1. You directed that two separate memoranda should be submitted, one regarding the clothing and the other regarding the arms and equipment situation of the CC.R2. At p.116 is that for the clothing situation - this is a précis of p.110. Both p.s 116 and 105, the latter containing the arms and equipment position, stem from p.99, which is the information supplied to Land Forces Sub-Commission by the War Ministry.

2. It had been assumed that 30,000 sets of uniforms had been supplied for the CC.R2 but when it came to the point at the meeting held at MMIA on 3 January the fact was that only 17,000 sets had been actually supplied, the remaining 13,000 being still in the process of production; they will be finished by 15 February.
