The position with regard to U.S. and British Nationals travelling to or through Germany and Austria is as follows.

U.S. Nationals: Unless passports are specifically endorsed by the State Department or authority given by S.D.A. validating travel in Austria and Germany, it is necessary for holders desiring to go to those countries to be referred to the nearest State Department representative, who in turn refers the case thru Washington to the authorities in Germany or Austria.

If approved is given, the passport is validated by the State Department representative and a permit is issued by the Travel Control Division, Public Safety S/C.

Those persons whose passports are already validated, approval for travel is obtained direct by Travel Control Division from authorities in Germany and or Austria.

British Nationals: Passports are normally stamped "Not valid for travel in areas under military occupation unless the necessary military permit has first been obtained."

In all cases therefore application is made through Travel Control Division to the authorities in Austria and Germany and if approved is given, the permit is issued.

The regulations have been and are being complied with by Travel Control Section.

7. Full particulars must be submitted. Failure to include necessary and pertinent information will be cause for return to originating officer.
8. In order to insure efficient handling of order requests, it is requested that special care be given to the correct spelling of names, ranks, serial numbers and frequency of service.
9. In indicating assignments or attachments of personnel, (e.g. Public Works, Finance, etc.), be sure to include parent unit, i.e., Headquarters Allied Commission, or the various National Headquarters.
10. If claims are required for proposed journey, be sure to indicate under item 3, number of persons for whom rations will be required and approximate number of days for which rations will be drawn. (e.g. Rations required for 3 men for 3 days).
11. If travel concurrence cannot be obtained, state fully the date for the waiver. This form will then be forwarded for comment to the interested and concerned officers after which action will be taken by the Executive Commission.

- a. Nearly all persons travelling to ERITREA and TRIPOLITANIA are Displaced persons. Shipping is an UNRRA and Ministry of Marine responsibility. The latter are very anxious that no unauthorized person travels on their ships and their personnel have been trained to recognize our visas. Hence the very exceptional cases of businessmen travelling to S.M.A. territories are processed through D. channels so that there should be no confusion at the time of embarkation.
- b. The standing policy is that NO Italians are to travel to TRIPOLITANIA for whatever reason, be it business or compassionate. Before this office, and its predecessor UNRRA took on itself the task of obtaining clearance for would-be travellers to TRIPOLITANIA, G-3 were getting Security clearances from the D.S.D. in TRI-POLI and had authorized people to proceed on their journey without "economic and policy" clearance from H... S.M.A. Amongst other things, this resulted in the unhappy incident of Fiat personnel not being granted permission to 1400 hrs TRI-POLI in spite of their being in possession of travel orders issued by the Adjutant at this H..

I have been in touch with the Allied Commission in Austria with regard to your journey to Austria and have elicited the following information:

1. Whilst in Switzerland you should apply to the Austrian Political Representative in BERNE for an "Aller et retour" visa for Austria. The intelligence organisation in Austria do not expect you will have any difficulty in getting into Austria, but there is no guarantee of your getting out again, owing to the Quadripartite regulations.
2. Your mother can apply to the nearest Austrian Police Station for an exit visa from Austria. She will also have to obtain a Swiss entry visa from the Swiss Consul in Vienna.
3. The applications of yourself and your mother would then go before the Quadripartite Frontier Control Working Party for consideration. As your reasons for travel are purely personal there is, I am afraid, always a possibility that they would not be granted. If, however, you made your application at a later date, when restrictions on travel may be easier, you would stand a chance of more favourable consideration by the Quadripartite Frontier Control Working Party.

I am sorry this is the best I can do for you but would advise you to try your luck.

I hope you and the boys are well and if there is anything further I can do to help, please let me know.

I have received your letter of the 14th July 1946 on the subject of Mrs. Eleanor Singer and her mother. I am afraid the security regulations here are a bit sticky at present and I have had some difficulty in persuading them even to consider this case.

I have, however, elicited the following information:

- (a) When Mrs. Singer arrives in Switzerland she should apply to the Austrian Political Representative in Bern for an "Aller et retour" visa for Austria. The Intelligence Organisation here do not expect that Mrs. Singer will have any difficulty in getting into Austria from Switzerland but there is no guarantee of her getting out again, owing to the quadripartite regulations. In any case, as her reasons are purely private ones, she would have a very low priority.
- (b) Mrs. Singer's mother can apply to the nearest Austrian Police Station in Austria for an exit visa from Austria. She would also have to obtain a Swiss entry visa from the Swiss Consul in Vienna.
- (c) The applications of Mrs. Singer and her mother would then go before the quadripartite Frontier Control Working Party for consideration. As stated above, the reasons for travel are purely personal and there is always the probability that they would not be granted in either case. If, however, the applications were made at a later date, when restriction on travel will have eased up a bit, they would stand a chance of favourable consideration by the quadripartite Frontier Control Working Party.

Now he has been told that his wife is seriously sick, and he would like to have the permission to go there to meet her. He said, a long time ago, an application in order to have his family back in Italy, but he never received any reply and for the present situation, he wishes to have himself the permit to go to Austria as soon as possible.

Would you be so kind, Valdas, to ask General Lush for the above mentioned permit.

I assure you that we ~~xx~~ can trust the man and he will not abuse of the permit (he is a Latvian's citizen).

With reference to the request for passages to China, I have to advise that there is no direct sea service and that it will be necessary to travel in stages as and when onward passages could be obtained.

2. In this connection passages could be arranged as far as money would enable passage to Singapore could be obtained. It would then be necessary to arrange continuation of journey there, but, in every case it is ordinary passengers must be warned that stop over in ports may be prolonged and all charges whilst awaiting passage must be paid by themselves.

3. Quoted below are extracts of signals received in this connection:-

Thank you for your letter C.A.2/(B)/WM/216 of 14th March regarding the request for a travel permit for FILIPPO MASCAHO to return to GERMANY. I am afraid I cannot be of much assistance in this matter.

Certain orders have been laid down by AFHQ prohibiting civilian travel to AUSTRIA and GERMANY for family reasons. It seems that Sig. MASCAHO has entered ITALY illegally and without the correct papers which would have enabled him to return. Also his request has already been refused once by the Allied authorities.

It is regretted that no exception can be made and until civilian travel becomes normal between these countries, the ruling laid down by AFHQ must be adhered to.
