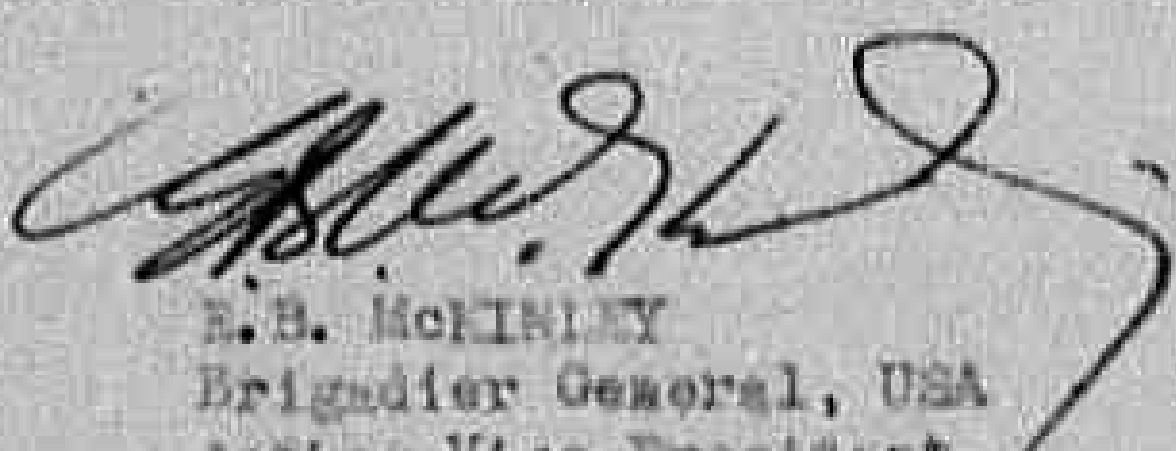

TO : A/VP, Econ Sec.

Forwarded below for your information is extract from the Supreme Allied Commander's Conference (4th Meeting) Minutes dated 24 Aug 45:

"11. GREEK REQUIREMENTS FOR OLIVE OIL.

MR. BROAD said he was informed that the Greek Government, considering that they were about to have serious economic difficulties in regard to the supply of oil and fats, had requested assistance from the British and United States Ambassadors, who in turn had referred this request to their governments. The Deputy Resident Minister had further had a signal from the British Ambassador to GREECE enquiring whether, pending such assistance on governmental level, AFHQ could make a loan to GREECE of 2,000 tons of olive oil from ITALY.

BRIGADIER GENERAL HANSEN said that he had received a copy of some of the signals to which the Deputy Resident Minister had referred and a preliminary examination had been made. This indicated that any major assistance from ITALY was out of the question. It was believed that this year only some 52,000 tons of olive oil had been amassed in the whole of ITALY as against 42,000 tons last year in that part of the country which was then under Allied control. Furthermore, he had information which indicated that the Greeks had not amassed some of last year's crop of olive oil in the AEGEAN Islands and that vigorous measures in these areas would produce results. A similar request for loans had been received in respect of both the US and British zones in AUSTRIA. He felt that the Greek Government had not realized that there was a world-wide shortage of oils and fats. He had also noted the Supreme Allied Commander's signal sent from GREECE indicating that failing ITALY an attempt should be made to get supplies from NORTH AFRICA or MIDDLE EAST. He was not hopeful of this but he wished to explore certain aspects of the matter further.

THE DEPUTY SUPREME ALLIED COMMANDER:

Instructed the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, to investigate the matter further and, in due course, to submit appropriate recommendations in regard to the Greek government's request. 11

Extract of Minutes of Executive Commissioner's Meeting held on 6 March 1945.

Olive Oil Amassing. Ecom Sec said that the total of olive oil collected to date was 32,500 tons. This was 34% of the target figure. Fairly satisfactory progress was being maintained. PRO stated that the olive oil film had been completed but there was difficulty in finding material to make prints. Ecom Sec considered that although it was rather late in the campaign the film might have some effect. Ex C considered another olive oil press campaign was due and instructed PRO to start on this.

Ecom Sec stated that the olive oil cases were not being brought to the law courts. Ex C said the matter should be referred to the Italian Government for prompt action. Application had been received for an increase in the olive oil ration to the Italian Army. Ecom Sec had prepared a letter for AshQ protesting against this. Land Forces B/C stated that the application was not supported from the Italian Army point of view.

1. Reference your letter 10.05/ES on this subject dated 13 Feb. 45.
2. My Agriculture Officer informs me that when the new schedule of retentions is taken into consideration the estimated amassable total for olive oil should be 76,500 qtls instead of 109,000 for Toscana Region. This figure has been reported to the Agriculture Sub-Commission.
3. As of 15 Feb. 45 the total amassed in this Region was 27,144 qtls. This is 35% of 76,500 qtls. You will agree that this puts a much better light on the olive oil amassing situation in Toscana Region.
4. Provincial Commissioners are aware of the importance of the olive oil amassing and are now exerting themselves to obtain at least sufficient for Food Plan "B".

2. The Chief of Staff has asked that your attention be called to the fact that as of 7 February your region has collected 17% of its estimated amassable oil whereas Lazio-Umbria and Abruzzi-Marche have collected 24 and 25% respectively.

3. It is recognized that there are a great number of difficulties in connection with the olive oil amassing and that your region is doing what it can to overcome these difficulties in order to amass the oil.

4. The amassing of the oil crop is so vital to the general food problem and has a direct bearing on future shipping requirements, hence it is respectfully requested that from an AC/AMG point of view we should be sure that we have done and are doing all that we can do to get in the oil.

Olive Oil Amassing Moon Sec stated that since the last report the percentage of the desired target of olive oil collected had risen from 21% to 24% (23,000 tons). They were confident that the 'B' target figure of 50,000 tons would be reached, which would provide the ration for devastated areas and the Italian Army and towns up to 50,000 inhabitants. Moon Sec said they had good hopes of the full 80,000 tons being amassed. OOS directed Moon Sec to tell the Italian Government that only 24% of the target figure had been collected in order to speed them up. OOS asked how AMG compared with other territory and directed Moon Sec to write to Toscana Region, who had only amassed 17% and draw the attention of this Region that they were behind other Regions.

Dear Mr. Khan,

Your assistance in connection with the Olive Oil campaign has been most helpful and is appreciated. Any additional efforts you may devote to promote further the understanding of the Italian people regarding their full responsibility in this connection will be well invested.

It is hoped that the Olive Oil campaign of Italy will go forward with increasing vigour as a result of recent joint efforts of the Italian Government and the Allied Commission. As of the end of January 1945 approximately 20,000 tons of oil had been collected in the "Oleari del Popolo".

No olive oil collected in Italy last year was exported, but was used for the Italian military and civilian population. In these circumstances the olive oil producers, pressers and processors have a definite responsibility this year to their own population in consigning their production through legitimate channels.

It would be wrong for me to assure you that no olive oil will be exported in aid of the Allied war effort and that no olive oil will be consumed by Allied troops. I can state categorically that if olive oil is to be deflected from consumption by Italians in Italy it will only be because it is needed by Allied troops or the Allied war effort. Italians should be content with this and your propaganda can pursue that course.
