1. The following JCS policy on disclosure of radar information to the public is transmitted for guidance and appropriate action.

a. Letter 113.44 (31 Jul 45)OB-S-B-M, 4 August 1945, subject: Policy on Disclosure of Radar Information to the Public, is rescinded.

b. Special military security measures for radar and related systems (including radars, IFF, Loren, etc.) are no longer necessary and hereafter information, principles, methods and means thereof shall be unclassified. Military security measures shall, however, apply to military radar applications and related systems in the same manner as to other military devices and systems.

c. The Joint Chiefs of Staff note that the following are functions of the War and Navy Departments:

(1) Declassification of all classified radar information, principles, methods, means, processes, designs, and inventions resulting from United States' sponsored research.

(2) Transmittal of recommendations to the Director of War Mobilization and Reconversion (Executive Order 9566) for the declassification of all classified radar information, designs, principles, and inventions received from the United Kingdom under the terms of Executive Agreement Series 265.

2. It is directed that all radar information which is declassified on the basis of paragraph 1b (1) above and appropriate for release to the public will be forwarded to the Department of Commerce, Committee on the Release of Information (Chairman: Mr. John Grand) for publication. Recommendations formulated in accordance with paragraph 1b (2) above will be transmitted to the Director, War Department's Division, War Department Special Staff for reference to the Director of War Mobilization and Reconversion.

TO: All Concerned.

Pending Revisions of War Department Circular Number 236, dated 3 August 1945, Release of Military Information, and Army Regulations 380-5, Safeguarding Military Information; and in accord with the Joint Chiefs of Staff action, relaxations of the security of information on the following are authorized:

a. Information for publication may be released concerning:

- (1) Movements of troops anywhere including the arrivals and departures of named individuals and units, Army aircraft and vessels.
- (2) Location, composition, strength, organization, armament and equipment of units within the theater. Except upon specific approval of the Theater Commander no information will be disclosed concerning classified or highly specialized units of equipment.
- (3) War material production, processes and rates of manufacture, except information relating to classified products, methods and processes.
- (4) Assembly, storage and location of war materials except classified items.
- (5) Facilities for communication and transportation in Theaters and Zones of the Interior.

b. Exceptions to the above are as follows:

- (1) Information pertaining to occupation operations relating to Japan and occupational units or units taking part in such operations will remain as classified information and will not be released until unit or units are in the territory that they are to occupy, unless an arrangement is made earlier by the Supreme Allied Commander for the Allied Powers.

SUBJECT: Indication of Message Security Classification.

TO: All Concerned

1. It is essential to have a uniform method of indicating the security classification of a message at all stages of transmission and on delivery to the addressee. The following procedure will be effective within the Mediterranean Theater:

Originators will include the security classification as the first word of the text in all messages. No message will be treated as unclassified unless the originator has franked the message with the instruction "UNCLASSIFIED". Any message which does not bear its appropriate security classification or the instruction "UNCLASSIFIED" at the beginning of the text will be referred back to the originator by the Signal Agency concerned.

NOTE: When the British Army message form JFC 2136 is in use, the originator's instructions contained in the two signature spaces are redundant and will not be applicable. However, for uniformity, all messages classified RESTRICTED or above will be signed in the right hand space and all UNCLASSIFIED messages will be signed in the left hand space with the word "except" deleted and the word "including" substituted.

2. As a result of the above procedure, every message will bear a security classification, or the instruction "UNCLASSIFIED", which will constitute the sole deciding factor in the security handling of the message.

3. The responsibility for the correct security classification of a message rests entirely with the originator. It is the responsibility of the Signal agencies concerned to insure that a message is given correct security handling in accordance with the designated classification and the security of the circuits over which the message is to be transmitted.

4. Any message franked with the instruction "UNCLASSIFIED" will be assumed to have been authorized by the originator for transmission in clear by any means of communication including radio and any commercial agencies.

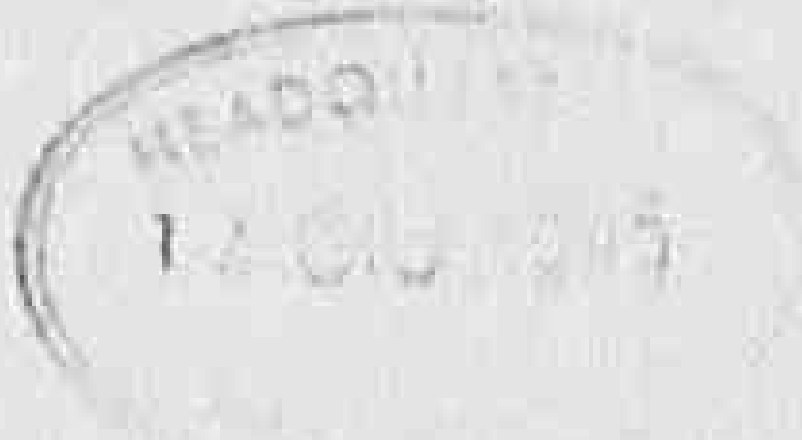

1. In connection with recent investigations of security, an examination of the present practices concerning appropriate classification, downgrading, etc., disclosed that the existing instructions on the subject are adequate but they are not in many instances being properly executed.

2. For example, the correspondence forwarding a letter written by an enlisted man requesting transfer from his present unit to another branch of the service was classified SECRET whereas the actual content of the file warranted a classification of no higher than RESTRICTED. In another instance an annex to a survey of an island containing detailed information on rainfall, vegetation and physical features was properly classified SECRET prior to landing operations. Several months following actual occupation of the island by Allied Forces a War Correspondent was charged with violating security regulations when he attempted to depart from the Theater with a copy of this annex still classified SECRET. Prior to the operation, the accumulation of such data indicated a probable attack by U.S. Forces on that area. After the successful occupation, the data itself could not be considered classified.

3. Such overclassifying of military information coupled with the failure to effect appropriate downgrading or reclassification has placed an undue burden on current security measures. It is the responsibility of all authorities charged with classification of information to assign the least restrictive classification consistent with security. It is imperative that information be classified in accordance with

the general principles enunciated in paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7, AR 380-5, 15 March 1944, as amended. It is a responsibility of command to scrutinize carefully classifications originating within subordinate echelons and to take, in cases of overclassification, appropriate corrective action.

4. Due to the large volume of classified information transmitted between military agencies it has become increasingly important for all practicable steps to be taken to downgrade material in accordance with the provisions of WD Circular 259, 26 June 1944. Continuance in effect of classified information which should be downgraded perpetuates the threat to the security of information which is classified.

5. Paragraph 15a, AR 380-5 provides: "It is the obligation of all authorities to keep classified matter constantly under review and to downgrade it as soon as conditions permit." It should not be resorted to, as has been the practice, only upon request or when to do so would facilitate solution of a problem at hand. Where practicable, authorities effecting downgrading of a document will take steps to have other recipients of that document notified of the change in classification.

6. The foregoing in no way affects the provisions of AR 380-5 applicable to the downgrading of information contained in previously cryptographed messages.

1. An excessive number of security violations with respect to classified documents, including their loss, has come to the attention of the War Department. The gravity of cases involving the loss of cryptographic or recognition material can scarcely be overstressed. The loss of one copy of a widely used cryptographic document may jeopardize large numbers of persons and important shipments of equipment and supplies, or disclose important future plans to the enemy. Also the compromise of a cryptographic system frequently requires its replacement at considerable expense and loss in time and energy.

2. Reports of investigation indicate that the most frequent violations occur in the following categories:

a. Failure to execute reports of transfer when there is a change in custodian so that the successor does not become fully appreciative of his responsibilities in the premises.

b. Failure to maintain the prescribed receipt system.

c. Failure to comply with regulations in connection with the destruction of registered matter.

d. Failure to give notice of loss or compromise to the Office of Issue by the fastest means available, with the result that cryptographic material may continue in effect, sometimes for a considerable period, after it has been subjected to compromise.

3. a. Study of the papers in the cases reviewed discloses that most of the violations have occurred because the military personnel concerned were careless or lacked the necessary familiarity with the provisions of AR 380-5, i.e., either the original instructions to personnel with reference to the provisions of AR 380-5 were not adequate or the proper emphasis has not been placed upon the importance of strict compliance with security requirements.

b. There is accordingly indicated a failure of appropriate commanders in meeting their responsibilities (1) for the observance of the provisions of AR 380-5 within their commands and (2) for requiring that their personnel be familiar with the provisions of AR 380-5. Furthermore, lack of appreciation of their duties is too frequently found in commanding officers, who

in making reports of loss or subjection to compromise, in many cases fail to investigate as thoroughly as they should, to fix responsibility, or to take adequate steps to prevent a recurrence of the incident. It is becoming increasingly apparent that officers having custody of registered publications are too prone to employ or to accept "inadvertent" burning as a plausible reason for their loss, without conducting an adequate investigation of all circumstances involved in such loss.

4. It is desired that necessary steps be taken to insure that all personnel engaged in the handling and transmission of classified material read and become familiar with the pertinent provisions of AR 380-5 and that strict compliance be effected therewith to the end that violations of security may be reduced to the lowest practicable minimum. In this connection it is desired that particular emphasis be placed upon the following:

a. Signing of required transfer report or prescribed receipt immediately upon delivery of material requiring such report or form.

b. Maintenance of a proper inventory of all material for which the custodian is responsible.

c. Strict responsibility on the part of each individual signing for material until relief therefrom by proper transfer report (or prescribed receipt in appropriate cases) or report of destruction pursuant to regulations and applicable directive.

d. In the event of loss or subjection to compromise the making of immediate report thereof, by the fastest means available, to the office of issue.

5. It is also desired that all concerned within your command be informed of the above.

1. RESCISSIONS--

Previous instructions contained in letters AG 311.5 (7 May 43) 03-S-E-1, 19 May 1943, and AG 311.5 (29 Feb 44)03-S-E-1, 10 March 1944, subject as above, are hereby rescinded.

2. PURPOSE--

The basic purpose for using code names is to insure secrecy concerning intentions and to safeguard information pertaining to military operations.

3. DEFINITIONS--

a. Code names are specially selected words assigned:

- (1) To provide discreet and brief names for plans, projects and forces.
- (2) To conceal intentions in documents, communications and discussions pertaining to plans and operations.
- (3) To designate places in conjunction with 1 and 2 above.

b. Code words assigned to major or special projected operations will be classified initially TOP SECRET. This classification may be later down-graded in accordance with paragraph 7, below. All other words will be classified SECRET and are not subject to downgrading but may be cancelled (See Paragraph 8, below).

c. Attention is invited to the distinction between code words and shipping designators (see letter AG 400.161 (19 May 43)03-S-37 OT- , 1 June 1943, subject: Requisitioning and Marking Supplies for Overseas Shipment (Marking Directive), as amended by letter AG 400.161 (23 Aug 43)03-S-37 OT-M, 23 August 1943, same subject).

4. ASSIGNING AUTHORITIES--

a. Joint Security Control, a subordinate agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, is the central U.S. agency charged with responsibility for the dissemination and coordination of code words for projected operations.

b. Within the U.S. Army, the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, is the coordinating and disseminating agency for all other code words.

c. The Operations Division, War Department General Staff, will allot blocks of code words from the "Combined British--United States Inter-Services Code-word Index." (CUBS 099) to commands under the War Department, including theater commands, upon their requests. Commands which are allotted blocks of code words are authorized to make assignments from these blocks subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 and 6, below. They will also be furnished a copy of the "Combined British--United States Inter-Services Code-word Index" (CUBS 099), which is the only authorized source for code words.

d. The selection and assignment of code words by agencies of the U.S. Army other than authorized assigning agencies and other than the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, is specifically prohibited.

5. METHODS OF ASSIGNMENT OF SECRET CODE WORDS--

a. Commands which require the assignment of a SECRET code word and which are not designated as assigning authorities will request the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, for a code word.

The meaning to be assigned the code word will be included in the request. The method of transmission of this request will be governed by the urgency of its requirement. Radio communication is authorized if necessary.

b. Commands designated as assigning authorities are authorized to assign SECRET code words from allotted blocks of the "Combined British--United States Inter-Services Code-Word Index" (COWI 099) at their discretion. The Operations Division, War Department General Staff, will be notified immediately of assignments by the most expeditious means available. The meaning assigned the code word and, in the case of geographical locations, the coordinates to identify properly the place will be included.

c. Limited dissemination of SECRET code words, together with their meanings, will be made by the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, to interested agencies and commands by a SECRET mimeographed publication entitled "Key Lists of Assigned Secret Code Names".

6. METHOD OF ASSIGNMENT OF TOP SECRET CODE NAMES--

a. Commands which require the assignment of a TOP SECRET code word for a projected operation and which are not designated as assigning authorities will request of the Secretary, Joint Security Control, Washington 25, D.C., a code word for the meaning as included in the request. The method of transmission of this request will be governed by the urgency of its requirement. Radio communication is authorized if necessary.

b. Commands designated as assigning authorities are authorized to assign TOP SECRET code words for projected operations from the allotted blocks of the "Combined British--United States Inter-Service Code-Word Index" (COWI 099) at their discretion. The Secretary, Joint Security Control will be notified immediately by the most expeditious means available of the assignment, including the meaning.

c. Joint Security Control will make and control the dissemination, except within the subordinate commands of the assigning agency, of TOP SECRET words through TOP SECRET control channels.

7. CLASSIFICATION, DOWNGRADING AND DECLASSIFICATION OF TOP SECRET CODE WORDS--

a. Code words assigned to certain major or special operations will be classified TOP SECRET during the planning stage and until the operation is mounted--e.g., until landing of amphibious mounted troops participating in the operation, or in the case of airborne troops, until such time prior to the landing as is necessary for their proper instruction.

b. Upon mounting and during continuance of the operation, such code words will be classified as SECRET.

c. On completion of the operation operational code words may be downgraded to CONFIDENTIAL.

d. Eventually operational code words may be downgraded to RESTRICTED or declassified, as appropriate, for use in historical documents or published articles.

e. The downgrading or declassification of operational code words does not control the classification to be assigned to the document in which it is contained. As in the case of classified matter generally, each document must be graded according to its own content, apart from the code word contained therein, except where the code word is graded higher than the classification which would normally be assigned to the document itself.

f. The reclassification of operational code words in accordance with the above principles, and notification of agencies concerned, including the Operations Division, War Department General Staff and Joint Security Control, is the responsibility of the theater commander concerned with the operation.

8. CLASSIFICATION, DOWNGRADING OR DECLASSIFICATION OF SECRET CODE WORDS--

SECRET code names, excepting operational code names reduced from TOP SECRET, will remain in a SECRET classification until cancelled or until they are no longer needed. SECRET code names no longer needed will be cancelled at the discretion of the assigning authority and notification made through regular channels to the Operations Division, War Department General Staff. They may then be published in historical reports and other documents without classification.

The proper use of all code words is enjoined on all personnel having access thereto. In the preparation of communications and documents, the following instructions apply:

a. Communications and documents containing code words will be placed in a classification at least equal to the Classification of the code words contained therein. Classification lower than that of the code word contained is in direct violation to the provisions of AR 380-5.

b. The meaning of a TOP SECRET code word will never be used in the same communication as the code word itself.

c. The meaning of a SECRET code word will be used in a communication together with the code word only when it is absolutely essential to do so.

d. When a code word is used in a communication or document, reference to related localities, forces, and plans should likewise be coded, if such code words are available.

e. Code words will not be used:

- (1) As an address for a communication
- (2) As a return address on mail
- (3) As an address for shipments
- (4) As an indicator for filing system
- (5) As a designation of exchange offices, or other activities associated with a force, place, or plan identified by the code word.
- (6) To indicate destinations in routine flight operations.

f. Commands requiring knowledge of the meaning of code words in order to transact official business should request this information through command or technical channels, as appropriate. Within the restrictions imposed by the need for security, commanding officers receiving information on code words are authorized to supply subordinate agencies of their commands with so much of this information as may be actually needed to transact official business.

When persons not subject to military law require knowledge of code words in order to transact governmental business, such information will be supplied under the provisions of paragraphs 20 and 23b, AG 350-6, 15 March 1944.

In the case of the compromise or possible compromise of a code word the organization having such knowledge will advise the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, (also Joint Security Control in the case of TOP SECRET code words) immediately by the most expeditious means possible. The assigning authority then will be advised and a new code word will be assigned and disseminated according to the procedure outlined above.

1. Political

The Council of Ministers, having postponed the scheduled meeting of the 13th on learning of the death of President Roosevelt, met on the 17th and began its activities by offering its thanks for the "gesture of generous hospitality" on the part of Argentina which has announced a gift of 100,000 tons of wheat to Italy. The Council acted that it looked to the Allies for help in bringing the wheat to Italy as soon as possible. A draft decree was approved creating a Defense Committee to advise the government on military matters and a new Chief of the General Staff, General Claudio Trezzani, was named. The functions of the General Staff were carefully defined as "advisory...on principal technical questions affecting the armed forces". General Trezzani is an Italianman who fought in Africa and has recently spent some time in the United States as a prisoner of war. According to reports he is regarded in military circles as a man of monarchist sympathies.

The Council then elaborated further the rules for repression of Fascist activities which it had approved some weeks ago. One point is noteworthy: the presidency of the operation committees may now be entrusted to University professors, lawyers or retired state functionaries as well as to magistrates, the only category eligible in the past. This is a move long since recommended in the interests of efficiency by Associate High Commissioner Berlinguer and the Leftist press. It was also announced that special Analysis Courts would be set up in the liberated North and that punishment for fascist activities had been made more severe. - even including the death penalty. It was perhaps this last measure which caused ITALIA NUOVA to exclude "the government is fighting Fascism with Fascist methods."

At this meeting too De Gasperi made a significant commentary on the relations with Jugoslavia. The question of Trieste, he said, could hardly be settled while the patriot elements of both countries were bending all their efforts to expel the German invader. He hoped the matter would be studied on a level "above that of press polemics". The Council followed these remarks with a resolution stating its desire to see a harmonious good neighbor relationship grow up and flourish between the two countries. These manifestations of reason and calm were applauded by some sections in the press but did not prevent others from continuing to maintain the Italian position.

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In this context further invitation was added by the Separatist Convention in Palermo. The session lasted three days and was full of fiery speeches and talk of defense of Sicilian independence at all costs. The signal accomplishment of the convention was the dispatch of a message to the United Nations urging that the Separatist case be considered at San Francisco. The government in an official

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communiqué outlined this as an act of treason and the whole press of Rome fell to denouncing the separatist movement, though explanations for its existence varied. To Henri in Avanti! a Fascist plot was clearly visible; ITALIA NUOVA saw in the movement the hand of outside forces; which had been known to stir up trouble in the South in pre-unitification days. Attilio, Emilio's High Commissioner, called the whole business a bluff but the TRIBUNA DEL POPOLO pointed out seriously and early that Italy will not be represented at San Francisco while the Separatists, thanks to their memorandum, will.

Further and apparently final plans for the Consultation Assembly were worked out at the second Council meeting of the week (April 20.) Noteworthy in the representation accorded parties outside the C.L.M. The Republicans are to have ten representatives and the Democratic Party and the Democratic-Liberal Concentration (both Rightist and Monarchist) five each. (Each of the six C.L.M. parties will have twenty-six representatives.) IFAJA likewise promptly took up the bids for the Sinistère Christian (Avondan Catholic Communists) or it is likely that other opposition groups will be heard from when the press has had some opportunity to study the Council's report, not yet officially published.

Power stations suffered minor damage and power is expected to be restored shortly. Water was O.K.

A 52-year-old former Latentshire football player, William Garbutt, was found in the town and hired as an interpreter. 50,000 persons were in the town, including 200 patients in the hospital. Milk, water and food appeared satisfactory. In its onward rush toward Ferrara, the 8th Army was

less than 20 miles from the first provinces of Venezuela Region which has four provincial towns ready to move in. Capital San Pelayo had 5,000 population on entry, including 1,500 from Bologna. Normal population is 3,500. And is already functioning. More than 100 tons of grain were found stockpiled. There was no electricity but two steam-operated flour mills were found. Masua Lombarda, with half its normal population of 4,000, sustained heavy damage. San Agata was 90 per cent. destroyed. Consolidated was also somewhat damaged, but in all three towns food and public health were no concern.

problem to be the oldest job of military government since the liberation of Sicily. Regional commissioners for the North have all been introduced to Major General William D. Cristenberger, commanding officer of IV Corps, which, as a separate unit under 15th Army Group, will be the first to enter the Northwest areas. First phase military government being thus under its control. The Economic Section and its sub-commission directors paid a mass visit to IV Corps this last week-end to discuss economic plans. Northwest Italy after the combat troops give over, will be in charge of No. 2 District under General Naves.

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The governmental institutions of North Italy will be officially announced shortly. Governmental functions of all Italy, the institutional North will present two major headaches - the political, the other economic (or more later). The first consists of Fascism in their last hour, and of Patriots who are called Volunteers of Liberty under the Commission of National Liberation of Italy. The Patriots, well organized and functioning with Allied support and even officers from our military units, are hoping to defeat key installations against German attempts at storage and destruction. Speaking of destruction, since Axis officers of 40 have made a detailed map of North Italy and deposits and monuments for the Air Force, copies of which map are being distributed down to squadron level. Patriots, hospitalization and clothing for Patriots will be a military weapon. Italy, according to the latest AFHQ military personnel confirmation, the military units will also try to get the Patriots to disarm as early as possible, after which it will be an AFHQ job until the Carabinieri move in. For the new tasks of their patrol, some discussion is under way to use Guardia Finanze is preferred to the CC.FR. A spearhead of 3,000 Carabinieri (eventually 500) is already set to move into the North and AFHQ has authorized a transfer of 46 armored cars, 24 trucks and four light utility cars to the CC.FR.

The C.L.D.A.I. is expected to have set up "sanctuary" governments in many places where all be found operating when they move in. They are supposed to assign at once and recognize the authority of A.M.S. which in U.S. is prepared to try to use as such C.L.N. personnel in the civil administration as possible. Prefecture, for example, should be appointed from local non-career persons acceptable to the C.L.N., while the vice prefects may come from career administrators being

needed in the past by the local Government Sub-Commission. The C.L.M.A.I. has been recognized by the Italian Government as its representative in the North and the Montenegro have recognized the Italian Government in Rome as the sole repository of legal authority. The Allies have not given the C.L.M. any political recognition as a constituted authority but have made military agreements with the army of the C.L.M. for the Voluntas of Liberty to come under Allied military orders. The wishes of the Italian Government to control C.L.M. representatives as quickly as possible will be favored by AC in the interests of obtaining a nationally representative government. As far as reputation is concerned, it is expected that the Patriots will to a bit of unofficial operation on their own, since all official positions there are held by Fascist Republicans. In any event, AC situation is expected to be as swift and thorough as it can be made.

Tied up with this question is that of re-creating the great pre-Fascist newspapers of the North like the Corriere della Sera of Milan and the Stampa di Torino. The PWS press plan, agreed to by AC, envisaged close cooperation between AMO and PWS, with PWS willing to check with AMO about all news and radio materials used. All newspapers will be suspended immediately and Fascist papers suppressed for good. These publications the authorities decide to authorize will be in charge of commissariats appointed by AMO. Dismissing papers which operated despite the Germans will be allowed to continue but must operate for a license within seven days. Military censors will operate in the larger towns. In others AMO will act as the censoring power. Newspaper is now being stockpiled for the North. A stockpile of 3,000 tons, belonging to Milan and Turin papers, has been found in Switzerland, incidentally, and will be shipped into Italy as soon as the Swiss border is negotiable.

What is worrying the Economic Section is the Northern economy of wages and prices, the availability of industrial production (Italian technical experts are to enter the area as soon as possible for this purpose) and the first priority problem - food and transport. The Allied Motor Transport Group, under its energetic organizer, Col. J. J. Carnes (A), and with new trucks arriving from the States, is set for its big job. 15th Army Group have requested transport help. AC will lend 600 trucks in the first phase. An advance expedition of the Transportation Sub-Commission will go forward as fast as possible to help coordinate movements. Col. Logan, director of the Food Sub-Commission, has been devoting his time almost exclusively to the North. A food directive for all regional officers has been issued. Approximately 40,000 tons are already stockpiled. Major troops being at Livorno and Ancona. Salt, a Northern deficiency, is well in hand. Further stocks of food 10,000 to 15,000 tons - are ready further from the peninsula and so should provide all together a reserve of one to two months at least. The initial ration of bread will be 100 grams plus

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a free market. Prizes may be allowed to vary regionally.
