3. As far as is known, no one yet present at the meeting at which these arrangements were made. Apparently, however, it will be noted in para 3(d) of the Labour & Pensions Control Commission relating to para 3d, paragraph (Appendix A) it was expected to pay city charges which might be made by the railways concerned. The Finance Sub-Commission could not properly undertake to carry out such an arrangement and therefore the following procedure was followed:-

a. Mr. B. Director General, Military Railway Division, conferred with Director, F.O.M. as to extent of dealing with returns.

b. Private Railways in Commission all arranged that returns should be made to their local representatives, who pass them to the local representatives of the Ministry of Communications concerned with private railways in commission.

4. The Transportation Sub-Commission, etc. has not felt it desirable that such a system should be allowed to operate and has drawn the attention of the Labour and Pensions Sub-Commission to the limited subsidy to workers which results whereas in effect the workers in question are already enjoying preferential treatment. Copy of a letter by Transportation Sub-Commission on this subject is attached (Appendix B). Also see Appendix C.

5. At a subsequent date and requested that the employees of contributors to the Allied Forces Fund. Also be allowed to enjoy free transport and further demand was made for free conference of workers on railway railway bases.

6. The system of free transport is now to continue. Employees travel at will with out-of-date permits. Also, they are entitled to an annual allowance to enable them to obtain a return to their homes. Appendix attached represents the point of view of the Finance Sub-Commission of this Headquarters. The latter has been in discussion in connection with representatives of the Transportation, Finance and Labour Sub-Commissions and the Economic Section. It is the considered opinion of this Headquarters that satisfaction should be given to military services at least that all persons that the entire system of free travel should cease by 31 January 45.

7. It will be noted in para. 6 of Appendix B that "from the point of view of the individual employee the amount of money paid to him, less his free transport is limited to official use, must be certainly a small contribution. The rates for urban transportation are still very small, amounting to a few lire". This was agreed to by the Finance Sub-Commission and in view of (1) the administrative difficulties which will continue to be involved in the system of free transport expands and (2) the fact that the Italian Government cannot be legally concerned

under the terms of the armistice to mean the elements requested by the armed forces and have already objected to this (particularly where private means of transportation is involved), it is recommended that the whole system be eliminated at the earliest possible date.

I --- ROME AREA ALLIED COMMAND - COMMAND & ADMINISTRATION

1. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 35, and Section II, Number 42, both 1944, are rescinded.

2. Current instructions are contained in AFHQ letter, AG 323.36/051 GGT-O, dated 4 November 1944, subject: "Rome Area Allied Command (Rome Area) - Command and Administration."

II -- DISSOLUTION OF ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES (NORTH AFRICAN) BOARD

1. Effective 13 November 1944, the Allied Force Local Resources (North African) Board is dissolved.

2. Section I, AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 28, 1944, is rescinded on this date.

III - LOCAL RESOURCES IN ITALY - MAINLAND & ISLANDS

1. In further use of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 41, 1944, the following procedure will be adopted in order to coordinate the utilization and allocation of local resources within the Italian territory under the control of AFHQ.

2. a. Coordination will be accomplished by the Allied Force Local Resources Section (AFPRS) of this headquarters, which is responsible to the CAO for carrying out the policies laid down by AFHQ. AFPRS may correspond directly with and give instructions to the Local Resources Section HQ AAI on matters of a technical nature as laid down in the above memorandum.

b. Generally, AFPRS will coordinate the efforts of all its detachments to ensure that the maximum benefit accrues to the Allied Armed Forces and Allied Commission from local resources. All communications intended for the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board will be addressed to AFPRS Rome Area CMF, or AFPRS, APO 512.

- a. FROZEN Stocks of - commodity/material in short supply, located in civilian hands, required by the Allied or Co-belligerent Forces, will be frozen by AG/AMG if so requested by the appropriate Committee of the Local Resources Board concerned. Direct procurement by civilians will be prohibited.
 - b. CONTROLLED items are those, the allocation of which as between all categories, military and civilian, must be made by the appropriate Local Resources Board, or by a duly authorized Committee of that Board.
 - c. RESTRICTED items are those which can only be procured by the Allied and Co-belligerent Forces after the essential needs of the civilian population have been met. Within the territory of each Board, available balances will be declared to the Board, or to a duly authorized Committee of the Board, for allocation.
 - d. UNCONTROLLED items are those in sufficient supply to meet both Allied Armed Forces and civilian needs and of which no allocation is necessary.
4. a. Schedules of Controlled and Restricted items will be issued through command channels on the recommendation of the AFHQ (Italian) Board. No restriction on procurement by Allied Armed Forces or Allied Commission will be made by any military or civil organizations on any items other than those so published by AFHQ.
- b. Lists of Controlled and Restricted items will be frequently reviewed by the Committee concerned and will be kept to a minimum.

5. Procedure

a. Allied Commission, or such other agencies as are responsible, will present data as to the availability of Controlled and Restricted items to the AFHQ Board at least twelve (12) days before the date of the meeting at which allocations will be made.

1. This data will be circulated to all interested services by AFHQ attached to the Agenda for the meeting.
2. Requirements against the items declared available will be forwarded by the services concerned to reach the AFHQ not later than 72 hours before the date of the meeting to permit scheduling and preparation for presentation before the Committee.
3. Civilian requirements will be submitted in bulk by Allied Commission.

- (e) The importation of such materials as are necessary to permit of the continued operation and/or rehabilitation of those plants essential to meet the needs of the Allied Armed Forces and/or the needs of the Italian industrial economy.

- (f) The transfer or prohibition of transfer of plant and machinery from one factory or industry to another, and to authorize such movement as may be deemed necessary.
- (g) Such other matters deriving from the functions of the Committee as may be necessary for the conduct of its business.
2. The Committee may appoint such Sub-Committees as are deemed necessary to operate within the above terms of reference.

ATTACHMENT "B"

In view of the Italian Government taking over more territory and the shortage of most materials they have requested that certain items which do not at present appear on the controlled and restricted lists should be controlled by them. The Committee agreed to accept the procedure agreed between the Italian Government and AC, namely:-

"In respect of materials under Italian Government control only, the Uffici del Commercio and dell'Industria must henceforth advise the firms owning such controlled materials that duly authorised agents of Allied Armed Forces have the right of enquiring the quantities necessary for their needs. Purchasing orders or similar documents of authority issued by the competent Command must be endorsed beforehand by the Provincial Officer of Commerce and Industry."

4. It should not be necessary to disturb the existing efficient mechanical arrangements for the production of agenda and minutes and the forwarding of the secretariat's other functions. Minutes and other documents would be issued jointly by the AFRL Section and the Economic Section, and the AC Subcommittee would of course submit papers and proposals in the first instance to the AC joint secretary for clearance with the AFRL Section and consideration by the Board.

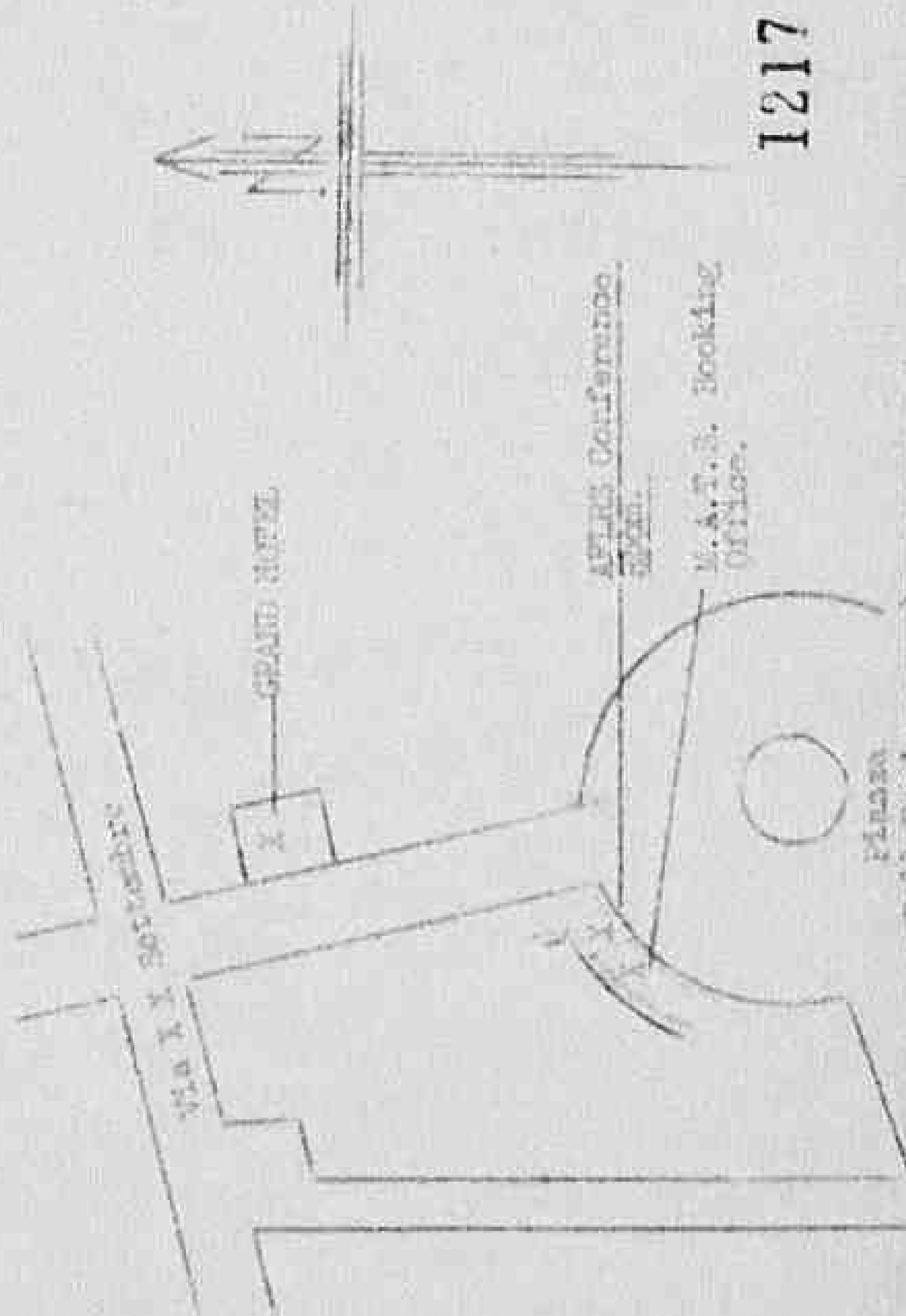

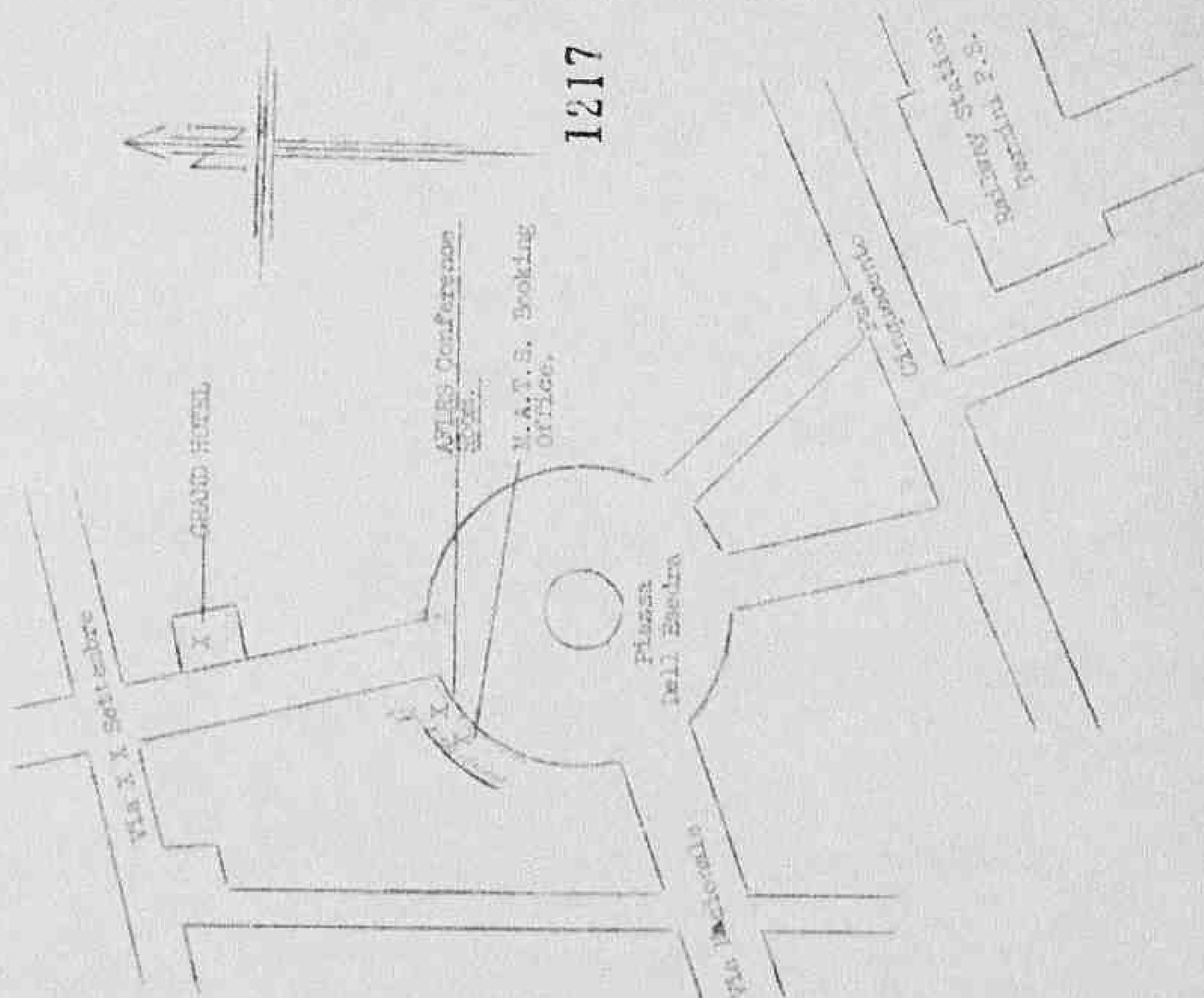

1. Consideration has been given to the best methods for ensuring that local resources found in Army Areas are used to the best interests of the war effort. These considerations have been guided by the following basic principles:-

- (a) Operational requirements of various formations must be first called on all local resources (in stores, materials and facilities) lying within Army boundaries.
- (b) Any balance remaining after demands of (a) have been satisfied will be made available to meet the requirements of the Allied Armed Forces under the civil administration.
- (c) Procurement of local resources will in all cases be restricted to the service or staff section actually responsible for their supply.
- (d) JAG/AS will be the sole authority for issuing stocks of commodities required by the Armed Forces.
- (e) Interchange of available resources between Areas will be arranged mutually.

2. In order to apply the principles stated in para. 1, the following instructions will take effect throughout in support of all local resources found in Army areas:-

- (a) Operational requirements may be met to the limit of availability without reference to this HQ.
- (b) Balances of controlled and controlled items not required in Army areas shall be reported in duplicate to the local command section of this HQ. Controlled and supervised items are defined as follows:-

4. The Italian Government has already put forward proposals to the Sub-Commission that in the case of large concerns such as Fiat, with many different factories under their control, it would be desirable, even in advance of liberation, to determine which individual factories should be available to the armed forces and which should be guaranteed immunity from requisition. This Sub-Commission views this proposal with favour but reserves difficulty in the adoption of such a plan owing to the paucity of accurate information as to the state of the factories immediately prior to liberation.

5. In conclusion, it is felt that if the terms of reference of the Industrial Coordination Committee are roughly on the lines indicated in this memorandum, and if IACC has strong representation on the Committee, the creation of this Committee should be of great value in minimizing the economic distress which is the inevitable result of military operations and the presence of armies of occupation in Italy. Therefore it is felt that IACC should give every encouragement towards the establishment of such a Committee.

SUBJECT: Local Resources Board.

TO : DCOB, Economic Section.

1. Brig. Currie, Vice Chairman of the Local Resources Board and head of the Local Resources Section at AFHQ saw me this morning.

He explained that at a meeting of the Supply Committee yesterday the question of the agreed bid for the harvest of seed potatoes was discussed. It was agreed that AOC should present a statement of the original estimate available to the Services and the actual supply already made. That the Services and the AOC would then agree to further provision of potatoes to the Services taking into account the needs of the civilian population.

He asked whether on this basis we would agree to drop our demand for inclusion of the sentence "Only declared surpluses will be made available to the Armed Forces" in para 4 of Administrative Memorandum No. 48.

I agreed.

2. I showed him the letter from the Ministry of Labour regarding the parity between wages of male and female workers of the Italian State. He said that orders had already been issued that wages paid by the Allied forces should carry the 15% differential between male and female workers and asked that this should be taken up on a high level (Ministerial) before any alteration was made in the order. I think it would be wise if you could see the Minister yourself and confirm from him the letter from his Chief of Cabinet so that there can be no ambiguity on this question.

3. Brig. Currie said that he thought that the AOC representation on the Engineering Materials Sub-Committee needed strengthening. At the moment AOC declared the total stocks of materials available in the country. The Services were obtaining practically 100% of these materials and in his opinion too little was left for the civilian requirements because the AOC representative was either under-briefed or not strong enough in his representations on behalf of the civilian population. He realized the difficulty in putting forward civilian requirements to the Committee but thought that more should be done in this way. Would you take this matter up.

III - ALLOCATION OF LOCALLY PRODUCED FOODSTUFFS

1. It is anticipated that the problem of feeding the Italian civil population will become increasingly difficult as the large centers in the North fall into our hands.

2. To meet this situation the following principles will govern allocations of locally produced foodstuffs by the Food Supply Committee of the Allied Food Local Resources (Italian) Board:

(a) In principle, locally produced foods which are readily stored or transportable will not be made available for allocation to the Armed Forces from 1 October 1944. Specifically, the following are not so available:

Dried Vegetables
Dried Fruits.

Meats

(b) The local military and AFO authorities shall consult together as to local surpluses, having regard to the possibility of moving the surplus to another area as directed by the AFO. That portion of the surplus which cannot be moved so as to arrive in good condition will be available to the Armed Forces under local arrangements. Specifically, the following fall in this category:

Green Vegetables
Root Vegetables
Horn Potatoes

 - (b) For immediate essential civilian uses, as for example Public Works and Utilities, matters affecting Public Health or Safety, Transport, Refugees, rehabilitation of essential industries, etc.

(c) For release of materials in excess of requirements for (a) and (b), declared available to A.F. Local Resources Board, and allocated by them.

5. The availability of Controlled Materials remaining after the emergency needs of 4 (a) and (b) have been met, will be forwarded monthly by AFG Army and Regional HQ to HQ AOC for transmission to A.F. Local Resources Section.

6. The A.F. Local Resources Board will make the allocation of available materials between AOC/AMS and military requirements. This Board will then forward (under terms of para. 5, AFGHQ A.M. Memo. 44) to its appropriate subordinate organizations, or to L.R.S., HQ, AAF or comparable subordinate HQ, such military allocations as may be appropriately dealt with by them. All release orders issued by LRS, HQ AAF in the Army area should be addressed by them directly to the AMS Provincial Commissioner concerned, for local endorsement and proper recording. This will facilitate prompt release to the Services of materials allocated to them.

7. No other method or authority for the freezing and release of civilian owned war material than those now prescribed will be recognised in the AMS Area. These instructions apply only to territory North of the Army boundary.

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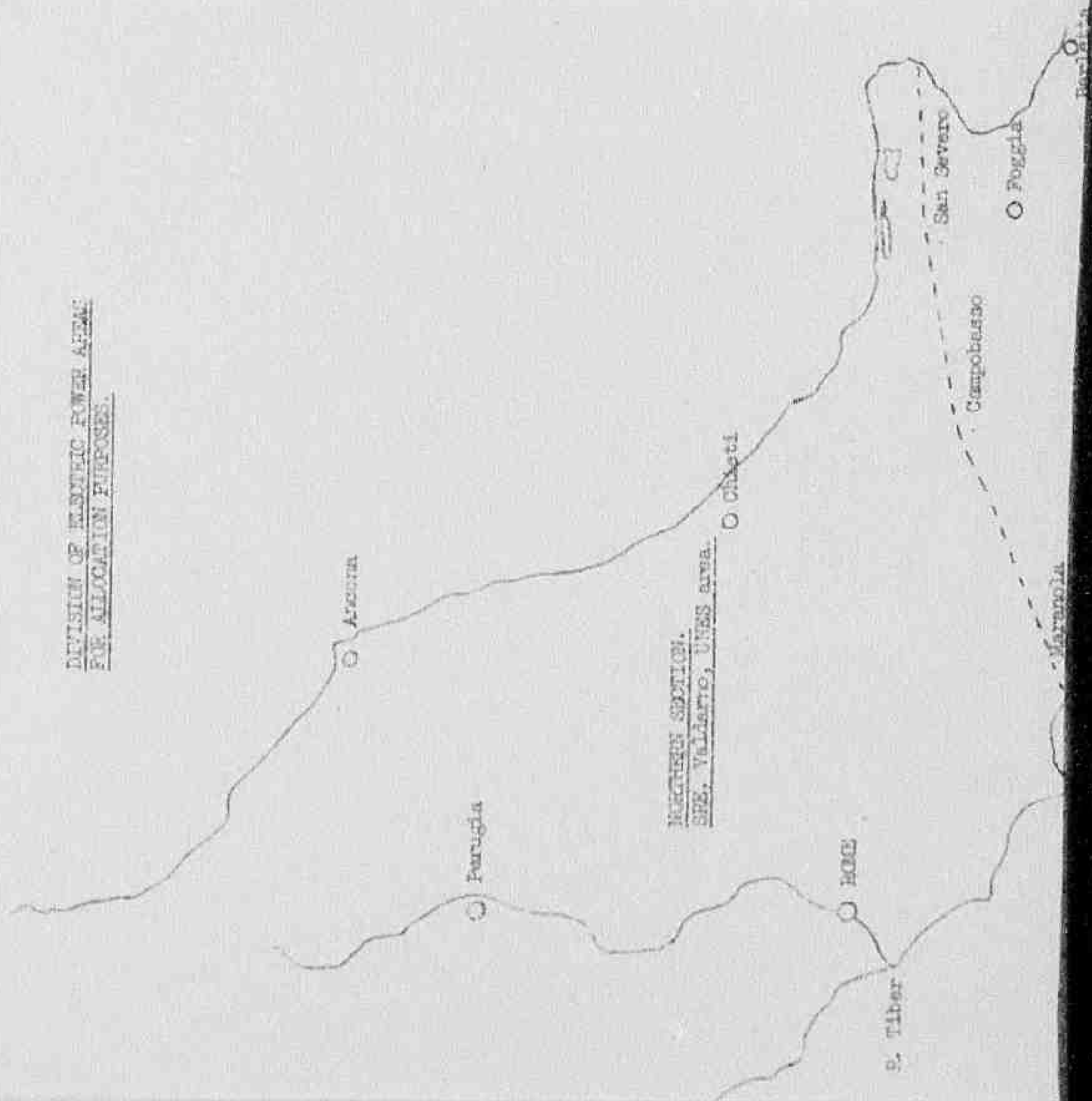

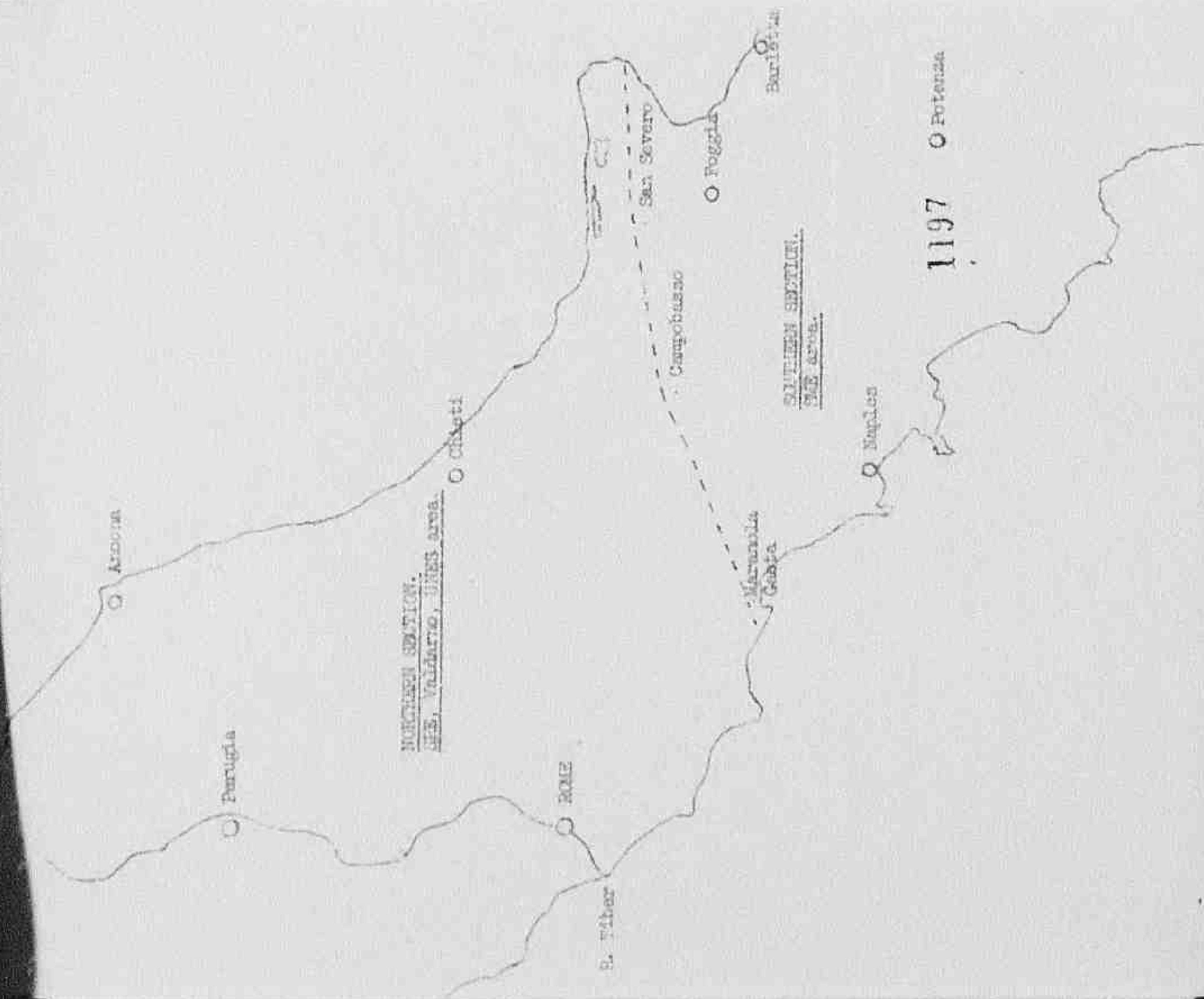

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT:- Social Insurance Coverage for Civilians employed directly by the Allied Armed Forces.

TO:- Chairman, Labour & Wages Control Committee.

1. At its meeting of 15 May 1944, the Local Resources (Italian) Board approved the extension of the Italian social insurance provisions to direct employees of the Allied Armed Forces and requested the Allied Control Commission to develop a plan, acceptable to Headquarters AAI for such extension.

2. The plan embodied in this memorandum is submitted to the Labour & Wages Control Committee for consideration. The plan is recommended by the Labour Sub-Commission, AOC, on the basis of extensive study of the problems involved and alternative possibilities of solution. The guiding objective has been to:-

- (a) determine the minimum information required to assure social insurance benefits to workers and enable the setting up of Italian State funds for the purpose; and
- (b) devise a method whereby the Armed Forces may supply the information with a minimum of clerical work and record keeping.

3. The Italian Government has agreed to pay for and to provide social insurance benefits covering:-

- (a) Accidental injury or death (as at present).
- (b) illness of worker or of member of his family.
- (c) Unemployment.
- (d) Invalidity and old age.
- (e) Tuberculous.
- (f) Marriage and births.

4. The minimum information required consists of data sufficient to identify the worker, his classification and pay rate, and the dates of his employment, which it is proposed to record and furnish to the worker by means of a "Worker's Social Insurance Card" (copy attached).

4. The minimum information required consists of data sufficient to identify the worker, his classification and pay rate, and the dates of his employment, which is in proposed to record and furnish to the worker by means of a "Worker's Social Insurance Card" (copy attached).

5. The following is proposed as the responsibility to be assumed by the Armed Forces:-

- (a) the paying officer or his delegate will be responsible for preparation of a "Worker's Social Insurance Card", Form III-1, for each worker employed. The cards will be maintained in an appropriate file during the period of employment.
- (b) The file will be initially constituted to include cards for all workers paid the first pay-period after the effective date of the plan. The date of commencing work, from the standpoint of social insurance coverage, will be considered as being the same as the effective date of the plan and will be so entered on the worker's card, except in the case of such employing units as are able/

will not make to previous retrospective coverage for their employees by supplying the actual remaining date, when it is verifiable.

- (3) When employment termination or is interrupted by illness or other unemployment contingencies, the card will be completed, certified by the paying officer or his delegate, and will be given to the worker or enable him to establish his social insurance rights. A new card will be prepared, to cover any succeeding period of employment, should he again return to work.
- (4) When a worker, during his period of employment, wishes to apply for social rate for a member of his family or for a marriage or birth allowance (d.e. a benefit not contingent on his own separation from work), a certification that he is currently employed by the armed forces will be given him, at his request, on the "Worker's Beneficiary Status Report", Form 31-1 (copy attached), based on information already collected on the basic social insurance card.

6. A suggested file maintenance procedure is also attached hereto.

SUBMITTED FILE MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE "WORKER'S SOCIAL INSURANCE CARD"

Form SI-1

1. The first four lines of card (items 1 to 5) will be filled out when or before worker draws first pay. The length of the pay period (weekly, monthly, bi-weekly or semi-monthly) will be indicated by circling the appropriate word in item 6 or by rubber stamp. The card then goes into active file.

2. Each pay day, cards in the active file will be pulled as workers are paid and a tally will be made on the card by circling the number of the pay period in item 7. If the worker is leaving and is being paid off, the card will be completed and given to him. Otherwise it will be returned to the active file. Cards not pulled will represent

represent workers who walked out on the job or who have otherwise deserted themselves since last pay period. These will be entered in space provided in item 6 and will be placed in dead file. If worker later reports and returns to work, card will be replaced in active file. If not, cards which applied to worker have been in dead file will be destroyed and insurance rights forfeited.

3. Whenever a worker's employment terminates, without any definite understanding as to resumption (such as in case of a temporary shut-down or suspension), or is interrupted by illness of other considerable contingency, his card will be completed and given to him. If he is subsequently re-employed, a new card will be made out.

NOTE:-

Both items 6 and 7 are simply tally items to simplify maintenance of the file. They may be used in whatever manner and with whatever variations the unit supervisor finds desirable.

SUBJECT: Sheep & Goats for S & T

TO : Brigadier LUSH

1. In June 50,000 Sheep & Goats were allocated to the French Armed Forces.

2. Of this allocation 10,000 head were obtained. The French attempted to transport the balance to France. This was stopped by A.F.H.Q.

3. S & T still have a balance of 8000 head outstanding from an allocation made to them.

4. S & T now state that they want 48,000 head for Native Troops to satisfy requirements to the end of December.

5. The present position in this, that at the last CAO's conference the CAO laid it down that as the allocation had been made to the French, it was immaterial to us if the allocation was transferred to S & T. He therefore authorized the transfer accordingly.

6. It is felt by Food Sub-Commission as well as by Agriculture that Native Troops who are engaged in battle cannot be deprived of this vital foodstuff but in view of the very precarious civilian food situation, it is considered that the Army might be asked to make available for civilian consumption an equal quantity of tinned meat (This meat being unacceptable to native troops for religious reasons). In any case, they should be asked to curtail their purchases to the minimum.

2. The meeting referred to in the Directive was attended by Colonel Legg. On his return he briefed Lt. Col. Stewart to produce the directive. The appendix attached is virtually the minutes of the meeting.
3. As a result of the meeting, Admin Memo No. 42 was produced under instructions of the C.A.O. It was not agreed by Food Sub-Commission.
4. Although the C.A.O. would not consult a lower formation, it is felt that the memorandum should have been submitted to Captain Stone, as joint chairman, before issue.
5. I have spoken to Colonel Stewart and he can throw no light on paragraph 5 of the memorandum. In his view there is no necessity for it.
6. It is the view of this Sub-Commission that Citrous Fruits, Soft fruits and nuts should be dealt with under paragraph 2b. It is estimated that there will be ample quantities of nuts, within the limits of transportation, for allocations to be made to the Armed Forces.
7. Col. Stewart maintains that as far as potatoes are concerned, his directive with appendix attached gives a truer picture of what passed at the meeting on Sept. 18th than does the memorandum.

3. The APO will not withhold the declared surpluses on substitution for use outside the area in which they are produced unless it has been established that they can be delivered in good condition to the areas in which they are required.

5. The AOC will not withhold from declared supplies any quantities for use outside the area in which they are produced unless it has been established that they can be delivered in good condition in the areas in which they are required.

6. Potatoes: Owing to a failure of crop it will not be possible to supply the full quantities which the Armed Forces should receive from the AOC. The Chief Quartermaster, AOC, and the Director of Supplies and Transport, respectively, in consultation with AOCs, AOCs, will also at agreed times bid for locally produced potatoes. Thereafter, paragraph 2 (b) above will apply.

5. Common fruits, soft fruits and nuts will continue to be made available under existing procedures.

6. Hospitals: The certified medical requirements for hospitals for patients only, both British and American, will be met, and nothing in this instruction is to be read as limiting the necessary direct supply of locally produced products to hospitals.

DIRECTIVE ON LOCAL PRODUCE IN ITALY

At a meeting of AFM on 18th to determine policy and procedure in the allocation of local produce, surplus to civilian requirements, it was agreed as follows:

1. POLICY:

a. Locally produced foods which can easily be stored, or transported within reasonable time should not be considered as available supplies for the Armed Forces. Specifically, dried fruits, dried vegetables, and potatoes will always be in this category.

b. The Great claims of the Allied Forces shall be for hospital requirements. Certified minimum requirements for hospitals, British and American will be met and nothing in this directive is to be read as limiting the necessary minimum supply for hospitals.

c. That portion of locally declared surplus which cannot be transported for civilian requirements in good condition within reasonable time to be determined by the Allied Control Commission, shall become available to the Armed Forces under local arrangements. (e.g. if in area "A", say 500 tons of any cabbage or cauliflower is declared surplus and only 200 tons can be transported for civilian consumption, the remaining 300 tons will become available for the Armed Forces). Root vegetables, green vegetables and fresh fruits are in this category.

d. Certain small quantities of local produce are required for victualling ships. These will be made available as a special priority after meeting the requirements of hospitals.

e. Where green or root vegetables of which there is not a surplus are bid for by the Armed Services at the Food Supply Committee, the Armed Forces will offer at the time of bidding the equivalent, or some other appropriate, preserved vegetables to the Allied Control Commission for use as directed by the Allied Control Commission in substitution of the green and root vegetables that may be made available for the Armed Forces.

2. PROCEDURE:

a. Regional Supply Officers will report monthly as at present the surplus

- b. If in the future between the monthly reports, a surplus of a vegetable becomes apparent this surplus will immediately be reported to Allied Control Commission, Food Sub-Commission.
- c. Representatives of Allied Forces Local Resources (Italian) Board will co-operate with Regional Supply Office of regions in the work of assessing availability and surplus.

3. DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS

SUBJECT: Industrial Coordination Committee.

TO : Admin Chief,
Diplomatic Section.

1. As requested, I have prepared this Memorandum outlining the views of this Sub-Commission in regard to the establishment of the proposed Industrial Coordination Committee of the A.F.L.R. Board.

2. Terms of Reference: We submit the following outline of what we consider should be the terms of reference of the proposed Committee:-

- (a) To determine an equitable allocation of "production potential" as between the needs of the Allied Armies and Italian civilian economy.
- (b) To ensure that the needs of the Allied Armies for stocks of raw materials, partly-finished products and finished products and equipment are met in accordance with pre-determined priorities which should allow for the maximum preservation of Italian industrial economy.

3. Policy: Under the terms of reference enumerated above it is suggested that the functions of the Committee would fall under the following heads:-

- (a) The division of the various factories into two groups. The first group being for those that are available to the armed forces for requisition, should the armed forces so desire, and the second being a list of factories which should be immune from requisition on the grounds of their products being essential to the civilian economy.
- (b) To give orders for the preservation of stock inventories in factories in the second group enumerated above, and to consider such inventories with a view to determining what portion of the stocks should be considered surplus and therefore available for allocation to the armed forces.

4. The Italian Government has already put forward proposals to this Sub-Commission that in the case of large concerns such as Fiat, with many different factories under their control, it would be desirable, even in advance of liberation, to determine which individual factories should be available to the armed forces, and which should be guaranteed immunity from requisition. This Sub-Commission views this proposal with favour but foresees difficulty in the adoption of such a plan owing to the paucity of accurate information as to the state of the factories immediately prior to liberation.

5. In conclusion, it is felt that if the terms of reference of the Industrial Coordination Committee are really on the lines indicated in this memorandum, and if A.C.C. is given representation on the Committee, the creation of this Committee should be of great value in maintaining the scientific interest which is the inevitable result of military operations and the presence of armies of occupation in Italy. Therefore it is felt that A.C.C. should give every encouragement towards the establishment of such a Committee.

TO : Major QUALL

1. Reference our conversation this morning on the above subject. I have spoken to Loefer (AFI-8) and he says that it is now too late to get this matter put on the agenda of the AFI-8 meeting on October 7.

2. However, the question could be raised under other business, either by myself or by Antolini in his capacity as Head of Economic Section or by Brigadier Lush who, I believe, will also be present.

3. The present position in this, that at the last CAO's conference the CAO laid it down that as the allocation had been made to the French, it was immaterial to us if the allocation was transferred to S & T. He therefore authorized the transfer accordingly.

4. It is felt by Food Sub-Commission as well as by Agriculture that Native Troops who are engaged in battle cannot be deprived of this vital foodstuff but in view of the very precarious civilian food situation, it is considered that the Army might be asked to make available for civilian consumption an equal quantity of tinned meat (This meat being unacceptable to native troops for religious reasons).

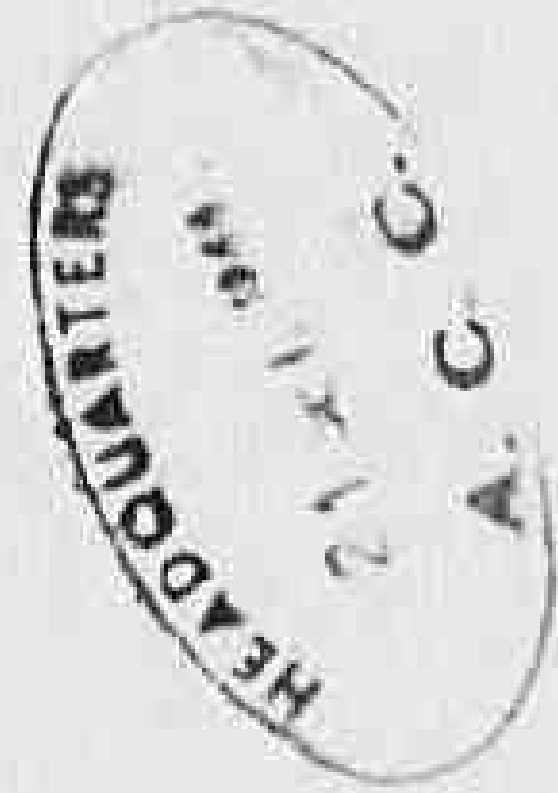

b) Under the previous AFM(I)Board, the Allied Control Commission had reported inventories and quantities estimated to be produced during the month of allocation for only OBTAINED and RECOVERED materials as listed by the Board.

3. Is it planned that the procedures of the previous Board ^{will} be continued for the new AFM Board?

a) What commodities are to be reported by the AFM Board?

b) In what detail will the AFM Board desire various categories reported, for purposes of general allocation as opposed with previous specific allocations made directly to services by the AFM(I)B?

c) Will it be desirable to report fixed plant equipment, the general allocation of which may disrupt rehabilitation and any future production of the factories reported?

(1) Plant Equipment it is believed is not requisitioned by the services without prior consent of ACI/AC.

(2) Liquidation of industrial resources by ACI as per para. 41. Admin. Memo No. 41 necessitates retention of equipment in plants capable of essential production.

d) Similarly, should raw materials required for production be reported; such as steel ingots, sulphuric acid, lead, cement, etc., even though included in the categories of controlled materials?

1. The Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board established in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Number 78, 1943, is transferred from the control of HQ AAI to that of AFHQ.

SECRETARIAT

The Secretariat of the AFHQ Italian Resources Board will be provided by the Allied Force Local Resources Section, AFHQ, the Chief of which shall act as Secretary.

4. The Function of the Board is to insure the orderly development and allocation of local resources for the common war effort.

Subject to the direction of AFHQ the Board will:

- a. Allocate between AGC, Naval, Army and Air Force such commodities as are produced in the area under its control, and of which the quantities available are insufficient to meet all requirements.
- b. Restrict dealings in specified commodities in order to achieve control over their allocation, lists of such commodities to be kept by the Secretariat of the Board.
- c. Receive applications and to make recommendations to the competent authorities for:
 - (1) The equitable allocation of factories, warehouses and other commercial and industrial facilities and space, and,
 - (2) The control of their use and operation.
- d. Indicate to the Allied Control Commission the degree and nature of the exploitation of such local industries, in the area for which the Allied Control Commission are responsible, as are required to support the military effort.
- e. Make recommendations to the competent authorities on such other matters deriving from the functions of the Board as may be necessary to make the work of the Board effective.

5. AFHQ will maintain, in areas to be recommended by the Board, such subordinate organizations as are necessary for the conduct of the Board's business. Where such organizations are allotted to areas under the control of HQ AAI or a comparable subordinate Headquarters they will be placed under command of that Headquarters and will act in accordance with the policies of the Board conveyed to them through Staff channels.

6. The Board is empowered to require such persons as may be necessary for the conduct of its business to attend its meetings and to produce such records as the Board may require.

7. The Staff Section at AFHQ to be approached in matters concerning the Board is the Allied Force Local Resources Section, AFHQ.

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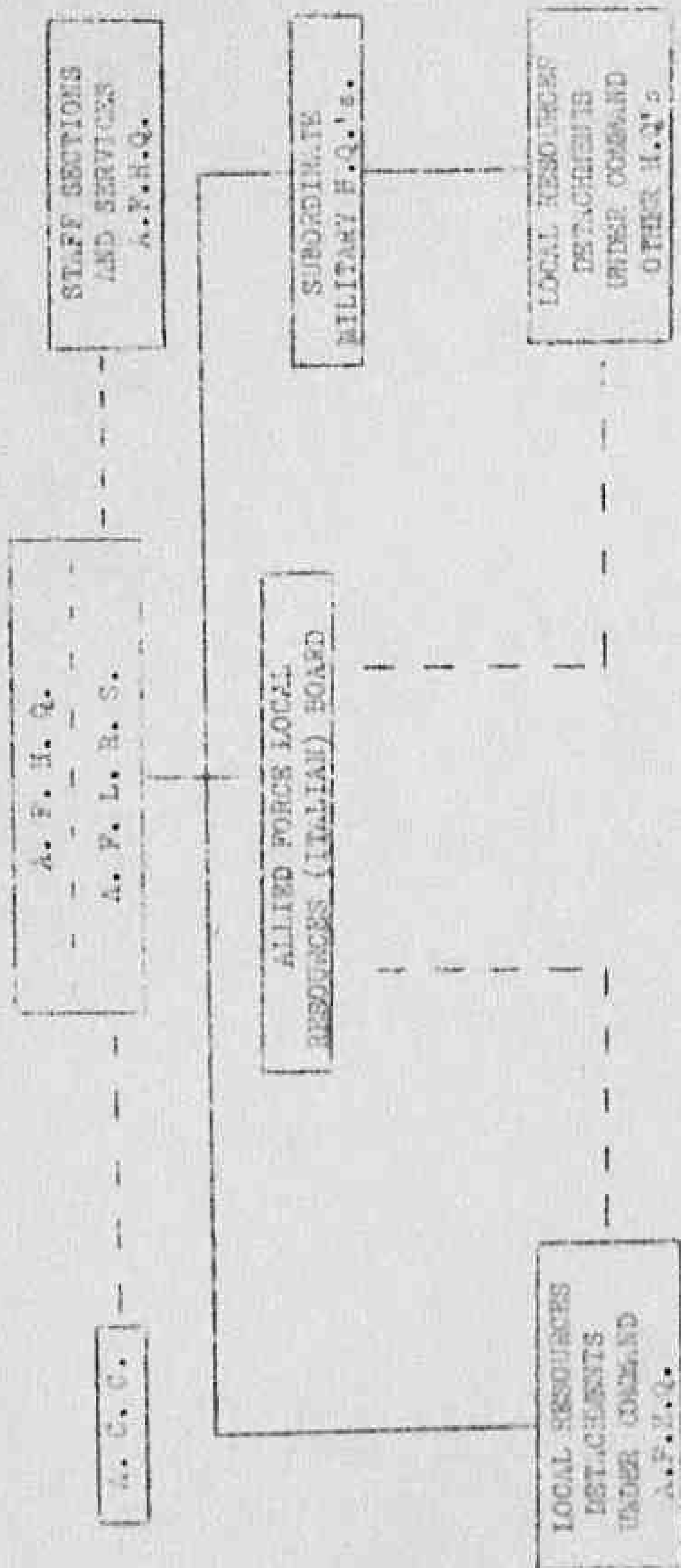
