The following information received from Colonel HARTLEY
1030 hrs. 7 October :-

The disturbance was a matter between Polish and Greek
Jews. There was no feeling against Allied Personnel and no attempt to
molest Allied Personnel. Col. HARTLEY has advised that 65 Greeks be moved
to another Camp.

During disturbance two persons injured situation in hand
and troops returned to TARANTO.

I will fly to LECCE to-morrow and will meet Lt.Col. KERR.

The following report phoned from Disper Rep. No. 1 Transit Camp Bari at 1620 hrs, 6 October is forwarded for information :-

"The riot was caused during a clothing distribution. It was started by a Greek Jew and a Polish Jew who were Group Leaders. This trouble started in the clothing store. It was stopped by Lt. Col. Kerr closing the store and turning everyone outside. 300 people waiting outside immediately started to riot. Lt. Col. Kerr called his Camp police who are mainly Greeks but they refused to co-operate. Lt. Col. Kerr did not regard the situation as very serious until shots were fired and 2 or 3 of the police were injured. Lt. Col. Kerr then called for assistance from H.Q. 52 Area who despatched Allied troops. Col. Hartley, A.C. Liaison

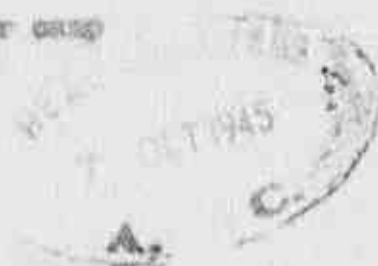

Subject is riot at AC camp for displaced persons SANTA CRUZ on 5 October. For some time the inmates of this camp of several nationalities have been dividing themselves into rival factions. A clothing parade yesterday provided suitable opportunity for start of dispute. Fighting broke out fists and stones mostly being used but a few shots were fired. Riot ceased 2200 hours. 3 people hospitalized. This morning camp was searched by our gals for arms with no result. 14 AMED CG withdrawn 1600 hours today. Command of camp apprehensive lest one of the injured should die and further riots break out. Believe he has requested AC to provide type as temporary gpm for camp.

They have not yet returned.
