1. Even though as Regional Commissioner I have no authority or responsibility for the effectuation of the industrial plan of the North because under AG directive they have been assumed by AG North, I asked Colonel Maskrey of AG North if it would be agreeable to him to have a conference in my office to review the situation. Colonel Maskrey immediately agreed. Hence, on Monday, August 5, we had a conference attended by Colonel Maskrey, Colonel Hancock, our Regional Industry Officer, and our Regional Commerce Officer, and on the Italian side, we had Mr. Tressaloni, who is Minister Ortoni's alter ego, commissario of two of the Industrial Committees, and Rodolfo Borrelli, the President of the CIMA.

2. The following was found:

a. The Industrial Council has been established and has an office which is operating.

b. The Price Fixing Board has not yet been fully established - two members are missing - but is now-the-less able to make decisions on a majority basis of the board. We have succeeded in finding offices for the board in Varese Bonaparte where IV Corps was. The board is now being installed there.

c. The commissioners of the various industrial committees are on the whole working at their job. There are some exceptions. The head of the committee on textiles has been sick and it has been decided to appoint a new head. There are one or two other soft spots which are being taken care of.

d. All those agencies that form the basis of the industrial plan have no funds. Through our Regional Headquarters, we have provided funds to the Price Fixing Board. It was agreed that the Industrial Council and, where necessary, the industrial committees should obtain funds through this Regional Headquarters. Our Finance Office will accept the approval of the tentative budgets by Colonel Maskrey.

e. The AG officers of some Regions, particularly Piemonte, Liguria, etc, are reluctant to recognize the over-all authority of the Council, the Board, and especially the Industrial Committees. This should not be in view of the fact that the plan is embodied in a directive from AG HQ which is equally binding on all regions. It might be worthwhile for AG HQ in Rome to refresh the recollection of other Regional Commissioners.

f. It was agreed that the Industrial Council, once it has obtained the approval of AC North, should issue the orders for the Northern Regions. The Industrial Council would send copies of these orders to the Prefects of the Northern Regions. AC North would send copies of the same orders to the ANG Northern Regions. The Price Fixing Board would submit its decisions to AC North and, once approved, the Board would issue the order. The Board would then disseminate the order to the offices of the Prefects and AC North would advise the ANG offices. It was clarified that the Price Fixing Board would not have to obtain specific approval of the Industrial Council before it issued a price order. In practice the Price Fixing Board works closely with the Industrial Committees and with the Industrial Council so that close coordination is obtained.

g. At the present time, there is no medium which can be fruitfully used to spread among the people of the North information concerning unblocking of commodity, prices thereof, and no medium to make known the orders that will be issued by the Industrial Council and the Price Fixing Board. We have agreed that it would be worthwhile for the Industrial Council to issue a bulletin. In order to do this, we must obtain permission from the Allied Publication Board.

3. There are three general observations that I made at the conference which I believe are sound. They result from many talks that I have had with various industrialists, my own officers, and with representatives of the Italian government. When I presented these observations, or perhaps one should call them guiding principles, no objection to them was voiced by anyone at the conference. These observations are:

a. The Industrial Committees should struggle to keep as close as possible to the industrialists themselves. Care should be taken not to create a gap between the commissioner of an industrial committee and the industrialists. It is clear to me that the industrialists must be integrated so that they have the feeling that the particular committee is their own and not some outside governmental bureaucratic mechanism to hamper the free exercise of business initiative.

b. The Industrial Council and the Price Fixing Board must keep ever present that what is vitally needed in North Italy today is the removal of economic restrictions. There is a mass of controls which are impossible to enforce and there is no use deluding ourselves in maintaining them. It is preferable to remove all the shackles. Control on production and price fixing should be kept at a minimum. Hence, the Industrial Council and the Price Fixing Board should keep this as an objective and speedily cut-away the many restrictions which are stifling business.

c. While AC-ANG naturally have final authority over the work of the Industrial Council, the Price Fixing Board, and the Industrial Committees, AC-ANG must be ever conscious of the necessity of not exercising such authority except when absolutely necessary. There is obviously too much temptation on the part of AC-ANG officers to keep their fingers in the pie. This is invariably accompanied with the presumption that we of AC-ANG are wiser and smarter than the Italian agencies and that we know best how things are to be done. Furthermore, frequent interference on the part of AC-ANG serves to upset the work of the Italian mechanism and discourages the officials that are devoting themselves to it. There has been a case, for instance, where an elaborate plan was worked out by one particular segment

of inventory and then an officer from AC, whether authorized or not, we don't know, stepped in and dictated an entirely different plan. It seems to me that it would be definitely worthwhile for AC in Rome to caution all AC HQ officers and, like-wise, all officers in the regions, not to adopt the attitude that everything that the Italians do must be submitted for approval and modifications made, and etc. ad infinitum. I trust that this report may be useful to you.

1. Further study on the above subject was made by the under-signed on a recent trip through North Italy. It would appear that a committee to allocate the available supplies of Fuel Oil will be necessary in the North as this should be done by a government agency rather than by C.I.P., a commercial agency. The available stocks will be notified by this Section to C.I.P. who will in turn notify the government committee that does the allocating the quantity that is available and will be governed by their judgment in making deliveries. This has reference to your 1.00/ES dated 9 July 45.

2. For manufacturing operations that are functioning, C.I.P. will do the necessary engineering work, make recommendations of lubricants needed, and deliver them on demand, as industrial lubricants are not rationed in the sense that automotive products are rationed, and the government oil committee is not expected to function in this type of work.

1. Attached is copy of Circular Ref. 1.00/ES dated
9 July 45 and of plan attached thereto.

2. It is part of the function of C.I.P. (Comitato
Italiano Petroli) to take care of the screening and
allocation of P.O.L. requirements for Industry and
Instructions to this effect were sent to all Northern
Regions by Circular AG/5083 dated 9 July 45 of which
copy is also attached.

3. U.D.L. was an office set up by the Fascist Re-
publican Government to control all F.O.L. matters and
Comitato Olii Minerali e Carburanti Succedanei was
organised under its auspices to take care of screening
and allocating Industrial Oil requirements. It is
understood that arrangements have already been made
for C.I.P. to absorb C.O.M.C.S. technical personnel
as from the time when the functions they were perform-
ing were handed over to C.I.P. -July 16th.

4. This has been brought to the attention of
Economic Section since it is obvious that the conti-
nuance of C.O.M.C.S. in its old function must clash
with C.I.P.'s activities in the same sphere.

5. The position is not so clear as regards Comita-
to Olii e Grassi though it is believed that this is
a similar organisation to C.O.M.C.S. specialising in
Mineral Greases.

VALETTA was ejected from Fiat management by: but no usurpation proceedings have been initiated. Requests made by this HQ to: PIEMONTE Region and MONDRI CNAI as to any objections have elicited no response. Efforts now being made to contact MONDRI to obtain definite answer.
3. Request representations be made to Italian Government that TRIVISANI cannot be regarded acceptable and that VALETTA is considered best suited for appointment. Advice is requested earliest possible. Pending receipt PIEMONTE Region will not be officially represented at MILAN meeting 30 July.

1. This is in reply to Executive Commissioner's Memorandum of 4 June 1945.

2. Minister Gronchi has indicated agreement in principle with the formation of Regional Italian Joint Advisory Committees (Labour and Industry); and from time to time has suggested the names of persons to be considered for appointment to various Committees. Representatives of organised labour and of Employers' Confederations have also indicated agreement; and the idea has been accepted by various *Consigli del Lavoro* in the northern Regions* with whom the question was discussed in May 1945.

3. Regional Commissioners have been advised to proceed with the establishment of Joint Advisory Committees in each Region, making appointments on a provisional basis to avoid delay whilst awaiting firm nominations.

A provisionally appointed Committee has already met and made recommendations to the Regional Commissioner in Liguria on wage adjustments. The recommendations were accepted.

In Venetia and Piemonte nominations are almost complete and it is hoped to operate the Committees shortly. The position in Liguria is not yet known.

4. In Lombardia no progress has been made and a change in the Regional Labour Officer will be made the occasion for stimulating activity on this issue.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

It has been decided to appoint Joint Advisory Committees comprising representatives of the Italian Government, Italian industry and Italian workers to be attached to each Regional Commissioner in ADO territory for the purpose of advising on labour and industrial questions. The functions of the Regional Joint Advisory Committees are:

(1) To advise upon proposals for wage changes reaching the Regional Commissioners from negotiating bodies through Ufficio del Lavoro with the comments and recommendations of the latter.

(2) To consider and advise upon matters leading to industrial unrest and, where necessary, to take a personal part in the negotiations upon such matters.

(3) Generally to advise on questions that may be referred regarding the establishment, staffing and operation of government offices dealing with labour, such as Ufficio del Lavoro.

(4) To identify at the earliest possible moment industrial establishments which should be safe-guarded from requisition or deterioration;

(5) Similarly to identify industrial establishments which should be re-activated at the earliest possible moment in the general interests and to prevent unemployment.

It is understood that the Italian Government, industry and workers are prepared to cooperate in the selection of such Committees and I shall be grateful if you will indicate the individuals nominated by the respective interests to serve immediately on the Regional Italian Joint Advisory Committees in the regions of Toscana and Marche Umbria, and other individuals to serve, in due course, in the regions of Emilia, Liguria, Piemonte, Lombardia and Venesia. It is considered important that individuals acceptable to Northern interests should be nominated for the last named regions.

It will be understood that the appointments are entirely honorary so far as ADO is concerned, and that no salary or expenses can be paid, although every facility will be afforded for the performance of the functions suggested.

SUBJECT: Italian Joint Advisory Regional Committees on
Industrial and Economic Questions.

TO : Executive Commissioner

1. It is recommended that Joint Advisory Committees on Industrial and Economic Questions, comprising representatives of the Italian Government, Italian industry and Italian workers, be attached to each Regional Commissioner in AMG territory for the purpose of advising on industrial and economic questions.

2. It is understood that the Italian Government, the Italian Confederation of Industry, representing employers, and the CGIL, representing Italian workers, will be prepared to nominate representatives and will be anxious to cooperate in an advisory and consultative capacity. It is recognised that such Committees should at the earliest possible moment, or in due course, include adequate representation of Northern interests.

3. The functions proposed for the Joint Advisory Regional Committees would be:

- (a) To identify, at the earliest possible moment, industrial establishments which should be safeguarded from requisition or deterioration;
- (b) Similarly, to identify industrial establishments which should be reactivated at the earliest possible moment in the general interests and to prevent unemployment;
- (c) To advise upon proposed wage changes reaching the Regional Commissioners from negotiating bodies forwarded through Ufficio del Lavoro with the comments and recommendations of the latter.
- (d) To consider and advise upon matters leading to industrial unrest and, where necessary, to take a personal part in the negotiations upon such matters.



(e) Generally to advise on questions that may be referred regarding the establishment, staffing and operation of Government offices dealing with labor, such as the Ufficio del Lavoro.

4. The ultimate responsibility of Regional Commissioners in their respective Regions, and of AMG/AC at Headquarters level would not be minimized by the appointments of these Committees, whose functions would be purely advisory and consultative. At the same time the nominating interests would be expected to abide by the advice given by the representatives, since the observance of such advice by Regional Commissioners would imply some degree of responsibility of the parties concerned for the resultant action.

5. If this proposal is accepted detailed instructions will be prepared and the necessary approaches made to the suggested nominating bodies.
