuss this subject with the bankers of the North, to persuade them to renew the Buoni instead of asking for their reimbursement.

3. Because of the monetary requirements which can be foreseen, and because of the question of the printing and changing of bank-notes in the North, it would be necessary to ascertain as soon as possible what concrete possibilities there are for printing bank-notes in the North, and supply the printing offices with the models of the new banknotes fixed for the provinces which have gone back to the administration of the Italian Government.

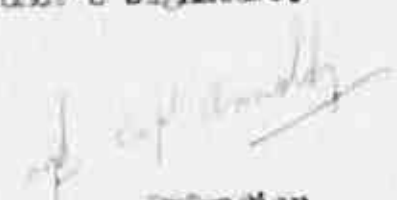
