1. Reference is made to your memorandum No 5/3863/3175,
dated 1 November 1945, relative above subject.

It is to be regretted that due to some misunderstanding
the Ricotti family suffered mistreatment while in Trivoli as ex-
plained in your letter and in the letter, dated 10 November 1945,
sent by Mr. Foley SCOTT to Rear Admiral ZONE.

2. Accordingly, Rear Admiral ZONE has forwarded to O-S,
AFN, a copy of the letter of Mr. RICOTTI with the recommendation
that a thorough investigation be made of this matter.

3. A letter of regret was also sent to Mr. RICOTTI by Rear
Admiral ZONE on 13 December 1945, expressing therein the action he
was taking.

4. Another letter of explanation was previously sent to
Mr. RICOTTI on 5 December 1945 by this Headquarters. In this
letter it was proposed that this office would be glad to process
the authorization to leave Italy. This will be done accordingly
upon the receipt of correspondence from AFN clarifying this
situation.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Sidney and Cesare Ricotti, visit to Tripoli.

1. With note ACB/510.3, of 19 October 1945, the Allied Control Commission (Economic Section) sent to this Ministry Travel Orders Authority: Cable AAFN, # 469897, 3 October 1945, authorizing Sidney and Cesare Ricotti, to proceed to Tripolitania.
2. The above named landed in Tripoli on October 25th, but through lack of possession of valid Travel Orders, they were immediately sent to a concentration camp. To explain such measures it was explained that their travel permit had no validity because the Colony's Military Government's approval was missing. After a two days detention the Ricottis were compelled to embark for repatriation.
3. In view of the circumstance that the Ricottis had been supplied with authorization which, as far as it is known by this Ministry, are necessary and sufficient to visit Tripolitania, the reasons of the restrictive measures to which they were submitted cannot be understood. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs will be very grateful to the Allied Commission if they will kindly make the reasons for such treatment clear.

4. At the same time the Ministry for Foreign Affairs wish to point out that further reports received by the parties concerned may stress on the urgency of their presence in Tripolitania to take all necessary measures in view of the forthcoming season of fishing campaign. Essential documents of a financial and organizing character which require the owners' presence on the spot, have to be taken in time. On the other hand the Allied Commission is aware of the great interest that tuna fish supplies - and consequently the good functioning of the important tuna fisheries belonging to

The ministry for foreign affairs will be very grateful to the Allied Commission if they will kindly make the reasons for such treatment clear.
4. At the same time the ministry for foreign affairs wish to point out that further reports received from the parties concerned lay stress on the urgency of their presence in Tripoli. It is necessary to take all forthcoming actions in view of the forthcoming fishing campaign. Essential associations of a financial and organizing character which require the owners' presence on the spot, have to be taken in time. On the other hand the Allison Commission is aware of the great interest that tuna fish supplies - and consequently the food functioning of the important tuna fisheries belonging to the messers. 5. In view of the above considerations the ministry for foreign affairs submit that all suitable steps be taken in order that the temporary sojourn in Tripoli is authorized of money and goods. Allusion - actually take place.

referring to my letter dated 10th Inst., I now examine the motives which make it so necessary for the Nicati brothers to proceed to Tripoli and be allowed to remain there freely.

Though we found it in order from the point of view of accounts and real property, the tunny-fishery, as we thought, lost all its replacement material, i.e. such machinery as, owing, were in the habit of replacing yearly. The people who financed the concern - and quite naturally so - had no interest in supplying funds to the concern beyond what was strictly necessary for the exploitation.

such a situation which, I repeat, we had foreseen, has been made much worse by a new fact of the greatest importance, for who concerns such supplies are immediately required and indispensable for the incoming fishing season. The local authorities lately granted to a new commercial Co. in Durban the right to establish a new tunny fishery, which, undoubtedly, will absorb all the material which is available on the market, so that next year, we won't be able to hire what we needed from the other tunny fisheries.

Thus, one of the 'vasselli' (a large and very special boat for tunny-fishing) was sunk by the soldiers during the occupation; during all these years, we replaced it by the 'vassello' of Pino (Gargnano) who already informed us (and we couldn't understand why) that we should no longer rely upon his boat for the next fishing season, for he will use her for other purposes, i.e. most probably hand her over to the now lame tunny fishery. For many technical reasons, it was never possible to build a 'vassello' in Tripoli, and it is now more impossible than ever; we should therefore get one from Pizzo Galabro, where, foreseeing such an emergency, we have one in readiness, which we took from another of our tunny fisheries. However, such a transport is most difficult in winter and by sea, and requires several months; we therefore need to be free to come and go, to be able to organize everything.

Besides the 'dolphin net' must be completely renewed this year, as well as the moorings that have not been replaced for three years and also the tunny-fishery net. Such purchases require a great technical ability and imply an expense of several millions; to carry out such delicate work, we must be able to proceed at once to San Colón and reside there firmly.

This without mentioning that the new tunny fishery organization at Zuniga, considering the incommensurability of the local market, is likely to make arrangements with all the head fishermen of the place. The labour of ice is well aware of the difficulties of the situation in the Colony because of this technical manpower, that the Colony must import every year from Italy, with considerable difficulties, because it is completely lacking on the spot. It must right now look for another man (technical head of the crew); and we may say that the results of the whole fishing organization depend on this most difficult and delicate operation. It must therefore be able to study

such problems on the spot, and if necessary take action for this difficult replacement, which would certainly paralyze the tunny fishery if it was attempted at the last moment.

This is why we lately asked for the permission to proceed to Tripoli, and for one of us at least to be allowed to reside there for about ten days; we trust that the Tripoli authorities will not refuse us the permission of staying there, if they want our concern to carry on its activity.

Will you kindly obtain for us the permission to make a new trip there, keeping in mind that our industry is of great interest for the colony, and that this is a matter of a most valuable foodstuff production, especially in consideration of the present difficulties of the world market.

TO : 2-5 AFHQ

1. The Public Relations Branch of the Allied Commission has received a request from an Italian journalist for permission to go to Nuremberg, Germany, to cover the war guilt trials. It is probable that we shall have similar requests from other journalists.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter No. 775 (Segr. Vol.) dated 9 September 1945.

Request has again been submitted to AFHQ to permit entry of the Ricotti brothers and Prince Paterno into Tripolitania, and upon receipt of a reply you will be informed of the action taken.

Application for permission for the above-mentioned men and also Mr. D'Amico to enter Libya was first made in February 1945, but was not approved by AFHQ because of the refusal of authorities in Tybin to permit their entry.

Prince Paterno and Mr. D'Amico were notified by our letter of 18 March 1945 that their travel request had been refused and on 12 May the Ministry of Foreign Affairs was notified that the request of Mr. Sydney Ricotti could not be granted.

We have no record of the reported visit to Tripoli by Mr. D'Amico and do not know from whom he may have obtained permission for such a trip.

SUBJECT: Entry of Tuna Fishing Owners into Tripolitania

TO : AFHQ

1. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has again applied to the allied Commission for permission for the brothers, Cesare and Sidney Ricotti-Princ, of Rome, and Prince Ugo Paterno, of Palermo, to proceed to Lybia where they own tuna fishing industries in Tripolitania. As it is understood they will provide their own transportation, clearance only is required for their entry.

2. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs states it is especially anxious that permission be granted because of the fishing industry's importance to the economies of Lybia and Italy and because it is a potential source of food production for the metropolitan population.

3. Application for permission for the above-mentioned men to enter Lybia was first made in February 1945 but was not approved by AFHQ because of the refusal of British authorities in Lybia to permit their entry.

4. With the end of the war it is recommended that further consideration be given to permit these owners of fishing interests to return to Tripolitania as requested by the Italian Government.

Dear Admiral Stone,

On August 14th last the liaison Office has addressed to the Allied Commission a note, (filed 6/27/45/127), asking for Countess Vannutelli Rey, wife of a former Italian Ambassador in Belgium, the authorization to travel by air from Rome to Brussels via Paris, but the General Headquarters has refused the permission estimating that the case is not within the essential categories.

I beg to point out, on the matter, that Countess Vannutelli Rey (a Belgian citizen before her marriage) is the daughter of Count de Broquerville, who gallantly supported the Allies, as Prime Minister and Minister of War of the King of the Belgians, during the whole World War 1914-1918.

Her father having died during the present war, Countess Vannutelli Rey has extremely pressing reasons for reaching Belgium, owing to her family affairs, inasmuch as her estates, lying in the Belgian country between the Canal Albert and the Dutch frontier, have been severely damaged by the fighting forces and need a prompt and careful restoration.

These peculiar personal circumstances might perhaps induce to take Countess Vannutelli Rey's request in full or benevolent consideration, and I should be very grateful to you if you would kindly recommend it to the proper quarter.

1. Reference is made to your letter 15.15/EC, 13 June 45, requesting that necessary travel permit be issued for Eng. Guglielmo Castelli of the Virzola Corporation, Milan, to go to Switzerland for the purpose of discussing electric power imports from Switzerland to Italy.

2. The authority for permission to make this voyage rests with AFHQ, and permission will only be granted in cases where a journey is essential. In any case, applications for permission, unless they are for persons in special categories such as diplomats, should originate through the Public Safety Subcommission. The officer handling such applications is Major Ballance.

3. It will also be necessary to complete the enclosed travel authorization applications, which should be completed in duplicate, and to them must be attached full face and profile photographs of the individual. He is then subject to security screening. This generally takes ten to twenty days, after which the applications are forwarded to O-2, AFHQ, (CI Section) with a request that authority be granted.

4. It is suggested therefore that when the applications are properly completed they be sent to Major Ballance, Public Safety Subcommission, with a letter asking that application be made for authority to travel.

With reference to your letter of 3 April 45.

Permits will be issued for the officials listed in your letter to proceed to the North of Italy on receipt of the usual particulars as to identity Card numbers and means of transport. Particulars will also be required of the drivers.

It will not be possible, as yet, to issue a permit for travel within the Province of Trieste as this is beyond the Security Control Line.

Other passes will allow your officials to travel anywhere except to the east of the Security Control Line which is now, approximately, on the River. They may not go within 25 Kilometres of the frontier except in the case of Lott, Herin, Hoffli, who will be given a special pass for this.

Dear Admiral,

1. During the last few days, I discussed with Brigadier Graffey-Smith the opportunity of extending to North Italy the issuing of the loan in 'Buoni del Tesoro' up with a premium, which is at present taking place in the provinces of the South.

This extension might bring over 10 milliard lire to the State which needs them very much, to face, without resorting to inflation, the urgent requirements of the Treasury for a few months, i.e., till it will be possible to draft a broad financial plan.

Brigadier Graffey-Smith fully agreed that it would be advisable to extend the loan.

However, no final decision can be made on the subject before hearing the bankers of North Italy.

2. From news which lately came from the North, it seems that the Treasury is faced with a very serious threat, considering that the banks of North Italy have a tendency to ask not the renewal, but the reimbursement of the ordinary 'Buoni del Tesoro', as they fall due, perhaps because they are afraid that the Italian Government might not acknowledge such obligations.

If it cannot be stopped at once, this panic might be very prejudicial to the credit of the State, and have most unfavourable repercussions on the monetary circulation and on the rices.

It is therefore necessary to discuss this subject with the bankers of the North, to persuade them to renew the Buoni instead of asking for their reimbursement.

3. Because of the monetary requirements which can be foreseen, and because of the question of the printing and changing of bank-notes in the North, it would be necessary to ascertain as soon as possible what concrete possibilities there are for printing bank-notes in the North, and supply the printing offices with the models of the new banknotes fixed for the provinces which have gone back to the administration of the Italian Government.
