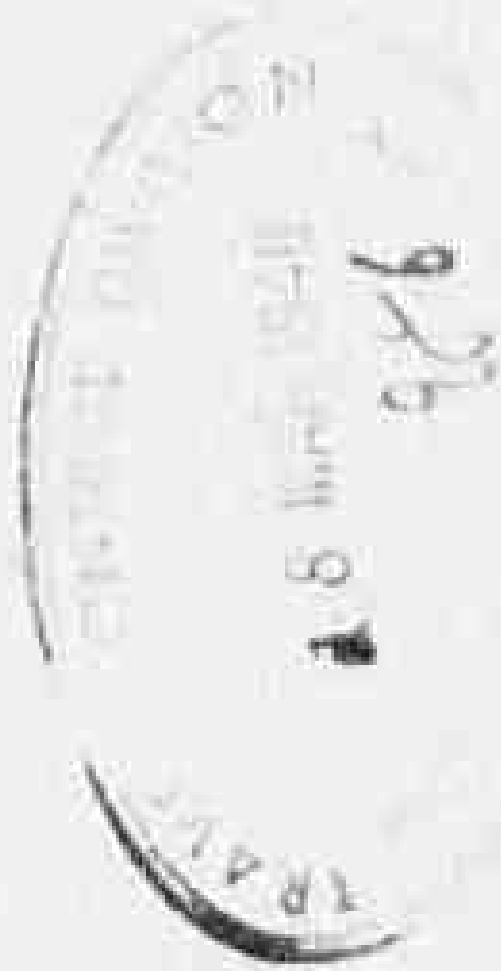

1. Letters, this correspondence, file AS 230.42/716-F subject: "Allocation of Travel Spaces to Department of State", dated 18 September 1945, and letter of 20 February 1946, file AS 230.42/072 -3, subject: "Travel of Quasi-Official and Quasi-Military Personnel" are reclassified and the following substituted therefore:

2. Personnel mentioned herein will obtain required surface transportation to the United States from the War Shipping Administration or vessels related to WSA by the Army, with priority in the order established hereafter:

- a. Armed Forces for transportation.
- b. Quasi-Military Personnel which include an American citizen employees of State Department and United States Governmental agencies, such as FBI, INS, CIA, etc.
- c. Quasi-Official Personnel sponsored by the United States State Department, i.e. alien government officials and diplomats, United States Governmental representatives, etc.
- d. American citizens and close alien relatives.
- e. Any individual holding valid passport and visa, or other documents valid for entry into the United States.

3. Personnel falling in category 2a, above are direct responsibility of the War Shipping Administration, which will accept in this category's cases, etc., and in order prior to transportation or return passage to the United States.

4. The personnel in category 2b, will, prior to obtaining passage from WSA, secure a letter from their employing United States agency authorizing the employee to secure passage to the United States with passage therefor. This letter will be retained by the War Shipping Administration.

5. The category of personnel in category 2c, above will, prior to obtaining passage present a letter from an American Consular Office to WSA certifying that transportation involved is ordered by United States State Department. This letter will be retained by War Shipping Administration.

6. No category of personnel in paragraphs 2a and c above will, prior to obtaining passage, demonstrate to USA by presentation of a statement from a representative of the State Department that they are considered eligible to receive an American passport or visa, valid for entry into the United States.

7. Military travel orders are not required for surface travel of personnel falling in categories listed in paragraph 2, above, unless such personnel are to be authorized passage on troop carrying transports.

8. a. Air passage for Quasi-official or other State Department sponsored personnel is available to the United States Political Advisors, Allied Force Headquarters within the limits of a monthly allotment of space based on availability of air lift and eligibility under the provisions of War Department Circular Number 37, 1940. American Consular Offices will obtain space allocations under this quota from the office of United States Political Advisors, Caserta, and issue a certificate, Form PT-45-A, to the traveler, which is then to be presented to the nearest Air Booking office. Military travel orders are not required for this travel.

b. Military orders will be issued by appropriate Military Headquarters authorized to issue orders for the following categories of personnel upon request of the supplying agency.

- (1) American Red Cross
- (2) War Department Civilian Technical Observers
- (3) USO
- (4) Civilian Consultants to the War Department
- (5) Accredited American War Correspondents
- (6) Any individual whose travel is properly chargeable to War and Navy Department appropriations.

URGENT and SECRET

My dear Admiral.

With reference to your inquiry regarding a visit of the assistant of the French Representative on the Allied Commission to Venezia Giulia at this time to get in touch with the French Delegation of the Commission of Experts, the Embassy has received a reply from the American Deputy of the Council of Foreign Ministers, London, to the effect that no arrangements have been made to permit any visit of officials, except the Commission of Experts themselves, to Venezia Giulia and that should any member of the Allied Commission desire to establish contact with the Commission in Venezia Giulia, it is felt that authority should be sought from the Council of Foreign Ministers to that end. Consequently, Mr. Dunn adds that he sees no reason why the visit contemplated by the French Representative on the Allied Commission should be authorized and concludes with the statement that a similar reply is being made by the British Foreign Office to its representatives in Rome.

I trust that this expression of opinion will assist you in replying to the request of Captain Mouillec.

The Allied Authorities oppose themselves to the visit of Trieste by Yugoslav journalists.

The Ministry of Information had announced itself earlier that the 1st February to the British Embassy in Belgrade with the demand to accept to a group of Yugoslav journalists to visit Trieste and the Julian March. In the answer received by this Ministry from the British Embassy the 5th February it is stated among others that "it is decided cannot issue permit until further notification is received from the Allied Military Authorities". The answer states further as follows that "the reason for this is due to be that the International Commission is not yet expected to arrive in Trieste", and that "the same conditions are being applied to Italian correspondents".

Several times after this, the Ministry of Information has intervened informing the British Embassy that the visit of the Yugoslav journalists to Trieste was not expressly tied to the arrival of the International Commission to Trieste, and as in spite of the fact that the required permit has not been issued up to the present, and because some foreign journalists have been in Trieste in the meantime and have returned the Ministry of Information considers that the Allied Authorities were the Yugoslav journalists free information about the situation in Trieste and in the Julian March impossible.

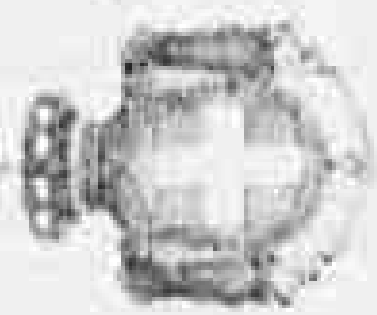

SUBJECT: Travel of Civilians

TO : Assistant Chief of Staff
C-5 AFHQ

1. I am attaching a copy of a letter received from an Italian civilian, Mr. Binotti, who recently traveled to Tripoli on letter orders from this Headquarters, prepared on authority of AFHQ cables 1-46981 of 3 October 1945 and 1-47797 of 3 October 1945.

2. It is to be noted that prior to that date military restrictions on civilian travel throughout the Mediterranean area had been removed, hence the interference by military authorities in Tripoli seems to have been completely unjustified.

3. I would appreciate it if an investigation of the matter could be made and if you could inform me as to what recommendations I can make to the Italian Government in regard to further applications for travel of civilians under the terms of existing procedures.

Sir

As it is well known by the Allied Commission, since the arrival in Rome of the Allied troops in June 1944, by kind intercession of General Mac Farren, through Mr. Jaccia, I repeatedly applied to obtain the permission to go to Tripoli together with my brother to attend our business which is over there of a remarkable importance.

Only lately, after 15 months, by your order, the enclosed travel order signed by M. A. Serrano, Adjutant, was given to us.

On the 23rd of October we sailed from Naples on the cruiser "Albatross" in possession also of a further permit of the Navy Sub-Commission to whom Admiral De Courten had applied in order to allow our embarkment, notwithstanding the travelling licence signed Serrano.

A thousand Italian ex-war internees and about 250 children ex-war repatriates were our fellow travellers.

As soon as the cruiser got to Tripoli we met with decidedly a hostile reception on behalf of the English local Authorities.

Of the numerous crew only ten people (two of which officers) were allowed to leave the ship that by special order of the local Authorities was forbidden to enter the harbour and therefore all landing operations of travellers and his luggage had to take place in open sea which fortunately was very calm.

We were the only free travellers together with Signora and Signorina Cirotola, wife and daughter of Doctor Cirotola the Tripoli Hospital Director. We held your travel permission, the Cirotola instead had a permit authorized from Tripoli. They were allowed to go free on shore whilst we were not allowed to leave the ship expecting further instructions.

after a few hours of useless waiting we were able to get on shore owing to the intervention of the "Garialdi" Captain and because the police sergeant who had remained on board, taken by surprise and impressed by our travel order, not taking in the wish of the chiefs, allowed us to land.

but as soon as we got on the quay we were by the police, directly conveyed to a repatriated concentration camp at 3 km. from the harbour.

I directly grasped what would have been our fate so I hurried to get through the medical and customs formalities and as soon as possible I reported to the commander of the camp, a young English captain, to whom I explained our special situation. As I expected the answer was that we had to wait for the necessary licence of the police, but after having listened to me and considered the importance of our special permit, he allowed us free on our promise to report next morning at the "Camp".

As we did; and next morning we were told that as we had come without the consentment of the local authorities, we could not remain in Tripoli and had to go directly back to Italy.

I explained to Major de Vella and Major Freyer and also to Captain Burgess that even in the few hours of my stay in Tripoli we had made sure that it was most urgent and necessary for at least one of us to remain in Tripoli to reorganize our tuna-factory which, having been now since three years exploited without the proprietors, was literally looted by the managers and had to be directly attended to, if we wanted to avoid it being paralysed in the next fishing season.

I also made it clear that I was ready to return directly to Italy having seen all that was needed as regards to our business, but that it was necessary for my brother to remain at least an other ten days so as to be able to take the necessary steps and agreements for the reorganization of the factory, have contact with our Vice Head of the Fishing Department and also visit the farm of 800 ettari, one of the most important agricultural possessions of all Tripolitania. By so doing the Government could have also made good the question of principle as one of us returned as desired, and the other one would have remained only and because of their consentment and only for a limited period. But all these arguments were all completely useless. In a very hard and hostile way we were told we had to leave.

I insisted to be received by the Governor, instead by the police we were summoned the day after to Colonel Madai Gen. Adm. Sec. of the Colony and A. "allerego" of the Governor himself.

He received us very coldly without even shaking hands / 482 confirmed the order to depart. He only just hesitated when I

objected that this was an injustice also because all the clandestine travellers till then arrived in the colony and always been consented to stay, at the utmost making them pay a fine. I pointed out cases of two other tumbari managers, of clandestine refugees, allowed to remain and one, a certain D'Amico, who had even been allowed a journey going and backwards in Italy. To these objections the Colonel told us to come back in the afternoon, evidently with the idea of again consulting the Governor. But in the afternoon the answer was for us to leave immediately with no resistance, sailing on the ship "Princess Kathleen" just arrived at Tripoli that morning, and starting on the next morning for Taranto with 600 Italian colonials so called "volunteered repatriates" but in reality colonials forced to go away from the country by the moral isolation and unhappiness due to the non-fraternization policy specially applied in Tripolitania.

Back to the concentration camp the next morning 28th October after two days stay we were grouped with 600 Italian repatriates and brought to the harbour where we only embarked after a long, painful and useless stay of five hours, from 10 to 3 p.m. on the quay divided in 11 groups under the scorching African sun of a sultry day with no shelter and no food or drink. While waiting, amongst the compatriots a lawyer, Santamaria, we had on account of the great heat, and fell on the quay where he laid with his legs bent by the fall. The journey was awful. Hellish for sleeping and altogether a much worse treatment than war prisoners would get.

I thought best, Sir, to let you know directly of the unlucky issue of this journey, longed for since 16 months, in order to beg you to clearly point out with Tripoli the outstanding necessity for us to freely go and stay in Tripoli to urgently be able to organize our tuna-factory and prevent the danger that it should be impossible to use in the coming fishing season.

By further note I shall explain in detail which are the ~~summarized~~ necessities that justify the urgency of our journey, but meanwhile we beg you, Sir, to kindly let us know what motives can the allied authorities have against us. We have always been notoriously great friends of the English, we are by birth partly English, we never were fascists and more so were persecuted by them, we always were against the war, and we are good Italians determined to collaborate squarely with the Al Ita, so that we feel sure not to deserve the treatment which has been used towards us and against which with the present letter, we very strongly protest.

My dear Mr. Ricotti,

In reply to your letter of 19 November 1945, I must first express my regret that your voyage to Tripoli resulted in an ordeal so inconsistent with the recent lifting of military travel restrictions between countries in the Mediterranean area.

Action in recent months has permitted the resumption of travel on a basis that should not include the intervention of military authorities to the extent you have indicated. In order to clarify the matter, I am asking AGO to investigate why your trip was, in fact, interfered with by military authorities in Tripoli in this manner.

Interference by civil authorities is, of course, a matter to be resolved between the Governments concerned, but I trust that we shall be able, by this enquiry, to avoid any further incidents of this nature and to render operative the current directives on the subject.

We refer to our letter of November 15th, 1943.

- 1 - During the recent persecution against the Jews, at Tripoli, our Jewish representative, who had been working there by himself, the house which is in the European district, almost in the center of the town, at fifty yards of the eastern port of Tripoli, opposite the Government Offices, was completely looted, and all the furniture taken away.
- 2 - Our representative is now unable to safeguard our interests and organize, for the fishing season which is shortly to begin, the fishing of the nets, for the manpower used is mostly Arab, and, as a Jew, he would have difficulty in commanding it.
- 3 - The Jews, who during the last few years, while we, the Germans, were away, financed and managed the Tunny Fishery, stated they didn't want to invest their money in tunny fishing, obviously because of the problem of the relations with the Arabs, for the plants are all located in far away and isolated places.
- 4 - It is hard to find people that want to invest their money in tunny fishing, mainly because the product of last year's fishing, which was exceptionally scarce, is still unsold as it is impossible to export.
- 5 - Tripoli can export tunny-fish only to England, Malta, and Cyprus; it cannot export it anywhere else, i.e. to any of the countries where starvation is more felt (Italy, Germany, Austria) or to the nearest (Egypt, etc.).
 - a) England doesn't buy tunny-fish in oil, particularly in large lots.
 - b) Malta has enough of it for she bought what could be bought.
 - c) From the commercial point of view, such an article is unknown in Cyprus.
- 6 - The fact that exporting is prohibited, the difficult and unsafe position of the Jews, and the absence of the Germans will paralyze the activity of the Tunny Fisheries, which is only industry existing in Syria.
- 7 - The impossibility for our Tunny Fishery to carry on its activity would be most prejudicial for us, and we protest against the permission to stay in the colony being refused to us.

TO : Mr. Ricotti
20, Via di Villa Ricotti, Rome

1. Your letter of the 19 November addressed to the Chief Commissioner, has been routed to this Sub-Commission for reply, as a matter relating to the supply of fish to Italy.

2. Certain of the points which you mention have been the subject of previous correspondence, and the reason for continuing contact with your properties in Tripoli are fully understood.

3. However, with specific reference to your letter of 10 November, outlining conditions which prevented your trip from being successful, I believe the matter should be clarified through the Minister of Foreign Affairs, in so far as it concerns the operations which you propose to carry out in Tripoli. That is, no difficulty is foreseen in the processing of your request to travel to Tripoli, but the AC is not in a position to interest itself directly in the operations which you carry on there that must be clarified with the authorities in Tripoli, through civil channels.

4. At such time as you have completed all arrangements, and desire to proceed to Tripoli, we shall be glad to process your authorization to leave Italy.
