3. A draft of revised terms of reference of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee was agreed by the Drafting Committee and is attached as appendix "A".

4. A procedure for implementing paragraph 1 of the draft terms of reference, in so far as the requisitioning and de-requisitioning of industrial properties are concerned, was agreed and is attached as appendix "B".

5. In case respect the Drafting Committee departed from the points in the GAO AFHQ's letter of 4 JAN 45. This letter suggested having one or more neutral inspectors or referees who could carry out investigations on the spot on behalf of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee with respect to conflict between military and civil interests in industry. The Drafting Committee considered that:

(a) It would be difficult or impossible to find an inspector or referee who would be truly neutral and at the same time sufficiently "in the picture" to make an intelligent investigation.

(b) If the AC and military documents in the case are sufficiently factual, a technical review of the facts would be redundant.

The Drafting Committee considered that:

- (a) It would be difficult or impossible to find an inspector or referee who would be truly neutral and at the same time sufficiently "in the picture" to make an intelligent investigation.
- (b) If the AC and military documents in the case are sufficiently factual, a technical review of the facts would be redundant.

6. As an alternative, it is suggested that one or more investigating Sub-Committees should be established which could both investigate the facts and possibly settle the matter "out of court", thereby relieving the Industrial Co-ordination Committee and expediting settlement.

7. The Drafting Committee was not instructed to consider the draft AFHQ Administrative Instructions on "Co-ordination of Military and Civilian Requirements for War Effort".

TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE INDUSTRIAL CO-ORDINATION COMMISSION

1. To adjudicate upon all cases referred to it wherein there is a conflict of interest between the requirements of the Allied Armed Forces and the Italian civilian economy with respect to
 - (a) The equitable allocation of factories, warehouses and other commercial and industrial facilities and space, and,
 - (b) The control of their use and operation.
2. To determine the need for new or revised policies and procedures governing military activities which affect Italian industry, and recommend such policies and procedures to the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board for approval and executive action through AFHQ if necessary.

APPENDIX "B"

PROCEDURE FOR REQUISITIONING AND
DE-REQUISITIONING OF INDUSTRIAL PROPERTIES

In order to implement para 1 of the revised terms of reference of IOC, the following procedure has been agreed by the Drafting Committee:

1. The IOC will appoint one of more investigating Sub-Committees consisting of not more than three members to consider the cases defined in para 2 below. X
2. In the event the military has occupied or plans to occupy a property that Allied Commission considers essential to the civilian economy, Allied Commission may request the responsible Area, District, Base Section or Army Commander to vacate the property or alter the plan, whether urgent operational need has been advanced by the military authority or not. Allied Commission will accompany their request with a complete and factual justification. X
3. The Area, District, Base Section, Army or equivalent commander will consider the request and every effort will be made to reach a solution satisfactory to AC and the military commander. In the event a satisfactory solution cannot be found, the military commander will return the request to AC with a written statement as to his reasons for being unable to comply with the request. X
4. AC may then submit the matter to the investigating sub-committee through AFIRS. The sub-committee will investigate the case in detail and attempt to find some solution agreeable to the parties concerned.
5. If no such solution can be found, the sub-committee will submit the case to IOC with recommendations.
6. The IOC will then adjudicate and make its award. If no protest is received by AFIRS within 48 hours after the time of the meeting, such award will become effective. In the event of protest, the matter will be referred to the AFIR (Italian) Board, the decisions of which will be binding upon all parties.

My dear Admiral Stone:

Following the last meeting of the Industrial Coordination Committee, I made arrangements to have an immediate investigation made of any cases in which American Forces were occupying industrial premises vital to the civilian economy. After several telephone conferences between representatives of the Industry Sub Commission and members of my staff, the Industry Sub Commission wrote to us on 1 January 45 stating that at present there is no case of an industrial premise now occupied by U. S. Forces that they were prepared to have my staff investigate.

While the above discussions were taking place, the proposal to requisition the Solvay Works was referred to you for comment. Based on your presentation of the case for the Solvay Plant, I am sending instructions to the Peninsular Base Section that neither the Solvay Plant nor its quarry is to be requisitioned. If it is possible for the Solvay management to contract with PENSEX to furnish quarry products or to do shop or repair work for PENSEX, such contracts would aid the military effort in that area. It is understood, of course, that such contracts would be made with your approval and would not interfere with the operation of the plant.

When a case is developed in which the American Forces hold a facility which is critical to the civil economy, I will be glad to insure that the case is given immediate attention and fair consideration.

My dear Admiral,

I have been giving further thought to the difficult question of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee, and have re-read the note which you prepared as a result of the meeting on 22 Dec. It is quite clear to me that we shall not get anything more from the Drafting Committee without a fresh policy directive.

I am inclined to agree with the views already expressed that in strict fact there is nothing in the original terms of reference of this Committee which could not be carried out by existing machinery. The Committee has already agreed that a duplication of machinery is to be avoided.

On the other hand, I should be opposed to the abolition of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee until we are quite sure that in practice it is not a more useful machine for certain purposes than any existing at present. It has already shown that there are things it can do. I think that the instructions being written on the subjects respectively of the Allied Commission's share in future planning, de-requisitioning, and the procedure for establishing what can be done to increase the output of plants in military hands, prove this.

You will agree, I am sure, that we should not set the Drafting Committee to work again until we are agreed in principle, and we have now established the fact that there is disagreement amongst us on the original terms of reference. My proposal to you is that the Drafting Committee should now be instructed by us to make a fresh start, with the object of presenting new terms of reference to the Board. In doing so, it should bear in mind the general agreement that the terms of reference of the Committee should not, as the present terms do, overlap those of other bodies.

In outline, I suggest that the terms of reference of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee should be drafted to cover the following functions:-

- A. The Committee to exist to act as a Court of Appeal of the first instance to study and make recommendations in all cases which are referred to it by either the military or civil agencies where military requirements conflict with Italian industry.

This will entail some elaboration of the procedures to be followed before a matter is brought before the Committee. Without clarity on this point, I fear we should clog the Committee with business which it is neither designed nor competent to undertake.

- B. To control one or more neutral inspectorates or referees which could carry out investigations on the spot on behalf of the Committee in respect of cases referred to it under A.
- C. To bring to the notice of the Board the need for new or revised procedures governing military activities which affect Italian industry.

If you agree to these proposals, will you please let me know by telephone and instruct the Chairman of the Drafting Committee accordingly, and I will instruct the AFHQ representative. I think the Committee should meet as early as possible.

I am rather tied here at the moment, but if you think it necessary I will send a senior officer to discuss the matter with you.

In conclusion I should like to assure you of the sincerity of my desire to reach a settlement of the question satisfactory to yourself.

1. AMG Eighth Army have raised the point that, if factories in newly liberated territory are to be saved for essential civilian purposes, it is necessary that there should be some agency on the spot which can give an immediate decision as to the factories' future in the early days of liberation.

2. When the allied troops first enter a town, the CAO, in his 48 hrs report states to AMG Army which factories are still standing, which are partially or wholly destroyed, and which are in working order.

3. Forward troops will take from these factories what they need operationally, as they are entitled to (AAI letter 2059/402 dated 29 Sep 44).

4. On arrival of Corps HQ, the question begins to be asked "What is to be the future of such and such a factory?" This is referred to Q Eighth Army, who ask the views of AMG and services. It is not in my opinion their province to answer such questions (nor should they be asked to make inventories, and such should be clearly stated). The question of the future of the factory has to be referred to this Section or HQ Allied Commission. It was pointed out to AMG Eighth Army that, to meet this situation, the Industrial Coordination Committee has been formed. But the trouble will be that while the Committee will have certain information as to factories in enemy occupied territory, on that information it can only say "If the factory is undamaged, it will work for the Army - or for AC - or it is unimportant and can be cannabilized". What will happen if, as is likely, the factory is damaged when the town is occupied? Army may say "The factory is damaged. Therefore it can't work for AC. Therefore we will remove all the materials we need". In such a case an immediate decision is needed. It will, I think, be useless to wait while the information is sent back to AFHQ, a decision is taken and sent back to Army. By that time the factory will be empty.

5. AMG Eighth Army suggest, and I am of the opinion that it is the only solution, that an officer of the rank of Lt. Col. or above (but not an AC/AMG officer) be attached to Army, and that he be empowered to take executive decisions on such points. He could well be on the strength of the Industrial Coordination Committee, and have under him the AFHQ Board officers whose duty it is to find and report back stocks of controlled materials. This officer, following the policy decided on by the Industrial Coordination Committee would be able to give decisions on the spot on each case as it arose (and the circumstances will never be the same). Moreover, the officer will have the double advantage of having the authority of AFHQ behind him, and will represent the interests of both AC/AMG and the Armed Forces.

In the event of a conflict between military and civilian requirements which cannot be resolved between the military commander responsible for military local administration in the area concerned, and the A.C./M.C. local representative,

1. Mr. Cleveland reported on the Meeting of the Drafting Committee pointing out that only two matters were agreed upon by it, namely:

- a. De-requisitioning procedure (Terms of Reference (b).)
- b. Requisitioning procedure (Terms of Reference (f).)

Col. Denmore put forward an objection to the wording of the procedure agreed by the Drafting Committee for requisitioning and presented a counter-proposal by which,

IN THE AIR AREA - The Military Commander responsible for local administration in the area would consult with AC/MS representative prior to such action with a view to reaching agreement. In case of disagreement, the decision of the Military Commander would prevail.

IN TERRITORY OTHER THAN AIR AREA - The Military Commander responsible for local administration in the area, would consult with the AC/MS representative prior to such action; in the event of a conflict of military and civilian requirements, which cannot be resolved locally, the Military Commander will take no action until a decision has been reached through reference of the matter through AFMS to IAC.

2. The Chairman then referred to the failure of the Drafting Committee to fulfill its instructions which were to re-draft and submit to the Committee, at a later meeting, the Appendix A to the Agenda of the first meeting (i.e., the terms of implementation of the Terms of Reference of the Industrial Coordination Committee.

Therefore, requisitions would not be made except in case of urgent necessity.

5. Brig. Lush said that the responsibility of the Allied Commission, in the interests of the economy of the country, was to prevent damage to industrial plants, etc. If there were requisitioned the expense of the Commission was that damage was done, plant removed, etc. The Commission needed machinery to prevent such action and if the Committee was merely to be a judicial committee to decide matters post factum, they could prevent initial damage. The phrase "operational necessity" was too widely interpreted.

6. Gen. Lewis then stated that "the English Language and AFHQ together were capable of producing an instruction on the subject which would be effective. He also stated that "Operational Necessity" claims could be subject to authority from AFHQ. He then said that Brig. Lush's doubts about the effectiveness of an AFHQ instruction on the subject of damage to requisitioned buildings, plant and machinery etc., were based on something which had not yet been produced.

7. The Chairman said that these doubts were based on AD experience with similar types of instructions which had already been issued.
8. The Chairman then instructed the Drafting Committee to meet again to recommend the extent to which the ICC Terms of Reference can be implemented, and the procedure for implementing these Terms of Reference. Gen. McInnes was then requested by the Chairman to produce a Draft Instruction as put forward by Gen. Lewis (see para 6 above).
- The Chairman continued, saying that, if it is found that the Committee could not serve the purpose for which, at AC's request, it was formed he would recommend its dissolution. If this were found to be necessary, however, he would consider it his duty to report the facts to the highest possible authority, if necessary in Washington and London, as its dissolution would be an obstacle in the path of AC fulfilling its own mission and would lead to further unrest and the assignment of special troops to preserve order.
9. Gen. Butterworth then presented a paper (referring to Appendix 'B' of the last ICC agenda) regarding the question of production of Military controlled plants in relation to their security, and AC's participation in the possible increased production. It was agreed that procedure for obtaining participation in such increased production should be that laid down in Minute No. 4 of the Meeting of the Industrial Coordination Committee of the 2 December 14.
10. It was then proposed by Gen. Lewis that the number of members on the Drafting Committee should be reduced. The figure was finally agreed at three - being: Mr. Gloveland as Chairman, Brig. Curry and representative from C-4. It was indicated that Fifteenth Army Group, was not sufficiently interested to require representation on the Drafting Committee.
11. Gen. Lewis then suggested that it would be more convenient if the meetings of the Industrial Coordination Committee could be held on the same day as the AFHQ meeting, as such an arrangement would save the time of a number of busy people.

- (2) IN THEATRE OR IN AREA, consult with the AC/AG representative prior to such action; in the event of a conflict of military and civilian requirements which cannot be resolved locally, the military commander will take no action until a decision has been reached through the procedure described in paras b) and c) below.

b) In the event of a conflict between the military and civil

- (b) In the event of conflict between the military and civil requirements which cannot be resolved locally, the matter will be referred through AFLRS to the ICC who will, in the case of (a)(1) decide whether de-requisitioning shall be effected and if action has already been taken and in the case of (a)(ii) decide whether requisitioning shall take place or not. "

SUBJECT: Industrial Coordination Committee

TO : Chief Commissioner

1. You will remember that at the Industrial Coordination Committee meeting on 2 Dec, a Drafting Committee was appointed to go over Appendix A to the Agenda, which was a statement of how the terms of reference might be implemented.

2. The Drafting Committee met on 11 Dec 44 and spent nearly the entire day discussing this question. In the end, agreement was reached only on the implementation on paragraphs 1 (b) and 1 (f) of the terms of reference. The attached Drafting Committee report, and the Appendix to it, shows the extent to which agreement has been reached on these two points.

3. Generally speaking, the representatives of G-4, AFHQ took the position that AC should only come into the picture after the damage has been done--that is, AC should be allowed to apply for the derequisitioning of a factory, or protest (after the fact) the movement of plant and machinery from one place to another. 5. On the other hand, the representatives of G-4 AFHQ were unable even to discuss the other four paragraphs in the terms of reference. The reason for this inability was very clear; they did not agree with the terms of reference themselves. Our representatives immediately said that if the terms of reference themselves were in question, AFHQ would have to raise that at the Local Resources Board itself, since the Drafting Committee had not been instructed to change the terms of reference, but only to find some way of implementing them. The status of these four paragraphs, therefore, is still up in the air at the moment, as indicated by paragraph 4 of the Drafting Committee's Report.

6. In order to put into practice as soon as possible the procedures summarized in paragraph 3 above, we are taking the following steps:

- a) The Industry S/C is preparing a complete inventory of the derequisition cases which the AC should press. The most urgent cases will be put up to the next meeting of the Industrial Coordination Committee, if concurred in by you.
- b) Instructions to all AC/AMG representatives in the field, stating the criteria to be used in changing military requests for clearance on proposed requisitions, are now being prepared. These AC instructions cannot, of course, be issued until the Drafting Committee report has been implemented by an APHQ order along the lines of para ii of the Appendix.

3. The Drafting Committee considered the terms of Reference of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee (as approved by AFIR Board) and recommend that Appendix "A" attached be the procedure to implement para 1 (b) and (f) of the terms of Reference.

4. The Drafting Committee were unable to agree an interpretation of para 1 (a) (c) (d) and (e) of the terms of Reference which would permit a procedure acceptable to AFHQ G-4 members.

INDUSTRIAL COORDINATION COMMITTEE

In order to implement paras (b) and (f) of the terms of reference, the following procedure is recommended by the Drafting Committee:-

A. In Liberated Italy

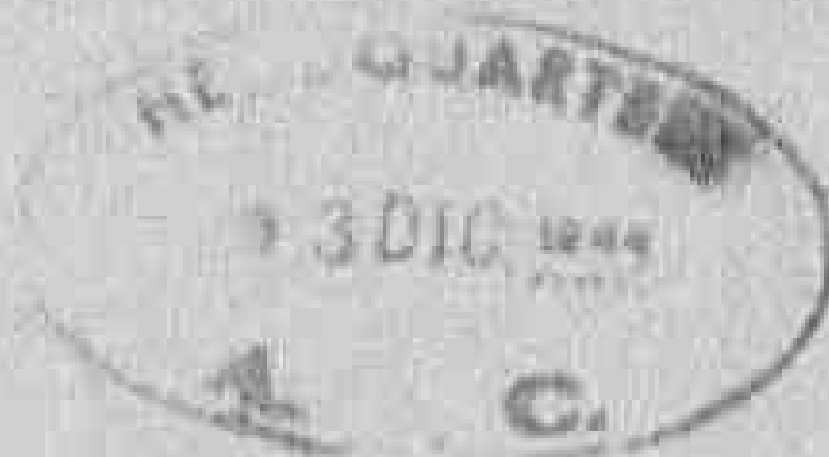

APPENDIX "A"

INDUSTRIAL CO-ORDINATION COMMISSION

Paper No. 1

In order to implement the approved terms of reference and decide what machinery should be established to permit the Commission to carry out its functions, the following proposals based on the terms of reference are submitted:-

Terms of Reference, Para. 1.

(a) To enable the Commission to carry out the provisions of this paragraph it is proposed that all Services be instructed to submit to AFIS details of all factories, industrial plant and machinery, warehouses and storage upon occupied by them, or operated under their control. This information to be obtained on the attached proforma 1.

(b) That section of the terms of reference in this paragraph not covered by the procedure outlined in para. (a), viz., the control of "the regulation of industrial factories, plant, storage space and warehouses should be effected by the issue of an Order that before application for the regulation of any of these for operation is made, the approval of the Industrial Co-ordination Commission, ratified by the A.F.L.S. (UTILITY) Board must be first obtained.

In forward areas all industrial plants and facilities, and their stocks will be blocked in the first instance by A/C/MS in areas uncovered by the Allied Area Board.

The Stores, Materials and Machinery will not be taken out of any industrial unit capable of any type of production until the responsibility for the operation or other disposition of the plant has been given by the Industrial Co-ordination Commission or its designated agent.

An immediate joint survey will be made of all blocked facilities by sub-committees of the Industrial Co-ordination

(a) To enable the Committee to carry out the provisions of this paragraph it is proposed that all factories be instructed to submit to AFHQ details of all factories, industrial plant and machinery, warehouses and storage yards occupied by them, or operated under their control. This information to be obtained on the attached proforma 1.

(b) That section of the terms of reference in this paragraph not covered by the procedure outlined in para. (a), viz., the control of the requisition of industrial factories, plant, storage yards and warehouses should be effected by the issue of an Order that before application for the requisition of any of these for operation in India, the approval of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee, ratified by the A.P.A.C. (INDIAN) Board must be first obtained.

In forward areas all industrial plants and facilities, and their stocks will be blocked in the first instance by AFHQ in areas uncovered by the Allied Armed Forces.

The stores, materials and machinery will not be taken out of any industrial unit capable of any type of production until the responsibility for the operation or other disposition of the plant has been given by the Industrial Co-ordination Committee or its designated agent.

An immediate joint survey will be made of all blocked facilities by sub-committees of the Industrial Co-ordination Committee which will consist of representatives of the Indian and of AFHQ.

The sub-committees will make recommendations in writing through the Secretariat to the Industrial Co-ordination Committee as to the way to which such blocked plant is to be put, and the authority which will be responsible for its operation. Any case of clearance out among the sub-committees in such recommendations should be stated.

Applications for authority to operate will be submitted through AFHQ to the Industrial Co-ordination Committee on the attached proforma 2.

Similar application by AFHQ for clearance from requisition by the Allied Armed Forces should be submitted likewise.

applications by civilian concerns will be submitted by the Industry Sub-Committee through AFISA to the Industrial Co-ordination Committee to permit of such arms being considered on its merits. The AF procedure on this is attached at Appendix 10.

The Industrial Co-ordination Committee will decide the use and allocation of such plant, and the release will be effected by a release note issued over the signature of the Chief of Section, AFISA.

The authority responsible for operating a plant will submit monthly reports to AFISA for presentation to the Industrial Co-ordination Committee on the operation and output of the plant.

(c) To enable the Committee to control raw materials, partly finished or finished products it is necessary for the Industrial Co-ordination Committee to recommend to the Board that such of the items be placed on the controlled list as they think are necessary to permit of the preservation and/or rehabilitation of industrial plant. Whenever it is discovered that in items which it is so desired to control is already on the controlled list of another Committee, the Industrial Co-ordination Committee will take precedence over the other Committee for the control of that item and will refer to the Committee concerned only such quantities as are not required for preservation and/or rehabilitation of industrial plant.

(3) The reports called for in part, (b) above from the authority responsible for operating a plant will enable the Committee to ensure that a maximum output is produced in critical areas.

(e) In general, the operation of materials will continue to be for the present the responsibility of the interested Service or the controlling organization, except in those instances where recommendation to the Committee is essential and/or arbitration is necessary. The allocation of coal is a specific example of one such case.

The authority responsible for operating a plant will submit monthly reports to AFHQ for presentation to the Industrial Co-ordination Committee on the operation and output of the plant.

(c) To enable the Committee to control raw materials, partly finished or finished products it is necessary for the Industrial Co-ordination Committee to recommend to the Joint that such of the above be placed on the controlled list as they think are necessary to permit of the preservation and/or rehabilitation of industrial plant. Wherever it is discovered that an item which it is so desired to control is already on the controlled list in another Committee, the Industrial Co-ordination Committee will take precedence over the other Committee for the control of that item and will refer to the Committee concerned only such questions as are not required for preservation and/or rehabilitation of industrial plant.

(d) The reports called for in para. (b) above from the authority responsible for operating a plant will enable the Committee to ensure that a maximum output is required is obtained from factories.

(e) In general, the importation of materials will continue to be for the purpose of the rehabilitation of the industrial plant or the controlling organization, except in those instances where recommendation to the Committee is essential and/or verification is necessary. The allocation of coal is a specific example of one such case.

(f) All plant and machinery should be placed on the controlled list by an order published through Communist channels, and the necessary steps taken by the Italian Government to prohibit the movement of any plant and machinery, except by a release note issued by the Industrial Co-ordination Committee over the signature of the Chief of Section, AFHQ.

ALLOTTED PERCENTAGE REQUISITION (ITALIAN) PLANTSINDUSTRIAL CO-ORDINATION CO-ALTYVEJOINT MILITARY/CO-ORDINATION IN THE INTEREST OF RECONSTRUCTIONRECOMMENDATIONS

1. When the end of all parties concerned is concerned in the detailed allocation of the output of Italian industrial facilities. Moreover, in many cases the output of these facilities is not used to the full, for the benefit of all claimants, where the claims of the authorities responsible for operating plants do not happen to be as large as the capacity of the plants operated.
2. In the case of some industries, of which cement and steel are notable examples, it is believed to be most efficient to have the best qualified authority operate the rehabilitated plants at capacity, and split the total output among the claimants on a percent $\frac{1}{2}$ basis. This procedure would have the advantage of making it possible for all claimants for the basic materials to know what quantity of such materials would be available for a month or more in advance, and to make plans for the allocation and use of these materials accordingly.
3. For example, the output from the production of all rehabilitated cement plants, whether resulting from military or $\frac{1}{2}$ efforts, should be divided between military and $\frac{1}{2}$ claims on the basis of a percentage to be fixed (and changed from time to time in the light of changing conditions) by the Industrial Co-ordination Committee.
4. The Industrial Co-ordination Committee is the logical group to make the overall allocations as to the allocation of output on the basis contemplated in paragraphs 2 and 3. Its percentage allocations could later be translated into specific technical allocations by the appropriate committees of the local Research Board (e.g. the Engineering Materials Committee), on the basis of the statements of rehabilitation from the authorities responsible for plant operation.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Industrial Co-ordination Committee consider and make appropriate except percentage allocations of the output of basic industries, along the lines of paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

1. Peak time and energy of all parties concerned is consumed in the detailed allocation of the output of industrial facilities. Moreover, in many cases the output of these facilities is not used to the full, for the benefit of all elements, where the claims of the authorities responsible for operating plants do not appear to be as large as the capacity of the plants operated.
2. In the case of some industries, of which cement and steel are notable examples, it is believed to be most efficient to have the best qualified authority operate the rehabilitated plants at capacity, and assign the total output among the elements on a percentage basis. This procedure would have the advantage of making it possible for all elements for the basic materials to know what quantities of such materials would be available for a month or more in advance, and to make plans for the allocation and use of these materials accordingly.
3. For example, the output from the production of all rehabilitated cement plants, resulting from military or "A" efforts, could be divided between military and civilian on the basis of a percentage to be fixed (and changed from time to time in the light of changing conditions) by the Industrial Co-ordination Committee.
4. The Industrial Co-ordination Committee is the logical group to make the overall decisions as to the allocation of output on the basis contemplated in paragraphs 2 and 3. The percentage allocations of all later be translated into specific tonnage allocations by the appropriate Committee of the Federal Reserve Board (e.g. the Engineering Materials Committee), on the basis of the statements of availability from the authorities responsible for plant operation.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Industrial Co-ordination Committee consider and make appropriate output percentage allocations of the output of basic industries, along the lines of paragraphs 2 and 3 above.
