1. The following telephone message received from Major Woodcock, P.O. Division Officer Milan, at 9.45 A.M. 24th April:-

Operations during all night by Police and troops on surrounding roads. Police and troops in possession of northern, but are waiting for light artillery before making general attack this morning.

Prisoners including all women have been evacuated. No military police (Allied) allowed in vicinity on orders from 1 District.

Inspector General of P.O. has arrived from Rome and is conferring with authorities.

Typewritten manuscript last of grave of Major Woodcock "The Robert Party later will go on living".

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I refer to your letter No. 36260 of 15 Sep 45 on the subject of the use of the Italian Army on Police Duties.

This matter has been discussed with MIA who have informed me that the use of military personnel on duties inside civil prisons or for operating civil prisons generally is precluded by the instructions governing the employment of the Italian Army.

MIA, however, sees no objections to the military authorities rendering assistance to the civil authorities outside the prisons, such as by patrols to prevent attacks on prisons from outside elements.

REPORT ON FIRE

The night of the 21/11/44 at 22 hours a call was received to go to the Regina Coeli Prison. Inmates had set fire to the roof of the 6th wing by sticking straw from their mattresses into the wooden rafters and setting them on fire.

One Motorpump and one Water Tender were used in extinguishing the fire. The firemen were at the scene about 4 hours.
