Extract of A.F.I.R.B. Meeting of 3 Mar 45.39 (c) Miscellaneous Purposes Committee

A representative of the Italian Government attended to answer questions arising out of the Committee's report on the Hemp Industry. He, in conjunction with a representative from Hemp Control Office AC, stated that the three main essentials necessary to ensure the 25,000 tons of hemp per annum which were required to meet the minimum military and civilian needs were as follows:

- i) adequate supply of seed;
- ii) sufficient fertilizer;
- iii) a remunerative price to farmers for their crop.

Arising out of the above:

- i) As the representative of the Hemp Control Office stated that the supply of 200 tons of seed stated to be en route for Italy would be sufficient to make up the local deficiency, no further action by the Board was considered necessary.
- ii) The anticipated arrival in the first half of March of a first consignment of nitrogenous fertilizer was reported by G-5 AFHQ. The Italian Government representative stated that this consignment together with the balance if delivered during April of the 5,000 tons required would be sufficient to produce the 25,000 tons of hemp needed. G-5 AFHQ was requested to take such steps as were necessary to ensure the arrival of the balance of the fertilizer during April.
- iii) HQ AC was requested to consider in the light of other economic problems the question of increasing the price of raw hemp to 8,000 lire per quintal, if desirable and to press their views on the Italian Government. It appeared to the Board that this was the controlling factor and it was pointed out to HQ AC that the military requirement was urgent.

HQ AC invited to arrange for its representative at the Miscellaneous Purposes Committee to present, as far in advance as possible, his difficulties in connection with the hemp industry to the Committee in order that Services could assist where practicable in overcoming them.

Except as stated above the Board accepted and approved the report of the meeting of 17 Feb 45.

4. Should the above rate of consumption continue and the further 2500 tons be pooled it is estimated that spinners and rope-makers would cease operating about the end of July and weavers about one month later. The shutting down of factories would create serious upheaval in the working classes and would also create difficulties when the factories were required to recommence production.

5. In the opinion of this office there are two solutions:

- That military priorities be established for each type i.e. a certain weight of raw hemp allocated to each type according to its military importance up to a maximum of 560 tons raw hemp per month.
- a pro-rata scaling down of the whole production not to exceed 560 tons raw hemp per month, this latter would however tend to favour civilian rather than military users.

- 2 -

6. From a study of the figures it would appear that rope, and heavy canvas are used exclusively by the Services, whereas medium and light canvas and sacks are largely used by civilian bodies. From a manufacturing point of view it is necessary however that a certain amount of light and medium Canvas and Sacking be made. Twine and Thread do not consume a great deal of hemp and need not therefore be considered.

7. In the above figures no calculation has been made of tow as this would be consumed in making No. 100,000 Jute type sacks per month and the 800 tons of binder twine required by agriculture for the harvest.

8. No account has been taken of any possible releases of raw hemp or Fishing line to the Fishery Division.

9. It is requested that decision be made as soon as possible so that the necessary instructions can be given by this office.

10. The following is put forward purely as a suggestion that might be adopted:

Reduce Rope to 300 tons net, thus saving 65 tons gross Hemp
" Light Canvas to 25,000 Sq. m. thus saving 57,700 tons of gross Hemp
Reduce Medium Canvas to 25,000 Sq. m. thus saving 16,875 tons of gross Hemp
Reduce Sacks (Cereal) to 50,000, thus saving 94. tons Gr. Hemp.
Saving in tonnage would total 193,575 tons.

We have good stocks of both light and medium canvas and the 50,000 sacks added to the Jute type sacks would make a monthly production of 150,000 sacks.

A report was received from HQ, AC Economic Section stating that a military requisition for 5,000 tons of ammonium nitrate fertilizer for use of hemp growers had been placed on AFHQ. Ammonium nitrate not being available, ammonium sulphate has been accepted in lieu with a tonnage adjustment to ensure the delivery of a similar total nitrogen content. Requisitions have been forwarded by AFHQ for delivery in late February.

HQ, AC representative confirmed that when this fertilizer arrived it would be delivered to the hemp growers and not utilized for other purposes.

34. SEWING THREADS AND TWINES:

A table (Appendix "B" attached) on the relative weights and lengths of sewing threads and twines was submitted by HQ, AC to assist services in the preparation of their demands.

HEMP SITUATION REPORT UP TO 31st JANUARY 1945

1. Control of the hemp industry was first taken over by A.M.G. early in January 1944. No directive was issued but it was soon evident that the industry could, if rehabilitated, provide many important military and naval needs which would otherwise have to be imported.

2. Lt. Comdr. Schlze, Capt. Bradbury and Capt. McVary took over the existing Italian Government hemp organisation under Regional decrees.

3. When these decrees lapsed about July 1944 and the Naples area was handed back to the Italian Government, steps were immediately taken to have an Italian decree published for the whole country and to institute a new body, the Consorzio Nazionale Canapa, with wide powers for the control of factories as well as raw material. The old Italian organisation had no control of factories but only of raw material and of export. The old organisations were dissolved.

4. In view of the importance to the armed forces of the various products manufactured from hemp, all hemp and its products are "controlled" items and, as such only released through the appropriate committee of the A.F.I.R.(1) Board.

5. The various items now being manufactured from hemp and tow are:

a. Rope - For Naval, Merchant ships and Military use. Also a certain amount of inferior quality rope for agriculture and civilian purposes. Approximately 400 tons monthly.

b. Canvases - Light, heavy and medium. The demands for these are far greater than the manufacturing capacity and would be still greater if light material could be made available for more civilian purposes.

These cloths are a substitute for cotton and linen and can be used to make bed linen, mattresses, sheets, working clothes, canvas shoes and summer suits for both men and women. Present manufacture about 250,000 metres monthly.

c. Fishing Line - There is a demand for about 10 tons monthly at present.

d. Sacks - Present production is about 120,000 a month which is not sufficient to supply the demands especially at harvest periods. As about 50% of the sack making potentiality is on the more machines that make medium canvas, periodical adjustments have to be made increasing the production of one or the other in accordance with the urgency of the needs.

e. Sewing Threads of varying types are obviously essential for use in the manufacture of sacks and canvas products.

f. Twines and Strings - There is a steady increase in the demand for these as more industries are rehabilitated, and goods have to be

moved round the country. The present production is quite insufficient and a cotton spun yarn has to be substituted in many cases.

This, of course, interferes with the production of binder twine for harvesting.

The present demands for string and twine amount to 55 tons a month for:

Military purposes -- The tying up and repairing of grain and flour sacks, citrus exports, tobacco factories, publishing firms, shoemakers' twine, etc., etc.

6. Factories therefore must be kept at 100% production if essential needs are to be even approximately met (they cannot be met in full). But factories are equipped 98% with American and British machinery and no spare parts have come into the country for four years. Production, however, has had to go on.

7. It will be obvious that repairs to the machinery will be required more and more frequently as time goes on and will be increasingly urgent. Buildings, partly damaged by war and by wear and tear, must be kept in reasonable repair. Glass must be renewed, electric lamps replaced, electric fittings renewed, etc.

8. To keep buildings and machinery in reasonable repair and efficiency, it is obvious that all sorts of materials will be required. Coal, timber, glass, oxygen, acetylene, tools, rivets, nails, paint, oil, lubricants, greases, leather belting, tiles, corrugated iron, steel, iron solder, electrodes for welding, electric lamp bulbs, wire, switches etc., etc.

9. In the early stages of rehabilitation it would have been impossible to get factories started in production, if it had not been for the direct assistance of the armed forces, particularly of the Royal Navy who supplied coal, oil, grease, soap, paint, nails, oxygen, acetylene at critical times. At that time there was no other organization through which these materials could be obtained.

10. After the A.M.O. and A.C. Supply organizations started to function, supplies, if available, arrived with reasonable regularity but these supply arrangements have now been turned over to the Italian organizations with some resultant confusions and delays.

Examples

- a. Short supply of transportation for the raw hemp and semi-finished material to factories.

Under the A.M.O. organization, 9 lorries a day were supplied; now two or three civilian vehicles, often in poor condition, are available on an average daily. For this reason, rope production for January is reduced from 400 to 50 tons.

- b. Demands for P.O.L. wood, metals etc, are not being supplied; possibly due to the fact that the Italian organization for dealing with demands is not yet properly set up or familiar with the routine for obtaining supplies.

- c. Railway bids by Italian organizations are not made in time, resulting in one case of three weeks delay, at least, in the movement of 400 tons of fertilizer.

11. While these delays may be only natural in the turn-over of such a big organization, they have a serious effect on factory production. Besides destroying the confidence in the organization which has been laboriously built up, the urgent need of the armed forces and essential civil organizations is such that any fall in production cannot be permitted. The overseas ministry of supply have been able, so far, to count on hemp type products being procurable locally and a sudden shortfall in production cannot easily be replaced by additional imports.

12. The only certain remedy for making good the supply shortage is a request for assistance direct to navy or military, via investigations and negotiations through normal channels are far too slow, when urgent materials are in demand. Whilst every consideration and assistance has been given, it is obviously unsatisfactory and unfair to military or civil organizations to expect such help from them, at short notice, when they have no direct control over the consent of the industry or organization.

13. Although 75 to 80% of the production of factories is absorbed by the armed forces and the balance is required under a direct military need for "the prevention of disease and unrest", the intermediate stage of actual manufacture is a civilian matter and has to work, to a great extent, under all the difficulties that engender civilian organizations in Italy.

14. The present status of production at the moment will be found in the "availability report" for March 1944 from which it will be seen that rope production has fallen considerably.

15. It is recommended that requirements for the hemp industry for transportation, railroad and water, and demands for material "controlled," "restricted," or otherwise, be treated as military demands insofar as such treatment is necessary in order to insure supply.

16. To implement this recommendation, a list of materials and transport required on a monthly basis is being prepared. Availability of hemp products for military elements will be in rough ratio to what materials can be made available by military and naval units.

17. It is the opinion of certain members of the Hemp Control Office that better results would continue to be obtained by the exercise of allied control. Nevertheless, as with other industries in Italy, it is necessary to follow the higher policy laid down regarding their return to Italian administration.

APPENDIX "B"

RATES OF HIRE FOR HORSE DRAWN TRANSPORT

1. It has been recommended that the rates of hire for horse drawn transport as laid down in HQ AAF Instr No 46 be reviewed.
2. The Economic Section of the Allied Commission in their letter ES/18.08 dated 2 DEC 44 recommend that in preparing these new rates they be determined in such a way as to allow for variation in the demand and supply of horse drawn vehicles in the different Regional Areas.
3. The Economic Section further suggest that the new rates be equivalent to the prevailing wages paid in that locality to a day-labourer for an eight hour day, subject to an over-riding maximum.
4. It is therefore proposed that the following maximum rates of hire and conditions of employment be adopted:-
 - (a) The following rates do not include the services of a driver.
 - (b) All labour (including driver) employed will be paid for in accordance with the normal Allied Forces rates of pay and conditions of employment.
 - (c) The rates include the provision of fodder. When contractors cannot produce the fodder, it may be provided from Army sources on repayment, the value being deducted from the total amount due.
 - (d) The daily rates of hire for a 10 hr day will be:-

One Horse	Normal Allied Forces daily rate payable to a day labourer in the area locality on an eight hour basis plus 2 hrs overtime.	Not to exceed 250

For any fraction of a day, a proportionate amount of the above rates will be paid.

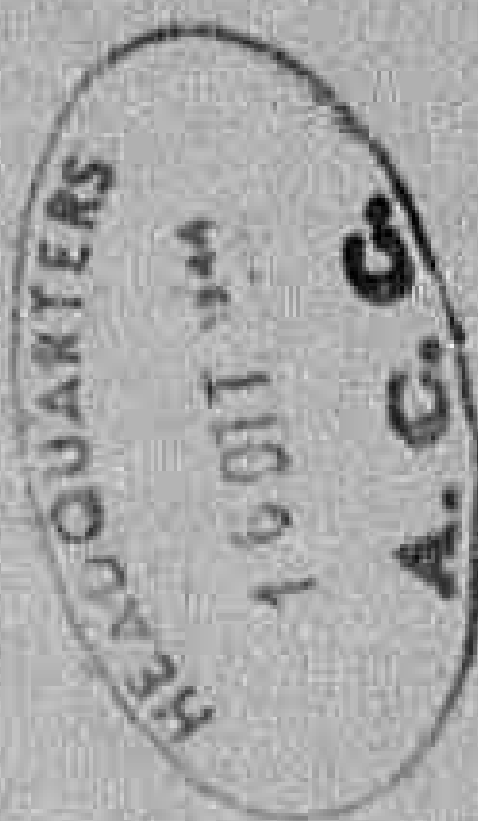

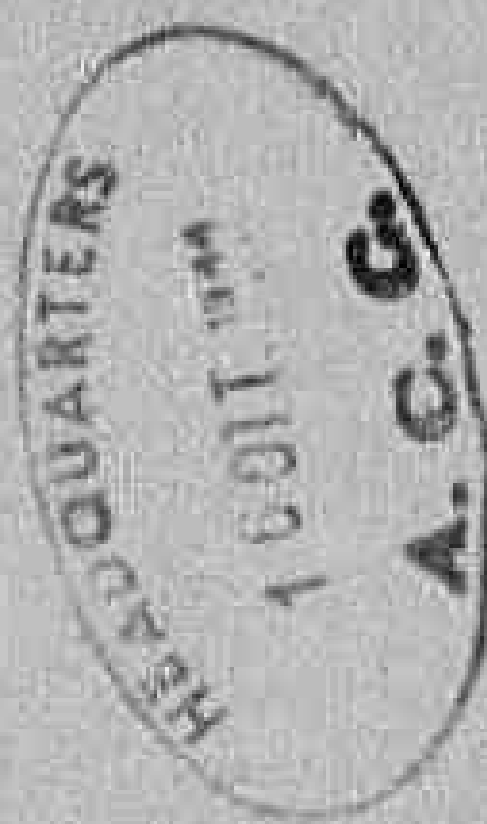
